


SIGNING OF LEGISLATION



BACKGROUND: As the city with greatest population located in Franklin County, Ohio, the City of Columbus, Ohio, is the "Proximate City," as that term is further defined in Section 349.01(M) of the Ohio Revised Code ("R.C."). As the Proximate City, the need exists for the City to determine the sufficiency of and if so, sign the Petition for Establishment of the Villages at Galloway New Community Authority (the "Authority") as a New Community Authority under Ohio Revise Code Chapter 349 (the "Petition") in order for the Franklin County, Ohio Board of Commissioners, as the "organizational board of commissions," as defined in R.C. Section 349.01(F), to hold a public hearing on the Petition for the establishment of the Authority. The "new community district," as defined in R.C. Section 349.01(C), of the Authority as described in the Petition is located in Prairie Township (Franklin County), Ohio on Franklin County Tax Parcel ID Numbers 240-000146 and 240-000112 along Galloway Road. Braumiller Development, LLC, as the "developer" indicated in the Petition plans to develop the 134.80-acre new community district as a comprehensive mixed-use development, consisting of approximately 381 single-family homes, 106 patio homes, 72 town homes and 240 multi-family units, along with various related commercial structures and improvements. The creation of this Authority is in furtherance of the Big Darby Revenue Program adopted by City Council under Resolution 0216X-2008 on April 20, 2009. Participation in the Big Darby Revenue Program was affirmed in a development agreement between the developer and the Board of Trustees of Prairie Township to complete essential early investments and community priority investments that will advance the Big Darby Accord and serve the new community district and the Township in general, improve water quality in the Big Darby Watershed, provide for adequate public facilities, and cause the creation of new housing and employment opportunities for Township residents. By this resolution, City Council, as the legislative authority of the Proximate City, will determine the sufficiency of the Petition and, authorize the Director of the Department of Development to sign the Petition.

FISCAL IMPACT: No funding is required for this legislation.

To determine that the Petition for Establishment of the Villages at Galloway New Community Authority as a New Community Authority under Ohio Revise Code Chapter 349 submitted by Braumiller Development, LLC is sufficient and complies with the requirements of Section 349.03 of the Ohio Revised Code in form and substance; and to authorize the Director of the Department of Development to sign said petition on behalf of the City of Columbus, Ohio as the "proximate city" as defined in Section 349.01(M) of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, Braumiller Development, LLC (the "Developer") plans to develop an approximately 134.80-acre site located entirely within the boundaries of Prairie Township (Franklin County), Ohio (the "Township") on Franklin County Tax Parcel ID Numbers 240-000146 and 240-000112 along Galloway Road (the "New Community District"); and

WHEREAS, the Developer plans to develop the New Community District as a comprehensive residential

development, consisting of approximately 381 single-family homes, 106 patio homes, 72 town homes and 240 multi-family units, along with various related commercial structures and improvements; and

WHEREAS, the New Community District lies within the *Big Darby Accord* planning area, which makes it subject to the requirements the Big Darby Revenue Program adopted on April 20, 2009 by City Council under Resolution 0216X-2008 as well as by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the creation of a new community authority is in furtherance of the Big Darby Revenue Program and affirmed in a development agreement between the Developer and the Board of Trustees of the Township to complete essential early investments and community priorities investments that will advance the *Big Darby Accord* and serve the New Community District and the Township; and

WHEREAS, on or about September 29, 2022, the Developer submitted to the Clerk of the Council of the City of Columbus, Ohio ("Council"), pursuant to Revised Code Section 349.03, a Petition for Establishment of the Villages at Galloway New Community Authority as a New Community Authority under Chapter 349 of the Ohio Revised Code (the "Petition") attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, as the New Community District as described in the Petition is located entirely within the boundaries of the Township, the City of Columbus, Ohio, as the city with the greatest population located in the county in which the New Community District is located, is considered to be a "Proximate City" for the purposes of the Petition under Ohio Revised Code Section 349.01(M); and

WHEREAS, this Council, as the legislative authority of the Proximate City and pursuant to Revised Code Section 349.03 and this resolution, desires to legislatively determine that the Petition complies with the requirements of that section as to form and substance and authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to sign the Petition prior to its submittal to the Franklin County, Ohio Board of Commissioners, as the organizational board of commissioners defined under Ohio Revised Code Section 349.01(F); NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS THAT:

- **SECTION 1.** Proximate City. This Council hereby acknowledges and determines that, pursuant to Revised Code Section 349.01(M)(1) and 349.03(A), it is a "proximate city" of the Villages at Galloway New Community Authority for all purposes of Ohio Revised Code Chapter 349.
- SECTION 2. Petition's Sufficiency and Compliance with Ohio Revised Code Section 349.03. This Council has examined the Petition and finds and determines that the Petition is sufficient and complies with the requirements of Ohio Revised Code Section 349.03 in form and substance.

Mayor Ginther's vision for Columbus, America's Opportunity City, is to create access to a high-quality pre-kindergarten education for every 4-year-old. Addressing early childhood learning means bringing awareness and resources to a critical learning stage in childhood development. Children who come to school ready to learn are more likely to succeed academically and in life.

Children who participate in high-quality pre-kindergarten experiences significantly improve their early literacy, language, and math skills. Ample evidence shows that children who enter school unprepared fall farther and farther behind. Students who get a poor start in their earliest years are likely to struggle in high school and subsequently, fail to graduate.

The purpose of Early Start Columbus is to expand high-quality pre-kindergarten services through partnerships with Columbus City Schools and community-based providers. The providers partnering in the Early Start Columbus Program have all demonstrated their ability to provide a high-quality pre-kindergarten education. All partnering providers are rated at least three stars in the State's Step Up To Quality rating and improvement system.

State law makes allowable the braiding of Ohio Department of Education Early Childhood Expansion funds with those of the Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Service Publicly Funded Childcare program. The 2022-2023 Early Start Columbus Program combines the Mayor's Office of Education funds with these funding streams to further extend the number of children served while using City funds more efficiently. This approach uses City funds as "last dollar" funding.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes an expenditure of \$5,308,500.00 from the 2022 Mayor's Office of Education's general operating fund. A transfer of \$1,348,584.50 within the general fund is needed to align the contracts with the school year.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: Emergency designation is requested to ensure the contracts are enacted to meet the operational needs of the providers.

To authorize and direct the Executive Director of the Mayor's Office of Education to enter into contracts with high-quality pre-kindergarten organizations to provide educational services; to waive the competitive bidding provisions of the Columbus City Codes; to authorize a transfer with in the general fund; to authorize the expenditure of up to \$5,308,500.00 from the general fund; and to declare an emergency. Competitive bidding is being waived for each of the below vendors. City agencies are required to obtain at least three actual quotes from STS vendors; the Fire Division is not able to do so with Atlantic Emergency Solutions and Sutphen Corporations, given the lack of available manufacturers of custom fire apparatus within the State of Ohio's STS schedule. By dealing directly with each manufacturer during the specification and price negotiation processes, Fire is able to control costs to remain

within budgeted funding, and manage lead times. The subsequent contracts established by Fleet Management with each manufacturer has also simplified the managing of parts/service after purchase.

Competitive bidding is being waived for Stryker Sales Corporation as the Stryker Power Cot is the standardized ambulance cot deployed by Columbus Fire, making it manifestly impractical to bid given Stryker is the sole distributor for their proprietary equipment.

Atlantic Emergency Solutions ~ FID #273187193 / Vendor 034448 ~ The Division of Fire is in need to purchase one (1) Pierce Tandem Axel 107' ladder in the amount of \$1,983,538.00; included in the quote for this purchase is the cost for three (3) inspection trips for eight (8) CFD personnel totaling \$33,000.00 (pre-construction, post paint, and final). This purchase is made in accordance with State of Ohio Index #STS618, Schedule #800918, which expires 6/30/2023, however bidding requirements for STS purchases cannot be fulfilled for this custom apparatus given the lack of available suppliers, thus a waiver of bidding is necessary. Sutphen Corporation ~ FID #310671786 / Vendor 004200 ~ The Division of Fire is in need to purchase two (2) Sutphen Corporation Monarch Custom Pumpers in the amount of \$1,726,368.00 to replace apparatus that are beyond their useful life with high maintenance costs; included with the Sutphen Monarch Custom Pumpers purchase will be the purchase/installation of all pertinent equipment to be utilized on the respective vehicles. This purchase is made in accordance with State of Ohio Index #STS618, Schedule #800814, which expires 8/31/2024, however bidding requirements for STS purchases cannot be fulfilled for this custom apparatus given the lack of available suppliers, thus a waiver of bidding is necessary.

Stryker Sales Corporation ~ FID #382902424 / Vendor 030281 ~ The Fire Division is in need to purchase seven (7) Stryker Ambulance Power Cots for each of the EMS Transport vehicles being ordered from Horton Emergency Vehicles. While in the past these cots have been included in the specifications along with other EMS equipment that comes included on the vehicle, it has been discovered that buying directly from the manufacturer will result in a significant savings to the City. BACKGROUND

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to modify and renew a contract with BCN Real Estate Holdings LLC for an additional year to provide for maintenance of properties held by the Land Redevelopment Division's Land Reutilization Program.

Original contract amount \$ 50,000.00 PO311077

The purpose of the property maintenance program is to provide services such as trash and debris removal from structures, cleaning and abatement of vacant lots, boarding structures, graffiti removal, tree services, and similar work for properties held by the Land Reutilization Program.

The Department of Development advertised RFQ020243 on Vendor Services in November 2021 for the property maintenance program. Thirteen bids were received and the Director of Development entered into contract with ten bidders under the authority of Columbus City Code Section 329.19. The original agreement contract period commenced from the date of approval of the purchase order to February 28, 2023, with an option to renew one additional year, through February 28, 2024. Advertising for services annually would interrupt the program and possibly result a delay in providing these services. The fee for services in the contract renewal will be the same as that of the original contract.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding is available in fund 2206, Land Management Fund.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: the vendor number is 023775 and expires 3/4/2024.

To authorize the Director of Development to modify and renew a contract with BCN Real Estate Holdings LLC for maintenance of properties held by the Land Redevelopment Division's Land Reutilization Program up to \$75,000.00; and to authorize the appropriation and expenditure of up \$75,000.00 from the Land Management Fund. (\$75,000.00)

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Safety, on behalf of the Division of Support Services, to enter into a contract with Motorola Solutions Inc. for the ongoing support of the Motorola P1/CAD system. This maintenance/support contract will provide the technical assistance, cyber monitoring, and upgrade to the various software components utilized by the system. The Motorola P1/CAD was purchased and brought online in 2017. It is a CAD system where the location functionality is utilized by being tied to the radio system in order to provide location of a radio in the event a first responder is in distress or trouble. When the emergency button is depressed on a radio, this system picks up the emergency and then utilizes the radio's GPS coordinates to display the location on a map screen in dispatch. Dispatch can then monitor the location of the radio and track it in the event of a foot chase or similar event. Dispatch can also find a radio using the system. The system is utilized by both police and fire. The system is currently under a 5 year support and warranty agreement that will expire at the end of 2022. With the expiration of the support and warranty approaching, Support Services is in need of a support contract with Motorola to ensure the continuation of technical assistance, cyber monitoring, and upgrades to various software utilized by this system.

<u>Bid Information</u>: This purchase is being executed in accordance with the sole source provisions of Chapter 329 of the Columbus City Code. The ongoing maintenance and support of the existing system requires proprietary software and infrastructure owned by Motorola Solutions Inc. No other vendor has access to Motorola source code and Motorola has not authorized any dealer or other party to obtain such access.

BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health has been awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate \$3,334,529.00 in grant monies to fund the Ryan White Part A HIV Care grant program, for the period March 1, 2023 through February 28, 2024. The total amount funded for this period is \$3,334,529.00.

The Ryan White Part A (RWPA) HIV Care grant's purpose is to improve access to medical care for persons living with HIV or AIDS living in Central Ohio. The goal is that each client will achieve viral suppression, which improves their quality of life and reduces the risk of spreading the infection. This grant will enhance medical services for both somatic and behavioral health, pay for HIV related doctor's visits, mental health services, substance abuse services, and other services allowable by the grant, and strengthen the case management and linkage to care programs at CPH.

HRSA has tasked CPH to improve the efficiency of the reallocation of funds as necessary in order to minimize unused funds to the greatest extent possible and to maximize the available services and avoid potential penalties as future carryover funds may not be permitted by HRSA. For this reason, it is necessary to authorize the Board of Health to accept any additional awards for the RWPA HIV Care grant program; to authorize the appropriation of any additional awards for the RWPA HIV Care grant program; and to authorize the City Auditor to transfer appropriations between object classes for the RWPA HIV Care grant program.

The department has determined it is in the best interest of the City to utilize the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) deicing chemical contracts that are available to us.

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Finance and Management, on behalf of the Department of Public Service, to establish purchase orders, enter into contracts, create purchase agreements, and associate all general budget reservations resulting from this ordinance with the appropriate purchase agreement necessary from existing and future ODOT chemical deicing contracts to obtain deicing chemicals for the 2022-2023 winter season.

ODOT 124-23 includes the following six vendors: Chloride Solutions, LLC, EnviroTech Services, Inc., Great Lakes Chloride, Inc., Nachurs Alpine Solutions Corp, K-Tech Specialty Coatings, Inc., and Nature's Own Source, LLC. The Division of Infrastructure Management needs the following deicing chemicals from the above six vendors, which are on the current ODOT deicing chemical contract:

The contract amount will be issued at the budgeted amount of \$650,000.00 and the amount of construction administration and inspection services will be \$97,500.00. The total legislated amount is \$747,500.00.

Searches in the System for Award Management (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery list (State) produced no findings against Decker Construction Company.

The HSCF, a nonprofit organization, currently provides support services to nonprofits in central Ohio. In the summer of 2022 a Shared Services Committee of the Human Services Chamber (HSC) was convened to identify the greatest need for specific professional services. The findings of the committee identified that the top professional services needed in the nonprofit sector that could be provided under a shared services model were human resources, communications and marketing, accounting and finance, development, IT, data management, and legal services. There was universal interest in such services, but near-universal acknowledgment that the agencies lacked the capacity or resources to integrate such efforts into their operations.

Furthermore, a "sustainability survey" conducted with Smart Columbus in the summer of 2021, was done in order to identify the interest in providing professional services or resources specific to helping health and human services nonprofits mitigate against the accelerating effects of global warming, both for their clients as well as for their own agencies.

This Shared Services approach will create unprecedented efficiencies and cost-savings while improving the

business operations of the nonprofit sector. As such, HSC seeks to expand and improve upon its current roster of professional services and resources. By hosting, administering, and facilitating these services, HSC can create equitable access to human resources, PR and communications, legal services, sustainability efforts, accounting services, development, and more for nonprofits of all sizes and service areas across the city. The cost-savings and capacity-saving will allow agencies to have greater resources and capacity to invest in addressing the most pressing needs of the people of our community, now and well into the future.

The Human Service Chamber of Franklin County will offer the following through a Shared Services approach: Human Resources, Communications/Marketing, Sustainability and Global Warming Preparedness for the nonprofit sector in Columbus. Additional services may be added in the future.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding is available in the Department of Development Division of Administration 2022 General Fund Budget. Funds will be transferred from Object Class 03 to Object Class 05.

1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Service to enter into rental agreements with Premier Truck Sales and Rental in the amount of up to \$492,000.00 for the rental of refuse collection trucks to be used by the Division of Refuse Collection.

The Division of Refuse Collection (Division) is responsible for providing weekly refuse collection service to the 344,000 residential units within the City of Columbus. Prior to the COVID pandemic it took nine to twelve months after placement of order to receive a refuse collection truck. The shutdown of many businesses during the pandemic has caused long delivery delays for these trucks. The projected delivery date of replacement trucks previously on order has been delayed by many months, and delivery times for new orders are now running twelve to eighteen months after receipt of order. The Division is experiencing a shortage of refuse collection trucks due to downtime needed for repairs of an aging fleet and the delays in getting replacement vehicles that have been ordered.

It is necessary to immediately rent refuse collection trucks to continue to provide timely refuse collection to the residents of Columbus. This will also allow the Division to be able to collect refuse during the normal work week hours and to avoid routinely scheduling mandatory overtime. The rental of these vehicles is expected to be needed for a year, possibly two, in order to give time for the trucks that have been on order, and for the trucks that are about to be ordered, to be delivered to the City. An assessment of delivery times of the vehicles on order will be made in the spring of 2023. At that time it may be necessary to rent additional trucks to accommodate further deficiencies in the Division fleet due to the ongoing pandemic related production delays.

Searches in the System for Award Management (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery List (State) produced no findings against Premier Truck Sales and Rental.

2. REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF FORMAL COMPETITIVE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS

A search was made for companies that rented refuse collection trucks. Two companies were found within Ohio that rented the trucks. Of the two companies, Premier Truck Sales and Rental was the only company that had trucks available for rent at this time. The delay associated with the pandemic in getting delivery of new vehicles has caused a shortage of rental vehicles. Taking the time required to do a formal bidding process could result in these vehicles no longer being available and delays in the collection of refuse. A request for waiver of the formal competitive bidding requirements of Columbus City Code Chapter 329 is requested due to the need to quickly secure the needed vehicles to avoid delays in the collection of refuse.

3. CONTRACT COMPLIANCE INFORMATION

Premier Truck Sales and Rental contract compliance number is CC-040372 and expires 12/9/2023.

4. FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this contract will come from the General Fund, Fund 1000. It is necessary to transfer appropriation within the General Fund, Fund 1000.

5. MINORITY AND WOMAN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE & SMALL LOCAL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

This expenditure is for the rental of refuse trucks. The purchase and rental of specialized equipment is exempt from this program.

6. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION

Emergency action is requested so the rental of refuse trucks can occur at the earliest possible time to ensure refuse continues to be collected in a timely manner.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to enter into an agreement with Premier Truck

Sales and Rental to rent refuse collection vehicles; to authorize the City Auditor to transfer appropriation with the General Fund, Refuse Collection Division; to waive the competitive bidding requirements of Columbus City Code; to authorize the expenditure of up to \$492,000.00 from the general fund to pay for this rental agreement; and to declare an emergency. (\$492,000.00)

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Service, Division of Refuse Collection, is responsible for providing weekly refuse collection service to the 344,000 residential units within the City of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, the COVID pandemic is causing a delay in the manufacture and delivery of new refuse collection trucks; and

WHEREAS, The Division of Refuse Collection is experiencing a shortage of refuse collection trucks due to downtime needed for repairs of an aging fleet and the delays in getting replacement vehicles that have been ordered; and

WHEREAS, a search was made for companies that rented refuse collection trucks; and

WHEREAS, one company, Premier Truck Sales and Rental, was found in Ohio that had refuse collection trucks immediately available to rent; and

WHEREAS, delivery delays of new vehicles caused by the pandemic is causing a shortage of refuse trucks available for rent; and

The Franklin County Board of Commissioners passed Resolution 0605-22 on 8/30/22 requesting ODOT investigate and determine a safe speed limit at this location. It is now necessary for the City of Columbus to enact similar legislation because a portion of Wilson Road lies within City limits.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the City for this ordinance.

3. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION

Emergency action is requested so as to allow the Franklin County Engineer's Office to formally submit the results of its study to ODOT for review and approval as soon as reasonably practicable to ensure or enhance the safety of the traveling public.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to request that the Director of the Ohio Department of Transportation establish a reasonable and safe prima facie speed on Wilson Road from Sullivant Avenue to the Franklin Township corporation limit immediately north of the Camp Chase Railroad; to repeal any and all previous speed limit ordinances and resolutions on said roadway; and to declare an emergency. 

Objection of Assessment: The owner of any lot or parcel may file an objection to the amount or apportionment of their estimated assessment, in writing, with the City Clerk within two (2) weeks from the date of service of this notice and any owner who fails to do so shall be deemed to have waived any objections to such assessment to the extent of the amount estimated.
