


SIGNING OF LEGISLATION



This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a contract with Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. for operational review and strategic planning consulting services. The consultant will continue a comprehensive operational review and help in the development of a strategic plan.

The Department of Public Utilities (DPU) consists of its Director's Office, which houses sections such as human resources and fiscal, among others, as well as the Divisions of Water, Sewerage and Drainage, Power and Stormwater. In total, DPU employs just over 1,000 full-time equivalent employees. The Department serves a population of approximately 1.2 million through the operation of three water and two waste water treatment plants and maintenance of approximately 3,600 miles of waterline and 4,600 miles of sewers. The Division of Power purchases and distributes power to approximately 17,000 customers and maintains approximately 57,000 streetlights. The Department's 2023 operating budget, comprised of the enterprise funds for each of the four divisions, is over \$750 million and it also has a 6-year capital improvement plan of over \$3 billion. The Department's budget request submitted for fiscal year 2024 is over \$828 million.

The first phase of this project included launching and managing the project, stakeholder engagement, and an effective utility management (EUM) 360 scan, which established a baseline of performance against various attributes of effective utility management. Phase two moved from the operational review to the strategic plan phase, and focused on tasks leading to its final development. This last phase will finalize the strategic plan development and move towards implementation.

PROCUREMENT:

The project was formally advertised (RFQ023079) on the Vendor Services and Bonfire websites from October 6, 2022 to November 4, 2022 in accordance with the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of Columbus City Code. The city received six (6) responses. All proposals were deemed responsive and were fully evaluated when the

Evaluation Committee met on November 16, 2022. The committee recommended that the contract be awarded to Raftelis Financial Consultants Inc.

The original contract was for one (1) year from the date of execution, with the option to renew for an additional two (2) years on a year-to-year basis, or a portion thereof, based upon mutual agreement of the parties, availability of funding, and approval by Columbus City Council. The original authorizing ordinance was ordinance 3470-2022. It did not automatically renew and future contract modifications were anticipated. A second ordinance, 1479-2023, authorized funding for the second renewal option to cover phases 4-6. That ordinance, in error, did not extend the time period of the contract so it expired. As such, it is in the best interest of the City to waive the provisions of competitive bidding and enter into a contract with Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. to provide funding for the final phase and tasks 7-8 of the overall project.

BACKGROUND:

This ordinance authorizes the transfer of \$490,000 from the general fund to the specialty docket program. The Specialized Docket consists of five programs that address drug and alcohol addiction, heroin addiction, mental health issues, and the special needs of human trafficking victims and veterans.

The Court operates five specialized dockets, which have been certified or are in the process of receiving certification from the Supreme Court of Ohio Commission on Specialized Dockets. Each docket has received certification after submitting written materials and undergoing a site review to ensure that statewide minimum standards are met. The Specialized Dockets hold criminal offenders accountable while linking them with comprehensive treatment and services, which reduces recidivism and increases community safety.

In April 2004, the Mental Health Program was created to better serve criminal defendants who are impacted by severe mental illness and who have pending cases before the Court.

In 2009, the Changing Actions to Change Habits (CATCH) program was created to better serve criminal defendants who have been charged with misdemeanor solicitation, prostitution, and/or loitering to solicit. The docket also serves people convicted of other crimes that were committed while the participant was a victim of human trafficking. Participants may have severe depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, or other mental illnesses and may be dependent on alcohol and/or drugs. Because many of the participants have been the victims of human trafficking, CATCH focuses on the trauma experienced by participants.

In 2009, the Alcohol and Drug Addiction Program (ADAP) was created to better serve criminal defendants who are dependent on drugs and/or alcohol and who have pending legal issues before the Court. In 2010, the Opiate Extension Program (ADAP-OEP) was developed to accompany ADAP but address the needs of criminal defendants who are dependent on opiates.

In 2012, the Military and Veteran Service Specialized Docket (MAVS) was created to better serve criminal defendants who have severe mental illness, chemical dependency, and criminogenic factors, all of which impact their ability to access and navigate services afforded to them because of their military involvement after they are charged with a misdemeanor offense.

The overall goal of each program is to decrease the number of jail nights and new summons that participants receive by diverting them to clinically appropriate treatment options and helping them to stabilize other basic factors in their lives, such as housing, employment, and education. The specialized dockets are designed to provide intensive supervision to program participants through a collaborative team process.

Funds are to be used to assist in the support of the Specialty Docket. The intent of these funds is to provide for personnel costs and the purchase of materials, supplies, and services.

FISCAL IMPACT: The funds are available for transfer in the 2023 general fund budget. This ordinance is

The site consists of one parcel developed with an automotive repair shop and accessory automotive parts sales in the ARLD, Apartment Residential District, as permitted by Ordinance #1061-81 (CV81-016), passed June 8, 1981. The requested Council variance will allow the continuance of the automotive repair and automotive parts sales uses, while also allowing automotive sales. BID INFORMATION: Request for Quotation RFQ025674 was advertised and proposals were opened September 21, 2023. Two (2) responses were received.

An evaluation committee consisting of five (5) representatives from the Department of Finance and Management. Each member of the committee scored and ranked the proposals. All offers and cost proposals were evaluated in compliance with Columbus City Code 329, the committee submitted final rankings.

WEX Bank dba Wright Express FSC received the highest score, 88.4 out of 100 points. The selected Offeror provides Retail Fleet Fuel Credit Card Services.

The request for purchase of Retail Fleet Fuel Credit Card Services used the best value competitive sealed proposal process to award the supplier that provided the relevant criteria specifically listed in the BVP and the lowest cost.

In accordance with the Committee recommendations, the Purchasing Office recommends the award to:

WEX Bank dba Wright Express FSC, CC# 010506, expires 1/19/2026, All Items, \$1.00 Total Estimated Annual Expenditure: \$5,000,000, Division of Fleet Management

The Affordable Housing Trust for Columbus and Franklin County (Housing Trust) combines public and private funding through a variety of sources to support the development of housing within the City. Both rental units and homeownership projects are developed.

In 2024, the City will commit its annual contribution of the hotel/motel/short-term rental tax receipts to the Housing Trust at an estimated \$2,317,000.00 or whatever greater or lesser sum of money may be received through the portion of the Hotel/Motel/Short-Term Rental Excise Tax fund allocated to the Housing Trust. The amount is based on 0.43% in relation to the 5.1% combined rate.

This legislation is presented as an emergency because of the need to continue program services without interruption.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding is estimated to be available in Fund 2231. Payments will be made to the Housing Trust by the Auditor's Office on a monthly basis, up to the amount available in the fund, which in total may be more or less than the estimated amount of \$2,317,000.00. Funding is contingent up passage of Ordinance 3011-2023.

To authorize the Director of the Development Department to enter into a Not for Profit Service Contract with the Affordable Housing Trust for Columbus and Franklin County to facilitate the production of affordable housing and enhance home ownership opportunities in Columbus; to authorize the expenditure of 0.43% of the combined rates of 5.1% of the Hotel/Motel/Short-Term Rental Excise Tax (presently estimated at \$2,317,000.00); and to declare an emergency. (\$2,317,000.00)

WHEREAS, Mayor Coleman commissioned a Columbus Housing Task Force in May 2000 to design the City's first housing trust fund and to recommend a structure whereby a Affordable Housing Trust for Columbus and Franklin County could facilitate the production of housing in Columbus; and


