 - 1. Special circumstances or conditions apply to the subject property that do not apply, generally, to other properties in the same zoning district.
 - 2. The special circumstances or conditions are not the result of the actions of the property owner or applicant.
 - 3. The special circumstances or conditions make it necessary that a variance br granted to preserve a substantial property right of the applicant which is possessed by owners of other property in the same zoning district.
 - 4. The grant of a variance will not be injurious to neighboring properties and will not be contrary to the public interest or the intent and purpose of this Zoning Code.
- **B.** In granting a variance, the Board may impose such requirements and conditions regarding the location, character, and other features of the proposed uses or structures as the Board deems necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Zoning Code and to otherwise safeguard public safety and welfare.
- C. Nothing in this section shall be construed as authorizing the Board to affect changes in the Zoning Map or to add to the uses permitted in any district.







Classified as an animal shelter which are allowed in a C-4Commercial 4 zoning district.

A zoning variance is required due to code 3356.05 – C -4 district development limitations.

A. Animal Shelter - or Animal Kennel

- 1. All activities should be conducted indoors.
- 2. Buildings containing animals shall be located at a minimum distance of 100 feet from a residential district.
- 3. Waste products shall be located a minimum distance of 100 feet from district and in compliance with Columbus Dept. of Health regulations.

Reasons why I am requesting a zoning variance:

- *The cats will remain indoors only. (pertains to item 1.)
- *We will not be housing dogs, so there will be no barking. (pertains to item 2)
- *Waste will be disposed of off-site if necessary. (pertains to item 3.)
- *We will have a limited number of cats (8-12)

Neighbors within 120 feet of the premises will be notified in advance of the proposed business.

Even though our business is classified as an animal shelter in regards to zoning, we will not operate as a traditional animal shelter. We will not intake animals from the public. The cats will be considered resident cats and free roaming until they are adopted. The cat café will offer a relaxing and comfortable environment for a small group of cats to mingle with guests.

1. cat ca-fe


NOUN a cafe or similar establishment where people pay to interact with cats housed on the premises.

The history of cat cafés.




Cat cafes actually originated in Taiwan in 1998 and then quickly became popular in Japan. Their success is attributed to a desire to interact with cats in a home-like

setting while relieving the stress of busy urban life. Cat cafes can now be found in many other countries,

including The United States. In the states, cat cafes partner with cat shelters to help boost adoptions. Oakland's Cat Town Cafe in California was the first permanent cat cafe to open in America on October 25th, 2014. Since then, many more cat cafes have opened (mostly on the east and west coasts) or plan to open soon.






About Us.

I have always been an animal lover and have had an affinity for cats. For over thirty years, I have been working in veterinary hospitals and have also been involved with animal welfare groups for over twenty of those. During that time; I have been a board member, managed volunteers and operations, organized adoption events, fundraisers and spay-neuter programs.



I have also fostered countless dogs and cats. My husband Jerry manages a large company

but finds time to help me with the business logistics of the cat cafe. We have two adult daughters, four cats and two rescued dogs. We also continue to foster cats and kittens on a regular basis. 


How will Eat, Purr, Love Cat Café operate?

Proposed hours will be Tuesday – Sunday from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Closed for business on Mondays, except for special events and holidays.

It will be recommended that patrons make a reservation and a limited number of guests will be allowed entrance at one time. (approximately 16) This will help keep the cat lounge from overcrowding and causing stress to the cats. Walk-ins welcomed when space allows. There will be an hourly cover charge to help with operational costs such as rent and utilities. Rules for keeping cats and people safe will be explained and posted. Children will need to be accompanied by an adult.






The entrance will be enclosed and separated from the "cat lounge" area. This space will function as the area where the coffee, beverages and snacks will be served and where



the cats will not be allowed. Guests will check in and wait until their reservation time. There will also be a vestibule that will function as a barrier to keep the cats out of that area and having access and escape to the entrance.

The cat lounge area will include seating for guests as well as furniture designed for the comfort of the cats.

We will have cat themed art on display for sale by local artists that will also benefit cat rescue organizations.



There will be no food prepared on premises. The drink and food options will be simple, such as bottled beverages, brewed coffee and pre-packaged baked goods, and in compliance with the Health Department.

We will sell cat themed items and Eat, Purr, Love Cat Café merchandise.



There will be a controlled number of resident cats. (approximately 10) The cats will be provided by The Capital Area Humane Society. They will be spayed/neutered and current on vaccinations. We will apply the cleaning and care policies of CAHS to our business.






There will be special events at the cat café such as "Yogatos" (yoga with cats) and "Purrs and Palettes" (painting with cats) as well as special times for children such as reading with cats and movie night with cats.



The cat café can be reserved for parties, book clubs, meetings, etc.

We will host special events for groups that would benefit from the therapeutic results of being with cats. We will also open the cat café to other cat rescue organizations and advocate groups for fundraisers, workshops and volunteer recruitment / orientations. There will be no charge to patrons for these events.

In Conclusion:



Even though cat cafes are a new business concept, they have proven successful and benefit the neighborhoods where they operate.

Not only do cat cafes bring commerce to the area but they also bring communities together. Cat cafes support cat rescue organizations and other local businesses. They are a family friendly establishment.

Eat, Purr, Love Cat Café has already gained a lot of buzz, excitement and anticipation in Columbus and Ohio and even from residents of nearby states.


