BACKGROUND:

This legislation will authorize the Director of the Department of Technology, on behalf of the Columbus Public Health Department, to modify and renew an annual contract for NextGen software license renewal, support and related services, provided by Mount Carmel Health Systems. The original contract (EL003835) was authorized by ordinance 2587-2003 on December 1, 2003. The contract was most recently renewed by authority of ordinance 0115-2011 (purchase order EL011480). This renewal will provide another year of service for the period April 1, 2012 to March 31, 2013, at a cost of \$166,503.00.

The NextGen system enables Columbus Public Health to operate five major clinical operations, which provide an extensive array of services. The software enables patient registration, appointment scheduling, monitoring and tracking of patient test results, creation and processing of electronic medical records, and generation of reports to help manage clinic operations.

This year's (2012) annual renewal amount of \$151,210.80 was modified and increased by \$15,292.20 to add remote scan licenses related to imaging systems and to accommodate for interface programming costs related to additional functionality in the NextGen software; making the grand total to be \$166,503.00. This need for additional goods/services could not be foreseen because they were not needed at the time the contract was established. This product would be manifestly impractical to bid because changing providers would require a major long-term effort, disrupting a revenue-producing process and doubling the annual cost. The Columbus Public Health Department negotiated the services needed, along with the monthly and annual costs with Mount Carmel Health Systems.

As an authorized NextGen reseller, Mount Carmel Health Systems was awarded a contract by authority of ordinance 2587-2003, following repeal of ordinance 1843-2003, which was submitted pursuant to competitive bidding for procurement of the NextGen clinical management solution. Mount Carmel, who did not bid in response to the solicitation, was awarded the contract because it could offer the NextGen solution at \$190,000 less than the lowest bidder. Since that time, the City has continued to utilize Mount Carmel to provide upgrades and software license support, as well as customizing the NextGen application to meet unique needs of the Public Health Department. Migrating the data and customizations from Mount Carmel to another vendor would be a long-term costly effort that would not be in the best interests of the City at this time. Consequently, this ordinance requests waiver of competitive bidding requirements of Columbus City Code, Chapter 329.

EMERGENCY:

Emergency legislation is requested in order to avoid interruption of services for the Next Gen software, which supports Columbus Public Health.

FISCAL IMPACT:

During fiscal year 2010 and 2011, \$144,864.00 and \$149,866.80 was legislated respectively for software license support and related services for the Next Gen system from Mount Carmel Health Systems. Funding for the 2012-2013 contract renewal and modification in the amount of \$166,503.00 is budgeted and available within the Department of Technology, internal services fund; bringing the aggregate contract total, including this request, to \$1,025,722.65.

BACKGROUND: The City of Columbus has been awarded a Federal Fiscal Year 2011 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Award from the Bureau of Justice Assistance, Office of Justice Programs via the Franklin County Office of Homeland Security and Justice Programs. The JAG program provides funding to allow states and local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and improve the criminal justice system. The total FY11 JAG award amount to the City of Columbus is \$325,872.90. Although the grant awarded \$225,872.90 under the purpose area of technology improvements for updates, maintenance, and service to the Division of Police's Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS), the Department of Public Safety may request a change in program allocation from the grantor. The remaining \$100,000.00 is awarded as partial funding for a joint Franklin County and City of Columbus collaborative project for staffing for an area Re-entry Program. The county will have all the fiscal responsibilities for the Re-entry Project funding. The City must act as subgrantee to the Franklin County Office of Homeland Security and Justice Programs. Therefore, the Mayor is required to sign a subgrantee award on behalf of the City. The official City program contact authorized to act in connection with the AFIS Project is Technical Services Bureau AFIS Manager, William Hannah. Staff in the City Safety Director's Office will be the primary contact for the Re-entry Program portion of this FY11 JAG grant.

Emergency Designation: Emergency legislation is necessary to meet grant deadlines and to make the funds available at the earliest possible time. The grant award period start date is January 1, 2012.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact on the General Fund. All appropriated funds will be reimbursed by the grant award.

WHEREAS, emergency legislation is needed to meet the grant deadlines and to make grant funds available at the earliest possible time because the grant award period start date is January 1, 2012; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual and daily operation of the Division of Police, Department of Public Safety, in that it is immediately necessary to accept and appropriate the \$225,872.90 amount of the FY11 Justice Assistance Grant award for the Columbus Division of Police Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) Project or other projects to be identified later for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, property, safety and welfare, now, therefore

The Municipal Court Judges have been provided funding from the Public Safety Initiatives Fund in order to continue services for the Specialty Docket Programs. This legislation authorizes a transfer of \$380,000. The Specialty Docket consists of three programs, the Solicitation Program, the Addiction Program and the Military and Veteran's Court Program. The Solicitation Program Specialty Docket, Changing Actions To Change Habits (CATCH Program), is intended to provide a mechanism to promote effective treatment as an alternative to incarceration for a person whose multiple solicitation arrests, summons and charges have negatively impacted the person's quality of life and community safety. Many of these individuals have a history of multiple arrests, criminal behavior, drug addiction, poverty and being victimized as a result of soliciting. The CATCH Program requires limited court involvement in treatment planning and compliance, which should result in more effective utilization of other court and county resources.

The Addiction Program Specialty Docket (APSD) provides a mechanism to promote effective treatment as an alternative to incarceration for a person whose arrests, summons and charges are associated with alcohol and/or chemical dependence (AOD), which negatively impact the person's quality of life and community safety. Many of these individuals have a history of multiple arrests, typically OMVI, criminal behavior, drug addiction, poverty and transient housing. The APSD requires limited court involvement in treatment planning and compliance, which should result in more effective utilization of other county and court resources.

The Military and Veteran Specialty Docket is intended to promote effective treatment as an alternative to incarceration for people whose criminal charges may be directly or indirectly connected to military service or combat. The arrests, summons, and charges obtained by these individuals have a negative impact on their quality of life and the safety of the community. Many of these individuals will have suffered from drug addiction, poverty, and a lack of community support. The Military and Veteran Service Specialty Docket Program requires limited court involvement in treatment planning and compliance, which should result in more effective utilization of other court and county resources.

FISCAL IMPACT: To authorize appropriation of \$380,000 to the Public Safety Initiatives Fund and to transfer cash totaling \$380,000 from the Public Safety Initiative Fund to the Municipal Court's Specialty Docket Program. No additional appropriation is needed in the Municipal Court's Specialty Docket Program at this time.

EMERGENCY: Emergency action is requested to continue funding of the program without interruption.

To authorize the appropriation of \$380,000.00 from the Public Safety Initiative Fund; to authorized the City Auditor to transfer said funds from the Public Safety Initiative Fund to the Municipal Court's Specialty Docket Program Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$380,000.00)

This company is not debarred according to the Federal excluded parties listing or prohibited from being awarded a contract according to the Auditor of State unresolved findings for recovery certified search.

This section does not allow for a Universal Term Contracts (UTC) to be established through an RFP process. It is in the best interest of the city to establish a UTC for these services so that various city agencies can use the contract as needed. This is being submitted as non-emergency waiver legislation to waive the regulations and to accept the proposal submitted by the highest ranked offeror and establish a Universal Term Contract.

An evaluation team of five evaluated, ranked and rated the proposals. The Purchasing Office is recommending award of one contract to the highest ranked offeror.

Joyce Avenue will be reconstructed from just north of East Hudson Street to just north of Kenmore Avenue. East Hudson Street will be milled and paved from where the reconstruction ends to just west of Parkwood Avenue. Total length of reconstructed roadway (Hudson and Joyce) will be approximately 0.55 miles. 0.7 miles of 8 foot wide shared use path, 0.7 miles of 5 foot wide sidewalk, and 1.3 miles of curbing will also be installed. 42 ADA ramps will also be added or reconstructed in this project.

A water line, a storm sewer system and a detention basin will also be part of this project. Storm sewers will be installed on East Hudson Street from Dresden Street to Cleveland Avenue. This portion of the street will also be milled and overlaid. Storm sewer installation will also be included along Bancroft Street for 1,316 feet from East Hudson Street due north, Briarwood Avenue, Republic Avenue, Bremen Street and Linden Avenue.

The existing ditch (East Drainage Ditch) located west of Bancroft Street will be regraded over a length of 1,085 feet due north from East Hudson Street. Landscaping (trees) will also part of this project.

There are a number of bus transit routes within the limits of this project: COTA Routes No. 81 (along East Hudson Street and Joyce Avenue), No.74 (along East Hudson Street west of Cleveland Avenue), No. 1, 27,35,37,40 (along Cleveland Avenue).

Pedestrian generators and destinations impacting the proposed project include residents walking to the bus stops, and to Hudson Market and the various small businesses along East Hudson Street. Duxberry School of Arts located along Duxberry Road generates pedestrian traffic as well as industries along Joyce Avenue south of East Hudson Street.

Pedestrian Quality of Service analyses show a marked improvement due to features of this project such as sidewalk, ADA curb ramps, shared use path, new traffic signal, upgrades at the intersections, added left turn lanes, tree lawn.

The estimated Notice to Proceed date is March 26, 2012. The project was let by the Office of Support Services through Vendor Services and Bid Express. 6 bids were received on February 9, 2012 (6 majority) and

The Purchasing Office advertised and solicited competitive bids in accordance with Section 329.06 (Solicitation No. SA00004207). Fifty Nine (59) bids were solicited; Five (5) bids were received. The specifications asked the bidders to provide a dollar amount over triple net dealer invoicing.

The Purchasing Office respectfully asks for a waiver of the competitive bidding requirements of Section 329 because all bidders took exceptions to various clauses of the bid specifications. All bidders made various changes to the warranty provisions of the bid. Some vendors, including the low bidder, Byers Ford, took exception to picking up and delivering the vehicles to the repair location for warranty work. The Purchasing Office in conjunction with the Fleet Management Division believes it is in the best interests of the City to accept these exceptions. The subject property contains 2 buildings and currently is vacant. The surrounding area is fully developed and consists of commercial/residential uses to the east, south and west and residential uses to the north.

C. Proposed Use:

The proposed use of the subject property is as a parking lot serving employees and clients of the property management services office.

D. Transportation and Circulation:

Access will be as shown on the Site Plan. No direct access will be permitted to East Broad Street.

E. Visual Form of the Environment:

The subject property will be developed to complement the existing facilities owned and operated by Applicant and its affiliates to the west. The subject property is contained within the Near East Area District and the development plans will be reviewed by the Near East Area Commission to ensure aesthetics of the development complement existing development.

F. View and Visibility:

Consideration has been given to the visibility and safety of motorists and pedestrians during the planning of development of the subject property and the location of access points.

G. Behavior Patterns:

The proposed improvements will service the existing neighboring development.

H. Emissions:

Emissions from the subject property will not substantially affect the environment of the surrounding neighborhoods.

5. VARIANCES:

A. Minimum Soil Area around Trees. Columbus City Code §3312.21(A)(2) contains a requirement that each tree be surrounded by a minimum radius of four feet of soil area. The minimum radius of soil around each tree shall be as set forth on the Site Plan.

B. Front, Rear and Side Setback Requirements: Columbus City Code §3361.04 requires a minimum twenty-five foot setback unless otherwise specified and made a part of the rezoning ordinance. The parking setback along the north and west property lines shall be zero. The parking setback line shall be a minimum of 10 feet from the East Broad Street right-of-way. The parking setback line shall be a minimum of 5 feet from the Miami Avenue right-of-way.

C. Landscaping, Screening and Fencing Requirements: Columbus City Code §3371.01 contains certain landscaping, screening and fencing requirements. The landscaping, screening and fencing requirements for the subject property shall be as set forth on the Site Plan.

Negotiating contract terms and power pricing with more than one provider should allow the City to secure the best contract available.

The Department of Public Utilities will request proposals from potential suppliers and will negotiate contract terms and conditions with suppliers deemed to have submitted responsive proposals. This process will allow department staff to compare proposals and terms in order to select the best purchase power contract for the Division of Power and Water.

The existing purchase power contract is in effect until May 31, 2014. The new proposal would provide power through December 31, 2016. It is in our customer's best interest to obtain stable prices in advance and it would be beneficial to secure power for these years at this time. Wholesale electric prices are currently driven by the volatile and escalating prices for natural gas and coal that are used to generate electricity. It is also adjusting to restructuring/deregulation by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and state public utility commissions in an effort to increase competition. These factors have created a seller's market for power producers and a change in the market dynamics. This wholesale power market environment warrants authorizing the Director of Public Utilities to negotiate contract terms with more than one potential supplier.

This ordinance is requested to be an emergency measure to allow contract negotiations to begin at the earliest possible date.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is an expenditure of \$1.00 associated with this ordinance to allow the Director of Public Utilities the

authority to enter into a contractual agreement for the purpose of locking down a firm fixed price for the supply of power. It is anticipated that the contract will have a multi year term beginning June 1, 2014. Ordinances will be submitted yearly to fund any planned phases of the contract.

To authorize the Director of Public Utilities to negotiate and enter into a contract for purchase power, to waive provisions of Columbus City Code relating to award of contracts through the request for proposal process, to authorize the expenditure of \$1.00 from the Electricity Operating Fund; and to declare an emergency. This program is administered by the Department of Development, Code Enforcement Division. These nineteen vendors were not only selected on their competitive hourly rates, but the selection was also based on their bid packet completion and/or their past performance and experience in the program. Of the nineteen vendors selected, three vendors are new to the program.

The eight (*Community-group*) associations and organizations do not formally submit a bid packet and are paid an equal hourly rate for their equipment and labor. Their hourly rates are based on the average hourly rates of the (*City-wide*) vendors that receive an award. The (*Community-group*) organizations are also involved in cutting and maintaining street islands, medians and mini-parks throughout the City.

Emergency action is required so these services can be available at the beginning of the season.

FISCAL IMPACT: The 2012 Budget includes funding for this service.

- Department of Public Safety, Division of Fire - increases the general fund sanctioned part-time strength by one (1) to accommodate the addition of an EMS instructor as part of civilianization efforts.

Both properties (see attached maps) are actively farmed. The ORC requires that the City hold a hearing to consider the designation within 30 days of receiving an application. A hearing was held on February 21, 2012 at which at which there was no opposition to the applications. The ORC further requires that City Council act on the application within 30 days of the hearing. These applications would renew existing designations, established through Franklin County. The Administration has reviewed the applications and determined that they meet the provisions of the ORC and recommends that they be approved. The time frames specified in the ORC require that this legislation be filed as emergency.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The designation of an Agricultural District will have no fiscal impact.

This ordinance will authorize the appropriation and transfer of \$461,000 from the Neighborhood Initiatives Fund for operating expenses related to Glenwood, Maryland and Lincoln pools for the 2012 outdoor swim season.

The Columbus Recreation and Parks Department has nine outdoor swimming pools that until 2007 were open in the summer months, and one indoor pool that was open year-round. Due to budget cuts in 2009 and in 2010, the Columbus Recreation and Parks Department opened only four pools for the outdoor, summer swim season: Dodge, Marion Franklin, Tuttle and Windsor. The pools that remained open were chosen based upon participation rates, overall maintenance costs and needs, and in consideration of other pools available for use by area residents. The pools that closed included Glenwood, Maryland, Lincoln, Fairwood, and Blackburn. In addition, the indoor pool was also closed for the summer season, but remained open the other nine months of the year.

It has been a top priority of Columbus City Council to identify opportunities to increase the number of open pools during the summer months. In 2011, the Columbus City Council directed funds from the Cultural Services Fund to be used for the opening and operations of Glenwood and Maryland pools for a portion of the outdoor swim season in addition to the four pools that had remained open since 2009.

This season the same four pools, Dodge Pool, at 545 Sullivant Ave.; Marion Franklin Pool, at 2699 Lockbourne Rd.; Tuttle Pool, at 240 W. Oakland Ave.; and Windsor Pool, at 1300 Windsor Ave., will again open for the outdoor swim season on Sun., June 10. This legislation will authorize the Recreation and Parks Department to open Glenwood Pool located at 1925 W Broad Street on the west side of Columbus, Maryland Pool located at 1380 Atcheson Street on the east side of Columbus, and Lincoln Pool located at 1700 Ann Street on the south side of Columbus on Sun., June 17.

Passage of this legislation will also allow for the hiring of part-time seasonal lifeguards, building maintenance staff for ongoing needs of the three facilities, and for special duty police officers as necessary, as well as for the purchase of uniforms, supplies and equipment to repair, open and maintain the pools.

FISCAL IMPACT

That funding for this ordinance is made available from the city's Neighborhood Initiatives Fund 018 for transfer to the Columbus Recreation and Parks Fund for expenditures as related to opening three pools for the 2012 outdoor swim season.

To authorize and direct the appropriation of \$461,000.00 within the Neighborhood Initiatives Fund; to direct the transfer and appropriation of \$461,000.00 from the Neighborhood Initiatives Fund to the Recreation and Parks Operating Fund for expenditures related to the operation of the Glenwood, Maryland and Lincoln pools for the 2012 summer season; and to declare an emergency. (\$461,000.00)

WHEREAS, Columbus Recreation and Parks Department has nine outdoor swimming pools that until 2009 were open in the summer months, and one indoor pool that was open year-round; and

WHEREAS, budget constraints during the 2009 and 2010 swim seasons caused the Columbus Recreation and Parks Department to only open four of its outdoor pools: Dodge, Marion Franklin, Tuttleand Windsor, keeping the five remaining pools closed as well as the indoor pool for the summer season; and

WHEREAS, it has been a priority of Columbus City Council to identify opportunities to increase the number of pools open during the summer months; and

The Economic Development Agreement will outline the plans and certain commitments of the parties relating to the proposed mixed use Commercial Development that encompasses both sides of a two block area of N. High Street in the

Short North area of Downtown Columbus. The plans and proposals remain subject to authorization pursuant to the adoption of appropriate legislation by Columbus City Council.

The Pizzuti Project, a proposed \$59 million investment, has been undertaken in cooperation/partnership with the City of Columbus as signature projects for both the Italian Village Commission Area and Victorian Village Commission Area. The project will include a \$33 million, boutique hotel with approximately 135 rooms; a \$12 million, approximately 60,000 square foot class A office building; a \$12 million parking structure that will accommodate approximately 313 cars; and the \$2 million renovation of the former United Commercial Travelers Headquarters to house the Pizzuti Collection Gallery.

Under the Economic Development Agreement, the Development Department will, for purposes of development of the Parking Garage, submit for City Council consideration all necessary legislation to enter into a TIF Reimbursement Agreement with Pizzuti. Additionally, the Department of Development will submit for City Council consideration all necessary legislation to provide an Enterprise Zone Real Property tax abatement of 75% for a term of ten (10) years for the office building to be located at 621-629 N. High Street, identified by parcel number 010-002258 to Pizzuti.

The Department agrees to submit an ordinance for Council consideration authorizing the Director to enter into a real estate purchase agreement with Pizzuti to transfer fee title by quit claim deed the real property, situated at 618 N. High Street, identified by parcel number 010-003663 for a purchase price of \$1.00. The agreement shall be approved by the City Attorney. The City and Pizzuti will enter into an agreement to reimburse the City for the displacement of the existing forty (40) parking meters currently located at 618 N. High Street in the amount of \$125,000 annually for a term of five (5) years.

The Department will submit for Council consideration all necessary legislation to authorize the contribution of up to \$1.9 million in capital dollars for eligible public improvements required as a result of the development. These improvements will include, but not be limited to, the reconstruction of Malay Alley and water, sanitary and storm sewers upgrades and/or relocation. Pizzuti will follow the processes of the Departments of Public Service and Public Utilities for the design and construction of the public improvements.

Fiscal Impact: No funding is required for this legislation.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into an Economic Development Agreement with Pizzuti Short North LLC; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, Pizzuti is proposing a mixed use Commercial Development (the "Project") that encompasses both sides of a two block area of N. High Street in the Short North area of Downtown Columbus; and

WHEREAS, the Pizzuti Project has been undertaken in cooperation/partnership with the City of Columbus as signature projects for both the Italian Village Commission Area and Victorian Village Commission Area; and

WHEREAS, Pizzuti is proposing to invest approximately \$33 million to construct and operate an approximately 135 room boutique hotel along N. High Street; and

WHEREAS, Pizzuti is proposing to invest over \$2 million to renovate the former United Commercial

Travelers headquarters to house the Pizzuti Collection Gallery; and

WHEREAS, Pizzuti is proposing to invest approximately \$12 million to develop a new approximately 60,000 square foot, Class A office building along N. High Street; and

WHEREAS, the new approximately 60,000 square foot, Class A office building is projected to attract over 400 jobs to the Short North area; and

WHEREAS, Pizzuti is proposing to construct a new parking garage at a cost of approximately \$12 million that will accommodate approximately 313 cars; and

WHEREAS, the City, by its Ordinance 2172-2005, passed December 12, 2005, authorized the creation of the Short North Incentive District to encourage the construction of structured public parking spaces; and

WHEREAS, a public parking shortage continues to exist within the Short North Incentive District; and

WHEREAS, Pizzuti is the owner of real property situated at 621-629 N. High Street, identified by parcel number 010-002258 and situated at 632 N. Park Street, identified by parcel number 010-052208; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into an Agreement with Pizzuti to outline the framework for many of the major terms of cooperation for the development of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City's agreement to provide the referenced financial assistance is contingent upon authorization pursuant to the adoption of appropriate legislation by Columbus City Council; and

Annual Reporting documents for Report Year 2010 were sent to International Diversified Funding, Inc. on March 1, 2011. It was confirmed by staff in April 2011 that the company was no longer in business. International Diversified Funding, Inc. was, however, in operation at the Project Site during Report Year 2010 and so a payment was made as per the terms of the Agreement for Report Year 2010 in 2011. This legislation is to dissolve the Agreement between the City of Columbus and International Funding, Inc.

This legislation is presented as an emergency measure in order for this dissolution to be legislated prior to the end of the Reporting Year 2011 Jobs Growth Incentive reporting period to eliminate any need for annual reporting documentation.

FISCAL IMPACT: No funding is required for this legislation.

To dissolve the Jobs Growth Incentive Agreement between the City of Columbus and International Diversified Funding, Inc.; and to declare an emergency.

A service ordinance must be passed before the annexation hearing takes place before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County. Should the petition be approved by the County Commissioners, a second City ordinance accepting the annexation will be required to complete the process. The time frames specified in the ORC require that this legislation be filed as emergency.

To set forth a statement of municipal services and zoning conditions to be provided to the area contained in a proposed annexation (AN12-001) of 58.1± acres in Prairie Township to the city of Columbus as required by the Ohio Revised Code; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Prairie Township was duly filed on behalf of Cypress Wesleyan Church on ~~March 7, 2012~~ **March 16, 2012**; and

WHEREAS, a hearing on said petition is scheduled before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County on ~~April 10, 2012~~ **April 17, 2012**; and

Section 1. That the city of Columbus will provide the following municipal services for 58.1 ± acres in Prairie Township upon the annexation of said area to the city of Columbus:

Public Safety: The City of Columbus, Department of Public Safety will be able to provide the appropriate level of safety related services to the proposed annexation area. Such services will include police and fire protection as well as emergency medical service to the subject property.

While the petitioner for annexation may have proposed future development plans for the property in question, the Department of Public Safety requests that the City exercise its discretion in the coming development planning and review process to ensure any future development will be properly served by the Department of Public Safety. Discussions between the City and the present property owner or any future developers regarding post annexation changes in zoning or other changes to the property should include the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Development to ensure any proposed development of the annexation property may be adequately accommodated. Water: The proposed annexation site will receive water service from the Division of Power and Water (Water). The site will be served by the existing twelve (12") water main located in Alton Darby Creek Road.

Sewer:

Sanitary Sewer: The proposed annexation site can obtain sanitary sewer from an existing 15-inch sanitary sewer stubbed to their east property line at the intersection of Iris Trail Drive and Weston Woods Drive.

Storm Sewers: All storm sewers necessary for development/redevelopment of the area shall be designed in accordance with design policy and zoning codes in effect at the time of development.

All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners/developers at their own cost and expense with no cost to the city.

Section 2. If this 58.1 acre site is annexed and if the City of Columbus permits uses in the annexed territory that the City of Columbus determines are clearly incompatible with the uses permitted under current county or township zoning regulations in the adjacent land remaining within Prairie Township, the Columbus City Council will require, in the zoning ordinance permitting the incompatible uses, the owner of the annexed territory to provide a buffer separating the use of the annexed territory and the adjacent land remaining within

Prairie Township. For the purpose of this section, "buffer" includes open space, landscaping, fences, walls, and other structured elements: streets and street right-of-way; and bicycle and pedestrian paths and sidewalks.

PROPOSED USE: To allow a contractor's storage yard in the R, Rural District.

NORTHEAST AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Disapproval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Disapproval. The applicant requests a Council variance to permit a contractor's storage yard for a tree service business in the R, Rural District. The applicant established the use without obtaining zoning clearance and was cited by code enforcement in December, 2009. A contractor's storage yard is permitted only in the M, M-1, and M-2, Manufacturing Districts which also prohibits open storage of materials within 100-feet of any residential district. Even if the site was zoned properly, open storage of materials would be limited because contiguous properties to the north, south, and west of the site are zoned residential and are developed with single-unit dwellings in Franklin County. The site lies within the boundaries of the *Northeast Area Plan* (2007) which recommends low-density residential as the most appropriate land use on this site. Staff does not recognize that a hardship exists or that deviation from the land use recommendation of the Northeast Plan is warranted noting that the proposed use is inappropriate at this location and incompatible with surrounding residential uses, due to noise and fumes from trucks and cars as well as dust raised by these vehicles. The applicant also requests a variance to allow parking of vehicles and equipment on an unimproved surface and without striped or marked spaces and maneuvering. Staff believes that there is no hardship or practical difficulty to support the requested variances to allow parking of vehicles and equipment on an unimproved surface and furthermore has concerns about dust impacting the surrounding residences if such a surface were to be permitted. Staff believes a properly designed and drained asphalt parking lot would also be necessary to avoid any stormwater issues with the surrounding residences.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3332.02, R, Rural District; 3312.39, Striping and marking, and 3312.43, Required surface for parking of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located **3903 WESTERVILLE ROAD (43224)**, to allow a contractor's storage yard in the R, Rural District with reduced development standards. (Council Variance # CV10-002).

WHEREAS, by application No. CV10-002, the owner of property at located **3903 WESTERVILLE ROAD (43224)**, is requesting a Council Variance to allow a contractor's storage yard in the R, Rural District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.02, R Rural District, prohibits the operation of a contractor's storage yard in the R, Rural District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.39, Striping and marking, requires parking spaces to be striped, while the applicant proposes to provide no striping or marking; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.43, Required surface for parking, requires the surface of any parking or loading space, parking lot, aisle or driveway be designed to control storm water runoff and be improved with Portland cement, or other approved hard surface other than gravel or loose fill, while the applicant proposes not to provide this; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Area Commission recommends disapproval; and

WHEREAS, City Departments recommend disapproval because the proposed use is incompatible with the surrounding residential uses due to noise and fumes from trucks and cars as well as dust raised by these vehicles. The tree service operation is too intense of a use for this established residential area and should be conducted within an M, M-1 or M-2 Manufacturing Districts as allowed by the Zoning Code. The applicant never sought zoning clearance before setting up his operation in this established residential neighborhood and therefore Staff finds no hardship. Given the size and nature of the applicants operation, Staff does not support the variance to the paving requirement due to concerns about dust raised from the vehicles using this site, some of which are quite large. A properly designed and approved asphalt parking area would be needed here to avoid any stormwater runoff issues with surrounding residences. *The Northeast Area Plan (2007)*, calls for this area to continue to be used residentially. Staff believes that there is no hardship or practical difficulty to support the requested variances to allow parking of vehicles and equipment on an unimproved surface and furthermore has concerns about dust and runoff impacting the surrounding residences if such a surface were to be permitted. The proposed use is too intense and negatively impacts the surrounding residents who bought their property with the expectation that only residential uses would be allowed in this area; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance requires separate submission for all applicable permits for the proposed use; and

WHEREAS, said variance will not adversely affect the surrounding property or surrounding neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, the granting of said variance will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent properties or unreasonably increase the congestion of public streets, or unreasonably diminish or impair established property values within the surrounding area, or otherwise impair the public health, safety, comfort, morals, or welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, the granting of said variance will alleviate the difficulties encountered by the owners of the property located at **3903 WESTERVILLE ROAD (43224)**, in using said property as desired; now, therefore:
