DOBIOS BLACK Infant Vitality Program	Columbus Public Health	 High-risk, low-income, African-American pregnant women and their infants to age 1 year who reside in 14 specific Columbus zip codes Under 200% Federal Poverty Level 1 of the following risk factors: Pregnant women under age 21; Previous preterm birth; Families with a history of child abuse, neglect or have had interactions with child welfare Families with a history of substance abuse, or demonstrate a need for treatment; Families that have users of tobacco products in the home; Active military families; Families with a history of unstable housing or homelessness; or
Nurse-Family Partnership Helping First-Time Parents Succeed *	Center for Family Safety And Healing/Nationwide Children's Hospital	 NFP is designed for first-time, low-income pregnant women and their families. Early in pregnancy and to receive first home visit no later than the end of the women's 28th week of pregnancy Under 200% Federal Poverty Level
Healthy Families	Center for Family Safety And Healing/Nationwide Children's Hospital Youth Advocate Services	 Prenatally or within 3 months postnatal Under 200% Federal Poverty Level 1 risk factor; see above list for Moms & Babies First
