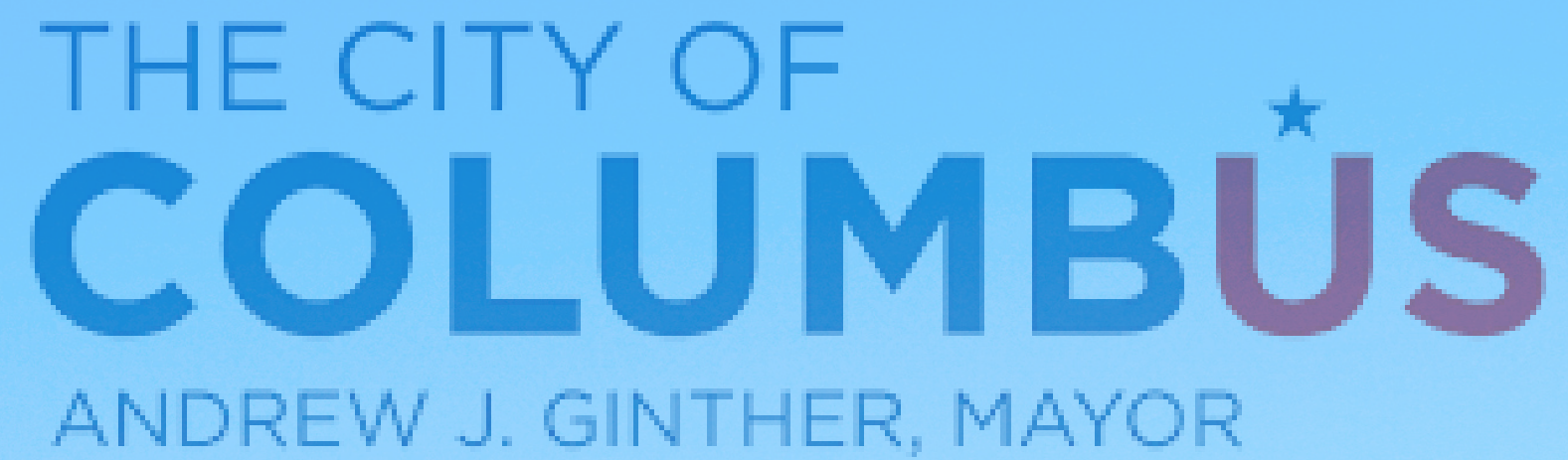

- Registered as Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- Operating for at least one year.
- Compliant with the State of Ohio Attorney General's Office
- In good standing with the Internal Revenue Service.

GRANT FOCUS AREAS

Elevate! will increase the organizational capacity of human service agencies in these focus areas:

Infant Vitality



Ensure that all babies—regardless of race, zip code or family income—celebrate their first birthdays. Their work in addressing one or more social determinants of health is helping reduce the disparity in the infant mortality rates (IMR) between Black and White babies while reducing the IMRs for all babies.

Unsheltered Homelessness



Reduce the number of individuals and families experiencing unsheltered homelessness to functional zero by improving access to obtain and/or maintain safe, affordable housing and person-centered supportive services.

Housing Stability for Immigrants & Refugees



Improve access to obtain and/or maintain safe, affordable housing and person-centered supportive services for immigrant/refugee individuals and families experiencing housing instability.

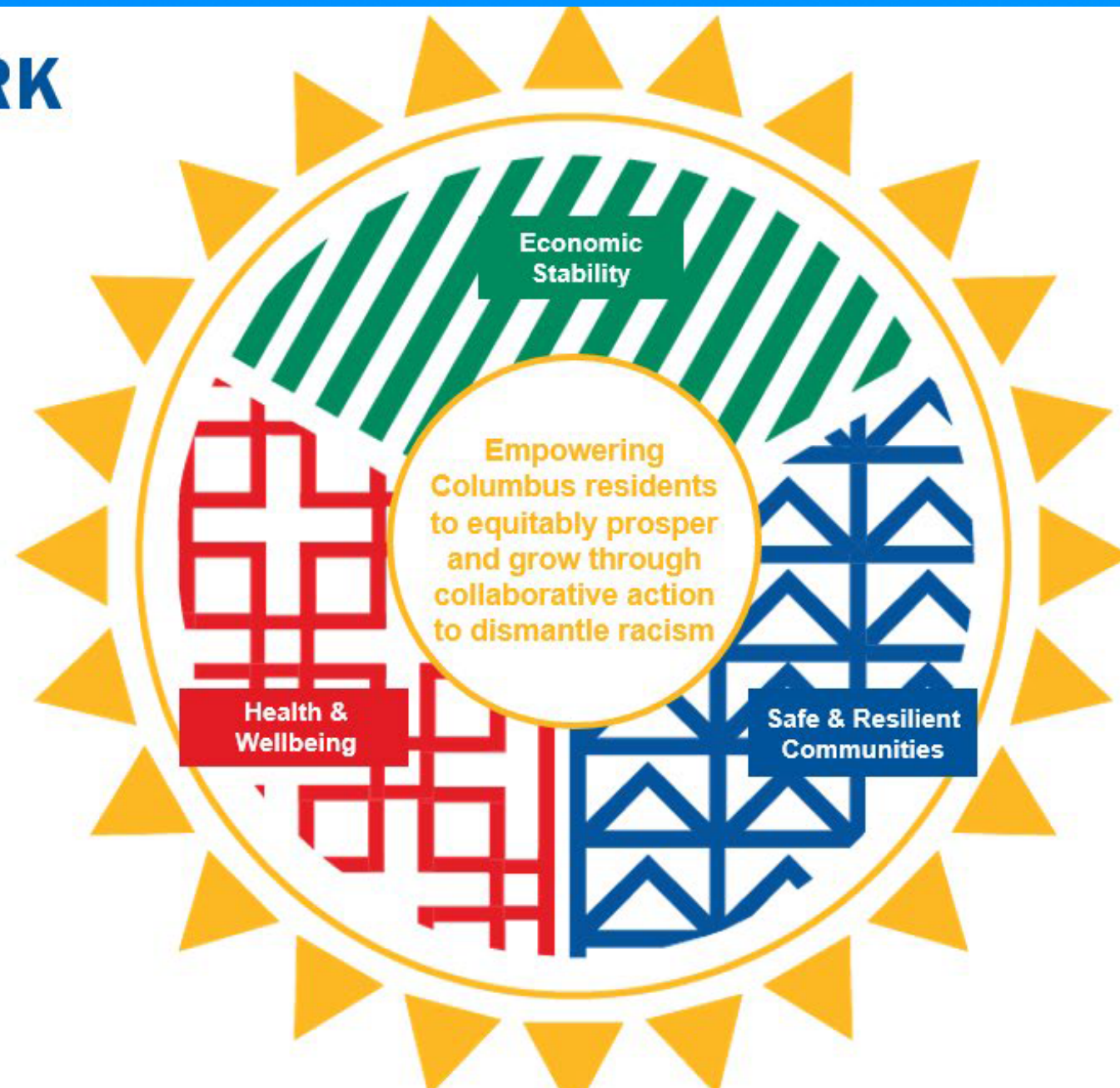

FRAMEWORK



Aspirational "Rays"

- Twenty-one “**Rays**” stated as aspirations for every member of our community
- Elicits understanding of how inequity is experienced by Columbus residents
- **Requires collaboration** with community partners to be fully realized

Economic Stability



- Homelessness
- Increasing Financial Stability
- Workforce Development
- Housing Stability

Economic Stability



Homelessness: working to assure that every resident is stably housed.

For example, assisting Columbus residents who are living on the land with housing and related supports.

Economic Stability



Increasing Financial Security: working to assure that every Columbus resident achieves and maintains financial security.

For example, working to assist residents and non-profit organizations in connecting with the Columbus Financial Empowerment Center. Funding is not intended to duplicate the financial counseling services currently offered by the Columbus Financial Empowerment Center.

Economic Stability



Workforce Development: working to assure that every Columbus resident is prepared to enter and advance in the workplace.

Economic Stability



Housing Stability: working to assure that no resident pays more than 30% of their monthly income to live in the neighborhood of their choice.

Safe and Resilient Communities



- Violence Elimination
- Re-entry
- Neighborhood Building

Safe and Resilient Communities



Violence Elimination: working to assure that every resident lives in a neighborhood that is free of violent crime. For example, reaching residents who are engaged in violence with strategies such as mediation and mentoring.

Organizations which received City of Columbus funding under the gun violence reduction and youth categories must be willing to serve as referrals for other City funded youth intervention programs.

Safe and Resilient Communities



Re-entry: working to assure that justice involved residents are ready to contribute to, and are accepted by the community.

For example, providing employment or housing opportunities and supports for returning, justice involved individuals.

Safe and Resilient Communities



Neighborhood Building: working to assure that every neighborhood has the infrastructure, greenspace, and programs to support safe and healthy living.

Examples include supporting residents through: community gardens, leadership development, beautification and crime prevention initiatives.

Health and Well-Being



- Infant Vitality
- Chronic Disease Prevention

Health and Well-Being



Infant Vitality: working to ensure that every baby reaches his or her first birthday.

Examples include: efforts to reduce premature births, eliminate sleep related deaths and connecting disconnected moms and dads to relationships and services.

Health and Well-Being



Chronic Disease Prevention: working to assure that healthy choices are easy for everyone to access and afford.

For example, connecting residents with healthy food choices, nutrition education, medications, or other health care.

How much may I apply for?

- Request is tied to FY 2022 Board-Approved Budget
- 3 Budget Tiers
 - Less than \$500,000
 - \$500,000 to \$1,000,000
 - More than \$1,000,000



How much may I apply for?

Budget of **less than** \$500,000, organization may request one of the following:

\$10,000
\$15,000
\$20,000
\$25,000
\$50,000



How much may I apply for?

Budget \$500,000 to \$1,000,000,
organization may request one of the
following :

\$25,000

\$50,000

\$75,000

\$100,000



How much may I apply for?

Budget greater than \$1,000,000, organization may request one of the following:

\$50,000
\$75,000
\$100,000
\$150,000



Eligibility Requirements

Registered (or in the process of registering) in Sam.gov:
https://sam.gov/content/duns-uei*

Registered(or in the process of registering) with the City of Columbus Vendor Services. There is a two year compliance registration that must be renewed every two years.

We cannot establish agreements or make payments without a current and accurate Vendor Registration.

Eligibility Requirements

Adherence to Non-Discrimination Clause:

“To provide services without regard to race, religion, national origin, ethnicity, age, gender, gender identity & expression, disability, sexual orientation, veteran status, familial status or socio-economic status; and agrees to maintain a commitment to cultural competence and ongoing development of cultural competence capabilities of staff and organization.”
