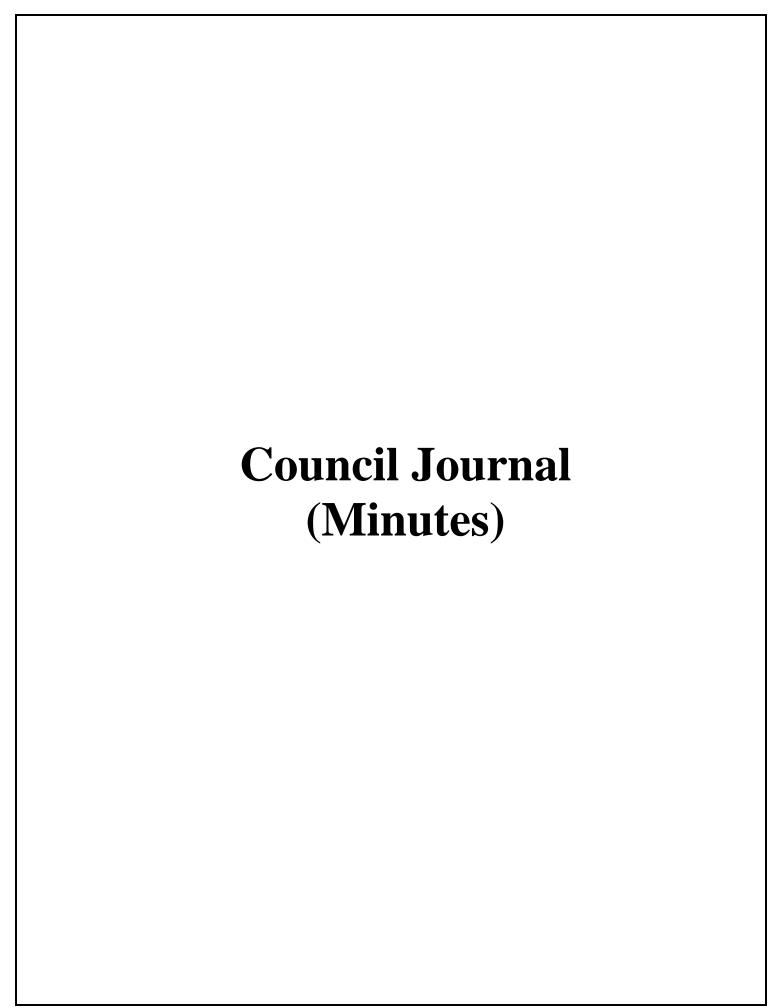


SIGNING OF LEGISLATION

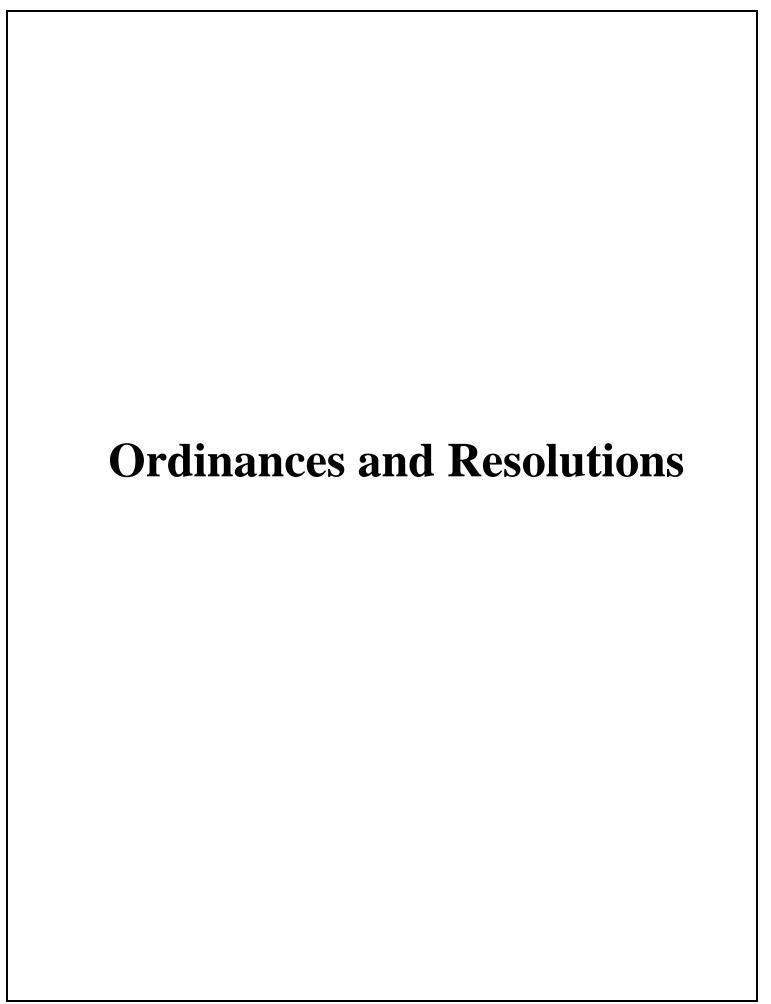

1.2 Reasons additional goods/services could not be foreseen:

When Task 2 was authorized, it was identified that the project had a \$50,000 shortfall in funding, so R/W Plans were moved to "If-Authorized" so the immediately necessary work could proceed. Stage 1 comments led to the need for additional work that has already been authorized including: a)SUL-A's to be performed (in the amount of approximately \$20,000), and b) the addition of Water Works Plans (in the amount of approximately \$20,000) for waterline relocations.

1.3 Reason other procurement processes are not used:

Dynotec is prime consultant on the Tussing Road SUP Project. The amount being requested is for the consultant and project team to perform the following services: a) R/W Plan development, b) temporary R/W staking, c) setting R/W pins after construction, d) pedestrian signal upgrades, and e) on-going services during bidding & construction. All of these services are integrally related to the design process for which they are currently tasked.

1.4 How cost of modification was determined:

Dynotec and subconsultants provided a cost breakdown for each task included in the scope. After several

negotiations, the final fee was determined to be in line with what is expected for the scope of work and the design timeline. Costs were also compared to other recent design project of similar scope and magnitude.

Searches in the System for Award Management (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery list (State) produced no findings against Dynotec, Inc.

(OSUP) provides outpatient care throughout Central Ohio and are the approved practice plan for The Ohio State University College of Medicine designated by the University Board of Trustees. Ohio State University Physicians, Inc. contractor compliance number is CC-005200.

Columbus Public Health has a need for physician services specializing in infectious disease, maternal-child health, and emergency preparedness/outbreak response including infectious disease consultation and other coverage as needed for our Sexual Health and Wellness Center.

There is an immediate need for the continuation of physician services to allow for expedited consultation and direct admit of patients to The Ohio State University Medical Center for patients of CPH Clinics. For this

reason, it is requested that the competitive bidding provisions outlined in Chapter 329.18 of the Columbus City Code be waived for this contract.

These training requirements can be found in Ohio Revised Code Section 109.802. Ordinance No. 0087-2008, passed on February 4, 2008, authorized the Public Safety Director to participate in the state-funded continuing professional training reimbursement program. The Division of Police complied with this mandate and has received consistent reimbursements from 2008 through 2018. Additional funds were received in 2023 for mandated training to be held in 2024. State law mandates that these funds be kept in a separate account and be used only to pay the costs of Continuing Professional Training programs.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: N/A

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: Emergency legislation is requested so that the appropriation may be in place to fund immediate training needs for Police officers. The Division of Police will need funds as soon as possible for training needs by Police Officers. Also, some of these requests are for mandatory training.

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to modify an existing contract with Advanced Engineering Consultants, LTD to provide professional services associated with the HVAC Upgrades 2020-2022 - Design Project. The modification amount being authorized by this ordinance is \$44,615.73.

The Recreation and Parks Department is responsible for the operation of forty-six City of Columbus buildings which contain mechanical HVAC systems. These buildings include community centers, athletic complexes, golf course clubhouses, and cultural arts centers. Many of these systems are failing and at the end of usability. This project will replace air handlers, boilers, condensers, furnace units, fans, ductwork, and associated systems that are identified as failure critical and in poor condition.

This second modification of the design contract will add replacement of HVAC control systems to Cleo Dumaree Athletic Complex and the Franklin Park Adventure Center. The controls in these facilities are failing and should be upgraded as part of this equipment upgrade project. This additional project scope overlaps with work currently underway by Advanced Engineering Consultants, LTD which would yield significant efficiencies.

It was not anticipated at the time this contract was started that the building automation systems at these facilities were going to fail. However, with HVAC projects being undertaken at these locations in the original contract, Advanced Engineering Consultants, LTD is positioned to deliver the additional work in a manner that will not affect the already established completion date. The rates established in the existing contract were used to establish the costs for this modification.

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to enter into a grant agreement with the Ohio Department of Natural Resource (ODNR) for the Olentangy Trail - Northmoor Park to Clinton Como Park Project. This ordinance will also authorize the appropriation of the grant and matching funds. The grant amount is \$435,000.00 and the local match amount is \$145,000.00. There is a total of \$580,000.00 available for this project being authorized by this ordinance.

The Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) accepted the Recreation and Parks application for the Clean Ohio program. The Clean Ohio grant is a reimbursable grant that supports projects for the construction of new trails or connector-trail development. In March of 2023, Recreation and Parks applied for Clean Ohio Trail Funds to be put towards construction funds for the project, Ordinance 0751-2023.

This project will complete this final trail gap by constructing a crossing of the Olentangy River at Northmoor Park and travel along the west bank of the river. At North Broadway, the trail will use a new, fully functional bike and pedestrian crosswalk with signal. To accommodate the increase of overall Olentangy Trail use, the new pavement will be 12 feet to 14 feet wide. This is being constructed as part of the North Broadway and 315 interchange improvements for the new Ohio Health campus. The trail then continues south and crosses the river to Clinton Como Park, where it rejoins the existing trail. The Olentangy Trail is Central Ohio's most used greenway trail. Recent trail count data shows over 1 million users per year travel on this path.

The consultant will continue to help with cost of service study updates, cost allocation plans, user fee studies, financial research, and more. The consultant will review all fees and charges and recommend changes based on cost of service results or other calculations, and recommend the implementation of new fees if appropriate. These fees and charges may include, but are not limited to, meter service fees, system capacity fees, backflow fees, tampering/theft fees, front footage connection charges, and other permit fees.

PROCUREMENT:

The Department of Public Utilities (DPU) solicited competitive bids through the Vendor Services and Bonfire websites from February 15, 2023 to March 17, 2023 for general financial services in accordance with the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of City Code (RFQ024033). One (1) bid, by a majority vendor, was received. The bid was deemed responsive and was evaluated on March 20, 2023. The committee recommended that Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. be awarded the contract. The committee determined their proposal was strong because it demonstrated a full understanding of the scope of work and met the requirements of the RFP, and due to their strong project team with clear roles and responsibilities.

The term of the contract was for one-year with two renewal options, with the original contract authorized by Ordinance 1230-2023. For each year of the contract, funding is contingent on availability within the budget, mutual agreement between the parties, approval of City Council, and certification of funds by the City Auditor.

This ordinance authorizes the first renewal option for the second year of the contract and is being submitted in accordance with the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of City Code.

1. BACKGROUND

From time to time, various parcels of land are deeded to the City of Columbus for public street and/or alley purposes. One such example when this occurs is streets included in the Columbus Thoroughfare Plan. Streets listed within the Plan have a pre-defined amount of required right-of-way. If that right-of-way width is lacking for a particular property, then the additional right-of-way must be deeded to the City when that property is sold or is being redeveloped. Another example is when developers install sidewalks, turn lanes, etc., on a property within the public right-of-way. The City requires such improvements to be located entirely within the public right-of-way. If any part of such improvements are outside of the public right-of-way, the developer must deed that part of the land to the City. Many of the deeded amounts are for very small pieces of land. All of the deeded land transactions go through the City Attorney's Office.

The Department of Public Service maintains a list of the deeded land and periodically submits the list to City Council for acceptance of the deeded land. Ohio Revised Code Chapter 723.03 requires that property proposed for use as a public street or alley must be accepted and dedicated as public right-of-way by an ordinance specifically passed for such purpose. This Ordinance provides for the City to accept deeds for various parcels

of real property, to dedicate the parcels as road right-of-way, and to name the parcels as public roadways to comply with Ohio Revised Code Chapter 723.03. Passage of this Ordinance also exempts the property deeded to the City from property taxes.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

There is no expenditure associated with this Ordinance.

The Fire Division's Distance Learning project was implemented to provide remote training in all fire stations via computer network. A computer-based training content provider is used to continue to provide and implement training, scheduling, and logging of employee training history, as well as software updates and support for the Fire Division.

Columbus Fire contracts with TargetSolutions Learning, LLC to deliver online Fire and EMS continuing education, under the parent company Vector Learning. Target Solutions is expandable and customizable, offering credentials tracking for many different specialties including DART, Haz-Mat, FAO, Investigator, Professional Standards, and ARFF training. TargetSolutions can track and notify members plus add informative videos to help fire personnel members meet their fitness and nutrition goals, and is also being used to track performance measures and identify training deficiencies. All Columbus Fire members are required by state law and the city to maintain the Firefighter, Fire Inspector, and EMS credentials. Columbus Fire has been using the TargetSolutions training platform since 2008, and is not currently seeking a alternative to the current solution; the Fire Division has built out credentials for Recruit, Apprentice, EMS Officer, and In-Service Training on a platform that is available 24/7 to fire personnel from any computer or portable device.

1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Service to modify the existing Amended and Restated City of Columbus Bike Share Agreement with Lyft Bikes and Scooters, LLC ("Lyft") to support the continued operation of CoGo Bike Share.

The City of Columbus has provided financial support to CoGo Bike Share since its inception.

Ordinance 2241-2012 authorized the execution of the City of Columbus Bike Share Agreement, between the Department of Recreation and Parks and Alta Bicycle Share, Inc., to facilitate the development, installation, operation, and management of a public bike share system, which launched on July 30, 2013, with 30 stations and 300 bikes. Since that time, CoGo Bike Share has grown to 88 stations and more than 600 bikes throughout the City, offering a low-cost option for alternative transit and personal recreation resulting in more than 50,000 rides annually.

Ordinance 0950-2023 authorized the execution of the Second Modification to the Amended and Restated City of Columbus Bike Share Agreement between the Department of Public Service, which assumed responsibility for supporting CoGo Bike Share from the Department of Recreation and Parks pursuant to that legislation, and Lyft.

Ordinance 2048-2023 authorized the execution of the Third Modification to the Amended and Restated City of Columbus Bike Share Agreement between the Department of Public Service and Lyft to provide financial support to CoGo Bike Share through the end of 2023.

The purpose of this legislation is to fund the ongoing operation of that program through at least the first half of 2024. This ordinance is being submitted in accordance with relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of City Code pertaining to contract modifications.

Amount of additional funds to be expended:

The total amount of additional funding needed for the proposed contract modification is \$600,000.00, which will sustain operations through the first half of 2024.

Reason additional goods/services could not be foreseen:

The Department of Public Service expected to have modify the existing Amended and Restated City of Columbus Bike Share Agreement with Lyft periodically after assuming responsibility for supporting CoGo Bike Share.

Reason other procurement processes are not used:

It is more cost effective for the Department of Public Service to continue to allow Lyft to oversee the operation of CoGo Bike Share through the end of the current contract term.

How cost of modification was determined:

The funding needed to support the proposed contract modification was calculated based on the current monthly operational costs for the CoGo Bike Share program attributable to the City.

Emergency action is requested for this contract in order to ensure Columbus has an uninterrupted continuation of harm reduction program services to save lives.

FISCAL IMPACT: The funds (\$350,000.00) for this contract with Equitas Health are budgeted within the Health Department Special Revenue Fund contingent on the approval of Ordinance No. 3012-2023.


