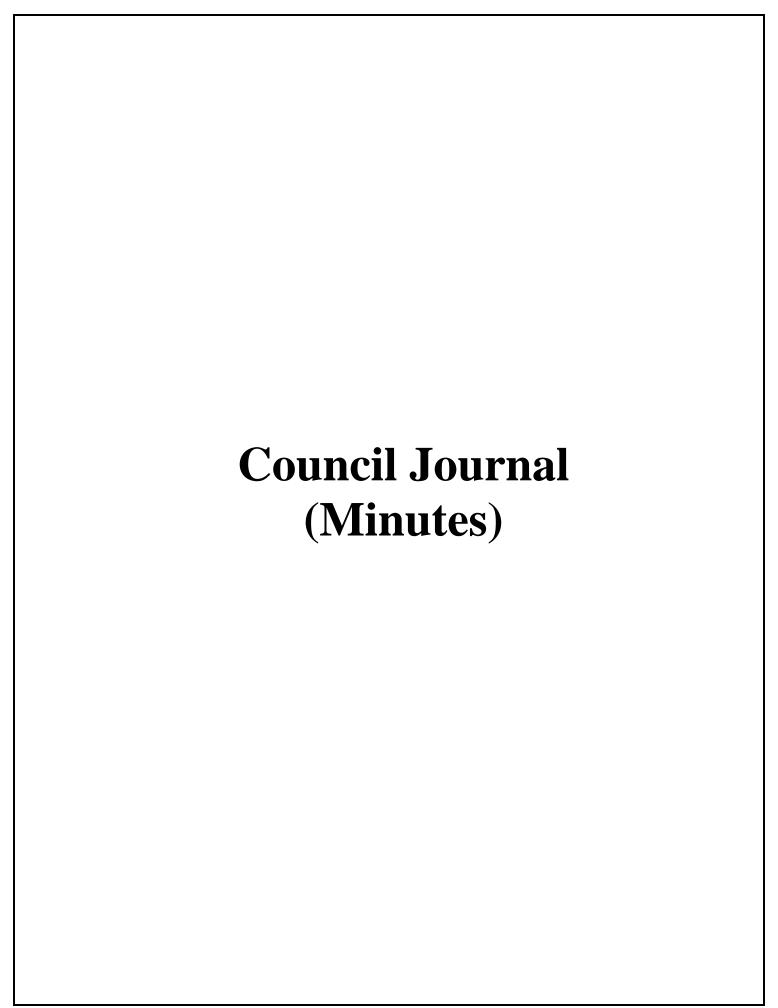

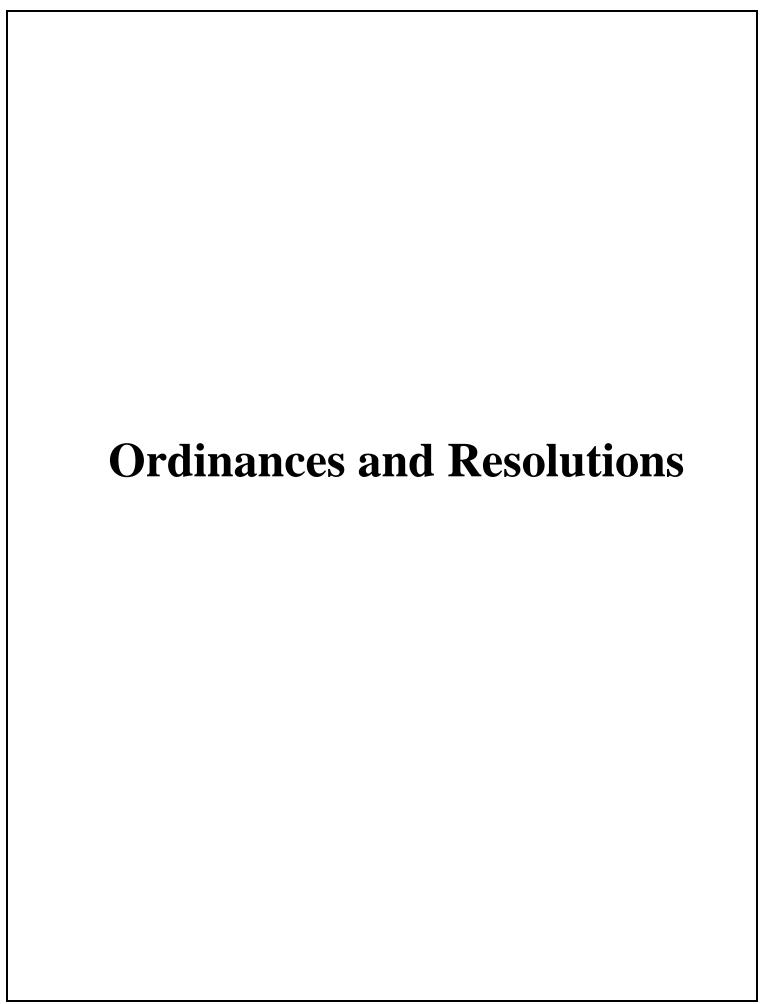

5TH BY NORTHWEST AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Disapproval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The applicant has received a recommendation of approval from Staff and the Development Commission for a concurrent rezoning (Ordinance #0227-2023; Z22-049) to the AR-3, Apartment Residential District. The proposed mixed-use development will provide up to 7,400 square feet of commercial space and up to 208 apartment units over two subareas. The requested Council variance permits commercial parking in the northern subarea of the site and commercial uses in the southern subarea of the site. The request includes variances to building height, landscaping and screening, maneuvering, parking space, reduced number of parking spaces from 275 to 250, vision clearance, landscaping, lot area, building lines, and rear yard. Staff finds the requested variances to be supportable as they will permit a mixed-use development that is consistent with similar new mixed-use developments along the West 5th Avenue and West 3rd Avenue corridors.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3333.03, AR-3 apartment residential district use; 3309.14, Height district; 3312.21(A), Landscaping and screening; 3312.25, Maneuvering; 3312.29, Parking space; 3312.49, Minimum number of parking spaces required; 3321.05(B)(2), Vision clearance; 3321.07(B), Landscaping; 3333.15(C), Basis of computing area; 3333.18, Building lines; and 3333.24, Rear yard, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **1010 W. 5TH AVE. (43212)** to permit a mixed-use development with reduced development standards in the AR-3, Apartment Residential District (Council Variance #CV22-059).

WHEREAS, by application #CV22-059, the owner of property at 1010 W. 5TH AVE. (43212) is requesting a Council variance to permit a mixed-use development with reduced development standards in the AR-3, Apartment Residential District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3333.03, AR-3 apartment residential district use, prohibits commercial uses, while the applicant proposes commercial parking in the northern subarea and a maximum of 7,400 square feet of commercial space in the southern subarea; and

WHEREAS, Section 3309.14, Height districts, prohibits the height of a building to exceed 60 feet at the building line in the H-60 Height District, while the applicant proposes an increased building height of 70 feet in both subareas; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.21(A), Landscaping and screening, requires the interior of any parking lot containing 10 or more parking spaces to provide one deciduous shade tree per 10 spaces within islands or peninsulas, with 4 shade trees being required for a 40-space parking lot, while the applicant proposes zero trees in the northern

subarea, but the equivalent number of trees in proximity of the parking lot; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.25, Maneuvering, requires parking spaces to have sufficient access and maneuvering area on the lot where the parking spaces are located, while the applicant proposes maneuvering through stacked parking spaces on both subareas; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.29, Parking space, only allows stacked parking spaces to be counted as required spaces for single- and two-unit dwellings, while the applicant proposes to allow stacked parking spaces, assigned to the same residential unit, to be counted toward the total number of provided parking spaces in both subareas; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.49(C), Minimum numbers of parking spaces required, requires 1.5 parking spaces per apartment unit, and 1 space per 75 square feet with a 25% reduction per Section 3372.609, for 275 required parking spaces for 134 apartment units and 7,400 square feet of commercial space in the southern subarea, while the applicant proposes a total of 250 parking spaces in the southern subarea, which is mitigated by 14 additional parking spaces in the northern subarea; and

WHEREAS, Section 3321.05(B)(2), Vision clearance, requires that a clear vision triangle of 30 feet by 30 feet at the intersection of West 5th Avenue and Gerrard Avenue, while the applicant proposes a reduced vision clearance triangle of 9 feet by 9 feet in the southern subarea; and

WHEREAS, Section 3321.07(B), Landscaping, requires one tree per ten residential units, a requirement of 8 trees for 74 apartment units in the northern subarea and 14 trees for 134 apartment units in the southern subarea, while the applicant proposes zero trees; and

BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health received funds for the Implementing Enhanced HIV Prevention and Surveillance for Health Departments to End the HIV Epidemic in Ohio grant program from the Ohio Department of Health. Columbus Public Health will contract with AIDS Healthcare Foundation (AHF) for HIV Testing and Screening services to persons at highest risk of HIV infection at community based testing sites. All negatives that are at highest risk of HIV shall be referred to PrEP. All HIV positive cases shall be referred to medical care, as well as CPH's Prevention Services.

The cost to renew the contract for these services totals \$198,579.61 and is for a one-year period, beginning on April 30, 2023 and ending on April 29, 2024. Contingency funds in the amount of \$15,000.00 are included in the total cost of \$198.579.61.

Various city agencies use the current IVR system, including 311, Public Utilities, Building and Zoning Services and Technology. On April 26, 2021, Ordinance 0724-2021 passed, authorizing a contract, via a waiver of competitive bids, with ConvergeOne to continue maintenance and support of the system. At that time, ConvergeOne submitted a five-year quote, to be renewed (with Council approval) on an annual basis. DoT requests that the aforementioned contract be renewed for a third year to ensure continuation of the noted services, which will allow the department sufficient time to bid out maintenance and support for the entire system. Bidding out the entire system is necessary because Genesys has a policy of not allowing multiple parties to support their IVR systems. Thus, until DoT can develop comprehensive specifications, the department requests that the contract with ConvergeOne be renewed and that the provisions of competitive bidding be waived in this instance.

The quote attached to this ordinance covers maintenance and support services for the entirety of the City's existing IVR environment for a five-year period. BACKGROUND:

On October 3, 2012 the Columbus City Treasurer's Office issued a request for proposal, SA004617, for various banking services. The Columbus Depository Commission received and reviewed proposals from six (6) local banks and recommended, subject to the approval of City Council, the award of banking services to specific banks on April 18, 2013. All such banks are currently eligible depositories of the City of Columbus, pursuant to Chapter 321.04 of the Columbus City Code. At a meeting of the Columbus Depository Commission held on December 28, 2012, the Commission approved Applications for the Deposit of Public Funds which each bank submitted for review. The contracts are for a period of ten (10) years beginning June 1, 2013 through May 31, 2023 subject to annual appropriations and approval of contracts by the Columbus City Council.

On May 6, 2013, Columbus City Council authorized contracts and expenditures for the first year of banking services, ordinance number 1040-2013, for the period of June 1, 2013 through May 31, 2014.

On May 19, 2014, Columbus City Council authorized contracts and expenditures for the second year of banking services, ordinance number 1073-2014, for the period of June 1, 2014 through May 31, 2015.

On June 1, 2015, Columbus City Council authorized contracts and expenditures for the third year of banking services, ordinance number 1101-2015 for the period of June 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016.

BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a Not-for-Profit Services Contract with The Ohio State University, through the College of Social Work, (OSU-CoSW) for the MBSR program and to pay for expenses from PO293529 (\$27,968.00).

Ordinance 1435-2021, passed by City Council on June 14, 2021, authorized the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a grant agreement with OSU-CoSW for the MBSR program in amount up to \$27,968.00. The agreement was executed with an agreement end date of December 31, 2022 (PO293529). Because of issues related to COVID, the program was not implemented as planned. The OSU-CoSW would like implement the program in 2023 and the Department of Development requests using the existing purchase order to pay for the program.

The Mindfulness-based stress reduction (MBSR) program is geared towards justice-involved Black girls and their parents and caregivers. In light of the tragic death of Ma'Khia Bryant in 2021, there is a need to provide specific, targeted support for criminal justice system-involved and at-risk Black girls. These girls are experiencing more stress due to the coronavirus and its effect on their mothers (parents/caregivers), with 57% noting that their mental health was worse due to the virus and its affects. In partnership with the Columbus City Council (CCC) and Franklin County Juvenile Court (FCJC), FCJC staff will refer interested parent/caregiver-dyads to the OSU program. This intervention will help reduce stress among all participants and promote restoration and healing that will reduce the potential for law-breaking behavior.

The targeted constituents include court-involved Black girls aged 14-17 who are also disproportionality affected by PTSD, with 70% of girls with histories of sexual or physical abuse as well as their parents/caregivers. The parent/caregiver-child dyads will undergo a stress reduction intervention, i.e., Mindfulness-based Stress Reduction (MBSR). MBSR may improve PTSD symptomatology, which is linked to delinquency and other risky behaviors. MBSR may help modulate the dysregulated stress response in the body to improve physical and mental health concurrently.

The project will be led by Dr. Camille R. Quinn, a licensed, independent social worker in Ohio and Assistant Professor at the OSU College of Social Work. Her work draws on over 20 years of prior experience in social and health services as a practitioner and administrator. She is a funded researcher and has substantive expertise to develop and tailor interventions to improve the well-being of Black youth and their families, especially girls and young women in the community and correctional settings, which are all needed to carry out this project.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding in the amount of \$27,968.00 is available on PO293529

As Columbus grows, the city will earn an increasingly elevated status as a destination for concerts, conventions, and other major events.

This tax is estimated to yield approximately \$3,463,000.00 per current year in revenue, with 20% of that revenue, or approximately \$695,000.00, contracted with the Greater Columbus Arts Council for disbursement to outside organizations to invest in improvements to cultural arts facilities, public art, sports venues, and performance arts spaces. GCAC will establish a process for application and consideration of grant proposals.

Greater Columbus Arts Council disburses the tax proceeds through applications and considerations of proposals to outside organizations to invest in the improvements of cultural arts and sports venues. The services provided cannot be provided by existing city employees because these services are beyond the City's current staffing capacity to provide.

Emergency action is requested so that tax proceeds can be disbursed without delay to ensure timely payments so that investment in cultural arts, sports, and performance arts venues can continue in the greater Columbus area with no interruption in service.

Broad St. Outerbelt St. to Reynoldsburg-New Albany Rd.), in Object Class 06 (Capital Outlay) per the account codes in the attachment to this ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** That the Director of Public Service be, and hereby is, authorized to enter into a contract modification with Burgess & Niple at 330 Rush Alley, Suite 700, Columbus, Ohio, 43215, for the Arterial Street Rehabilitaton E. Broad St. Outerbelt St. to Reynoldsburg-New Albany Rd project in the amount of \$1,900,000.00, or so much thereof as may be needed, in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the Department of Public Service, which are hereby approved.
- **SECTION 5.** That the expenditure of \$1,900,000.00, or so much thereof as may be needed, is hereby authorized in Fund 7428 (E. Broad Dominion TIF Capital Fund), Dept-Div 5912 (Design and Construction), Project P530103-100066 (Arterial Street Rehabilitaton E. Broad St. Outerbelt St. to Reynoldsburg-New Albany Rd.), in Object Class 06 (Capital Outlay) per the accounting codes in the attachment to this ordinance.
- **SECTION 6.** Funds are hereby deemed appropriated and expenditures and transfers authorized to carry out the purposes of this ordinance and the City Auditor shall establish such accounting codes as necessary.
- **SECTION 7.** That the City Auditor is authorized to make any accounting changes to revise the funding source for all contracts or contract modifications associated with this ordinance.
- **SECTION 8.** That the City Auditor is hereby authorized to transfer the unencumbered balance in a project account to the unallocated balance account within the same fund upon receipt of certification by the Director of the Department administering said project that the project has been completed and the monies are no longer required for said project.
- **SECTION 9.** That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

This ordinance enacts a new chapter of city code to promote pay equity by prohibiting the inquiry into and use of salary history information in the hiring process for job applicants. This ordinance also amends sections of City Code related to the enforcement of these provisions by the Community Relations Commission.

Requesting a job applicant's previous salary or earnings is a historically common practice that employers have used in the hiring practice to make determinations about hire and job offers. This practice has the unfortunate propensity to perpetuate historical inequities that women, especially women of color, face in the job market. Asking a worker about their salary history and relying upon that information when making a job offer can perpetuate any previous disadvantages that worker experienced in the market.

As of 2022, women who work full-time and year-round make \$0.84 for every dollar that men make. For Black women, that number is \$0.64. For Latina women, it is a staggering \$0.46. On average, women lose out on over \$400,000 over the course of a 40-year career due to the pay gap. For Black and Latina women, that number is closer to \$1,000,000. This means that the lack of pay equity contributes to both the wage gap and the wealth gap. Issues of pay equity are the result of both personal discrimination and systemic discrimination. Eliminating questions about salary history helps to address the systemic discrimination that women face.

The existing wage gap can be perpetuated when a historically underpaid worker is asked questions about her salary history and a subsequent job offer relies upon that information. A prohibition on salary history inquiries prevents employers from considering factors that unfairly contributed to a women's inequitable pay, rather than a job applicant's qualifications and capability for the role.

This ordinance establishes prohibitions on salary history inquiries for Columbus employers, placing enforcement of these provisions with the Community Relations Commission under its charge to eliminate discrimination and remove the effects of historical discrimination.

FISCAL IMPACT: No funding is required for this legislation.

To enact Chapter 2335; to amend sections 139.02 and 2301.05; and to repeal existing sections 139.02 and 2301.05 of Columbus City Codes, to promote pay equity in Columbus.

WHEREAS, women in Columbus face systemic challenges and discrimination in the job market including a wage gap; and

WHEREAS, women in 2022 made 84 cents for every dollar that a man made, and that number is much lower for Black and Latina women; and

WHEREAS, the wage gap contributes to the wealth gap, so that women lose out on hundreds of thousands of dollars over the course of their career as a result of systemic discrimination; and

WHEREAS, inquiries into a job applicant's salary history can perpetuate previous personal or systemic discrimination that the applicant experienced; and

WHEREAS, prohibitions on salary history inquiries have been shown to increase wages for all workers by as much as six percent in an area; and

WHEREAS, Columbus City Council seeks to promote pathways out of poverty and equitable systems for all residents of Columbus; **NOW**, **THEREFORE**,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 2335 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby enacted to read as follows:

<u>Chapter 2335 - PROHIBITED SALARY HISTORY INQUIRY AND USE 2335.01 - Definitions</u>

- (A) "Applicant" means any person applying for employment to be performed within the geographic boundaries of the City of Columbus, and whose application, in whole or in part, will be solicited, received, processed, or considered in the City of Columbus, regardless of whether the applicant is interviewed.
- (B) "Employer" means an individual, firm, limited liability company, partnership, association, labor organization, corporation, or any other entity whether or not organized for profit, that employs fifteen (15) or more persons on a qualifying wage, commission, or other compensation basis within the City of Columbus. "Employer" includes job placement and referral agencies and other employment agencies when such agencies operate on behalf of an entity that otherwise meets the definition of "Employer". "Employer" does not include any unit of local, state, or federal government, except the City of Columbus.
- (C) "Employment" means any occupation, vocation, job, or work, including but not limited to, temporary and seasonal work, part-time work, contracted work, contingent work, work on commission, and work through the services of a temporary or other employment agency for which the applicant is to receive wages or a salary. Employment does not include work as an independent contractor.
- (D) "Inquire" means to communicate any question or statement to an applicant, an applicant's current or prior employers, or a current or former employee or agent of the applicant's current or prior employers, in writing or otherwise, for the purpose of obtaining an applicant's salary history, or to conduct a search of publicly available records or reports for the purpose of obtaining an applicant's salary history, but does not include informing the applicant in writing or otherwise about the position's proposed or anticipated salary or salary range.

 (E) "Salary history" includes the applicant's current or prior wage, benefits, or other compensation. "Salary history" does not include any objective measure of the applicant's productivity such as revenue, sales, or other production reports.

2335.02 - Purpose

The purpose and intent of this chapter is to elevate the best practices for hiring that promote pay equity. The practices addressed in this chapter can, if used, perpetuate issues of systemic discrimination related to the wage gap and wealth gap for women, especially women of color. To promote pay equity across the workforce in the City of Columbus, the following prohibitions are established.

2335.03 - Unlawful discriminatory practices regarding the use of salary history.

- (A) Except as otherwise provided in division (B) of this section, an employer shall not do any of the following:
 - (1) Inquire about the salary history of an applicant for employment;
 - (2) Screen job applicants based on their current or prior wages, benefits, other compensation, or salary histories, including requiring that an applicant's prior wages, benefits, other compensation or salary history satisfy minimum or maximum criteria;
 - (3) Rely solely on the salary history of an applicant, except as provided in division (C) of this section, in deciding whether to offer employment to an applicant, or in determining the salary, benefits, or other compensation for such applicant during the hiring process, including the negotiation of an employment

contract;

- (4) Refuse to hire or otherwise disfavor, injure, or retaliate against an applicant for not disclosing salary history to an employer.
- (B) Notwithstanding division (A) of this section, an employer may, without inquiring about salary history, engage in discussion with the applicant about their expectations with respect to salary, benefits, and other compensation, including but not limited to unvested equity or deferred compensation that an applicant would forfeit by resigning from their current employer.
- (C) The prohibitions contained in this section shall not apply to any of the following:
 - (1) Any actions taken by an employer pursuant to any federal, state, or local law that specifically authorizes the reliance on salary history to determine an employee's compensation;
 - (2) Applicants for internal transfer or promotion with their current employer;
 - (3) A voluntary and unprompted disclosure of salary history information by an Applicant;
 - (4) Any attempt by an employer to verify an applicant's disclosure of non-salary related information or conduct a background check, provided that if such verification or background check discloses the applicant's salary history, such disclosure shall not be solely relied upon for purposes of determining the salary, benefits, or other compensation of such applicant during the hiring process, including the negotiation of a contract;
 - (5) Applicants who are re-hired by the employer within three years of the Applicant's most recent date of termination of employment by the Employer, provided that the employer already has past salary history data regarding the Applicant from the previous employment of Applicant;
 - (6) Employee positions for which salary, benefits, or other compensation are determined pursuant to procedures established by collective bargaining;
 - (7) Federal, state, and local governmental employers, other than the City of Columbus.

2335.04 - Complaint Procedure

An applicant may file a complaint with the Community Relations Commission under Section 2331.05(A) alleging that an employer has engaged in or is now engaging in any violations of section 2335.03.

2335.05 - Civil Penalties

<u>Upon an administrative finding of violation by the commission, an employer may be subject to civil penalties outlined in Section 2331.05(B).</u>

2335.06 - Severability

If any provision or section of this chapter or the enforcement of any such provision or section is held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect or render invalid or unenforceable any other provision or section of this chapter. To this end, each of the provisions and sections of this chapter are severable.

2335.07 - Effective Date

This Chapter shall take effect on March 1, 2024.

SECTION 2. That Section 139.02 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby amended as follows:

139.02 Duties.

The community relations commission is created and established under the Department of Neighborhoods to help eliminate discrimination or to remove the effects of past discrimination on both a personal and systemic level in the city of Columbus.

To advance these objectives the community relations commission may:

(a) Promote the development of mutual understanding and respect among all racial, religious, nationality,

- cultural and ethnic groups in the city of Columbus by making recommendations to city officials on means to prevent discriminatory practices against such groups.
- (b) Aid in seeing that no person is deprived of equal services by city government by reason of discrimination on account of race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability, familial status or military status.
- (c) Encourage, receive, investigate and evaluate from any person a claim of discrimination in accordance with section 2331 or section 2335 of the Columbus City Codes, and make public the procedures which a person may use to complain of discrimination.
- (d) Confer with the city attorney or designee on such complaints pertaining to the city of Columbus or criminal conduct as appear to require a legal process after initial investigation and/or failure to achieve conciliation.
- (e) Initiate and conduct or refer for mediation in situations in which the commission has reason to believe that discrimination may have occurred.
- (f) Engage a hearing officer to conduct administrative hearings.
- (g) Investigate upon request or initiate investigation of alleged discriminatory practices and make recommendations for corrective action and coordinate efforts toward their resolution.
- (h) Verify information relating to complaints of alleged discrimination practices.
- (i) Formulate, develop and disseminate programs of community information, educational materials, and reports which will assist in the elimination of prejudice, intolerance and discrimination or which promote good will and result in better human relations.
- (j) Coordinate with the city's equal employment officers, local employers, unions, and employment agencies to improve employment opportunities in city government for persons who have been the traditional targets of discrimination in employment.
- (k) Assist community groups and various social, service and benevolent organizations in the promotion of educational campaigns devoted to the elimination of group prejudices, racial or neighborhood tensions, and tolerance and discrimination.
- (l) Conduct research to ascertain the status and treatment of racial, religious, and ethnic groups in the city and the best means of progressively improving human relations in Columbus.
- (m) Cooperate with and render assistance to city government entities in the area of human rights.
- (n) Cooperate with and render assistance to county, state, federal and other governmental agencies in the area of discrimination.
- (o) Prepare and publish an annual report and other factual reports and recommendations as it deems necessary concerning problems relating to the discrimination, racial tensions and other human relations concerns. Copies of all such reports and recommendations shall be filed with the city council.
- (p) Contract with an entity not affiliated with the City of Columbus government to conduct investigations.

SECTION 3. That Section 2331.05 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby amended as follows: **2331.05 Complaint procedure.**

- (A) Whenever it is alleged in a complaint, in writing, by a person or aggrieved organization, hereinafter referenced to as "complainant," that any person, employer, employment agency, or labor organization, hereinafter referred to as the "respondent," has engaged in or is engaging in any unlawful discriminatory practices as defined in Title 23, Chapter 2331 and Chapter 2335 of the Columbus City Codes, or upon its own initiative, in matters relating to such discriminatory practices, the community relations commission staff may initiate a preliminary investigation. Such complaint shall be filed with the community relations commission within six (6) months after the alleged unlawful discriminatory practices are committed.
 - (1) If the community relations commission staff determines after such investigation, that there is no reasonable basis to believe that unlawful discriminatory practices have been or are being engaged in,

- staff may recommend to the community relations commission that the complaint be dismissed. If the commission approves, staff shall notify the complainant that it has so determined, and the complaint will be dismissed.
- (2) If the community relations commission staff determines, after such investigation, that there is a reasonable basis to believe that unlawful discriminatory practices have been or are being engaged in, they shall endeavor to eliminate such practices by informal methods of conference, conciliation, and persuasion.
 - (a) If after such investigation and conference the community relations commission staff is satisfied that any unlawful discriminatory practice of the respondent will be eliminated, staff may recommend to the community relations commission that it treat the complaint as conciliated. If the commission agrees, staff shall notify the complainant that the complaint will be dismissed.
 - (b) If the community relations commission staff fails to effect the elimination of such unlawful discriminatory practices or to obtain conciliation of the matter, or, if the circumstances warrant, in advance of or during any such preliminary investigation or endeavors to conciliate the matter, the community relations commission may refer the complaint to the City Prosecutor to evaluate for criminal prosecution. This subdivision shall not apply to complaints filed under Chapter 2335.
 - (c) If the community relations commission staff fails to effect the elimination of such unlawful discriminatory practices or to obtain conciliation of the matter and no referral to the City Prosecutor to evaluate for criminal prosecution is then pending, the community relations commission may direct staff to issue and cause to be served upon the respondent a notice of a finding of administrative violation and imposition of civil penalty. The notice shall notify the respondent of the right to request an administrative hearing before a hearing officer appointed by the community relations commission to contest the finding of administrative violation. Failure to request an administrative hearing within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the notice of violation shall constitute a waiver of the right to a hearing.
- (B) If a hearing officer is appointed, the hearing officer shall have the authority to:
 - (1) Conduct an administrative hearing;
 - (2) Provide to all the parties, witnesses, and the Community Relations Commission timely notice of the hearing date, time, and location;
 - (3) Direct the exchange of discovery;
 - (4) Set, change as necessary, and timely communicate to the parties such reasonable procedural rules as the hearing officer shall deem appropriate including:
 - (a) A member of the Community Relations Commission staff shall have the burden of going forward with the presentation of evidence. All parties shall have the right to appear and be heard in person, or by legal counsel, to present their case.
 - (b) All parties shall have the right to: offer and examine witnesses and present evidence in support of their case; cross examine adverse witnesses; and proffer evidence into the record if its admission has been denied.
 - (c) Testimony shall be given under oath.
 - (d) The hearing officer shall make recommendations on all matters of evidence. In so doing, the hearing officer is not strictly bound by the rules of evidence. The hearing officer may ask questions of any witness at any point in the proceedings and may set time and other limitations for each side in the presentation of evidence. A record of proceedings shall be kept. Parties seeking a stenographic record shall acquire such stenographic record at their own expense.
 - (5) Except as otherwise prescribed by law, the hearing officer shall submit to the Community Relations Commission a written report setting forth the hearing officer's findings of fact and conclusions of law and a recommendation of the action to be taken by the Commission.
 - (a) If the Hearing Officer finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that respondent did engage in,

- or continues to engage in, an unlawful discriminatory act or practice under this chapter as noticed in the finding of administrative violation, the Hearing Officer's report shall so indicate by recommending that the finding of violation be upheld.
- (b) If the Hearing Officer finds that the evidence presented failed to support the finding of violation, the Hearing Officer's report shall so indicate by recommending that the finding of administrative violation be overturned and the complaint dismissed.
- (c) The final report of the Hearing Officer may not include any orders for reinstatement of employment, refund of monies paid, other mitigation of damages, or any other orders for corrections or sanctions, except as provided in this section.
- (6) A copy of the Hearing Officer's written report and recommendation shall, within five days of the date of filing thereof, be served upon the respondent or respondent's attorney, by certified mail. The respondent may, within ten days of receipt of the copy of the written report or recommendation, file with the Community Relations Commission written objections to the report and recommendation, which objections shall be considered by the Community Relations Commission before approving, modifying, or disapproving the recommendation. The Community Relations Commission may grant extensions of time to the respondent within which to file such objections. No recommendation of the Hearing Officer shall be approved, modified, or disapproved by the Community Relations Commission until ten days after the service of the report and recommendation as provided in this section. The Community Relations Commission may order additional testimony to be taken or permit the introduction of further documentary evidence.
- (7) The Community Relations Commission, by majority vote, may approve, modify or disapprove the recommendation from the Hearing Officer by written decision which shall become effective upon service to the affected parties, unless otherwise stated in the Community Relation Commission's decision.
- (8) The final decision of the Community Relations Commission may be appealed pursuant to the provisions of R.C. Chapter 2506.

(B) Civil Penalties

- (1) Upon an administrative finding of violation by the commission, a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) may be imposed;
- (2) Upon an administrative finding of violation by the commission, if the violator has been found to have committed one violation of this Chapter during the five-year period immediately preceding the date on which a complaint was filed with the community relations commission, a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) may be imposed;
- (3) Upon an administrative finding of violation by the commission, if the violator has been found to have committed two or more violations of this Chapter during the five-year period immediately preceding the date on which a complaint was filed with the community relations commission, a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) may be imposed;
- (E) If a civil penalty has been imposed by the Community Relations Commission, and any portion thereof remains unpaid thirty days following receipt of service of the notice of finding of violation or, if an administrative hearing had been requested, thirty days following receipt of service of the final written decision of the Community Relations Commission, the City Attorney may institute civil enforcement proceedings against the respondent.

SECTION 4. That existing Sections 139.02 and 2331.05 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to execute a commitment letter, loan agreement, promissory note, mortgage, and/or restrictive covenant with individual homebuyers who access the Department of Development's American Dream Downpayment Assistance (ADDI) program using non-federal funds.

The Department of Development provides down payment assistance using federal HOME funds to first time homebuyers whose household income is at or below 80% AMI for the purchase of a home in the City of Columbus. The amount of assistance provided is the lesser of 6% of the purchase price or \$7,500.00 and is provided as a forgivable loan. The household must remain in the home for a period of five years for the loan to be forgiven.

In addition to HOME funds for this program, the Department of Development is expanding the program to use non-federal funds in order allow for applicants up to 120% AMI. The use of non-federal funds also reduces the time it takes to review/approve an application as specific HUD required documents are not needed. These funds would be in the form of a loan and the household must remain in the home for a period of five years in order for the loan to be forgiven.

Ordinance 2768-2022, approved by Columbus City Council on November 7, 2022, authorized the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a non-for-profit service contract with the Tony R. Wells Foundation to act as the fiscal manager of the non-federal ADDI funds and dispense the funds as directed by the City.

This ordinance is a companion piece to Ordinance 2768-2022 in that this ordinance will authorize the director to execute the necessary documents for the non-federally funded ADDI program.

Emergency action is requested in order to allow those seeking down payment assistance to obtain it in a timely manner and maintain their closing schedules.

Fiscal Impact: no funding is needed for this ordinance.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to execute a commitment letter, loan agreement, promissory note, mortgage and restrictive covenant with first time homebuyers who receive affordability assistance through the Department of Development's Homeownership Program.

Type:

The Department of Development's Homeownership Program works with housing development partners (e.g. Homeport) by providing financial support to construct single family homes in Columbus for low and moderate income homebuyers. The agreement with these partners allows for the city to support the construction of the home, provide affordability assistance to the homebuyer, or a combination of both.

When affordability assistance is provided to the homebuyer through this partnership, the housing development partner provides this funding at closing. This funding, along with other sources, allows the homebuyer to buy their home. The transaction of affordability assistance is memorialized in loan documents between the City, acting through the Director of the Department of Development, and the homebuyer, even though the funds come from the housing development partner. No additional city funds are encumbered for this loan for affordability assistance.

The loan is a forgivable loan if the homebuyer maintains the property as their primary residence for the required

number of years. If they sell the home before the affordability period has been met, the mortgage and restrictive covenant are enforced and the amount of the loan is paid to the City from the proceeds of the sale.

Emergency action is requested in order to allow those seeking affordability assistance to obtain it in a timely manner and maintain their closing schedule.

Fiscal Impact: no funding is needed for this ordinance.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to execute a commitment letter, loan agreement, promissory note, mortgage and restrictive covenant with low and moderate income homebuyers who receive affordability assistance through the Department of Development's Homeownership Program; and to declare an emergency. (\$0.00)




