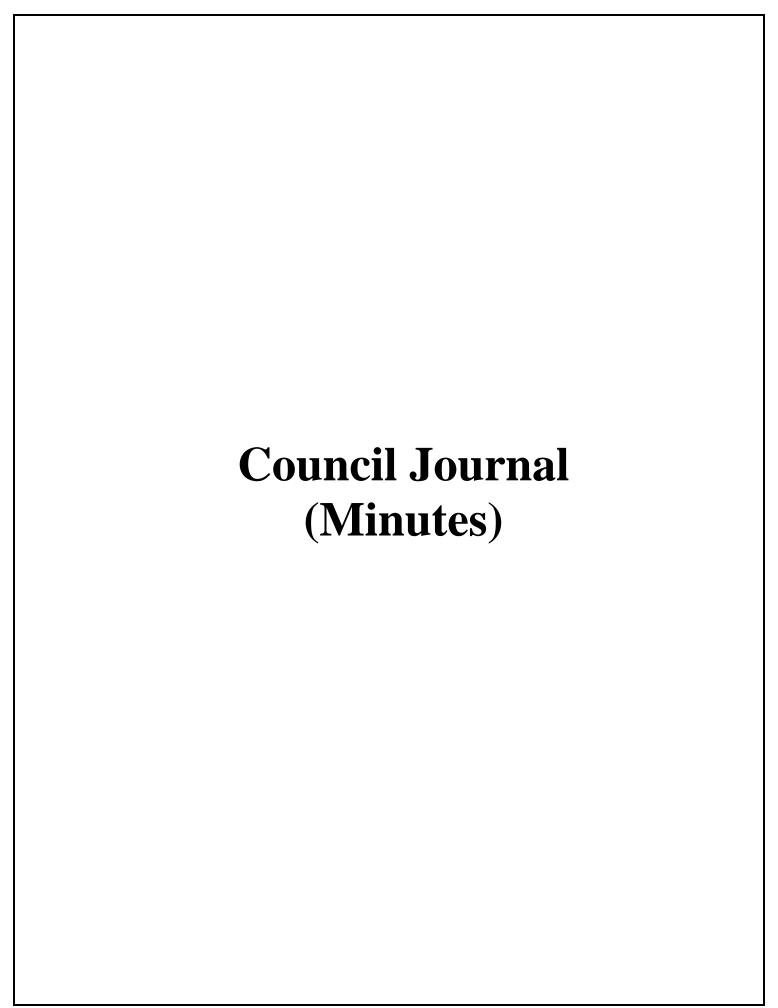

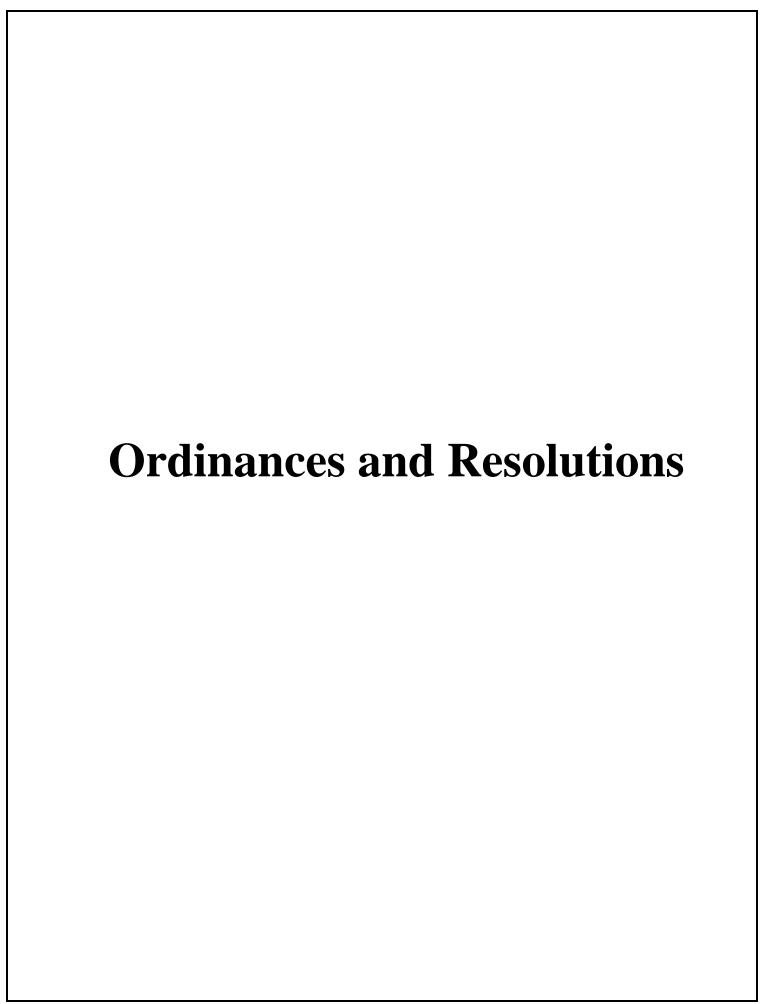

The Board of Health has been awarded a grant from the Ohio Department of Health to fund the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program for the period October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2023. Columbus Public Health has been designated as the primary grantee agency and administrator for all WIC programs in Franklin County. The grant funds awarded provide for a contract with Nationwide Children's Hospital for \$825,977.00, for the staffing and operation of five WIC clinics at their facilities.

The contract compliance number for Nationwide Children's Hospital is 31-4379441. Nationwide Children's Hospital is listed as a non-profit organization.

Emergency action is requested in order to avoid any delays in providing program services.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Women, Infants and Children Program is entirely funded by the Ohio Department of

Health. This program does not generate any revenue or require a City Match.

To authorize the Board of Health to enter into a contract with Nationwide Children's Hospital for the provision of five WIC Clinics at their facilities; to authorize the expenditure of \$825,977.00 from the Health Department Grants Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$825,977.00)

WHEREAS, The Ohio Department of Health has designated the Columbus Health Department as primary grantee agency and fund administrator for the Women, Infants and Children Grant Program in Franklin County; and,

WHEREAS, The Research Institute at Nationwide Children's Hospital will provide various services to meet all grant deliverables required by the Women, Infants and Children Grant; and,

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Health Department in that it is immediately necessary to enter into this contract to avoid any delays in providing program services to meet grant deliverables, all for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety and welfare; Now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the Board of Health is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Nationwide Children's Hospital for the provision of five WIC clinics for the period of October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023, in an amount not to exceed \$825,977.00

SECTION 2. That for the contracts stated above, the sum of \$825,977.00 is hereby authorized to be expended from the Health Department Grants Fund, Fund No. 2251, according to the attached accounting document.

SECTION 3. That the funds necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance are hereby deemed appropriated, and the City Auditor shall establish such accounting codes as necessary.

SECTION 4. - 5. If landscaping is used to screen service area containing dumpsters, 90% opacity is required for all non-servicing sides and must be protected from service vehicles. Screening shall be 1 foot above height of structure to be screened but not less than seven (7) feet above finish grade.
- D. Building design and/or Interior-Exterior treatment commitments.
- 1. A residential appearing roof shall be required and structures that appear to have flat roofs shall specifically be prohibited. A residential appearing roof shall be defined as a roof structure with a minimum pitch of 6:12 and a maximum roof of 12:12. The height of the roof element shall not be less than 40% of the overall height of the building as measured from finish floor to top of roof. Once the roof element has reached the 40'X level, then the roof may be flattened or depressed so long as the flattened or depressed portion of the roof is not visible from adjacent parking, service areas or roadways. The sloped roof noted above shall be finished with one of the following materials: dimensional asphalt shingles, wood shakes, slate, composite slate, tile, standing metal seam, or copper.
- 2. A maximum of three building material types shall be utilized for the exterior of any building including roof material. Minor accenting of structures through the use of a fourth building material shall be permitted.

The Department of Development recommends an Enterprise Zone property tax abatement of seventy-five percent (75%) for a period of ten (10) consecutive years on real property improvements related to the construction of approximately 250,000 +/- square feet of a new data center at 7500 & 7474 Alta View Boulevard, Columbus, Ohio 43085, parcel number 610-207094.

The Worthington City School District has been advised of this project as required by law.

This legislation is presented as 30-day legislation.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No Funding is required for this legislation.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement with Cologix US, Inc. and Cologix Services Company, LLC for a tax abatement of seventy-five percent (75%) for a period of ten (10) consecutive years in consideration of a total proposed capital investment of approximately \$160.5 million, which includes \$61 million in real property improvements, the creation of fifteen (15) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated new annual payroll of approximately \$1.5 million and the retention of twenty-four (24) full-time jobs.

WHEREAS, effective January 8, 2004, the Director of the Department of Development of the State of Ohio determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Ordinance No. 0427-03 contains the characteristics set forth in Section 5709.61(A) of the Ohio Revised Code, and certified said area (the "Columbus North Enterprise Zone") as an "MSA principal city non-distressed based jobs and enterprise zone" (limited authority) under Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, Cologix US, Inc. and Cologix Services Company, LLC. (collectively, and hereinafter referred to as "Cologix") was founded in 2010 and is headquartered in Denver, Colorado. Cologix is North America's leading network-neutral interconnection and hyperscale edge data center company with a carrier-dense ecosystem of 700+ networks, 350+ cloud service providers and 30+ onramps across its platform. The company provides colocation and connectivity solutions to more than 1,600+ customers through its operations that span 40+ digital edge and Scalelogix hyperscale edge data centers in 11 North American markets; and

WHEREAS, Cologix is proposing to invest a total project cost of approximately \$160,500,000, which includes \$61,000,000.00 in real property improvements, and \$99,500,000.00 in machinery and equipment to expand its existing Columbus campus by constructing a new data center consisting of approximately 250,000 square feet on an undeveloped land consisting of approximately 7.49 acres at 7500 & 7474 Alta View Boulevard, Columbus, Ohio 43085, parcel number 610-207094; and

WHEREAS, the company is proposing to create 15 net new full-time permanent positions with a cumulative estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1.5 million and retain 24 full-time jobs with an annual payroll of approximately \$1.4 million at two separate locations, 7500 & 7474 Alta View Boulevard, parcel number 610-207094 and 555-585 Scherers Court, parcel number 610-210593, which are adjacent from one another and owned by Cologix, with both parcel comprising the **Project Site**; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing and investigating the Proposal submitted by the Enterprise, the Director of the Department of Development believes that the Enterprise has demonstrated that it is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in the Columbus Enterprise Zone and improve the City's economic climate; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Development is recommending that City Council approve a ten (10) year, seventy-five percent (75%) abatement on the assessed valuation of the **Project Site** due to construction of the \$61million Facility, to incentivize the Enterprise to construct a new state-of-the art data facility in the City's north corridor; and

WHEREAS, the City is encouraging this project because of plans to develop a vacant lot parcel in the Northside of the City into an income producing property; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to increase employment opportunities and encourage the creation of new jobs in the City in order to improve the overall economic climate of the City and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter in such a binding formal agreement in order to foster economic growth for the preservation of public health, peace, property and safety. NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF COLUMBUS:

- SECTION 1. That Columbus City Council, having reviewed the proposal, finds that the Enterprise is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in the City of Columbus Enterprise Zone and improve the City's economic climate pursuant to Revised Code Section 5709.62(C).
- SECTION 2. That City hereby finds and determines that the project will (1) create jobs in the State and City (2) the project is economically sound and will benefit the people of the State and City by increasing opportunities for employment and strengthening the economy of the State and City; and (3) receiving this tax incentive is a critical factor in the decision by Cologix US Inc. and Cologix Services Company, LLC, collectively, the Enterprise hereunder, to move forward with the constructing the aforementioned project.
- SECTION 3. Based on this determination, City Council approves and authorizes a 10-year, 75% abatement on the increase in assessed valuation of real property related to the new construction on parcel number 610-207094 at the **Project Site**, contingent upon the Enterprise investing approximately \$61 million in real property improvements by constructing an approximately 250,000 square-foot data center at 7500 & 7474 Alta View Boulevard, Columbus, Ohio 43085, identified as parcel number 610-207094, the retention of twenty-four (24) full-time jobs with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1.4 million and the creation fifteen (15) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1.5 million at the **Project Site**.
- SECTION 4. The Director of the Department of Development, for and in the name of the City, is authorized to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement with the Enterprise in a form substantially similar to the one attached hereto as Exhibit "A" with such changes, amendments or edits thereto, that are not inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance, or adverse to the City. Such authorized amendment includes assignment of the Agreement from the Enterprise to a Related Member as defined in R.C. Section 5709.61(W), or to a Successor Enterprise as defined by R.C. Section 5709.61(Y). The Director of the Department of Development also is authorized to execute any other agreements or sign any documents necessary to effectuate the Agreement and the Exemption provided therein, and approved as to Form by the City Attorney, if required.
- **SECTION 5.** That the City of Columbus Enterprise Zone Agreement is signed by Cologix US, Inc. and Cologix Services Company, LLC within ninety (90) days of passage of this ordinance, or this ordinance and the abatements and credit authorized herein are null and void.
- **SECTION 6.** That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

The Board of Health has been awarded a grant from the Ohio Department of Health to fund the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program for the period November 7, 2022, through September 30, 2023. Columbus Public Health has been designated as the primary grantee agency and administrator for all WIC programs in Franklin County. The grant funds awarded provide for a contract with S & S Management Group, DBA Guard-One Protective Services for \$178,860.00, for security services at two WIC clinics.

The contract compliance number for S & S Management Group, DBA Guard-One Protective Services is CC-026826. These services were advertised through Bonfire (RFQ022757) according to bidding requirements of the City Code.

This ordinance authorizes the transfer of \$178,860.00 within the WIC Grant Program Fund 2251 to the appropriate object class for this contract. As a part of the WIC Grant Program budget for Columbus Public Health, \$5,071,429.00 was appropriated and placed into fund 2251, object class 01 for personnel. The transfer of these funds to object class 03 will allow for service costs for WIC clinic operations.

Emergency action is requested in order to avoid any delays in providing program services. WIC clinics are in need of security services to ensure the safety of all Women, Infants, Children, staff and public members entering buildings.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Women, Infants and Children Program is entirely funded by the Ohio Department of Health. This program does not generate any revenue or require a City Match.

But beyond improving food access, community gardens provide the space for powerful neighborhood-level social change.

Ordinance 1904-2021 modified the name of the endowment fund from the Foundation for Active Living to the Foundation for Columbus Public Health, approved by City Council on July 26, 2021. The Foundation for Columbus Public Health is a donor-advised fund that was established by the Columbus Board of Health with The Columbus Foundation in 2008 under the authority of Ordinance No. 1210-2008, approved by City Council on July 14, 2008. Ordinance No. 0493-2011, approved by City Council on April 4, 2011, amended the agreement with The Columbus Foundation by authorizing The Columbus Foundation, Foundation for Columbus Public Health to accept funds from the City for these purposes.

FISCAL IMPACT: A total of \$20,000.00 has been designated for this project. Funding for this ordinance is available in the amount of \$20,000.00 in the Health Special Revenue Fund.

To authorize the expenditure of \$20,000.00 from the Health Special Revenue Fund to pay The Columbus Foundation, Foundation for Columbus Public Health, for the management of the 2023 Community Gardening Projects. (\$20,000.00)

The Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) serves as staff to the District Three Public Works Integrating Committee and makes funding awards, in rounds, based on committee recommendations to the Ohio Public Works Commission concerning fund distribution for the State Capital Improvement Program and the Local Transportation Improvement Program. MORPC prorates costs to serve as staff for each round to local

jurisdictions based upon the total funds ultimately awarded to each jurisdiction.

The Department of Public Service received a total of \$7,846,111.00 in FY2021 for the following Round 35 projects: Arterial Street Rehabilitation - SR161 - I-71 to Cleveland Avenue Phase I, ADA Curb Ramps - Citywide Curb Ramps, Signal Installation - Hocking Street and Hanover Street and Bridge Rehabilitation - Harrison Road Culvert. This ordinance authorizes payment to MORPC in the amount of \$30,272.57 to satisfy the local share of administrative costs incurred during the administration of the aforementioned programs.

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) accepted applications to fund projects that address locations with a history of fatal or injury crashes where low-cost safety improvements have failed to solve the problem. The Highway Safety Improvement Program accepts formal safety applications once a year, on August 31; and it accepts abbreviated safety applications four times a year, on March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31. These grants require a 10% local match.

The Department of Public Service submitted applications seeking funds to construct safety improvements at (1) the intersection of Dublin-Granville Road (SR-161) at Busch Boulevard, (2) the intersection of Bethel Road at Dierker Road, and (3) the Gantz Road bridge over I-270. This ordinance will authorize the Director of Public Service to execute project agreements for approved projects, to accept and expend grant funds, and to issue refunds, if necessary, after final accounting is performed or when notified by the Department of Public Service's Division of Design and Construction that a refund can be issued. Separate legislation authorizing the encumbrance and expenditure of capital funds to support the local share of anticipated project costs will be put forth at a later date as needed.

2. EXPECTED PROJECTS

The Department of Public Service submitted applications for the projects listed below:

538022-100000 -Intersection Busch Blvd at Dublin Granville Road: This project improvements to intersection of Dublin Granville Road and Busch Boulevard as well as modifications to the mainline Dublin Granville Road to mitigate crash patterns. The project also includes changes to the south leg of Busch Blvd to mitigate crashes associated with Roche Dr. This project will include widening, signal work, signing, intersection, and striping upgrades. This is a formal safety application, and the total project cost is approximately \$3,493,300.00.

598029-100000 - Intersection - Bethel Road at Dierker Road: This project includes safety modifications to the intersection of Bethel Road at Dierker Road. These modifications include the removal of portions of Bethel Road's concrete median to reduce the negative offset of the turn lanes and improve sight distance along Bethel Road. This is an abbreviated safety application, and the total project cost is approximately \$133,373.00

590105-100476 - Pedestrian Safety - Gantz Road Bridge over I-270: This project includes improvements to ODOT's Gantz Road bridge over I-270. ODOT has a project to rehabilitate the existing bridge over I-270. The City of Columbus would partner with ODOT to add pedestrian facilities to the bridge. This is an ODOT led project. This is a formal safety application, and the total cost for the additional pedestrian improvements is approximately \$1,860,000.00.

3. FISCAL IMPACT

No financial participation is required at this time. Separate legislation authorizing the encumbrance and expenditure of capital funds to support the local share of anticipated project costs will be put forth at a later date as needed.

To authorize the Director of Public Service to execute grant agreements with the Ohio Department of Transportation relative to the Highway Safety Improvement Program, to accept and expend awarded grant funds, and to issue refunds, if necessary, for approved projects. (\$0.00)

Background

City Council established the Downtown tax increment financing (TIF) area in 2008 by Ordinance No. 0973-2008 to provide for a 30-year tax increment financing exemption beginning for tax year 2009 and ending in tax year 2038 to fund infrastructure improvements necessary for the future development needs of Downtown. The Downtown TIF area was subsequently reduced in size in 2009 by Ordinance No. 1189-2009, in 2012 by Ordinance No. 0923-2012, in 2019 by Ordinance No. 3169-2019, and in 2020 by Ordinance Nos. 2619-2020 and 2620-2020, but will be reset by passage of this Ordinance to encompass its pre-November 23, 2020 boundaries, as shown on Exhibit A attached to this Ordinance.

The Downtown TIF currently generates approximately \$1.6 million per year in non-school TIF revenue after providing for the compensation payment from the county to the Columbus City School District, which receives all real property taxes it would otherwise receive absent the TIF exemption. In 2019, the Ohio General Assembly adopted Section 5709.51 of the Ohio Revised Code ("R.C."), which allows City Council to extend the term of a TIF exemption for an additional period of not more than 30 years for certain TIFs like the Downtown TIF which generates in excess of \$1.5 million per year in service payments made pursuant to R.C. Section 5709.42 in the calendar year preceding the adoption of the extension amendment ordinance.

Neither the City, nor the property owners, has filed a new tax increment financing application pursuant to R.C. Section 5709.911 on the parcels removed from the Downtown TIF by Ordinance No. 2619-2020 and Ordinance No. 2620-2020, and placed in newly authorized TIF areas, this Ordinance repeals Ordinance No. 2619-2020 and Ordinance No. 2620-2020, thereby resetting the parcels of the Downtown TIF in order to determine the proper boundaries of, and parcels within, the Downtown TIF.

This Ordinance also repeals and replaces Exhibit B attached to Ordinance No. 0973-2008 to provide an updated list of eligible public infrastructure improvements that can be funded during the remaining and extended term of the Downtown TIF. This Ordinance extends the Downtown TIF for an additional 30-year period, through tax year 2068, in order to provide funding for the additional public infrastructure improvements necessary to continue to attract development to Downtown during that time frame. In compliance with R.C. Section 5709.51(A)(3), the Columbus City School District will continue to receive all real property taxes it would otherwise receive absent the TIF exemption and extension.

Fiscal Impact

No funding is required for this legislation. The City will continue to forego real property tax revenue that it would have received from the development of the Downtown TIF parcels. Instead, the non-school portion of that

revenue will be diverted to a TIF fund.

To repeal Ordinance No. 2619-2020 and Ordinance No. 2620-2020 to reset the boundaries of, and parcels within, the Downtown TIF area; to amend Ordinance No. 0973-2008, as previously amended, (i) to amend the parcels and map of the Downtown TIF, as depicted in Exhibit A, attached to that ordinance; (ii) to repeal and replace the authorized list of public infrastructure improvements funded by the Downtown TIF, attached as Exhibit B to that ordinance; and (iii) to extend the exemption period an additional thirty-years for certain parcels comprising the Downtown TIF pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5709.51.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 0973-2008, passed by this Council on July 7, 2008 pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") Section 5709.40(B) (as subsequently amended by Ordinance Nos. 1189-2009, 0923-2012, 3169-2019, 2619-2020, 2620-2020 and this Ordinance, collectively, the "Downtown TIF Ordinance"), declared improvements to certain parcels of real property that are part of Downtown (as identified on Exhibit A to the Downtown TIF Ordinance) to be a public purpose, required the owners of such parcels to make service payments in lieu of taxes and otherwise established a tax increment financing program for those parcels in Downtown; and

WHEREAS, the City nor the property owners have filed a new tax increment financing application pursuant to Section 5709.911 of the ORC on the parcels to be removed from the Downtown TIF Ordinance and placed in newly authorized TIF areas by Ordinance No. 2619-2020 and Ordinance No. 2620-2020; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2619-2020 and Ordinance No. 2620-2020 shall be repealed by this Ordinance thereby also repealing those prior amendments to the Downtown TIF Ordinance to now reset the boundaries and the parcels included in the Downtown TIF Ordinance (as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto, the "Parcels"); and

WHEREAS, Section 5 of Ordinance No. 0973-2008 authorized any other public infrastructure improvements thereafter designated by ordinance as public infrastructure improvements, as public infrastructure improvements made, to be made, or in the process of being made by the City that directly benefit, or that once made will directly benefit the Parcels; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to ORC Section 5709.51 this Council may amend the Downtown TIF Ordinance to extend, for a period not exceeding 30 additional years, the exemption from taxation of improvements to the Parcels granted pursuant to the Downtown TIF Ordinance if certain conditions are met; and

The plans may be slightly adjusted to reflect engineering, topographical, or other site data developed at the time of the development and when engineering and architectural drawings are completed. Any slight adjustments to the plan shall be subject to review and approval by the Director of the Department of Building and Zoning Services, or a designee, upon submission of the appropriate data regarding the proposed adjustment.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is further conditioned on the applicant obtaining all applicable permits and a Certificate of Occupancy for the proposed use.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 6. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect an be in forced from an after its passage and approval by the Mayor or 10 days after its passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

approximately \$10,000,000.00 in leasehold improvements, \$8,000,000.00 in machinery and equipment and entering into a long-term lease agreement to establish new operations (the "PROJECT") at a vacant industrial warehouse consisting of approximately 144,000 square feet at 2955-3035 Charter Street, Columbus, Ohio 43228 (the "PROJECT SITE") and create 305 net new full-time permanent positions with projected cumulative annual payroll at the end of the five (5) year term of approximately \$13,341,917.00.

Based on correspondence between the CITY and the GRANTEE, the GRANTEE has advised the CITY of having issues with the owner of the PROJECT SITE which have delayed the start of the PROJECT. Additionally, the GRANTEE has also advised the CITY of their intent to expand the scope of the PROJECT to include an additional location at which to establish additional operations by entering into a long term lease at 2099 Wright Brothers Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43217 which they project will result in an additional 35 net new employees, an additional projected \$1,745,000.00 in commensurate payroll and an additional investment of approximately \$7,100,000.00 comprised of \$700,000.00 in leasehold improvements, \$6,000,000.00 in machinery and equipment and \$400,000.00 in IT expenditures. BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Columbus Department of Development to petition the Director of the Ohio Department of Development to amend the certification of an area designated within the City of Columbus (City) as a Community Reinvestment Area (CRA). CRAs have been designated by Columbus City Council (Council) under the general guidelines of Ordinance 1698-78. Such areas allow for the granting of real property tax incentives to encourage industrial, commercial and residential growth. This designated area, currently known as the South Grove CRA, number 049-18000-31, was authorized by Council

by Resolution No. 0218X-78, passed on August 3, 1978 and certified by the State of Ohio on September 3, 1978.

This ordinance will amend the existing South Grove CRA by (1) renaming the South Grove CRA to be the Southside Investment District CRA (the "CRA"); (2) to revise the improvements eligible for abatement within the CRA; and by (3) adding approximately 8,931 acres as described in Attachments A-1 and A-2 (City of Columbus Community Reinvestment Area Expansion Map (A-1) and List of Parcels to be added to the CRA (A-2)). This addition is comprised of 1,959 individual parcels within the City of Columbus, contiguous with the current boundary of the CRA but not currently within the boundary of the CRA.

Approximately ninety percent (90.0%) of the parcels to be added to the CRA are within the Columbus City School District (CCSD), five percent (5.0%) are within the Groveport Madison Local School District, one

percent (1.0%) will be within the Hamilton Local School District (HMSD) and four percent (4.0%) will be within the South-Western City School District (SWCSD). This CRA, as amended herein, results in sixty-two percent (62%) of the area is within the CCSD, six percent (6%) of the area to be added is within the GMLSD, seventeen percent (17%) of the area to be added is within the HLSD and fifteen percent (15%) of the area to be added is within the SWCSD.

This amending ordinance is the first of the "first two amendments" as defined in Sections 3735.661(A) and 3735.661(B) of the Ohio Revised Code (Pre-1994 community reinvestment area term extension) as related to Section 3 of Am. S.B. 19 of the 120th General Assembly and will authorize the expansion of the CRA and will continue to provide the City the ability to offer real property tax abatements for parcels within the expansion area described in Exhibits A1, A2 and A3.

The Columbus City School District, Hamilton Local School District, Groveport Madison Local School District and the South-Western City School District have been advised of this proposal as required under State law.

FISCAL IMPACT: No funding is required for this legislation.

To authorize the Director of Development to petition the Ohio Department of Development to amend the existing South Grove Community Reinvestment Area as established by the Ohio Revised Code to (1) rename the Community Reinvestment Area as the Southside Investment District Community Reinvestment Area (the "CRA"); (2) to revise the improvements eligible for abatement within the CRA; and (3) to add approximately 8,931 acres of land within the City of Columbus, contiguous with the current boundary of the CRA but not currently within the boundary of the CRA.

WHEREAS, City Council desires to pursue all reasonable and legitimate incentive measures to assist in encouraging housing maintenance and economic and community development in areas that have not benefited from reinvestment through renovation or new construction; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1698-78, approved by City Council on August 3, 1978, authorized the Columbus Department of Development to implement a Community Reinvestment Program, pursuant to Sections 3735.65 to 3735.70 of the Ohio Revised Code, and approved certain administrative procedures for the program; and

WHEREAS, on August 3, 1978, City Council approved Resolution No. 0218X-78 designating the South Grove CRA as a Community Reinvestment Area as established by Sections 3735.65 to 3735.70 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, the South Grove CRA has been assigned the CRA number 049-18000-31 by the Ohio Department of Development and was certified by the State of Ohio on September 3, 1978; and

WHEREAS, the proposed area and its immediate vicinity have been surveyed and has been found to meet the criteria for designation of a Community Reinvestment Area; and

WHEREAS, the opportunity exists to modify the boundaries of the South Grove Community Reinvestment Area to include parcels within the expansion area shown on Exhibits A1, A2 and A3 (the Expansion Area); and

WHEREAS, this amending ordinance is the first of the "first two amendments" as defined in Sections 3735.661(A) and 3735.661(B) of the Ohio Revised Code (Pre-1994 community reinvestment area term extension) as related to Section 3 of Am. S.B. 19 of the 120th General Assembly and will authorize the expansion of the CRA and will continue to provide the City the ability to offer real property tax abatements for parcels within the expansion area described in Exhibits A1, A2 and A3; and now therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS

- **Section 1.** That, as to the original designation of the South Grove Community Reinvestment Area, reference is made to Resolution No. 218X-78 passed by City Council on August 3, 1978, which as amended by this ordinance is hereby renamed the Southside Investment District Community Reinvestment Area.
- **Section 2.** That Section 1 of Resolution 218X-78, passed by City Council on August 3, 1978, is repealed and that Section 2 of Resolution 218X-78, passed by City Council on August 3, 1978 shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:
 - "Section 2. That the Southside Investment District area has housing and industrial facilities with discouraged investment and as such has successfully met the criteria for designation as a Community Reinvestment Area."
- **Section 3**. That Section 3 of Resolution 218X-78, passed by City Council on August 3, 1978, shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:
 - "Section 3. That the boundaries of the Southside Investment District Community Reinvestment Area are described and shown within Exhibits A1 and A2 (the Expansion Area) attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference."
- **Section 4.** That Section 4 of Resolution 218X-78, passed by City Council on August 3, 1978, shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:
 - "Section 4. That within the Southside Investment District Community Reinvestment Area tax abatements on the increase in the assessed valuation from improvements of or to real property as described in Section 3735.67 of the Ohio Revised Code will be granted upon (1) the completion of a pre-application on a form to be provided by the City prior to the commencement of the improvements and (2) the filing of a proper application for the tax abatement (the "Applications") by the property owner following completion of the improvements and certification thereof by the designated Housing Officer to the Franklin County Auditor. Applications for tax abatements hereunder must be filed with the Housing Officer no later than twelve (12) months following completion of the improvements. The abatement will first apply in the year following the calendar year in which the certification is made to the County Auditor (ORC 3735.67(D); Pre-SB19). Tax abatements on improvements will be granted as per the following:
 - (A). Up to twelve (12) years for the remodeling or renovation (as defined in Ohio Revised Code Section 3735.65(C)) of existing structures for commercial and industrial use as described in Ohio Revised Code Section 3735.67(D)(1), upon which the cost of remodeling or renovation must be at least two thousand

five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of the structure (per the Franklin County Auditor prior to the commencement of the improvements), whichever is more. Remodeling or renovation for commercial retail business use is not an eligible improvement. All abatements granted pursuant to this Section shall be for one hundred percent (100%) of the improvement.

(B). Up to fifteen (15) years for the remodeling or renovation (as defined in Ohio Revised Code Section 3735.65(C)) of existing structures for commercial and industrial use, upon which the cost of remodeling or renovation must be at least two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of the structure (per the Franklin County Auditor prior to the commencement of the improvements), whichever is more, if the structure is (1) of historical or architectural significance (as defined in Ohio Revised Code Section 3735.65(D)) or (2) is a certified historic structure that has been subject to federal tax treatment under 26 U.S.C. 47 and 170(h) and units within the structure have been leased to individual tenants for five consecutive years, all as described in Ohio Revised Code Section 3735.67(D)(1). Remodeling or renovation for commercial retail business use is not an eligible improvement. All abatements granted pursuant to this Section shall be for one hundred percent (100%) of the improvement.

(C). Up to fifteen (15) years for commercial and industrial new construction as described in Ohio Revised Code Section 3735.67(D)(2), upon which the projected cost of the improvements is at least one million dollars (\$1M). New construction for commercial retail business use is not an eligible improvement. All abatements granted pursuant to this Section shall be for one hundred percent (100%) of the improvement.

Prior to the commencement of the improvements, the property owner will be considered to be a covered entity subject to Chapter 377 of the Columbus City Codes, Wage Theft Prevention and Enforcement ("Chapter 377") and that the property owner will comply with all requirements set forth in Chapter 377.

The community reinvestment area tax abatements provided hereunder are senior to any other community reinvestment area tax abatements pursuant to Sections 3735.65 to 3735.70 of the Ohio Revised Code. Other than as specified in Sections 4(A) through 4(C) hereof, no community reinvestment tax abatement shall be granted in the Southside Investment District Community Reinvestment Area."

Section 5. That Section 5 of Resolution 218X-78, passed by City Council on August 3, 1978, shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

"Section 5. That reference is made to Ordinance No. 1698-78, adopted by City Council on August 3, 1978, as to the designation of the Housing Officer and establishment of a Community Reinvestment Area Housing Council for the Southside Investment District Community Reinvestment Area and that a copy of this legislation (1) shall be forwarded by the Housing Officer to the Franklin County Auditor for information and reference, (2) a copy of this legislation shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City once a week for two consecutive weeks immediately following passage of the legislation, and (3) that the Housing Officer is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf of the City, to petition the Director of the Ohio Department of Development for certification of the Southside Investment District Community Reinvestment Area with points (2) and (3) above being done within fifteen (15) days of passage of the legislation as described in Section 3735.66 of the Ohio Revised

Code."

Section 6. That Section 6 of Resolution 218X-78, passed by City Council on August 3, 1978 shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

"Section 6. Except as amended hereby, the original CRA Resolution, Resolution No. 218X-78, shall remain in full force and effect and that for reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption and approval by the Mayor or ten (10) days after its adoption and approval if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same."

The Enterprise is proposing to invest a total project cost of approximately \$14 million, which includes \$11 million in real property improvements to construct and expand its existing warehouse distribution facility of approximately 42,965 sq. ft. by another 120,000 sq. ft. (the "Facility") at 6611 Broughton Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43213, parcel number 010-241763 (the "Project Site"). Xtreme Express will be the tenant and employer of record, and enter into a lease agreement with Broughton Investment, the property owner. Additionally, Xtreme Express will retain eighty-one (81) full-time jobs with annual payroll of approximately \$3.83 million and create fifty (50) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$2,649,700 at the proposed Project Site ("New Employees").

The Director of the Department of Development is recommending that Council approve a 75%/10-year Enterprise Zone tax abatement on real property improvements made by the Enterprise at the **Project Site**, in

consideration of it creating, or causing to be created, the New Employees.

"Project") to expand its existing industrial warehouse and distribution facility of approximately 42,965 sq. ft. by another 120,000 sq. ft. (the "Facility") at 6611 Broughton Avenue, Columbus, Ohio, 43213, identified as parcel number 010-241763 (the "Project Site"). The Enterprise anticipates that the Project will retain eighty-one (81) full-time positions with an annual payroll of approximately \$3.83 million and will create fifty (50) net new full-time permanent positions at the Facility with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$2,649,700 ("New Employees"); and

WHEREAS, Broughton Investment, LLC will own the property while Xtreme Express, LLC will be the tenant and employer of record, and will enter into a long-term lease agreement with Broughton Investment, LLC to lease the Facility at the **Project Site**; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing and investigating the Proposal submitted by the Enterprise, the Director of the Department of Development believes that the Enterprise has demonstrated that it is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in the Columbus Enterprise Zone and improve the City's economic climate; and

Based on this determination, City Council approves and authorizes a 10-year, 75% abatement on the increase in assessed valuation of real property on the **Project Site**, contingent upon the Enterprise investing approximately \$11 million in real property improvements by constructing an

addition of approximately 120,000 square-foot Class A distribution and warehouse facility at 6611 Broughton Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43213, identified as parcel number 010-241763, the retention of eighty-one (81) full-time jobs with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$3.83 million and the creation fifty (50) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$2,649,700 at the **Project Site**.

SECTION 4. The Director of the Department of Development, for and in the name of the City, is authorized to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement with the Enterprise in a form substantially similar to the one attached hereto as Exhibit "A" with such changes, amendments or edits thereto, that are not inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance, or adverse to the City. Such authorized amendment includes assignment of the Agreement from the Enterprise to a Related Member as defined in R.C. Section 5709.61(W), or to a Successor Enterprise as defined by R.C. Section 5709.61(Y). The Director of the Department of Development also is authorized to execute any other agreements or sign any documents necessary to effectuate the Agreement and the Exemption provided therein, and approved as to Form by the City Attorney, if required.

SECTION 5. That the City and the Enterprise must execute the attached Enterprise Zone Agreement within ninety (90) days of this Ordinance's passage, or this Ordinance, and the authorization to enter into the tax abatement agreement, is null and void.

The company is not debarred according to the Excluded Party Listing System of the Federal Government or prohibited from being awarded a contract according to the Auditor of State Unresolved Findings for Recovery Certified Search.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: This ordinance is being submitted as an emergency because, without emergency action, no less than thirty-seven days will be added to this procurement cycle and would cause a disruption of the GreenSpot metrics software platform throughout the organization.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Utilities to enter into contract with JadeTrack Inc. to provide access and support to the GreenSpot metrics software platform; to waive the competitive bidding

provisions of the City Code and to authorize the expenditure of \$19,500.00 from the Electricity Operating Fund, the Water Operating Fund, the Sewer System Operating Fund, and the Stormwater Operating Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$19,500.00)

WHEREAS, in its continuing efforts to be an environmentally friendly and "green" community, the Department of Public Utilities has determined that is in its best interest to continue the GreenSpot program and associated web-based metrics platform; and

WHEREAS, the City has a need for an electronic tool for the metrics component to the GreenSpot commitments; and

WHEREAS, JadeTrack, Inc. has the necessary experience and expertise to provide said service; and WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to waive the competitive bidding provisions of City Code Chapter 329 to allow JadeTrack, Inc. to improve upon and add features, provide access and support to the GreenSpot metrics software platform; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Utilities, in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a contract for support to the GreenSpot metrics software platform with JadeTrack, Inc., so there is no interruption in GreenSpot metrics software platform for the department, for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore

That the expenditure of \$19,500.00 or so much thereof as may be needed, is hereby authorized in Fund 6100 Sanitary Sewer Operating Fund, Fund 6000 Water Operating Fund, Fund 6300 Power Operating Fund, and Fund 6200 Stormwater Operating Fund, in Object Class 03, Main Account 63946 in the amount of \$19,500.00 per the accounting codes in the attachment to this ordinance.

This ordinance authorizes an increase in water rates effective January 1, 2023 for the Division of Water and to amend Chapter 1105 of the Columbus City Codes, 1959.

The proposed rate configuration for 2023 recognizes that water and sewer charges disproportionately affect lower income groups. The Department of Public Utilities will continue the Low Income Discount Program that discounts participant's sewer commodity portion of their quarterly bill by 20%.

Requested adjustments in rates result in a typical inside city residential water rate increase of 4%. When a sewer increase of 5% and a 2% increase in stormwater rates are considered, the overall impact on a typical residential customer's bill in the City of Columbus is 4.45%, and for a typical outside city residential customer, the overall bill impact is 4.51%. Low Income Discount participant's overall bill impact is 4.42%. Outside city customers are not charged stormwater fees. Considering the 2023 rates increases for water, sewer, and storm combined -- based on average household water use of 30 ccf's per quarter, City of Columbus residents are estimated to see their total bill increase \$14.07 per quarter, or \$56.29 per year.

The Sewer and Water Advisory Board (SWAB) met on October 19, 2022, and after reviewing the Department of Public Utilities' projected expenditures for Fiscal Year 2023, recommends to City Council a 4% increase in water rates and no increase to the water capacity charges.

FISCAL IMPACT: These rate increases will generate approximately \$7.2 million in additional revenue in Fiscal Year 2023. Combined with rate increases for Sewer and Stormwater, the overall impact to a City of Columbus' residents bill will be 4.45%.

To amend various sections of Chapter 1105 of the Columbus City Codes, and to enact new water rates for the year beginning January 1, 2023, and to repeal the existing sections being amended.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to establish new water services rates, effective January 1, 2023, for water service provided by the City of Columbus in order to recover the cost of rendering said water services; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities Division of Water requests that a 4% rate increase be applied to water rates for 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities requests that water capacity fees not be increased in fiscal year 2023, and

WHEREAS, City Council recognizes that increased water rates disproportionately impact low income residents. Low income residents already pay a higher percentage of their household income in utility bills, and this percentage would increase with higher rates; and

WHEREAS, City Council further recognizes that past rate increases in the City have demonstrated that increasing rates leads to increased delinquencies among the City's customers; delinquency rates are higher among low income residents. It is well recognized that increased delinquencies are expensive for the City and

its customers; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that continuing the discount rate for low income users at 20% is appropriate to assist those least able to manage the impacts of increased sewer and water rates; and

WHEREAS, the Sewer and Water Advisory Board has adopted recommendations that are consistent with the rates established in this legislation; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that the rates and the low income discount established therein are equitable to all of the City's customers; now, therefore

SECTION 1. That the existing Sections 1105.04 and 1105.041 of the Columbus City Codes shall be and are hereby amended effective January 1, 2023 to read as follows:

1105.04 Residential Inside city water rates.

The charges for Residential water supplied through meters to consumers within the corporate limits shall be based upon a service charge plus a commodity charge. The following rates shall apply to Residential water services within the city:

This ordinance revises sewer charge definitions, revises discretion to reduce sewer front footage fees, and authorizes an increase in sewer rates effective January 1, 2023 for the Division of Sewerage and Drainage and to amend Chapter 1147 of the Columbus City Codes, 1959.

Sewer charge definitions need to be revised from time to time and in this ordinance grit waste is being added to the list of "Scavenger wastes" which are usually collected at the source by tank truck for disposal.

This ordinance also eliminates the authority of the Director of the Department of Public Utilities to reduce the amount of the front footage fee per section 1137.01 due to the infrequency of reduction requests and lack of a promulgated rule.

The proposed rate configuration for 2023 recognizes that water and sewer charges disproportionately affect lower income groups. The Department of Public Utilities will continue the Low Income Discount Program that discounts participant's sewer commodity portion of their sewer bill by 20%.

Requested adjustments in rates result in a typical inside city residential sewer rate increase of 5%. When a water increase of 4% and a 2% increase in stormwater rates are considered, the overall impact on a typical residential customer's bill in the City of Columbus is 4.45%, and for a typical outside city residential customer, the overall bill impact is 4.51%. Low Income Discount participant's overall bill impact is 4.42%. Outside city customers are not charged stormwater fees. Considering the 2022 rate increases for water, sewer, and storm combined -- based on average household water use of 30 ccf's per quarter, City of Columbus residents are estimated to see their total bill increase \$14.07 per quarter, or \$56.29 per year.

In 2005, in accordance with Ordinance No.1904-2005, passed November 28, 2005, Council created a Clean River Fee to recover costs of construction of projects necessary to meet the requirements of the two consent orders that mandate elimination of wet weather flow from Combined Sewer Overflows and Sanitary Sewer Overflows. This charge was assessed based on each property's measured impervious surface area. Since 2005, Council has approved across-the-board rate increases, including the Clean River Fee. The Department of Public Utilities, with approval of the Sewer and Water Advisory Board (SWAB), recommends that the Clean River Fee again be increased with an across-the-board rate increase of 5% to continue to allow wet weather construction projects to be paid for by a blend of the Clean River Fee and Commodity Charges.

The proposed rate structure is necessary to continue to address projects related to the two (2) consent orders entered into in 2002 and 2004 mandating the City of Columbus to mitigate wet weather flow from Combined Sewer Overflows (CSO) and Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSO) and other operating costs and infrastructure improvements.

The Division of Sewerage and Drainage charges some industrial customers an extra strength charge. Extra strength charges are for the treatment of high strength wastewater generated by various industries that require additional treatment processes within the wastewater treatment plants. To stay economically competitive, the Department of Public Utilities is recommending an increase of extra strength charges for inside-city and

outside-city BOD (Biological Oxygen Demand) by 5% beginning January 1, 2023 and an increase to outside-city TKN (Total Kjeldal Nitrogen) 2% beginning January 1, 2023. No changes are recommended to TSS (Total Suspended Solids) Extra Strength Charges beginning January 1, 2023.

The Sewer and Water Advisory Board (SWAB) met on October 19, 2022, and after reviewing the Department of Public Utilities' projected expenditures for Fiscal Year 2023, recommends to City Council a 5% increase in sewer rates and extra strength increases for inside-city and outside-city BOD (Biological Oxygen Demand) by 5% and an increase to outside-city TKN (Total Kjeldal Nitrogen) by 2% starting January 1, 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT: These rate increases will generate approximately \$12.2 million in additional revenue in the Sewer Operating Fund in Fiscal Year 2023.

To amend Sections 1137.01, 1147.01 and 1147.11 of the Columbus City Codes to revise sewer charge definitions, revise the discretion to reduce sewer front footage fees, and enact new sanitary sewer service rates for the year beginning January 1, 2023; and to repeal the existing sections being amended.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to eliminate the authority of the Director of the Department of Public Utilities to reduce the amount of the front footage fee per section 1137.01 due to the infrequency of reduction requests and lack of a promulgated rule; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to revise sewer charge definitions from time to time; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to establish new sewer sanitary services rates, effective January 1, 2023, for sewerage services to properties discharging into the sanitary sewerage system of the City of Columbus in order to recover the cost of rendering said sewerage services for the calendar year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities, Division of Sewerage and Drainage requests a 5% increase in sewer rates for 2023 to pay for necessary ongoing operations and needed improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities, Division of Sewerage and Drainage recommends extra strength increases of 5% for inside-city and outside-city BOD (Biological Oxygen Demand) and a 2% increase to outside-city TKN (Total Kjeldal Nitrogen) by 2% starting January 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities requests that sewer capacity fees not be increased in fiscal year 2023, and

WHEREAS, in addition to the commodity rates, City Council finds it necessary to continue a Clean River Fee to fund the wet weather capital improvement projects required by the Consent Orders with the State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that the most appropriate way to assess the Clean River surcharge is by correlating the surcharge to the amount of impervious surface, as the factor most closely associated with increased inflow and infiltration is impervious cover from urban development; and

WHEREAS, City Council recognizes that increased sewer rates disproportionately impact low income residents. Low income residents already pay a higher percentage of their household income in utility bills, and

this percentage would increase with higher rates; and

WHEREAS, City Council further recognizes that past rate increases in the City have demonstrated that increasing rates leads to increased delinquencies among the City's customers; delinquency rates are higher among low income residents. It is well recognized that increased delinquencies are expensive for the City and its customers; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that continuing the discount rate for low income users at 20% is appropriate to assist those least able to manage the impacts of increased sewer and water rates; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that the rates and the low income discount established are equitable to all of the City's customers; **NOW**, **THEREFORE**,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That effective January 1, 2023, Section 1137.01 of the Columbus City Codes be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

1137.01 - Tapping sewer where property not assessed.

Upon application to tap any sewer built by the city for the purpose of draining the service lateral of any property directly into such sewer, the Director of Public Utilities shall require a fee of forty-five dollars (\$45.00) per foot of width of front-footage be paid for the privilege of making such a direct connection from the service lateral to the main or lateral sewer before a permit is issued. This charge shall not be imposed if the owner of the property concerned can show that the owner or the owner's predecessor in title paid, or is paying a special assessment for the construction of the sewer to be tapped or that the sewer to be tapped was constructed at no expense to the sanitary enterprise fund. The number of feet to be paid for shall be determined by one of the following applicable methods:

(1)Lots or parcels of ground having the same width at the front and rear and the same depth on each shall be charged for on the basis of the actual frontage.(2)Lots or parcels of ground which are irregular shape shall be charged for on the basis of the width of the property as measured on a line forty (40) feet from the front lot line and parallel to the center line of the street upon which property is to face, except that for lots or parcels of ground having curved frontage the width to be charged for shall be measured on a line parallel to and forty (40) feet distant from a line tangent to the curved frontage at a point midway between the sides of the lots or parcels of ground.

The width of front-footage to be paid for shall be determined by the use of an engineer's scale applied to the record drawings of the sewers sought to be tapped, on file in the office of the Division of Sewerage and Drainage, and the widths so determined by the clerk issuing the permit shall be final. The amounts collected shall be deposited to the credit of the sewer fund.

The Director of Public Utilities may, in the Director's sole discretion, may reduce the amount of the front footage fee if the fee is disproportionate to the benefit to the property due to a significant portion of the property

not being subject to development. The director shall promulgate a rule to implement this section.

SECTION 2. That effective January 1, 2023, Section 1147.01 of the Columbus City Codes be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

1147.01 Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter, the meaning of the following terms shall be defined in this section:

- (a)"Approved laboratory procedures" means the measurements, tests, and analyses of the characteristics of water and wastes in accordance with analytical procedures determined acceptable by Federal Guidelines as established in Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 136, or as approved by the Regional Administrator, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
- (b)"Billing Charge" shall mean a fixed charge to recover the costs incurred to provide service whether or not any consumption is used. These may include the costs of producing and mailing utility bills, applying payment as it is received, providing customer support and service, and other related sewer system costs.
- (c)"Commodity Charge" shall mean a sewer use charge that varies in the amount with the level of water the customer actually uses. This charge recovers the operating and maintenance costs associated with treating wastewater to clean water standards, providing the collection system to convey wastewater, and recovers the cost of system capital improvements. The charge includes an Operating and Maintenance charge, a Capital charge, Sewer Maintenance charge, and Industry Specific charge.
- (d)"Biochemical Oxygen Demand" (BOD 5) means the quantity of oxygen utilized in the biochemical oxidation of organic matter as determined by approved laboratory procedures.
- (e)"Chemical Oxygen Demand" (COD) means the amount of oxygen consumed from a chemical oxidant as determined by approved laboratory procedures.
- (f)"Contracted reserve capacity" means that portion of the unused system design capacity which has been retained by contract for future use by a user.
- (g)"Cooling water" means the clean wastewater discharged from any heat transfer system such as condensation, air conditioning, cooling or refrigeration. (Ord. 2616-87.)
- (h)"Director" means the director of public utilities, City of Columbus. (Ord. 478-92.)
- (i)"Discharge" means the disposal of sewage, water or any liquid from any sewer user into the Columbus sewerage system.
- (j)"Domestic waste" means any discharge to the sewer system that has strength characteristics which do not exceed 250 mg/l of BOD, 300 mg/l of suspended solids and 40 mg/l of TKN.
- (k)"Industrial process" means any activity where materials are received and are altered by one or more internal operations and then dispatched in the altered form.
- (1)"Industrial user" means any nongovernmental user of the Columbus sewerage system identified in the

Standard Industrial Classification Manual, 1972 edition, classified in Division A, B, D, E or I, that discharges wastewater from an industrial process, and the total wastewater discharged is not primarily non-process domestic waste.

- (m)"Maintenance" means keeping the treatment works in a state of repair and shall include expenditures necessary to maintain the capacity (capability) for which said works were designed and constructed.
- (n)"Major contributor" means any wastewater contributor identified in the Standard Industrial Classification Manual (SIC) in any of Division A, B, D, E and I that:(1)Has a discharge flow of 50,000 gallons or more per average work day (if seasonal, the average shall be computed on the period of use); or(2)Has a flow or pollutant loading greater than five percent of the design capacity of the treatment works; or(3)Has in its wastes toxic pollutants in toxic amounts as defined in the standards issued under Section 307(a) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972; or(4)Is found by the director to have significant impact, either singly or in combination with other contributing industries, on the treatment works or upon the quality of effluent from the treatment works.
- (o)"Phosphorus" means total phosphorus content in wastewater as determined by approved laboratory procedures.
- (p)"Primarily non-process domestic waste" means that at least ninety (90) percent of all wastewater contributed is attributable to sanitary conveniences.
- (q)"Proportionate" means that each unit has the same relationship to the total with respect to magnitude, quantity and degree.
- (r)"Replacement" means those expenditures made for obtaining and installing equipment, accessories and/or appurtenances during the useful life of the treatment works which are necessary to maintain the capacity and performance of the treatment works for which they were designed and constructed.
- (s)"Sewerage charge" means the aggregate of the appropriate user charges and local capital cost charges.
- (t)"Sewerage system" means all of the facilities required to transport sewage from the premises of the source to a sewage treatment facility and shall include the treatment and disposal facility. All such facilities of the City of Columbus shall be considered to be one such sewerage system.
- (u)"Significant user" means a user who contributes ten (10) percent or greater of the system design flow or system design for pollutant loadings.
- (v)"Standard Industrial Classification" means a coded classification of industries based upon economic activity developed by the U.S. Department of Commerce as published in the current Standard Industrial Classification Manual published by the U.S. Government Printing Office.
- (w)"Standard Strength" means sewage having concentrations of one hundred fifty (150) milligrams per liter BOD, two hundred (200) milligrams per liter suspended solids and twenty-five (25) milligrams per liter TKN.
- (x)"Suspended solids (total nonfilterable) residue" means total nonfilterable residue that are removable by filtering using approved laboratory procedures.

- (y)"System design capacity" means the design capacity for normal domestic wastewater as established by accepted engineering standards.
- (z)"Total organic carbon" (TOC) means the total of all organic compounds expressed in milligrams per liter as determined by the combustion-infrared method prescribed by approved laboratory procedures.
- (aa)"Service load" means total billed load as determined by calculating the non-extra strength billed flows times standard strength pounds plus established extra strength flow and loadings.
- (ab)"Treatment parameter" means a fundamental characteristic of sewage around which treatment is designed, such as, but not limited to flow, BOD, suspended solids and phosphorus.
- (ac)"User" means any person, lot, parcel of land, building, premises, municipal corporation or other political subdivision that discharges, causes or permits the discharge of wastewater into the city sewerage system.
- (ad)"Scavenger wastes" means liquid waste materials such as wastes from septic tanks, portable toilets, sewage holding tanks, <u>grit waste</u> and industrial processes which are usually collected at the source by tank truck for disposal elsewhere.
- (ae)"Industrial wastes" means any discharge to the sewer system that has strength characteristics which equal or exceed two hundred fifty (250) mg/l of BOD, three hundred (300) mg/l of suspended solids or forty (40) mg/l of TKN.
- (af)"NPDES Permit" means the conditions and limits set forth by the NPDES on the City of Columbus, division of sewerage and drainage for discharging treatment plant effluent into public waters.
- (ag)"Debt service charge" means the portion of a user's bill that is used to offset the principal and interest payments on outstanding debt of the division of sewerage and drainage.
- (ah)"Operations and Maintenance (O&M)" means the organized procedure for causing a piece of equipment, a treatment plant, or other facility or system to perform its intended function and to keep these units in such condition that it is able to continually and reliably perform its intended function.
- (ai)"Residential user class" means all users who discharge sewage from a structure of human occupancy.
- (aj)"Commercial user class" means all users who discharge sewage from a non-industrial business establishment.
- (ak)"Governmental user class" means all users who discharge sewage from a property owned by a local, state or federal governmental entity.
- (al)"Institutional user class" means all users who discharge sewage from a school, church or hospital.
- (am)"User charges" means the operation, maintenance and replacement cost of the division of sewerage and drainage.
- (an)"Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen" (TKN) means total ammonia and organic nitrogen content in wastewater as determined by approved laboratory procedures.

- (ao)"Sewer service outside the city" means sewer service furnished to consumers in contract areas or sewer authorized by the Director of Public Utilities for consumers in non-contract areas.
- (ap)"Non-contract areas" means areas outside the city provided with sewer service by the city where no contract exists with a political subdivision.
- (aq)"Wet Weather Charge" A charge based upon the Equivalent Residential Unit to recover costs of construction of projects necessary to meet the requirements of consent orders that mandate elimination of wet weather flow from Combined Sewer Overflows and Sanitary Sewer Overflows. This charge recovers debt service costs and other expense of all projects related to correcting wet weather overflows.
- (ar)"Equivalent Residential Unit" (ERU) Each ERU is based on two thousand (2,000) square feet of impervious surface area. Residential customers are assigned one (1) ERU per residence. All other customers are charged based on measured impervious area divided by two thousand (2,000) square feet to determine an ERU equivalent. The maximum per customer charge based on calculated ERUs is one thousand (1,000).
- (as)"Eligible senior customers" means any customer who (a) is receiving service by means of a single meter to a single-family residence; (b) is personally responsible for payment of the bill as head of household; and (c) is sixty (60) years of age or older having a total income of less than one hundred fifty (150) percent of the poverty level as published by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Census.

SECTION 3. That effective January 1, 2023, Section 1147.11 of the Columbus City Codes be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

1147.11 Rate Schedules.

- (a) Charges Within Corporate Limits. For the purpose stated in Sections 1147.02 and 1147.12 there is hereby charged to each user situated within the corporate limits of the city, having any active sewer connection with the sewerage system of such city or otherwise discharging sewerage, industrial wastes, water or other liquids, either directly or indirectly into the city's sewerage system, sewer charges as hereinbefore provided, and in the amount determinable as follows:
- (1) For any such lot, parcel of land, building or premises having any connection with the city's sewerage system or otherwise discharging sanitary sewerage, industrial wastes, water or other liquids, either directly or indirectly into the city's sewerage system, such charge shall be based upon the quantity of water used therein as the same is measured by a water meter or meters there in use, as hereinafter described, and there shall be charged:

The charges as prescribed in the rate schedule as follows:

(b) Charges Outside Corporate Limits. For the purpose stated in Sections 1147.02 and 1147.12, there is hereby charged to each user situated outside the corporate limits of the city, having any active sewer connection with the sewerage system of such city or otherwise discharging sewage, industrial wastes, other liquids, either directly or indirectly into the city's sewerage system, sewer charges as hereinbefore provided, and in the amount determinable as follows:

(1) For any such lot, parcel of land, building or premises having any connection with the city's sewerage system or otherwise discharging sanitary sewage, industrial wastes, water or other liquids, either directly or indirectly into the city's sewerage system, such charge shall be based upon the quantity of water used thereon or therein as the same is measured by a water meter or meters there in use, as hereinafter described, and there shall be charged:

(d) Septic Tanks and Scavenger Waste Haulers. Fees and charges for treatment of normal scavenger wastes shall be based on the costs of providing such services and on the expected overall average characteristics of such discharges, which shall be designated as 3,902 mg/l BOD, 17,934 mg/l S.S. and 1,301 mg/l TKN for septic tank wastes, 311 mg/l BOD, 596 mg/l S.S. and 104 mg/l TKN for sewage holding tank wastes, 7,407 mg/l BOD, 8,895 mg/l S.S. and 2,469 mg/l TKN for portable toilet wastes, and 27,142 mg/l BOD, 26,345 mg/l S.S. and 9,047 mg/l TKN for grease interceptors grit waste. With prior approval of the Director (or designee), when available treatment capacity allows, high-strength trucked wastes that have total solids between thirteen and thirty (13-30) percent of which eighty to one hundred (80-100) percent are volatile solids and which originate from food packaging or processing or similar facilities may be accepted for special disposal at designated location(s) within the treatment plant(s). The Director may designate characteristics on which to base charges in special situations on submission of proof that waste discharges have other than expected overall average concentrations and with provisions of positive identification procedures. Charges may be billed at monthly intervals or at the discretion of the Director, and shall be considered delinquent if not paid within thirty (30) days of billing date. Delinquency in payment shall be basis for revocation of permit.

For each one hundred (100) gallons, or portion thereof, of either truck capacity or actual measured discharge, the fee shall be as follows:

This ordinance authorizes an increase in Stormwater charges effective January 1, 2023 and to amend Chapter

1149 of the Columbus City Codes.

The stormwater charges per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) will increase from \$5.06 to \$5.16 per month for a typical Inside City residential customer.

Requested adjustments in rates result in a typical inside city residential storm water rate increase of 2%. When a sewer increase of 5% and a 4% increase in water rates are considered, the overall impact on a typical residential customer's bill in the City of Columbus is 4.45%, and for a typical outside city residential customer, the overall bill impact is 4.45%. Low Income Discount participant's overall bill impact is 4.42%. Outside city customers are not charged stormwater fees. Considering the 2023 rates increases for water, sewer, and storm combined -- based on average household water use of 30 ccf's per quarter, City of Columbus residents are estimated to see their total bill increase \$14.07 per quarter, or \$56.29 per year.

The stormwater ERU charge is assessed based on each property's measured impervious surface area. Each Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) is based on 2000 sq ft of impervious surface area. Residents are charged at one (1) ERU per residence. All other customers are charged based on measured impervious area divided by 2,000 sq ft to determine an ERU equivalent.

The Sewer and Water Advisory Board (SWAB) met on October 19, 2022, and after reviewing the Department of Public Utilities' projected expenditures for Fiscal Year 2023, recommends to City Council a 2% increase in storm rates.

FISCAL IMPACT: These rate increases will generate approximately \$1,100,000 in additional revenue in Fiscal Year 2023.

To amend Section 1149.08 of the Columbus City Codes, to enact new Stormwater fees for the year beginning January 1, 2023, and to repeal the existing Section being amended.

WHEREAS, the Sewer and Water Advisory Board met on October 19, 2022, and after reviewing the Department of Public Utilities projected expenditures for 2023, recommends to City Council an increase of 2% in stormwater rates, and

WHEREAS, stormwater fees are not charged to those customers outside of the City of Columbus, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to increase the monthly Stormwater charges from \$5.06 per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) to \$5.16 per ERU to accurately match needed revenue to estimated program expenses; now, therefore,

Charges within corporate limits. For any such property, lot, parcel of land, building or premises that is tributary directly or indirectly to the stormwater system of the city, such charge shall be based upon the quantity of impervious area situated thereon.

All properties having impervious area within the city will be assigned an equivalent residential unit (ERU), or a multiple thereof, with all properties having impervious area receiving at least one (1) ERU.

Residential properties. All residential properties will be assigned one (1) ERU. A flat rate will apply to all residential properties.

Non-residential properties. Non-residential properties will be assigned an ERU multiple based upon the properties' individually measured impervious area (in square feet) divided by two thousand (2,000) square feet (one (1) ERU). This division will be calculated to the first decimal place and rounded according to mathematical convention.

(b) The charge as prescribed in the rate schedule is as follows:

The Division of Design and Construction is responsible for managing construction contracts, providing quality and timely construction inspection, surveying, and materials testing services in support of publicly and

Bid Information: The Commission is in the process of soliciting proposals for the provision of pre-employment physicals and cardiovascular stress testing of public safety recruits, but will be unable to complete the proposal assessment, vendor selection, and associated legislative actions prior to Council's last meeting of this year, December 12, 2022. BACKGROUND: The cases of Gutknecht Construction Co. v. City of Columbus, Case No. 21 CV-002381 and Gutknecht Construction Co. v. City of Columbus, Case No. 21 CV-002382, pending in the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas, were filed on April 15, 2021, and named the City of Columbus, through its Departments of Finance & Management and Recreation & Parks, respectively, as defendant. Subsequently, both cases were consolidated into Mr. Excavator v. Gutknecht, et. al, Case No, 21 CV-1568. Due to the specialized and complex nature of the construction litigation, it was necessary for the City Attorney's office to retain outside counsel to represent the City. The City Attorney's office entered into special legal counsel contracts with Porter Wright Morris & Arthur LLP on May 5, 2021. It is now necessary to modify the contracts in order to continue to provide the statutorily required representation.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes the expenditure of \$300,000.00 with Porter Wright Morris & Arthur LLP Funding to provide special legal counsel services. Background: The City determined to facilitate the urban redevelopment of approximately 300 acres of real property generally located at the northeast corner of Dublin Road and Trabue Road. The redevelopment includes about 80 acres of approximately 20,000 square feet of Class A office space, 600 multi-family housing units, 440 single family homes and condominiums, up to 50,000 square feet of retail space (collectively, the "Project") to be constructed during three separate phases (the "Phases"), and includes 220 acres for the new Quarry Trails Metro Park. In connection with that redevelopment and pursuant to Ordinance 3075-2017, the City entered into an Economic Development Agreement dated September 9, 2019 (the "EDA") with Marble Cliff Canyon, LLC (the "Developer"). Under the EDA, it contemplated the creation of tax increment financing ("TIF") area for the Project pursuant to Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code as well as a new community authority ("NCA") pursuant to Chapter 349 of the Ohio Revised Code. Therefore, in order to implement the EDA, Council passed Ordinance 3176-2019 to establish the Quarry TIF area to provide 100%, 30-year exemptions from real property taxation on all improvements to each of the Phases within the Quarry TIF area. Pursuant to the passage of Resolutions 0268X-2019 and 0284X-2019, the Marble Cliff Quarry NCA (the "Authority) was created of which the Project parcels are a part thereof.

The applicable portion of those service payments from the Quarry TIF will be distributed directly to the Hilliard City School District and the Central Ohio Joint Vocational School District (Tolles) with the remaining non-school portion of those service payments paid to the City. Those non-school service payments from the

Quarry TIF Fund are pledged to the Authority to be used to fund public infrastructure improvements benefiting the TIF parcels pursuant to Ordinance 3253-2019, which authorized the Tax Increment Financing and Cooperative Agreement dated May 1, 2020 by and among the City, the Developer, and the Authority. Due to unforeseen market changes during the pandemic, the Developer has proposed changing which parts of the Project occur in the second and third Phases. In order to continue to maximize the amount of service payments available to the Authority for the public infrastructure improvements, this legislation will amend Ordinance 3176-2019 to update which parcels of the Quarry TIF are in each of the exemption Phases.

Emergency Justification: Emergency passage of this legislation is requested in order to exempt the improvements to the parcels of the Quarry TIF within the modified exemption Phases prior to the end of the current tax year, thereby continuing to maximize the amount of service payments necessary to finance the public infrastructure improvements, which will preserve the public peace, health, property, safety, and welfare.

Fiscal Impact: No funding is required for this legislation.

To amend Ordinance 3176-2019 to update which parcels of the Quarry TIF are in each of the three exemption phases of the project; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City determined to facilitate the redevelopment of approximately 300 acres of real property generally located at the northeast corner of Dublin Road and Trabue Road with about 80 acres consisting of a mixed-use development (the "Project") to be constructed during three separate phases (the "Phases" and each a "Phase") and the remaining 220 acres consisting of the new Quarry Trails Metro Park; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 3075-2017, the City entered into an Economic Development Agreement dated September 9, 2019 (the "EDA") with Marble Cliff Canyon, LLC (the "Developer") for the Project by which the City agreed to establish tax increment financing ("TIF") on those Project parcels pursuant to Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code, and to support the creation of a new community authority ("NCA") pursuant to Chapter 349 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, to implement the EDA, Council passed Ordinance 3176-2019 to establish the Quarry TIF that provides for a 100% exemption from real property taxation on all improvements to the parcels of each of the Phases within the Quarry TIF area for separate periods of not more than thirty (30) years for each of the Phases; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the EDA, Council also passed Resolution 0268X-2019 to determine the sufficiency of the NCA petition submitted by the Developer and passed Resolution 0284X-2019 to establish the Marble Cliff Quarry NCA (the "Authority) and its new community district over the Project parcels; and

WHEREAS, Council then passed Ordinance 3253-2019, which authorized the Tax Increment Financing and Cooperative Agreement dated May 1, 2020 (the "Agreement") by and among the City, the Developer, and the Authority; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, the applicable service payments generated from the Quarry TIF not to be provided to the schools but directed to the Quarry TIF Fund are pledged by the City to the Authority to be used to fund public infrastructure improvements benefiting the TIF parcels; and

WHEREAS, due to unforeseen market changes during the pandemic, the Developer has proposed changing which parts of the Project occur in the second and third Phases thereby affecting when improvements in each of the Phases of the Quarry TIF will be exempted and for how long; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the Department of Development in that it is immediately necessary to amend Ordinance 3176-2019 to update which parcels of the Quarry TIF are in each of the exemption Phases prior to the end of the current tax year thereby continuing to maximize the amount of service payments necessary to finance the public infrastructure improvements, such action being necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace, property and safety; NOW, THEREFORE,

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Technology (DoT) to enter into contract with 3SG Plus, LLC, a dealer of Hyland OnBase Software, for continued maintenance and support services for OnBase Software. This is being done on behalf of various city departments, including Building and Zoning Services, Health, Public Utilities, Public Service and Human Resources. The term of this contract is six months, beginning on January 1, 2023 and ending on June 30, 2023 at a cost of \$87,056.70. This agreement was most recently authorized by Ordinance No. 3002-2021, which passed on December 6, 2021.

Background: City Council passed Ordinance 1732-2019 authorizing the City to enter into an Economic dated September 27, 2019 ("EDA"), with The Gravity Development Agreement, Project "Developer") and Columbus Housing Partnership, Inc. ("Homeport"). In furtherance of the commitments in the EDA, City Council passed Ordinance 0072-2020 (the "TIF Ordinance") to establish a new tax increment financing ("TIF")" area under Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code (the "Gravity Phase II TIF"). The Gravity Phase II TIF includes Homeport's parcel(s) at the northwest corner of McDowell St. and W. State St. as well as the parcels originally controlled by the Developer between W. Broad St. on the north, W. State St. on the south, McDowell St. on the west, and the CSX railroad on the east, but it did not include Tax Parcel ID number 010-042942 or Tax Parcel ID number 010-301918, as they existed at the time of the passage of the TIF Ordinance (the "Additional Parcels"), since they were not controlled by the Developer. An affiliate of the Developer acquired the Additional Parcels on November 10, 2021.

In order for the Gravity Phase II TIF to be administered more efficiently due to the combination of these two new parcels into other parcels within the Gravity Phase II TIF, the City has agreed to add the Additional Parcels to the Gravity Phase II TIF. The improvements to the Additional Parcels will have the same one-hundred percent exemption and 30-year term as the current parcels under the TIF Ordinance. The applicable portion of the annual service payments from the Additional Parcels will be distributed directly to the Columbus City Schools. The remaining non-school portion of those service payments will be paid to the City for deposit into the Gravity Phase II TIF Fund to be used to finance certain public infrastructure improvements in accordance with the Cooperative Agreement dated May 1, 2021 by and among the City, the Columbus-Franklin County Finance Authority, the Developer, Gravity 2 - Garage LLC, and the Gravity II New Community Authority, which said agreement was authorized by City Council pursuant to Ordinance 0976-2020. To effectuate these changes, this legislation will amend Ordinance 2283-2012, as previously amended by the TIF Ordinance, to remove the Additional Parcels from the existing East Franklinton TIF. This legislation will also amend the TIF Ordinance to add the Additional Parcels to the Gravity Phase II TIF.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: No funding is required for this legislation. The City is foregoing real property tax revenue that it would have received from redevelopment on the Additional Parcels. Instead, the non-school portion of that revenue will be diverted to the Gravity Phase II TIF Fund.

<u>Emergency</u> <u>Justification</u>: Emergency legislation is necessary to maximize revenue for the public improvements under the cooperative agreement requiring the Additional Parcels be added to the Gravity Phase II TIF immediately; this will allow the City to file the exemption application, on all of the parcels of the Gravity Phase II TIF, collectively with the county and state without delay as the TIF exemption commenced with tax year 2022 in accordance with Section 2 of the TIF Ordinance.

To amend Ordinance 2283-2012 by removing Tax Parcel ID number 010-042942 and Tax Parcel ID number 010-301918, as they existed at the time of the passage of Ordinance 0072-2020, from the East Franklinton TIF; to amend Ordinance 0072-2020 to add the same parcels to the Gravity Phase II TIF; to declare the improvements to said parcels to be a public purpose and exempt from real property taxation for the same exemption percentage and term as the original Gravity Phase II TIF parcels; to require the owner(s) of said parcels to make service payments in lieu of taxes; to require the distribution of the applicable portion of those service payments to the Columbus City School District; to deposit the remainder of those service payments into the Gravity Phase II TIF Fund to finance certain public infrastructure improvements in accordance with the Cooperative Agreement dated May 1, 2021; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code and Ordinance 2283-2012, City Council created the East Franklinton Tax Increment Financing area bounded by the CSX railroads on the north and east, State Route 315 on the west, and I-70 and the Scioto River on the south; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 1732-2019, City Council authorized the City to enter into an Economic Development Agreement dated September 27, 2019 ("EDA") with The Gravity Project 2 LLC (the "Developer") and Columbus Housing Partnership, Inc. ("Homeport") putting forth the commitment to create a new tax increment financing ("TIF") area encompassing the Developer's and Homeport's parcels under Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code (the "Gravity Phase II TIF"); and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the EDA, City Council passed Ordinance 0072-2020 (the "TIF Ordinance") to amend Ordinance 2283-2012 to remove from the East Franklinton TIF their parcels at the northwest corner of McDowell St. and W. State St. as well as between W. Broad St. on the north, W. State St. on the south, McDowell St. on the west, and the CSX railroad on the east and to place them into the Gravity Phase II TIF; and

WHEREAS, Tax Parcel ID number 010-042942 and Tax Parcel ID number 010-301918, as they existed at the time of the passage of the TIF Ordinance (as depicted on this Exhibit A, the "Additional Parcels"), within the aforementioned described boundaries were not removed from the East Franklinton TIF and included in the Gravity Phase II TIF, as they were not controlled by the Developer at that time; and

WHEREAS, an affiliate of the Developer acquired the Additional Parcels on November 10, 2021, and the Developer and the City have agreed to remove the Additional Parcels from the East Franklinton TIF and add them to the Gravity Phase II TIF in order to more easily administer the two TIFs due to the Additional Parcels being combined with existing parcels in the Gravity Phase II TIF; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined to be in the best interest of the City to exempt from taxation one-hundred percent of the improvements to the Additional Parcels for the same thirty-year exemption term as the original parcels of the Gravity Phase II TIF (with the Additional Parcels now being included as a "Parcel" and collectively included with the "Parcels" as defined in and for purposes of the TIF Ordinance); and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the applicable portion of the service payments in lieu of taxes shall be paid directly to the Columbus City School District (the "School District") in an amount equal to the real property taxes that the School District would have been paid if the improvements to the Additional Parcels had not been exempted from taxation; and

WHEREAS, the remaining non-school service payments in lieu of taxes from the Additional Parcels will be distributed to the City for deposit into the Gravity Phase II TIF Fund to be used for certain public infrastructure improvements in accordance with Ordinance 0976-2020 and its authorized Cooperative Agreement dated May 1, 2021 (the "Agreement") by and among the City, the Columbus-Franklin County Finance Authority, the Developer, Gravity 2 - Garage LLC, and the Gravity II New Community Authority; and

Background: Pursuant to the *Big Darby Accord Watershed Master Plan* and Resolution 0216X-2008, the City enacted a revenue program for public improvements within the Big Darby Accord area (the "Big Darby Revenue Program"). Ordinance 1947-2008 established a tax increment financing (TIF) incentive district south of West Broad Street between Galloway Road and Alton Darby Creek Road (the "Blauser-Summerlyn TIF") pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5709.40(C) to support the Big Darby Revenue Program and the then planned single-family development on the eastern portion of the Blauser-Summerlyn TIF. Due to the effects of the Great Recession, the western portion of the Blauser-Summerlyn TIF was not immediately developed, but by Ordinance 0411-2021, the City rezoned it to allow two-hundred sixty (260) multi-family units, one-hundred ninety-one (191) single family housing units, and a maximum of 150,000 square feet of commercial uses (the "Project").

By authorization of Ordinance 2659-2021, the City and the Blauser Capital Ltd. (the "Developer") then entered into the Big Darby - Blauser Farms Development Agreement dated November 22, 2021 (the "Agreement"). Per the Agreement, the parties desire to maximize the Big Darby Revenue Program from the Project by TIF exempting the multi-family improvements to immediately occur on Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-306518 and 010-306519 (together the "Additional Parcels") for a term not to exceed 30 years. Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5709.40(B) and Ordinance 2990-2021, the City established a new TIF area over Tax Parcel ID No. 570-184818 at the corner of West Broad Street and Doherty Road (the "West Broad Street TIF") near the Project to support the Big Darby Revenue Program.

This legislation will amend Ordinance 1947-2008 to remove the Additional Parcels from the Blauser-Summerlyn TIF and amend Ordinance 2990-2021 to add the Additional Parcels to the West Broad Street TIF. The Columbus City Schools will continue to receive, in the same manner as usual, all amounts that it would have received in real property taxes had the new TIF exemption not been granted to the Additional Parcels. This legislation will also remove Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-287875 and 010-297361 owned by the City, and Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-296933, 010-291856, and 010-291855 owned by the Board of Trustees of Prairie Township, from the Blauser-Summerlyn TIF and not include them in any TIF as those parcels will not add to the Big Darby Revenue Program.

Emergency Justification: Emergency legislation is required to allow for the immediate effectiveness of this Ordinance to add Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-306518 and 010-306519 to the West Broad Street TIF prior to the assessment at the end of the year of any new Project improvements already under construction in order to maximize revenue available for the Big Darby Revenue Program.

Fiscal Impact: No funding is required for this legislation. The City is now foregoing ninety-five percent (95%) of the real property tax revenue that it would have received from the Project on the Additional Parcels. Instead, the non-school portion of that revenue will be diverted to the West Broad Street TIF Fund.

To amend Ordinance 1947-2008 by removing Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-306518 and 010-306519 (the "Additional Parcels"), Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-287875 and 010-297361 owned by the City, and Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-296933, 010-291856, and 010-291855 owned by the Board of Trustees of Prairie Township, from the Blauser-Summerlyn TIF; to amend Ordinance 2990-2021 to add the Additional Parcels to the West Broad Street TIF; to declare the improvements to the Additional Parcels to be a public purpose and exempt from real property taxation for the same exemption rate and period as the original West Broad Street TIF parcels; to require the owner(s) of the Additional Parcels to make service payments in lieu of taxes; to require the distribution of the applicable portion of those service payments to the Columbus City School District; to deposit the remainder of those service payments into the West Broad Street TIF Fund for certain public infrastructure improvements contemplated by the Big Darby - Blauser Farms Development Agreement dated November 22, 2021; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5709.40(C) of the Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") and Ordinance 1947-2008, City Council created a tax increment financing (TIF) incentive district south of W. Broad Street generally between Galloway Road and Alton Darby Creek Road (the "Blauser-Summerlyn TIF"); and

WHEREAS, Blauser Capital Ltd. (the "Developer") is planning the development of an approximately 126.3-acre site on Tax ID Parcel Nos. 010-256886, 010-306518, and 010-306519 (the "Developer Property") as depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, as allowed by Ordinance 0411-2021 rezoning the Developer Property, the Developer has proposed the construction of two-hundred sixty (260) multi-family units, one-hundred ninety-one (191) single family housing units, and a maximum of 150,000 square feet of commercial uses (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, as authorized by Ordinance 2659-2021, the Director of the Department of Development entered into the Big Darby - Blauser Farms Development Agreement dated November 22, 2021 (the "Agreement") with the Developer; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement outlined the implementation of a public revenue generating program on the Developer Property consistent with the *Big Darby Accord* and Resolution 0216X-2008 (the "Big Darby Revenue Program") including establishing a new tax increment financing area over parts of the Developer Property prior to the construction of certain phases of the Project; and

WHEREAS, on July 5, 2022, the Developer transferred Tax ID Parcel Nos. 010-306518, and 010-306519 (the "Additional Parcels") to Darby Crossing Apartments LP for the construction of the multi-family phase of the Project; and

WHEREAS, ORC Sections 5709.40(B), 5709.42, and 5709.43 (collectively, the "TIF Statutes") authorize this Council, by ordinance, to declare the improvement to parcels of real property located within the City to be a public purpose and exempt from taxation, require the owner of each parcel to make service payments in lieu of taxes, provide for the distribution of the applicable portion of such service payments to the subjected school districts and the City, establish a municipal public improvement tax increment equivalent fund for the deposit of those non-school service payments, and specify the purposes for which money in that fund will be expended; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the TIF Statutes and Ordinance 2990-2021 (the "TIF Ordinance"), the City has already recently established a new TIF area over Tax ID Parcel No. 570-184818 at the corner of W. WHEREAS, in accordance with the Big Darby Revenue Program, the five percent (5%) of the real property taxes of the improvements to the Additional Parcels not exempted from taxation pursuant to this Ordinance will be distributed directly to Franklin County and the county-wide levy agencies; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the applicable portion of the service payments in lieu of taxes generated from the Additional Parcels shall be paid directly to Columbus City Schools in an amount equal to the real property taxes that Columbus City Schools would have been paid if the improvement to the Additional Parcels located within the Columbus City Schools District had not been exempt from taxation; and

WHEREAS, the remaining non-school service payments in lieu of taxes from the Additional Parcels will be distributed to the City for deposit into the West Broad Street TIF Fund to be used for certain public infrastructure improvements contemplated by the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, notice of this proposed ordinance has been delivered to the Board of Education of the Columbus City Schools, and South Western City Schools as the original school district, in accordance with and within the time periods prescribed by ORC Sections 5709.40 and 5709.83, respectively; and

WHEREAS, Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-287875 and 010-297361 owned by the City (the "City Parcels"), and Tax Parcel ID Nos. 010-296933, 010-291856, and 010-291855 owned by the Board of Trustees of Prairie Township (the "Township Parcels" as they and the City Parcels are depicted on Exhibit A hereto) will also be removed from the Blauser-Summerlyn TIF by this Ordinance and not included in any other TIF as the City Parcels and Township Parcels will not add to the Big Darby Revenue Program; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the Department of Development such that the Blauser-Summerlyn TIF and the West Broad Street TIF must be immediately amended to remove and add the Additional Parcels before the end of the year prior to the assessment of any new Project improvements to the Additional Parcels to maximize the revenue available for the public infrastructure improvements thereby preserving the public health, peace, property and safety; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

BACKGROUND: Ordinance #1652-2022, passed October 17, 2022 enacted and amended various chapters of Title 25 - Fire Prevention Code of the City of Columbus to ensure alignment with the Ohio Fire Code, establish an appeals process for review of violations, and established a new fee structure for certain permits, inspections, modifications and rates. However, this ordinance, 1652-2022 Section 2550.02 needs amended to; first, reinstate the ability of the Division of Police to issue hazardous material citations for all violations of this chapter. This change simply restores the prior status quo enforcement ability of Columbus Police which was inadvertently left out of ordinance 1652-2022. Second, the underlined proposed language of Section 2550.04 adds language to correct a typographical error in order to mirror the Code of Federal Regulations (CF). Again, this restores the prior status quo. The underlined proposed language of Section 2550.0.13.1 simply corrects an error by referencing the correct section number. This amendment does not alter any other requirements established by Ordinances #1652-2022.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: The Department of Public Safety requests emergency legislation to allow the Division of Police to continue with the issuance of hazardous material citations.

To amend Ordinance #1652-2022, passed October 17, 2022 by editing Chapter 2550 to reinstate the ability of the Division of Police to issue hazardous material citations:, to correct a typographical error in order to mirror the Code of Federal Regulations and to make changes to reflect the correct section number of the fire code; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, Ordinance #1652-2022, passed October 17, 2022 enacted and amended various chapters of Title 25 - Fire Prevention Code of the City of Columbus to ensure alignment with the Ohio Fire Code, establish an appeals process for review of violations, and established a new fee structure for certain permits, inspections,

modifications and rates, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance, #1652-2022 Section 2550.02 needs amended to reinstate the ability of the Division of Police to issue hazardous material citations for all violations of this chapter, and

WHEREAS, this change restores the prior status quo enforcement ability of Columbus Police which was inadvertently left out of ordinance 1652-2022, and

WHEREAS, Section 2550.04 adds language to correct a typographical error in order to mirror the Code of Federal Regulations as well as restores the prior status quo that was inadvertently left out of ordinance #1652-2022, and

WHEREAS, the proposed language of Section 2550.0.13.1 corrects an error by referencing the correct section number, and

WHEREAS, all other aspects of Ordinance #1652-2022, passed October 17, 2022 are unaffected by this amendment and remain in effect and all of Chapter 2550 are included below for consistency, and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Safety in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Division of Police to continue to issue hazardous material citations without interruption, thereby preserving the public health, peace, property, safety, and welfare; NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the recently revised Columbus Fire Code, as adopted by Ordinance #1652-2022, passed on October 17, 2022, is hereby revised by edits to Chapter 2550 as follows:

Chapter 2550 - HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

2550.01 Scope. This chapter of the Columbus Fire Prevention Code shall include in its entirety, and as changed from time to time, the OFC Rule 50, OAC 1301:7-7-50, Hazardous Materials. The following revisions and additions, if any, apply to this Article.

<u>2550.02</u> Enforcement. The Columbus Division of Police shall have the authority to enforce this chapter and issue citations for violations.

2550.03 Hazardous Material Reporting. This chapter of the Columbus Fire Prevention Code shall include in its entirety, and as changed from time to time, the Ohio Fire Code (2017) Appendix H, Hazardous Materials Management Plan (HMMP) and Hazardous Materials Inventory Statement (HMIS) Instructions.

2550.04 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TRANSPORTATION.

2550.04.1 Scope. The purpose and intent of this section is to protect the public health, safety, and welfare from the potential hazards of fire, explosion, and exposure to toxic substances that accompany a hazardous materials incident by regulating the transportation of hazardous materials in and through the City of Columbus.

2550.04.2 General. This chapter shall apply to all hazardous materials as defined herein which are transported in and through the city of Columbus, and shall be in addition to all other sections of this code, and all other provisions of the Columbus City Ordinances regarding hazardous substances or materials, or any rules or regulations of other city departments, boards or commissions pertaining thereto. For the purpose of this chapter

any area located within the boundaries of the outerbelt, I-270, shall be considered to be either a point of origin or destination (delivery point) within the city.

2550.04.3 Adoption and incorporation of Federal Regulations. Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, (49 CF) Subchapter C - Hazardous Materials Regulations, Part 171 - General Information, Regulations, and Definitions; Part 172 - Hazardous Materials Tables and Hazardous Materials Communications Regulations; Part 173 - Shippers - General Requirements for Shipments and Packagings; and Part 177 - Carriage By Public Highway, governing the transportation of hazardous materials in commerce on highways are hereby adopted by the City of Columbus to ensure the application of those requirements to the city's streets.

2550.04.4 Conflict. When any provisions of this chapter is found to be in conflict with the regulations adopted, the provision which establishes the higher standard for the promotion and protection of the safety and welfare of the public shall prevail.

2550.04.5 Adoption and incorporation of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations. The requirements of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations 49 CF Part 397 - Transportation of Hazardous Materials; Driving and Parking Rules, Section 397.3, 397.5, 397.7, 397.9 and 397.21 are a dopted as referred to and as modified herein.

2550.04.6 Hazardous materials subject to regulation. Transportation in commerce within the City of Columbus of the hazardous materials required to be placarded <u>and / or marked</u> by 49 CF, Part 172, Subpart F - Placarding, shall be subject to the regulations set forth in Sections 2550.04.7 through 2550.04.21 herein in addition to those regulations adopted in Sections 2550.04.3 and 2550.04.5 above.

2550.04.7 - Restrictions on the use of city streets for the transportation of hazardous materials. For the purpose of applying 49 CF Section 397.9(a) of the regulations adopted in Section 2550.04 herein to the City of Columbus, the following restrictions are adopted.

2550.04.8 Major thoroughfares. Those portions of major thoroughfares as defined in Section 2550.04.13 which lie inside Interstate 270 (the outerbelt) are conclusively presumed to be routes of the materials specified in Section 2550.04.6 is prohibited where there is neither a point of origin nor destination (delivery point) within the city.

2550.04.9 City streets. The use of city streets for the transportation of the materials specified in Section 2550.04.6, is prohibited whether there is neither a point of origin or destination (delivery point) within the city.

2550.04.10 Point of origin nor destination. Where there is neither a point of origin nor destination (delivery point) within the city the materials specified in Section 2550.04.6, shall be transported around the heavily populated areas of the City of Columbus by using Interstate 270.

2550.04.11 Prohibited time. The use of city streets in the downtown area, as defined in 2550.04.11.1 for the transportation of the materials specified in Section 2550.04.6 is prohibited during the hours between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. daily except Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

2550.04.11.1 Downtown area. The downtown area is defined as the area bounded by, but not including, the Innerbelt on the North, East, and South, and State Route 315 on the West; more specifically by Interstate 71 on the East, by Interstate 70 on the South, by State Route 315 on the West, and by Interstate 670 on the North.

Exceptions to the restrictions listed in 2550.04.6 will be made by permit issued on application to the chief of the division of fire in accordance with the procedures of Section 2550.04.15, herein.

2550.04.12 Additional permitting. Authority to require permits for transportation of hazardous materials outside the downtown area.

2550.04.12.1 Special Precautions. The fire chief may require permits for the transportation of hazardous materials, as specified in Section 2550.04.6 in areas outside of the downtown area (as defined in Section 2550.04.11.1 when, due to the nature of the particular hazardous material, the routes of travel and parts of the city involved, special precautions may be required.

2550.04.13 Regulations concerning the operation of motor vehicles carrying hazardous materials. The following regulations shall apply to the transportation in Columbus of the materials specified in Section 2550.04 above:

2550.04.13.1 Traffic Violations. Transporters of hazardous materials shall comply with 49 CF 397.3 while operating within the city. Traffic violations involving moving or parking infractions shall be treated as violations of these regulations and shall be subject to the penalties of Section 2550.15-Section 2550.04.21 herein.

2550.04.13.2 49 CF. Transporters of hazardous materials shall comply with applicable rules of 49 CF 397.5, 397.7 and 397.21 while operating within the city.

2550.04.14 Use of major thoroughfares. Transporters of hazardous materials shall use only major thoroughfares, as defined in Section 2550.04.14.1, to reach their destinations. When a destination is not on a major thoroughfare, said transporters will use major thoroughfares to a point as close as possible to the destination. Before using non-major thoroughfare routes said transporters shall comply with the provisions of 49 CF 397.9.

2550.04.14.1 Use of major thoroughfares. For the purposes of Chapter 2550.04, the following are considered to be major thoroughfares:

- 1. Interstate 70.
- 2. Interstate 71.
- 3. Interstate 670.
- 4. U.S. Route 33.
- 5. State Route 161.
- 6. State Route 315.
- 7. Broad Street.
- 8. High Street.

2550.04.15 Permits. The following procedure shall apply to the granting of permits to operate in exception to the regulations set forth herein:

2550.04.15.1 Application. Application for a permit shall be made to the fire chief on the forms provided and accompanied by a fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) plus ten dollars (\$10.00) per each vehicle listed on the application. All applications shall be acted on within thirty (30) days of submission to the fire chief and timely notice of approval or denial shall be given to the applicant.

2550.04.15.2 Single permit. A single permit shall be granted to a transporter (carrier, trucking company, etc.) for the hazardous materials identified in Section 2550.04.6.

2550.04.15.3 Rejected applications. Permits denied by the fire chief shall be subject to review by a hearing before the Director of Public Safety on approval by the applicant made to said Director within thirty (30) days of the receipt of notice of denial.

2550.04.15.4 Approval. Permits will be granted only where the following criteria are met as determined by the fire chief:

2550.04.15.4.1 Need. Compelling need is shown, that is, the applicant must show that delivery or pick-up of the hazardous material identified in Section 2550.04.6 can be made only by entering the area defined by Section 2550.04.11.1 during the time period identified in Section 2550.04.11.

2550.04.15.4.2 Public Interest. Transportation of the hazardous material is in the public interest.

2550.04.15.4.3 Conditions. Permits issued shall set forth conditions such as routes and other special precautions as determined by the fire chief.

2550.04.15.5 Renewal. Permits shall be granted for a period of one (1) year and be renewed upon application unless revoked for cause after a hearing before the Director of Public Safety.

2550.04.15.6 Revocable. Permits shall be revocable and nontransferable.

- 2550.04.16 Reporting requirements. Incidents involving hazardous materials occurring within the city of Columbus and required to be reported by 49 CF 171.15 shall be reported immediately by the carrier to the division of fire by telephone using the Fire Alarm Office Number (614) 221-2345, and the fire chief shall file a standing request with the Materials Transportation Bureau/U.S. DOT for routine mailing to the Division of fire of a copy of the written report required by 49 CF 171.16.
 - **2550.04.17 Suspension of operations.** The fire chief may temporarily suspend the operation notice whenever road, weather, traffic, or other hazardous circumstances warrant that action.
 - **2550.04.18 Suspension of regulations.** The fire chief shall have the authority to suspend these regulations in whole or part, when extenuating circumstances severely limit transit.
- 2550.04.19 Civil liability. In addition to the criminal penalty provided by Section 2550.04.15.10, in the event of a hazardous materials incident, as described in 49 CF Section 171.16, requiring the response of the division of fire and/or others to control said incident, the transporter (carrier, trucking company, etc.) shall be liable to the city for the payment of all costs and expenses of the division of fire incurred in and about the use of employees, apparatus and materials in the control and/or neutralization of said incident. The amount of such costs and expenses shall be determined by the Director of Public Safety and shall be collected by him in a civil action wherein the city shall be plaintiff and the transporter shall be defendant. This responsibility is not conditioned upon evidence of willfulness or negligence on the part of the transporter.
- **2550.04.15.19.1 Violation.** This section shall apply only if the transporter is in violation of the provisions of this chapter.
- **2550.04.20 Separability.** If any portion of this chapter or any section or part of a section shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration shall be limited solely to that portion, section or part of section that was directly involved in the controversy before the court upon which judgment was rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of the chapter.
- **2550.04.21 Penalty.** Any person who violates any provision of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree. Each violation shall be treated separately. When a violation is a continuing one, each day of the violation constitutes a separate offense.

SECTION 2. That previously existing Sections 2550.04.6 and 2550.04.13.1 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

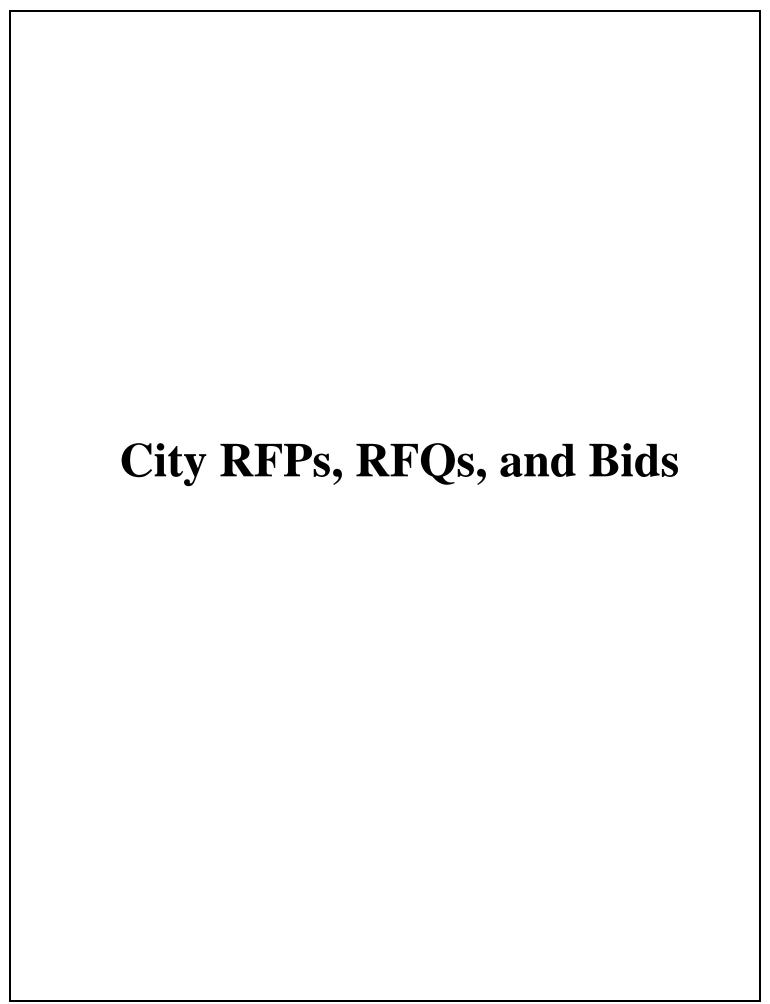

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CITY CODE, CHAPTER 903

DIVISION OF INFRASTRUCTURE MANAGEMENT

CITY OF COLUMBUS, OHIO

SUBJECT: EXCAVATION AND OCCUPANCY PERMITS IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY

EFFECTIVE DATE: JANUARY 2, 2023

RULE:

All public service agencies, companies, corporations, utility companies, and individuals wishing to dig into, under, open holes, ditches, or trenches in any sidewalk, roadway pavement, or public right-of-way or to occupy the right-of-way of any street, alley, or public way of the City of Columbus for any purpose defined under City Code chapter 903 shall obtain the prior consent of the Director of Public Service and/or their designee. Such consent shall be obtained in writing as set forth in the rules of this regulation.

1. General Provisions:

- 1.1 Authority: Chapter 903 of the Columbus City Code, 1959, requires any person or agency desiring to excavate in or to occupy Public Right-of-Way for any construction related purpose to obtain a permit. Section 903.02 of the Columbus City Code authorizes the Director of Public Service to promulgate reasonable rules and regulations to carry out the provision of this Chapter. The Director of Public Service has designated the Administrator of Infrastructure Management to enforce these rules and regulations. Therefore, permits to excavate or to occupy the right of way for construction related purposes shall be submitted to and approved by the Administrator of Infrastructure Management in accordance with the provisions of these rules and regulations. Permits are non-transferable.
 - **1.1.1** Per Chapter 121.05 of the Columbus City Charter, these rules and regulations are to become effective immediately as temporary rules and regulations and shall remain in effect for a period of thirty (30) days after being filed with the city clerk.
 - 1.1.2 Per Chapter 121.05 of the Columbus City Charter, after filing of these rules and regulations with the city clerk to establish them as temporary rules and regulations, these rules and regulations are being published in the City Bulletin prior to the thirty (30) day temporary period expiring and shall remain in effect until amended or repealed.
- **1.2 Type of Permits:** There are two categories of permits covered by these rules and regulations: excavation and occupancy.
 - **1.2.1 Excavation Permits:** This category of permit shall be requested when excavating within the right-of-way of any public street or alley. The work covered by this permit includes excavations in street or alley pavement, sidewalk or driveway, or the non-paved area within the right-of-way for any purpose whatsoever.
 - **1.2.2 Occupancy Permits:** This category of permit shall be requested when it is necessary to occupy the right-of-way of any public street or alley for a purpose related to construction activity. Examples include working on or in any roadway appurtenance, or work on or in buildings or properties outside the right-of-way.

When a permit is issued for a block party, special event, parade, or other event, items within and outside of the permit area may require additional permits for items to be temporarily constructed within road rights -of-way in support of the event.

- **1.3 Restrictions on Issuing Permits:** Permits will not be issued within High Impact Areas when the purpose is vehicle storage on City right-of-way. It is the responsibility of the applicant to store vehicles off-street, or at unreserved long term meters per the City's On-Street Parking out of Service Policy. Occupancy permits are intended for commercial vehicles only. Occupancy permits shall only be issued for the purpose of work within the public right -of-way and activities associated with the adjacent private property by the adjacent property owner or their agent.
 - **1.3.1 High Impact Areas:** For purposes of this regulation, High Impact Areas are defined below:
 - Downtown Business District
 - Major Construction Areas
 - · Arterial Streets (Arterial Streets are those listed on the City of Columbus Thoroughfare Plan)
- **1.4 Application, Review and Approval:** Requests for excavation or occupancy permits shall be made through the Administrator of Infrastructure Management. All requests shall be on forms approved by the Administrator and shall conform to Section 2 of these regulations. No work may begin, or occupancy occur, until a permit has been issued, except as provided within Section 5 of these regulations.
 - 1.4.1 Excavation Permits: Requests to dig, open holes, ditches, bore, or trenches in the sidewalk, roadway or right-of-way of any improved or unimproved street, alley, or public way shall be obtained at least 10 working days in advance of proposed excavation. Review times vary based on the complexity of the project and adequate review time must be considered in the applicant's schedule. The permit office can assist any applicant in determining the extent of the review needed and the time required. Complex reviews can take up to twenty (20) days by City Staff (this does not include any time the applicant has the plans in their possession for revisions). Subsequent reviews can take up to ten (10) days each. The permit request shall include plan, details, and specifications as set forth in Sections 2 and 3 of these regulations.
 - **1.4.2** Occupancy Permits: Requests to occupy or barricade the right-of-way of any improved or unimproved street, alley, or public way shall be submitted at least three (3) working days in advance. When the permit is for a full street closure, permit request shall be submitted at least ten (10) working days in advance. When a full street closure is for a major planned event, the submittal shall be twenty (20) working days in advance.
 - **1.4.3 Review of Plans:** Plans shall be routed for review and approval as set forth in the Right of Way Plan Routing Manual. A copy of this publication may be obtained at the Public Service permit desk.
 - **1.4.4 Issuance:** A permit shall be issued after a permit application has been reviewed and approved as required above, and the applicant has notified the Department of Public Service of a scheduled start date.
- **1.5 Length of Permit:** Permits will be issued only for the time necessary to perform the work. Every effort must be made by the permittee to minimize the amount of time of traffic restrictions or meters out of service when no work occurs. The City has the right to remove meter or lane restrictions left in place three (3) days with no work occurring. Permits issued for less than thirty (30) days may be extended once for a short duration, subject to a re-issue fee specified in Section 7.3.
- 1.6 Liability: The issuance of an Excavation or Occupancy Permit does not relieve the agency or agent requesting the permit from liability for any damage that might occur to the roadway, or any public, or

personal property while performing work authorized by the permit.

- **2. Form of Application or Request for Permit.** Excavation or Occupancy Permit requests shall contain, but not be limited to, the following information:
 - · Name of applicant or agent making request.
 - · Address of applicant or agent.
 - · Contact name and phone number (24-hour emergency number is needed if not the same).
 - · Location of work be specific, provide street name and specify limits (house number as applicable); lane requirements, sidewalk, etc.
 - · Size of trench (width/length/depth).
 - · How long permit is needed.
 - · Proposed work hours if applicable; state if a complete closure is desired.
 - Purpose of request (Utility placement, working in roadway structure, working on or in a building, etc.),
 provide address when appropriate.
 - · When work is to begin and completion date (required to issue permit).
 - Traffic control requirements (full closure, number and location of lanes to be closed, etc.), provide adequate maintenance of traffic notes.
 - · Plans are required by Section 3.
 - Parking Meter Numbers, for all meters the applicant would like reserved, or taken out of service for specified duration during the performance of their work (see Section 11).
- 3. Permit Plans: Whenever construction is to be performed within the right-of-way (excluding service line repair), the permit application shall be accompanied by fully approved plans. The plans shall be of suitable size and clarity to show the nature of the work to be performed. Such plans shall show all existing City utilities and topographic features. The City utilities shall be shown on the plans as to horizontal and vertical alignment based upon an actual field inspection and a diligent search of City records for the same. All conflicts with any City facility shall be resolved to the satisfaction of the owner Division. The applicant should refer to the right of way plan routing manual for more information.
- **4. Restoration:** Whenever any person or agency has the authority to excavate in any sidewalk, roadway or right-of-way of any improved or unimproved street, alley, or public way the person or agency causing such excavation shall be required to return, in accordance with current City standards, the right-of-way to the same quality condition it was prior to the excavation or restore the same in such a manner and by such time as required by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee.

Restoration of any sidewalk, curb, street pavement, etc. shall occur no later than 14 calendar days after the conclusion of any utility repair or installation activity unless expressly authorized otherwise by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee. Construction activity completed from December through April shall be permanently restored no later than May 31st. After May 31st, non-compliance with this required restoration work shall be considered a violation of this policy. Additional permits shall not be issued to the permittee until the violations are corrected to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Service and/or their designee. In addition, each violation may be dealt with in accordance with Section 903.99 of the Columbus City Code.

Permanent repairs to any roadway cut for the purpose of installing, extending, or repairing any utility wire, conduit, or any other repair shall be made in accordance with Department of Public Service Standard Drawing 1441 A, or other suitable means conforming to current City specifications and approved by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee.

Standard Drawing 1441 A has been developed to provide specifications on long pavement cuts, small pavement repairs, and other minor repair work within the right-of-way. Whenever a pavement cut area exceeds the nominal size of 8 feet in width and 100 feet in length, the plans shall provide the method of pavement replacement in accordance with current City standard specifications and are subject to review and approval by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee.

Per Standard Drawing 1441 A whenever a trench is contained within a travel lane and the trench exceeds 100 feet in length the repair shall include milling the full lane width. Where the excavation trench encroaches into more than one lane of traffic, each lane shall be milled and repaved the entire length of the excavation or street block as directed by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee.

Temporary brick street repairs are to be performed in conformance with Standard Drawing 1441 A, Special Note "F", which allow a temporary material placed until permanent restoration can be completed. Temporary material is not to be used without prior approval from the Department of Public Service. Temporary material is not allowed over a period of fourteen (14) calendar days without prior approval from the Department of Public Service. All street bricks that are excavated shall be salvaged intact. The sawing of existing bricks shall not be permitted. Bricks must be removed whole. Bricks not used in pavement restoration shall be cleaned, stacked on pallets, and delivered to the City's Operation Center, located at 1850 East Twenty-Fifth Avenue. (614) 645-8120. Any bricks that are not delivered shall be charged to the applicant at a rate pre-determined by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee or through forfeiture of deposits.

All trenches within the road right-of-way shall be backfilled and temporary pavement applied or securely plated. Item No. 304 material, CDF (control density fill) and/or millings shall not be permitted to be used as temporary pavement on major arterial, collector, or high volume roadways. With the approval of the Director of Public Service and/or their designee, the Temporary Traffic Control Coordinator (645-6269) and/or the Permit Supervisor (645-3039), properly compacted Item No. 304 may be used as temporary fill on residential streets and alleys between intersections. Intersections shall have temporary pavement applied for a maximum of 5 working days.

- **5. Emergency Repairs:** When any public agency, private utility company, or corporation must excavate within the road right-of-way in order to make emergency repairs necessary for the safety and health of the public, the same shall request a permit no later than the following working day. All permanent repairs shall conform to Section 4 of this policy.
- **6. Inspection:** Inspection of work performed under these permits shall be done by personnel of the Department of Public Service. The permittee shall call the telephone number indicated on the permit at least 4 hours before any needed inspection. Any authorized excavation work shall be inspected.
 - **6.1. Inspections:** call the City of Columbus's Division of Infrastructure Management's Permit Section at (614) 645-

7497

- **6.2. Backfill**: Call before backfill operation begins. Approval is needed to start backfill. (4 hrs. notice)
- **6.3. Sidewalk, driveway or curb:** Form work installation inspection is required before placement of material.
- **6.4. Final Inspection:** When all work is complete. Upon a successful final inspection, deposits will be processed and returned to the permit holder.
- 7. Inspection Fees and Deposit Costs: All private companies, corporations, or individuals shall pay, at the time of permit application, a fee as set forth below to cover the administrative costs of issuing the permit(s) and performing the required inspection(s). It is the responsibility of the permit holder to request inspections. Failure to obtain an inspection will result in requiring re-excavation of the location and replacement with approved materials in the presence of proper inspection personnel. In addition, this action may result in the forfeiture of 100% of all deposits, bonds, and fees on account.
 - **7.1 Street Excavation Deposit:** A street excavation deposit shall be required for all roadway excavations when the pavement is open cut. The deposit shall be a minimum of \$800.00 for an open cut area of three square yards or less. For cuts larger than three square yards the deposit shall be \$250.00 per square yard of pavement to be cut. The street excavation deposit shall be refunded if the repair work is inspected and

completed in a manner satisfactory to the Director of Public Service and/or their designee.

- **7.2 Additional Deposits:** If, in the opinion of the Director of Public Service and/or their designee, additional inspections are needed due to the use of granular backfill material, or horizontal directional drilling operations, the permittee shall place on deposit sufficient funds necessary to pay for said inspection services in addition to all other deposits and fees associated with the inspection process. Any unused inspection deposits will be refunded once it has been determined that the work has been completed in a satisfactory manner. Sewer TV Inspection Deposit shall be required where Sewer TV inspection is noted by the Division of Sewerage and Drainage on the Permit Plans (see Section 3 for plan requirements). The Sewer TV Inspection deposit fee shall be determined and paid to the Division of Sewage and Drainage, located at 910 Dublin Road, Attn: Jacque Kelley (614-645-5824).
- **7.3 General Permit Fees:** There are general fees associated with the issuance of an Excavation or Occupancy permits.

Fees are as follows:

· Emergency No Parking Signs: \$.75 each

Application Fee: \$120.00
Inspection Fee: \$90 per hour
Reissued Permits: \$60

Parking Meter Charges: See Section 11

Shared Mobility Devices: \$90 per unit. See Section 18.

· Small Cell Tower non city poles only: \$300 each unit.

Fee for contractors that failed to obtain a permit (after an inspector or other finds work being done without a permit):

· Application Fee 24-48 hours after notification of emergency repair: \$200.00

· Application Fee after 48 hour notice: \$350.00

On Demand Fee: \$250.00

NOTE: Billing of General Fees for all public and private utility companies will require approval from the Director of Public Service and/or their designee.

Projects of a duration requiring multiple inspections will be billed at the \$90 per hour rate. The need for additional inspection will be determined during the plan review process based on the complexity and duration of the project. When an inspector is required to work beyond their normal scheduled hours or weekends, the permittee shall be required to pay any additional inspection cost at an hourly rate. When a Department employee is required to respond to an emergency situation due to neglect of securing a steel plate or other hazardous situation, it will be the responsibility of the permittee to cover the cost of the employee and any material cost to rectify the situation in a safe manner. These costs shall be paid upon receipt of invoice or deducted from the permittee's deposit. Failure to pay these costs may result in the forfeiture of deposit monies, a moratorium on obtaining future permits, or both.

8. Traffic Control: Traffic control devices shall be furnished, erected, maintained, and removed by the permittee in accordance with guidelines published in the manual of "Traffic Control for Construction and Maintenance Operations" current revision. Copies are available at the Ohio Department of Transportation, located at 1980 West Broad Street. In the event of conflicting requirements, any additional maintenance of traffic requirements spelled out in the plans shall take precedence over the above-mentioned manual. Any specific condition attached to the permit by the Temporary Traffic Control Coordinator shall take precedence over both the manual and plan notes.

NOTE: Traffic cones are not permitted as traffic control devices for night work within the City.

9. New Pavement or Re-pavement: No permit will be granted to any person to make any opening in the new pavement or re-pavement of a street or alley, except for the purpose of repairing leaks in pipes, for a period of three

years after the completion of such new pavement or re-pavement. When emergency repairs are necessary, the Director of Public Service and/or their designee shall provide details and specifications on how the permanent pavement repairs are to be made per Standard Drawing 1441.

No permit shall be granted to any person to make any opening in hard surface areas (pavement, sidewalks, curbs, etc.) within right-of-way for Special Improved Streets for a period of five (5) years after construction or substantial construction of such hard surface areas. In addition, within right-of-way of Special Improved Streets, joint use of facilities shall be required so long as there is adequate space available in the existing facilities at reasonable and nondiscriminatory rates. Special Improved streets shall be reviewed and approved by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee upon which hard surface or landscaped improvements have been constructed or proposed to be constructed which are enhanced architecturally, aesthetically and/or structurally compared to standard City specifications for publicly dedicated streets or alleys. The Director of Public Service and/or their designee shall maintain a list of Special Improved Streets together with the beginning and ending dates of the five (5) year period.

- 10. Option for Pavement Repairs by City Contract: A permittee may elect to perform all or part of the repair work required when making a permitted pavement cut. If the permittee is not able to meet the requirements of this regulation and current City standards and specifications governing repairs to utility cuts, the permittee may opt to have all or part of this work performed by the City. The request for the City to perform any and all restorations shall be given at the time the application is submitted for permit processing. If the work is to be performed by the City, a separate pavement repair fee shall be paid to the City for this work. The amount of this pavement repair fee shall be established by unit prices for the quantity of work to be performed. This money shall be collected at the time the permit is issued, unless billing procedures have been approved by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee. The unit price rates shall be made available in advance for cost estimating purposes. The amount due the City shall be equal to the work planned to be performed.
- 11. Parking Meters: Whenever the work being performed restricts the use of City parking meters, the agency requesting the permit shall be responsible for paying the daily meter charge for each meter involved. The permit application shall include the meter numbers affected. When the activities require the removal of the meter heads, or it is determined by the City that meter heads need to be removed, a meter head removal fee shall also be charged. These fees shall be paid at the time the permit is issued. Parking meter fees charged will be the total daily fee, as if the meter is to be occupied for all enforcement hours.

When an occupancy permit is issued where parking meters have been requested to be bagged, each vehicle using a bagged meter location must have a permit. The original occupancy permit must be visible and in the vehicle using the bagged meter location. All other vehicles within the closure limits will be subject to parking restrictions identical to those of loading zones, which allows 15-minute parking unless actively loading or unloading. Permittee shall comply with the City's On-Street Parking Out of Service Policy.

12. Steel Roadway Plates: The City requires that all companies, corporations, or individuals placing steel roadway plates in the right-of-way of any street, alley, or public right-of-way shall notify the Department of Public Service. The contractor's name, employee contact name with a 24-hour emergency telephone number, plate location, number and size of plates, and the approximate number of days planned for placement shall be submitted weekly either by telephone at (614) 645-7497 or via FAX at (614) 645-1876.

The contractor shall also have available sufficient quantity and various sizes of trench plates for their use when needed for protecting and securing trenches opened by the contractor. In the Downtown Business District area, all steel plates shall be a minimum of one inch in thickness. All steel plates shall be secured by using bituminous asphalt material around the perimeter of the plate and shall be a minimum of twenty-four inches wider in width than the actual excavation size, and a minimum of twenty-four inches longer in length than the actual excavation size. Steel plates shall not be left in the roadway for a period to exceed 30 calendar days, unless approved by the Director of Public Service and/or their designee.

NO SPIKES OR PINS ARE PERMITTED TO SECURE A STEEL PLATE.

Steel plates shall have the company name etched, engraved, or welded on each plate placed in road right-of-way, face up for identification and be monitored by the permittee to assure plates are secured and have not moved from their trench. Warning signs (COC - 327 (R/L) must be placed in such a way that it does not obstruct motorist or pedestrians, identifying a steel plate is located in the roadway per standard drawing 1441. When steel plates are to be placed on roadways with a posted speed limit of 35 M.P.H. or greater, advanced warning signs (COC - 328) must be placed per standard drawing 1441. Failure to secure a roadway steel plate may result in fines and penalties per City Code, Chapter 903.99.

- **13. Emergency Phone Number Posting:** The permit holder shall post in a conspicuous place at the job site a sign with a 24-hour emergency phone number. This shall be required whenever any travel portion of a lane or a sidewalk is barricaded.
- 14. Dumpster/Containers: All dumpsters or containers placed within public right-of-way must have an occupancy permit. This regulation does not apply to the trash containers placed by the Refuse Collection Division. Occupancy permits for dumpsters or containers may be issued to the vendor who supplies them or the permittee requesting the use of one. The vendor shall be responsible for providing a dumpster or container in compliance with current City of Columbus regulations. Each dumpster or container shall be equipped with reflectorized hi-intensity barricade tape (minimum 8 inches wide, standard orange and silver). A minimum of two bands each are required for dumpsters or containers less than four feet in height and three bands for dumpsters and containers over four feet in height. Each band shall be spaced evenly around the perimeter of the dumpster or container. The company's name and a 24-hour telephone number shall be placed on each side so that it is clearly visible. A weatherproof 9"x12" plastic envelope shall be affixed to the dumpster or container to provide a means of posting the permit. The permittee shall be responsible for the placement of two lighted barrels. The requirement of such shall be evaluated at the time of permit application or when a hazard develops.

If a permit is only for a dumpster or container to be placed in the right of way and not part of a larger construction project, it shall be limited to a seven (7) day period unless approved in advance as part of the permit process.

If a dumpster or container is to occupy an actual parking meter space, the fee(s) for that particular meter shall be charged in place. (See Section 11).

- **15. Special Duty Police Officers:** When required by the permit, or if required by the City Service or Safety Director, the permittee shall be responsible for hiring and paying for the services of Uniformed Special Duty Police Officers. Police officers shall be required at all times when working within a signalized crosswalk and for controlling traffic in a 2-way 1-lane traffic pattern as determined by the Director. The City of Columbus will determine the number of officers required. An officer may be obtained by calling (614) 645-4795 and obtain the "Guidelines for Supervising Special Duty Police Officers," issued by the Chief of Police.
- **16. Penalty:** Whoever violates any provision of this policy shall be deemed guilty of a first degree misdemeanor and fined not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or imprisoned for not more than six months, or both. Any such violation shall constitute a separate offense on each successive day continued, in accordance with Columbus City Code, Section 903.99.
- 17. Right to Decline: The City of Columbus reserves the right to decline additional permits to a previous permit holder for other projects if a violation exists. No permit shall be issued until the violations are corrected to the satisfaction of the Division of Infrastructure Management Administrator or designee.

The City may limit the approved use of the right-of-way at any time due to unforeseen operational circumstances, but shall make every reasonable effort to alleviate the effects of any such limitation.

18. Shared Mobility Devices: Shared Mobility Devises (SMD) means small mobility devices, such as bicycles, scooters, or other similar mobility devices as determined by the Director of Public Service, including electronic versions thereof, that are offered for short term rental to subscribers on a minute, hourly, or daily basis for a fee for short distance travel. The fee shall include, but shall not be limited to, per trip, per time period, or on a subscription

basis.

Councilmember Emmanuel V. Remy, Chair of the Public Safety Committee, will host a public hearing to review the 2022 Liquor Objection request by the Columbus City Attorney's office.

Each year, Columbus is required to submit any objections to the renewal of liquor permits within the City by December 31. Throughout the calendar year, the City Attorney's office works with community leaders, Columbus Police, Fire, Health, Building, and Code Enforcement, as well as various state entities, including the Ohio Investigative Unit, to identify and investigate liquor permitted locations that have violations of state and city code and chronic criminal activity (including violent crime, overdoses, and liquor violations). Proposed objections are then presented to Council, and if approved via resolution, are sent to the Ohio Division of Liquor Control. The objection does not result in any immediate change to business operations. The City Attorney's office is committed to working with these businesses to enact appropriate security and safety improvements for their establishments and surrounding neighborhood.

Below is the current 2022 objections list. A handful of objections remain from the 2021 liquor objections list that have not been given a hearing date before the Division of Liquor Control, and have not yet fully resolved. Until a final agreed solution can be reached with the businesses or until a decision is made before the Division, the City will renew the following objections from last year. SUBJECT: SIDEWALK REPAIR GRANT PROGRAM

EFFECTIVE DATE: JANUARY 2, 2023

RULE:

The abutting private property owner(s) of record shall be responsible for the proper maintenance and repair of all sidewalks, shared-use paths and driveway approaches within the abutting right-of-way for any improved or unimproved street, alley, or other public way within the city, which provides access around, in, or to said private property in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 905 of Columbus City Code and these rules and regulations.

The City may provide grant funds to assist in the payment of these required repairs. The grant money is subject to

the availability of funds and the applicant meeting the grant requirements.

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1. General Provisions:

- **1.1 Authority:** These rules and regulations were created under the authority provided within Chapter 905 of Columbus City Code.
- **1.2 Definitions:** Terms contained within these rules and regulations shall have the meanings outlined within Section 905.02 of Columbus City Code.

2. Purpose Of The Sidewalk Repair Grant Program:

2.1 Purpose: To provide grant money to low income residential property owners and Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization (NCR) district small business owners to help them make sidewalk repairs.

3. Eligibility Requirements:

3.1 Violation Letter: The residential property or business owner must have received a violation letter

requiring the owner to repair the sidewalk, and/or shared-use path, and/or driveway approach within the abutting right-of-way to their property. Alternatively, the property or business owner can self-report their property. If found to be in violation, a violation letter will be issued.

3.2 Other Requirements: The residential property or business owner must meet the income eligibility requirements and the property eligibility requirements to be eligible for a grant.

4. Income Eligibility Requirements:

- **4.1 Residences:** Residential households must have a total gross adjusted income of 80% or less of the Area Median Income (AMI) as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), with adjustments for household size.
- **4.2 Residence Household Size:** Total residential household income includes the income of people 18 years of age and older living in the home at least 50% of the year.
- **4.3 Small Businesses:** Small business owners in Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization districts must meet the income eligibility limits in 49 Code of Federal Regulation part 26.67.

5. Property Eligibility Requirements:

- **5.1 Property Location:** Eligible properties are residential single-family owner-occupied properties located within the City of Columbus corporate limits or small business enterprises located within one of the City's six Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization (NCR) Districts.
- **5.2 Ownership and Occupancy:** The applicant must have owned and occupied the property for at least 12 months prior to the time of grant application.
- **5.3 Property Tax Status:** Property taxes must be current at the time of application or the owner must be on a verifiable payment plan with the Franklin County Auditor's Office.
- **5.4 Money Owed to the City of Columbus:** Property owners must not be delinquent on taxes or other money owed to the City of Columbus.

6. Grant Amount:

- **6.1 Dollar Amount:** Residential properties can receive a maximum of \$2,500.00 or the amount of the required repairs, whichever is less. Eligible small businesses located in a Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization (NCR) can receive a grant amount equal to the entire cost of the repairs.
- **6.2** Availability of Funds: Grants are dependent on the availability of funds.
- **6.3 Cost of Repairs in Excess of Grant Funds:** If the grant amount does not cover the entire cost of the repair, the property owner is responsible for the remaining balance.

7. Program Requirements:

- **7.1 Items Eligible for Repair:** Only items specifically stated in the Notice of Violation letter are eligible for repair with this grant money.
- **7.2 Contractor Selection:** Repairs can be made by a contractor the property owner selects, by the City's contractor, or by the property owner. If the property owner makes the repairs without using a contractor, the property owner will only be reimbursed the cost of materials.

- **7.3 Payment of Grant Funds:** The City will pay the grant amount directly to the contractor unless the contractor verifies they have been paid in full by the property owner. Property owners that make the repairs without using a contractor will only be reimbursed the cost of materials.
- **7.4 Property Owner Responsible for Contracting:** If the property owner elects to have the City make the repairs, the City's contractor will be used. If the property owner does not want the City to make the repairs, the property owner will be responsible for contracting with an approved contractor to perform the work, and also for paying the balance of the charges after the grant amount is applied.
- **7.5 Property Tax Assessment:** If the property owner wants the balance of the charges to be assessed against property taxes, the repairs must be performed by the City's contractor. The City will pay any remaining balance after the grant amount is applied, and the amount paid by the City will be assessed against property taxes.

8. How To Apply For A Grant:

- **8.1 Where to get the Application:** Download the application from the Department of Public Service's website or contact 311.
- **8.2 Returning the Application:** Mail or deliver the completed application to the Department of Public Service.

9. Permit and Fee:

- **9.1 Permit Required:** A permit is required for repair work to be performed on a sidewalk, driveway approach, and/or shared use path located within the public right-of-way.
- **9.2** Application Fee: The application fee for the permit is \$165 and includes 1/2 hour of inspection.

SUBJECT: NON-COMMERCIAL OCCUPANCY IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY

EFFECTIVE DATE: JANUARY 2, 2023

RULE:

All governmental agencies, companies, corporations, and individuals wishing to occupy any street, sidewalk, alley, or public right-of-way of the City of Columbus for any purpose other than construction activity shall obtain the consent of the Director of the Department of Public Service. Such consent shall be in writing as set forth in the rules of this regulation.

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1. General Provisions:

- **1.1 Authority:** Chapter 906 of the Columbus City Code requires any person or agency desiring to occupy public right-of-way for any non-commercial purpose to first obtain a permit. Such permits are issued by and through the Department of Public Service, Division of Infrastructure Management Administrator in accordance with the provisions of this regulation.
- 2. Type of Permits: There are two types of permits for occupying the public right-of-way:
 - **2.1 Street Occupancy Permits:** This type of permit is needed when it is necessary to occupy the right-of-way of any public street or alley.
 - 2.2 Sidewalk Occupancy Permits: This type of permit is needed when it is necessary to occupy the

right-of-way of any sidewalk. Pedestrian access must be maintained at all times with a minimum of six (6) feet of clearance at all times.

3. Parking Meters: Whenever the event being performed restricts the use of City parking meters, the applicant shall be responsible for obtaining the parking meter numbers to be reserved and paying the total daily meter charge for each of the parking meters reserved. The permit application shall include the parking meter numbers affected. Parking meter fees charged will be the total daily fee, as if the meter is to be occupied for all enforcement hours.

When an occupancy permit is issued where parking meters are to be bagged, each vehicle using a meter must have a permit. The occupancy permit must be visible and displayed on the front dash of each vehicle.

4. Permits Not Issued For:

- · Vehicle storage on City right-of-way within High Impact Areas (as defined by Section 8)
- · Structures over 200 square feet
- · Heating and/or cooling devices in the public right-of-way
- · Any type of camping or cooking
- **5. Application and Review:** Requests for occupancy permits shall be made through the Division of Infrastructure Management Administrator. All requests shall be on forms approved by the Division of Infrastructure Management Administrator and shall conform to Section 2 of these regulations. No occupancy may begin until a permit has been issued.

Requests to occupy the right-of-way of any improved or unimproved street, sidewalk, alley or public way shall be submitted at least five (5) working days prior to an event. When the applicant is requesting a full lane closure, the request shall be submitted at least ten (10) working days in advance.

- **6. Review and Approval:** Each permit request shall be reviewed as indicated below and is subject to approval by the Division of Infrastructure Management Administrator.
 - **6.1 Review:** All occupancy permit applications shall be reviewed by the Division of Infrastructure Management and the Columbus Police Division, Traffic Bureau.
 - **6.2 Application Approval or Denial; Appeal:** Applications for permits shall be processed in order of receipt by the Division of Infrastructure Management.

The Division shall decide whether to grant or deny a permit or a request for an extension of time within five (5) working days unless, by written notice to the applicant, it extends the period an additional five (5) working days.

If the Division denies an application, it must notify the applicant by email or in writing of the grounds for denial. Denial of an application or extension of time may be appealed in writing to the Director within ten (10) working days of the date of the denial. The Director shall decide any appeal within seven (7) working days of receipt of the appeal and shall notify the applicant of the decision by email or in writing.

The Division may only deny an application for a permit on one or more of the following grounds:

1) The applicant or the person on whose behalf the application for permit was made has on prior occasions made material misrepresentations regarding the nature or size of the structure and/or associated use or activity previously permitted or has violated the terms of prior permits issued to or

on behalf of the applicant;

- 2) The application for permit (including any required attachments and submissions) is not fully completed and executed:
- 3) The applicant has not tendered the required application fee with the application;
- 4) The application for permit contains a material falsehood or misrepresentation;
- 5) The applicant is legally incompetent to contract or to sue and be sued;
- 6) The applicant or the person on whose behalf the application for permit was made has on prior occasions damaged City property and has not paid in full for such damage, or has other outstanding and unpaid debts to the City;
- 7) A fully executed prior application for permit for the same time and place has been received, and a permit has been or will be granted to a prior applicant authorizing a structure associated with a use or activity which does not reasonably permit multiple occupancy of the place requested in the application;
- 8) Any use or activity by the applicant associated with the proposed structure would conflict with a previously planned use or activity organized and conducted by the City and previously scheduled for the same time and place;
- 9) The proposed structure and/or associated use or activity would present an unreasonable danger to the health or safety of the public or would be otherwise prohibited by law, including but not limited to any applicable requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

In no event may any application be denied or conditions placed on any permit issued based on the content of any speech or communicative activity associated with the proposed structure or occupancy.

- **6.3 Permit Expiration:** Permits shall be issued for the time period necessary to conduct the activity in accordance with these regulations. No permit shall be issued for a period longer than five (5) consecutive days. No permit will be issued back to back or consecutively. An applicant who is issued an initial permit may receive a subsequent permit for the same area one (1) day after the date of expiration of a previous permit, provided the applicant meets all other rules and regulations. Applicants for subsequent permits will be subject to a priority given to a new applicant for the same area. The five day time limit for permits may be extended by the Administrator of the Division of Infrastructure Management upon request of the permit holder and for good cause shown.
- **7. Liability:** The issuance of an Occupancy Permit does not relieve the permit holder from liability for any damage that might occur to the Public right-of-way, street, sidewalk, the public, or personal property while engaging in activities authorized by the permit.
- 8. High Impact Areas: For purposes of this regulation, High Impact Areas are defined below:
 - Downtown Business District
 - · Construction Areas
 - Arterial Streets (Arterial streets are those listed on the current City of Columbus Thoroughfare Plan).
- **9. Form of Application or Request for Permit:** Occupancy Permit requests shall contain, but not be limited to, the following information:
 - · Name of applicant making request
 - · Address of applicant
 - · Contact name and phone number (24-hour emergency number is needed)
 - · Location of event or activity street address number if applicable (permits issued per location, not per structure)
 - Days needed (3 days maximum)

- · Proposed hours for event
- · Purpose of request
- · Start date
- · Traffic control needs
- · Parking meter numbers (see Section 3)
- 10. Inspection: Inspection of occupancy shall be completed by personnel of the Division of Infrastructure Management. Any additional inspections required by other city agencies will be determined at the time of processing an application. Upon a successful final inspection, any deposits will be processed and returned to the permit holder.
- 11. Fees: All applicants shall pay a fee as set forth below to cover the administrative costs of issuing the permit and performing an inspection of the site. All fees are to be paid at the time the permit is obtained. These fees are non-refundable.
 - · Application Fee: \$60.00
 - · Parking Meter Charges: various, depending on meter
 - · Emergency No Parking Signs: \$.75 each

12. Obligations of the Permit Holder:

- 12.1 Traffic Control: Traffic control devices shall be furnished, erected, maintained, and removed by the permit holder in accordance with guidelines published in the manual of "Traffic Control for Construction and Maintenance Operations" current revision. Copies are available at the Ohio Department of Transportation, located at 1980 West Broad Street. Any specific condition attached to the permit by the Division of Infrastructure Managements Construction Coordinator shall take precedence over the manual.
- **12.2 Monitoring of Site:** No structure or personal property used for an event or activity, to include shelter tents, chairs and tables, may remain in the public right-of-way unattended, and in no case may remain in the public right-of-way between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. unless the street is closed under the authority of a block party permit. These hours may be extended by the Administrator of Infrastructure Management upon request of the permit holder and for good cause shown.
- 12.3 Maintenance of Site: It shall be the responsibility of the permit holder to provide all materials and services necessary to maintain the permit area in a clean, safe and sanitary condition. These materials include but are not limited to: trash receptacles, portable restroom facilities, and snow and ice removal with pre-approved materials. The permit holder shall be responsible for any actual costs or damages incurred by the City as a result of the use of the right-of-way, including but not limited to, reimbursement, at the employees' regular hourly rates, for time spent by city employees removing debris or repairing damage resulting from the event.
- 12.4 Special Duty Police Officers: When required by the permit, or if required by the City Service or Safety Director, the permit holder shall be responsible for hiring and paying for the services of Uniformed Special Duty Police Officers. Police officers shall be required at all times when event activities are at or near street intersections. The City of Columbus will determine the number of officers required. The determination as to the need and number of any special duty officers shall be made solely on the basis of traffic control, which basis shall be specified and communicated by email or in writing to the applicant by the City official making the determination. An officer may be obtained by calling (614) 645-4795.

13. Penalty: Whoever violates any provision of Chapter 906 of the Columbus City Code shall be deemed guilty of a first degree misdemeanor and fined not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or imprisoned for not more than six months, or both. Any such violation shall constitute a separate offense on each successive day continued, in accordance with Columbus City Code, Section 906.99.

The City may limit the approved use of the right-of-way at any time due to unforeseen operational circumstances, but shall make every reasonable effort to alleviate the effects of any such limitation.

1. Purpose

The City of Columbus recognizes that public on-street parking as well as private parking for mobile food vending businesses is limited in many commercial, residential, historic, and mixed-use neighborhoods. In order to preserve the vitality for residents and to balance it with the needs of businesses in areas of limited parking, it is necessary to establish a temporary commercial zone permit for mobile food vending. The purpose of these rules and regulations is to establish requirements and processes for application, review, and issuance of permits for the temporary occupancy of on-street parking by a licensed mobile food vendor while maintaining vehicular traffic access on the street, road, or alley.

2. Authority:

- **2.1** Pursuant to the authority granted under Chapter 922, Chapter 523, and Chapter 573 of the Columbus City Codes, 1959, the Director of Public Service hereby adopts, establishes, and publishes these rules and regulations to be effective at the earliest time allowed by law.
- **2.2** These rules and regulations supersede all previously promulgated rules and regulations for temporary commercial zone permits, and are applicable to public right-of-way, and city-owned and operated public parking facilities.
- 3. **Definitions:** The following words, terms and phrases, when used in these rules and regulations, shall have the meanings ascribed to them, except when the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - **3.1** Application means a form created by the Department of Public Service, Division of Infrastructure Management.
 - **3.2** *Commercial zone* means a geographic area that has a combination of public right of way access, vehicular traffic patterns, pedestrian density, and mobility options, such that reasonable access for mobile food vending does not constitute an unreasonable threat to public health and safety.
 - **3.3** *Congestion Zone* means a geographic area that has a combination of public right of way parking limitations, meter restrictions, vehicular traffic patterns, pedestrian density, and mobility issues, such that unrestricted access for mobile food vending constitutes an unreasonable threat to public health and safety.
 - **3.4** *Department* means the City of Columbus Department of Public Service, Division of Infrastructure Management.
 - **3.5** *Director* means the Director of the Department of Public Service, or designee.
 - 3.6 Mobile food vendor means every corporation, association, joint stock association,

person, firm or partnership, their lessees, directors, receivers, trustees, appointees by any court whatsoever, or the heirs, executors, administrators, or personal representatives or assignees of any deceased owner, owning, controlling, operating or managing any mobile food vending unit.

- **3.7** *Non-commercial zone* means all areas within the corporate limits of the city of Columbus that have not been designated a "congestion zone" or a "commercial zone." Non-commercial zone includes any public right of way where the city of Columbus requires, at all times, a permit for parking.
- **3.8** *Petition* means a form created by the Department which is developed from an application for a temporary commercial zone, which includes the requested parking area. There shall be an area on each petition for property owners or tenants, or building managers whose property adjoins the side(s) of the public street affected by the permit to sign as being in favor of the requested permit.
- **3.9** *Public Right of Way* means any property owned by the city of Columbus, including but not limited to, any street, road, alley, sidewalk, vacant lot, or other tract of land.
- **3.10 Residential Zone** means a geographic area that is made up of predominately single-family and/or multi-family housing.
- **3.11 Temporary Commercial Zone** means the closing of one (1) or more parking locations in the public right of way between one (1) or more intersections, while maintaining vehicular traffic access on the street, road, or alley, for the purpose of conducting commercial activity, including mobile food vending.
- 3.12 Temporary Commercial Zone Permit (hereinafter referred to as "Permit') means a permit issued by the Department to an Applicant for the temporary closure and occupancy of one or more on-street parking spaces, but not for temporary closure of the public right-of-way.

4 General Permit Rules

- **4.1** No person shall use any public right of way to establish a temporary commercial zone without first obtaining a temporary commercial zone permit.
- **4.2** A permit is required in a residential zone anytime a mobile food vendor operates in the public right of way.
- **4.3** A permit is required in a commercial zone anytime a mobile food vendor operates in any parking space that is not the first or last parking space adjacent to an intersection of any street, road or alley.
- **4.4** A permit is required in a congestion zone anytime a mobile food vendor operates in any parking space between the hours of 6:00 AM and 3:00 AM that is not a designated

mobile food vending parking space or the first or last parking space adjacent to an intersection of any street, road or alley after 10:00 PM.

- **4.5** Each permit is the property of the City of Columbus. Improper use or forgery of a permit may result in the revocation of the current permit and/or non-renewal of any future permit application, as determined by the Department.
- **4.6** No permit shall be issued to an Applicant with unpaid City of Columbus parking tickets, or who is delinquent on any taxes of other obligations to the City or County.
- **4.7** Each permit issued by the Department shall display the motor vehicle's license number. The permit shall be displayed on the driver's side dashboard of the lower front window of the vehicle. A permit is valid only for the location and dates designated on the permit.
- 4.8 Permits are non-transferrable.

5 Limitation On Parking Closures

- **5.1** In a residential zone, no temporary commercial zone permit shall be effective for more than three (3) consecutive days without written approval from the Director.
- **5.2** In a commercial zone, no temporary commercial zone permit shall be effective for more than three (3) consecutive days without the written approval from the Director.
- **5.3** In a congestion zone, no temporary commercial zones permit shall be effective for more than one (1) day without written approval from the Director.
- **5.4** In a congestion zone, no more than three (3) total permits shall be issued for the same day without written approval from the Director.
- 5.5 No individual or organization shall cause or allow the operation of a mobile food vending unit in the public right-of-way or in any city-owned and operated public parking facilities, as prohibited by Title 5 of Columbus City Codes, 1959, without first obtaining a Mobile Food Vending License and Right of Way Permit.
- **5.6** The Department, the Columbus Division of Police and the Columbus Division of Fire may temporarily suspend permit parking if the public right-of-way is needed for an emergency or temporary use, including, but not limited to, the construction, maintenance, or repair of a street or utility or special event.
- 5.7 Whenever an Applicant requests a Permit for a metered parking space, the applicant shall be responsible for obtaining the parking meter numbers to be reserved and pay the total daily meter charge for each of the parking meters reserved. The Application shall include the parking meter numbers affected. Parking meter fees charged will be the total daily fee, as if the meter is to be occupied for all enforcement hours.

- **5.8** When a Permit is issued where parking meters are to be bagged, each vehicle using a meter must have a permit. The temporary commercial zone permit must be visible and displayed on the front dash of each vehicle.
- **5.9** No permit shall be issued on any street or area that is a no stopping zone.
- 5.10 At no time shall the permitted vender be allowed to park on a sidewalk or drive over the curb.

6 Indemnification And Hold Harmless Agreement

- **6.1** The applicant shall agree in writing on a form provided by the City to hold the city of Columbus, its employees, agents, servants, boards and commissions harmless from liability arising from the issuance of the temporary commercial zone permit and from the conduct of the participants or customers of the temporary commercial zone.
- **6.2** The applicant shall agree in writing on a form provided by the City to indemnify the city of Columbus, its employees, agents, servants, boards and commissions against all claims of injury or damage to persons or property caused by the negligent acts of the applicant.

7 Permit Application Process

7.1 Applications shall be submitted to the Department at the following address

- **7.2** Requests to occupy the right-of-way of any improved or unimproved street, sidewalk, alley or public way shall be submitted at least five (5) working days prior to an event.
- **7.3** Applications for permits shall be processed in order of receipt by the Department.
- **7.4** Applicants requesting a permit in a residential or commercial zone may include multiple dates over a three (3) month period for a specific location per application.
- **7.5** Applicants requesting a permit in a congestion zone may include up to three (3) dates in a thirty (30) day period for a specific location per application.
- **7.6** If the parking requested for a Permit is located within the boundaries of a civic association, business association, area comm1ss1on and/or special improvement district that represents the area proposed for a Permit. The applicant is required to obtain a Certificate of Appropriateness or a letter of support from the appropriate commission or association. The Department shall consider the input from the applicable organization(s) a s i t r e v i e w s t h e A p p l i c a t i o n.

7.7 Following the review of the permit application and complete petition, the Director shall take one of the following actions:

- Approve the permit application as submitted; or
- Deny the permit application, with basis for denial; or
- Recommend to the Applicant approval of the petition with changes, with basis for recommendation.
- 7.8 A Permit shall be issued if the following requirements are met:
 - The Application is on the form provided by the Department; and
 - The Applicant has met the requirements of the Application and paid the required fees; and
 - The Applicant has submitted a petition bearing the signatures of all property owners or business owners whose property is within twenty-five (25) feet of the parking space(s) affected by the permit. A petition with less than the required signatures may be accepted provided the applicant has demonstrated and documented, in person and in writing, a good faith effort to contact the business owners or property owners who did not sign the petition; and
 - The Applicant has executed the indemnity agreement; and
 - The Applicant has presented proof of a current and valid Mobile Food Vending License and a MFV Right of Way Permit; and
 - The Applicant has agreed to otherwise abide by the relevant rules and regulations regarding such mobile food vending activity;
 - The Applicant is not delinquent on any taxes or other obligations to the city or county; and
 - The Applicant has no unpaid parking citations; and
 - In consideration of the input from an applicable civic association, business
 association, area commission or special improvement district, the Department
 has made a determination that the public health, safety or welfare will not be
 negatively impacted upon the granting or renewal of a Permit.
- 7.9 The decision of the Director shall be final.
- **8 Permit Application:** The Application for a Permit shall be on a form provided by the Department, and shall require, at a minimum, the following information:
 - Name and mailing address of the Applicant
 - Name of vendor(s), if not the Applicant
 - Motor vehicle year, make and current year motor vehicle registration
 - Mobile Food Vending License Number or decal number
 - Contact name and phone number (24-hour emergency number is needed)
 - Location of event or activity street address number if applicable (permits issued per location, not per structure)
 - Days requested for permit activity
 - Proposed hours for permit activity
 - · Purpose of request
 - Start date
 - Traffic control needs
 - Parking meter numbers

• Valid government photo ID at the time of purchase.

9 Permit Fees

- **9.1** All applicants shall pay a fee as set forth below to cover the administrative costs of issuing the permit and performing an inspection of the site.
- 9.2 All fees are to be paid at the time the permit is obtained.
- 9.3 The fee for a Permit shall be \$120.00.
- **9.4** Parking meter out of service fees will vary, depending on meter duration, location and hours of operation, and shall be imposed as if the meter requested for a Permit is fully occupied for the duration of the Permit. Please contact the Permit Office at (614) 645 -7497 for more information.

10 Refunds, Transfers, and Expiration

- 10.1 Permit fees shall not be refunded.
- 10.2 A Permit is specific to a specific location, and shall not be transferred to another location or vehicle.

11 Enforcement, Denial, Revocation, Suspension, and Termination

- 11.1 The Director, the Director of the Department of Public Safety, the Director of the Department of Development, the Health Commissioner, and his/her designees shall have the authority to inspect and enforce the provisions of these Rules and Regulations.
- 11.2 The use of a Permit is subject to the enforcement of applicable local and state traffic, parking, general offenses, and right-of-way occupancy codes and regulations. Enforcement of these rules and regulations may include parking citation and/or impoundment, suspension, revocation, termination or denial of a Permit, or in egregious circumstances up to and including criminal prosecution pursuant to Section 922.99 of Columbus City Code.
- 11.3 The Department may deny issuing a Permit or revoke or suspend without refund any portion of any fees for a Permit if:
 - The permit holder fails to comply with the requirements of these rules and regulations or other applicable law;
 - The permit holder makes a false statement of material fact on an application for a Permit; or
 - 3. The permit holder misuses, copies or transfers a Permit without written approval from the Department.

SUBJECT: SPECIAL HAULING PERMITS (SHP)

EFFECTIVE DATE: JANUARY 2, 2023

Purpose:

These rules and regulations are necessary to mitigate the deterioration of streets, highways, bridges, utilities and other City-owned structures caused by overweight and oversized vehicles. Sections 5577.01 to 5577.15 of the Ohio Revised Code address the weight and dimension limits for such vehicles. Section 4513.34 of the Ohio Revised Code and Section 2139 of the Columbus City Code authorize the Director of Public Service to issue permits for those loads that exceed the statutory weight and dimension limits contained in the Ohio Revised Code. These limitations and provisions described below are the general requirements placed on the operation of the over dimension and overweight vehicles traveling on roadways and are in addition to specific provisions stated on the Special Hauling Permit (SHP) or its attachments. For reference or detailed information, please refer to the ODOT Special Hauling Permits Operational Guide or contact the City of Columbus Permit Section.

1. General Permit Requirements:

- 1.1 No application for a Special Hauling Permit (SHP) shall be approved unless the application is legible and complete.
- **1.2** A copy of the current and valid Special Hauling Permit (SHP) issued by the City of Columbus(COC) shall be in the possession of the driver at all times during the progress of transportation and shall be shown on demand to any law enforcement officer, Ohio State Highway Patrol or to any employee of City of Columbus. The SHP shall be clearly legible and free of any markings, writing, symbol, logo, letterhead, characters or inscriptions that are not part of the SHP as transmitted by COC (an additional tele-facsimile header is allowed).
- 1.3 The permission granted in the SHP restricts the movement of the vehicle(s) or object(s) to the highways specified, between the points designated, and within the time allotted. Permittee shall check the route for abnormal, changed, or unknown/unusual conditions which may exist during any transport. Permits are only lawful on city streets. At the discretion of the local authority provided in the Ohio Revised Code, they are not valid on the interstate system, US routes, and state routes under the authority of the state of Ohio. Permittee shall obtain permission to travel county or township roads or local streets not part of the City of Columbus Roadway System within the city from the proper governmental agencies.

- 1.4 No vehicle(s) or object(s) being transported under a SHP shall be parked on the roadway at any time except in case of an emergency, in which case permittee shall be responsible for obtaining adequate protection for the traveling public while such vehicle or object is parked. The vehicle(s) shall not be loaded or unloaded while on the roadway.
- **1.5** The driver of the permitted vehicle must comply with all laws, rules, regulations or credentials covering the movement of traffic over highways and streets and Commercial Motor Vehicle operations.
- 1.6 SHPs will not generally be issued for built-up loads that are divisible into legal loads or loads that have not been loaded to the least over dimension or the least overweight. However, miscellaneous items may, however, be transported on the same vehicle with an over dimensional piece or pieces as long as the miscellaneous items do not add to the over dimension. It is not necessary to identify these miscellaneous items. If, in the event of an extenuating circumstance, an SHP is issued for a divisible load in which two or more pieces add to the over dimension or over weight, such load shall be adequately described
- 1.7 An SHP is void at any time that road, weather or traffic conditions make travel unsafe, as determined by the State Highway Patrol or local law enforcement.
- **1.8** Movement of mobile homes, manufactured structures, office trailers, and park model recreational vehicles is prohibited when wind velocity exceeds 25 mph on the roadway or 15 mph on bridges.
- 1.9 The duration of the SHP shall not extend beyond the expiration date of the insurance policy filed with the Department.
- 1.10 The original permit and any attachments as issued must be carried in the cab of the vehicle during movement.
- 1.11 The permittee is solely responsible for renewing its permit prior to its expiration date. The City of Columbus shall not issue any notice prior to expiration of said permit. The permittee is also responsible for ensuring that the permit accurately describes the vehicle and load. The permit is null and void if there are any inaccuracies contained in the description of the vehicle or load.

2. Type Of

Permits:

2.1 Single Trip

- 2.1.1 Single Trip permits will be issued for a specific origin and destination. This permit may also include a return to the stated point of origin. This type of permit would be appropriate when a load is needed at a job site and is then returned to the point of origin all within the effective dates of the permit. Application must include the specific route proposed.
- 2.1.2 Single Trip permits will be issued for vehicles that are over 120,000 pounds gross weight and/or over 90 feet in length and/or over 11 feet in width and/or above 13'-6" in height.
- 2.1.3 Single Trip permits are issued to the specific truck or commercial tractor used for the load or loads. When indicated on the application, various trailers may be used. On overweight configurations, the trailers must be identical as far as number of axles, axle spacing, axle weights, and number of tires on each axle and the sizes of those tires.
- 2.1.4 Permittee will have 5 consecutive days to move the vehicle.

2.2 Continuing Annual Permits (Less Than 120,000 Lbs. GVW)

- 2.2.1 When more than one load needs to be moved, a 365 day continuing permit may be issued to a specific vehicle including an approved load for repeated one-way movement between the same two points over prescribed routes. This permit may also include a return to the stated point of origin. Maximum duration of validity is 365 days.
- 2.2.2 The permit is issued to the truck or commercial tractor. When indicated on the application, various trailers may be used. On overweight configurations, the trailers must be identical as far as number of axles, axle spacing, axle weights, and number of tires on each axle and the sizes of those tires.

2.2.3 The load, in addition to being under 120,000 lbs. gross weight, must not be greater than 13'-6" in height and not greater than 11 feet in width. If any of these conditions exist, a single trip permit must be obtained per Section 2.1.

2.3 Construction Equipment (UNDER 120,000 LBS. GVW)

- 2.3.1 This specialized permit is used for the frequent movement of over width construction machinery to and from job sites. To qualify for this permit, the vehicle and load must be legal in accordance with Section 5577.04 through 5577.05 of the Ohio Revised Code. Maximum duration of validity is 365 days.
- 2.3.2 Loads may consist of small dozers, backhoes, or other similar equipment being transported on straight trucks or on equipment trailers pulled by trucks, or on semi-trailers hauled by commercial tractor. Field office trailers towed on their own undercarriages may also be included. The permit is issued to the truck or commercial tractor. When indicated on the application, various trailers may be used.
- 2.3.3 Be alert for overhead obstructions and be aware that posted limits, including those on pavements and bridges, must be obeyed.
- 2.3.4 The load, in addition to being under 120,000 lbs. gross weight, must not be greater than 13'-6" in height and not greater than 11 feet in width. If any of these conditions exist, a single trip permit must be obtained per Section 2.1.
- 2.3.5 Revisions may be issued upon request at no charge whenever construction impedes movement along the assigned route. Request may be made by calling the Permit Office at 614-645-7497.
- 3. Fees: The fees for government projects may be waived at the discretion of the Director of Public Service.
 - 3.1 OVERSIZE LOAD (1 TIME MOVE)
 - § \$100.00
 - 3.2 OVERSIDE LOAD (ANNUAL)
 - § 80,000 to 90,000 lbs. GVW = \$500.00
 - § 90,001 to 105,000 lbs. GVW = \$1,150.00
 - § 105,001 to 120,000 lbs. GVW = \$1,700.00

4. VEHICLE OPERATING LIMITATIONS:

- **4.1** No vehicle(s) or object(s) being transported under an SHP shall travel in convoy with any other oversize /overweight vehicle or vehicle and load. Convoying is defined as operating within 500' of any other permitted vehicle that is traveling in front and in the same direction as said vehicle.
 - 4.1.1 Every vehicle operating under an SHP when traveling on freeways, expressways, multi-lane undivided highways, shall remain in the extreme right-hand lane of said roadway except as necessary to maintain continuous through movement, to make left turns or exits or to pass other vehicles.
 - 4.1.2 Any load with an overall height in excess of 14 feet 6 inches shall be required to coordinate the move with the owners of all overhead signs, signals, utilities, etc., which may obstruct safe, clear movement.
 - 4.1.3 Reductions in legal weight posted on roadways or bridges must be obeyed. Contact the Permit Office immediately if your route includes legal load reductions.
 - 4.1.4 Due to bridge load limit restrictions, no SHP is permitted for the following roadways

within the City of Columbus:

- § Arcadia Ave east of Indianola
- § Calumet St.
- § Country Club Rd.
- § Lehman Rd. east of Gender Rd.

5. Days/Hours of Travel Restrictions

- 5.1 Overweight vehicle/loads that are not over dimensional, traveling under the authority of an SHP, will not be restricted as to travel hours or days so long as the overweight vehicle/load can move without obstructing the normal flow of the traffic.
- 5.2 With the exception of permitted legal dimensioned overweight vehicle/loads noted above, vehicle/loads traveling under the authority of a SHP shall be prohibited from movement on the following days / weekends: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
- 5.3 Movement of all vehicles/loads in excess of twelve feet in width shall be prohibited within the city limits of Columbus between the hours of 6:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- 5.4 Movement of all vehicles/loads in excess of twelve feet in width shall be permitted during daylight hours only (daylight hours are defined as one-half hour prior to sunrise to one-half hour after sunset).

6. Warning Flags, Lighting, And Signs:

6.1 All warning flags, lights, and signs shall be displayed as described in the OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS section of the ODOT SHP OPERATIONAL GUIDE and per the Ohio Revised Code, section 5577.

7. Private Escort Vehicles:

- 7.1 Private Escort vehicles, when required by an SHP to accompany an over dimensional or overweight vehicle or vehicle/load, shall be required to display a warning sign, yellow with black letters, reading "OVERSIZE LOAD". The sign shall be 5 feet long by 12 inches high with 8 inch high letters and shall be in good repair. Escort vehicles shall also be required to maintain radio communication with the operator of the permitted vehicle and shall also be required to be equipped with a roof mounted amber flashing or rotating light(s). Driver of the escort vehicle is to act as a flagger when needed.
- 7.2 The Driver of an escort vehicle shall not serve as an operator of other vehicles or equipment while escorting a vehicle/load operating under an SHP. Unless otherwise specified on the SHP, Public Safety /Law Enforcement Vehicles shall not be considered to be Private Escorts.
- 7.3 One rear escort vehicle shall be required for the transportation of any vehicle/load with a permitted length in excess of 90 feet. Columbus Police escort required when excess of 100 feet.
- 7.4 One lead (rear on multiple lane highways) escort vehicle shall be required for the transportation of any vehicle/load with a permitted width in excess of 11 feet. Columbus Police escort required when excess of 13 feet.
- 7.5 One lead escort vehicle equipped with a height sensing device shall be required for the transportation of any vehicle/load with a permitted height in excess of 14 feet. Columbus Police escort required when excess of 15 feet.

7.6 One lead and one rear escort shall be required on any vehicle/load with a permitted width in excess of 11 feet and on any vehicle/load with a permitted height in excess of 14 feet.

7.7 If more than one of the conditions set forth in numbers 2 through 4 above are met, (for example, a load with a permitted width exceeding 11 feet and a permitted length exceeding 90 feet) two escorts (one lead and one rear) shall be required. Depending on size of load and route, more than one Columbus Police Officer

maybe required.

7.8 Front and rear escort vehicles, when required, shall maintain a safe operating distance consistent with

existing traffic conditions between the vehicle/load being escorted and the escort vehicle.

7.9 Escort vehicles shall be a single unit vehicle with unobstructed vision from the front and rear. Escort Vehicles when accompanying a vehicle/load operating under an SHP shall not tow a trailer or another vehicle,

or haul equipment which extends beyond the dimensions of the escort vehicle.

8. Penalties for Violation:

8.1 Failure to comply with the requirements herein shall render the SHP null and void and the operator of the vehicle will be subject to enforcement action, as provided in Sections 2139.02 through 2139.05 of the

Columbus City Code.

8.2 An SHP should not be voided when a vehicle exceeds a granted axle weight by 2000 lbs or less, provided

that the vehicle does not exceed the gross vehicle weight granted by the SHP. The permittee shall be responsible for bringing the vehicle into compliance with the SHP prior to substantial movement upon being ordered so by law enforcement officials pursuant to a traffic stop. If the load cannot be brought into compliance, the load may not move until a revised SHP is obtained from the Department of Public Service.

Should the vehicle be moved prior to the vehicle being brought into compliance or prior to a revised SHP being obtained, the SHP shall be rendered null and void and the operator will be subject to enforcement

action as provided in Sections 2139.02 to 2139.05 of the Columbus City Code.

8.3 Moving violations for offenses that are relevant to the safe movement of a Commercial Motor Vehicle (for example, Speed, Reckless Operation, DUI, Improper Lane Change, etc.) shall render the SHP null and void, and

the operator subject to additional enforcement action as provided in Title 21 of the Columbus City Code.

Explanation

This ordinance appropriates monies within the General Fund, to the various departments, commissions, and offices of the government of the City of Columbus for the twelve months ending December 31, 2023.

Emergency action is requested to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the City's accounting system as soon as possible. Up to date financial posting promotes accurate accounting and financial management. As well, this ordinance will be the subject of public hearings and is not likely to be passed by City Council until 2023. If an additional 30 days is added to the process, valuable services and programs may be affected.

Title

To make appropriations for the 12 months ending December 31, 2023, for each of the several Object Classes for which the City of Columbus has to provide from the monies known to be in the treasury of said City of Columbus, in the fund known as the General Fund, during the said 12 months from the collection of all taxes and from other sources of revenue, the amount of \$1,144,000,000.00; and to declare an emergency (\$1,144,000,000.00)

Body

WHEREAS, the matter herein provided for constitutes an emergency in that it is immediately necessary to appropriate funds to the various city departments, commissions, and offices for a 12 month period beginning January 1, 2023, and ending December 31, 2023, for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety and welfare; Now, Therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That from the monies in the fund known as the "Fund for General Purposes", otherwise known as the General Fund (fund 1000), and from all monies estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources during the 12 months ending December 31, 2023, there be and hereby are appropriated to the use of the several departments, commissions and offices and Object Classes for which the corporation has to provide the following sums for use during the 12 months ending December 31, 2023:

SECTION 2. That the monies appropriated in the foregoing Section 1 shall be paid upon the order of the respective department directors or Elected Officials for which the appropriations are made except that

small claims in an amount not to exceed Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) may be paid as authorized by Chapter 335 of the Columbus City Code, 1959, as amended; and except that payments or transfers between departments, divisions or funds of the City may be made by the City Auditor; and except that payments for premiums for official bonds, depository commissions, employees' hospitalization, life insurance, pensions and dental insurance shall be made on the order and approval of the Director of the Department of Finance and Management or City Auditor; and except that the monies appropriated in the foregoing Section 1, Division No. 20-01, be paid upon the order of the City Clerk or President of City Council; and that no order shall be drawn or money paid except upon voucher, the form of which shall be approved by the City Auditor.

SECTION 3. Except in the matter of payrolls providing for the payment of the salaries of officers and employees regularly employed by the City and extraordinary emergencies, no warrant shall be issued in liquidation of vouchers, unless the department contracting the expense shall have first obtained an order duly certified that there are sufficient funds appropriated to the credit of the proper fund from which the expenditure is to be made, which certificate must be obtained prior to the incurrence of the obligation, and the head of any department or division authorized to contract expenditures will be held personally responsible for any obligation incurred contrary to the provisions of this section. Except that such certificate shall not be issued for obligations pertaining to "Capital Outlay" in programs or activities funded by federal or state categorical grants without the prior approval of the Director of the Department of Finance and Management; such prior approval must be obtained before submission of any requisition for items coded as "Capital Outlay" to the Department of Finance and Management. The Director of the Department of Finance and Management will review such requests for conformity with the approved budget.

SECTION 4. That with the exception of the provisos (reasons) established in previous sections, as stated in the reason paragraphs following each subdepartment's appropriation, it is understood that this Council is not making specific appropriations for each item of every classification hereinbefore contained but only for the total for each department and subdepartment, as shown in the final column. The itemized classification shall, however, constitute limitations on the powers of the several department heads as granted in Section 2 and no such officer shall make any expenditure for any other purpose in any amount beyond that of the particular classification, provided, however, that transfers may be made from one Object Class to another, within any one department or division. Transfer of sums exceeding \$100,000.00 shall be authorized only by ordinance of Council. Transfers of sums of \$100,000.00 or less shall only be approved pursuant to a letter over the signatures of the head of the department, the Director of the Department of Finance and Management, the City Auditor, and the Chairperson of the Committee of Finance.

SECTION 5. That the City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to pay obligations of various departments pertaining to preceding years' obligations from current appropriations up to a maximum of \$25,000.00 per obligation.

SECTION 6. That the Director of Finance and Management or designee is authorized to make any amendments to the general fund appropriation between each of the general fund subfunds as deemed necessary.

SECTION 7. That the City Auditor shall transfer funds included in Object Class 10 of the Department of Finance and Management to fund 1000, subfund 100012, the "Anticipated Expenditure Fund," subject to the authorization of the Director of Finance and Management (\$2,851,000.00).

SECTION 8. That the City Auditor shall transfer funds included in Object Class 10 of the Department of Finance and Management to fund 1000, subfund 100011, the "Economic Stabilization Fund," subject

to the authorization of the Director of Finance and Management. (\$2,750,000.00).

SECTION 9. That the City Auditor is hereby authorized to transfer appropriations within any fund, if necessary, add necessary appropriations, and to cancel encumbrances, if necessary, to provide for final City payrolls, unpaid internal services, tax adjustments, and other obligations from any object class with available appropriations to close out 2023.

SECTION 10. That the City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to honor and pay all properly presented payrolls, related items, tax adjustments, and other obligations occurring prior to passage of the annual appropriation ordinances for fiscal year 2024.

SECTION 11. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.
