A Zoning Adjustment Variance is requested for the following:

1. Parking Setback - Section 3312.27

Decrease parking setback along East 8th Avenue from 10'-0" to 1'-2".

2. Parking Space - Section 3312.29

Parking space(s) designated #6-10 on Site Plan (stacked parking area) to not be made accessible via street, alley, or maneuvering area.

3. Number of Parking Spaces - Section 3312.49

Decrease off-street parking space requirement from 42 spaces to 35 spaces.

4. Building Setback-Section 3363.23

Decrease building setback along East 8th Avenue from 25'-0" to 0'-0".

To make this project viable for the Owner of the property, the number of off-street parking spaces would need to increase as part of a larger property development plan – facilitating the newly remodeled, leasable third floor office space. The existing asphalt surface parking lot is proposed to expand from 24 spaces (currently) to 35 total spaces.

The proposed design includes the expansion of the existing surface parking lot that would extend to the existing south property line (East 8th Avenue) to a new structural retaining wall running directly adjacent to the existing public sidewalk. The viability of the parking lot expansion is dependent on this retaining wall being re-constructed to support to newly proposed parking surface.

The property, which is zoned Manufacturing is situated within a heavy Residential area and is currently on the National Register of Historic Places. The property is bounded by East 8th Avenue (South side), Peters Alley (West side) and South Summit Street (East side). The existing structure is centrally located on the site and is surrounded by several old-growth trees, which prohibits the use of certain portions of the site for off-street parking to meet the specified requirements.

With the addition of eleven off-street parking spaces on the property, the immediate surrounding street parking would be better allocated for residential use, affording the building tenants designated, monitored, and more convenient parking options.

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
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
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
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SITE REFERENCE PLAN - PROPOSED WORK . C. .







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Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Orton Memorial Laboratory is located northeast of downtown Columbus in what is known as the University District, a large residential area adjacent to the Ohio State University that is composed primarily of houses which predate 1925. Set back approximately fifty feet from Summit Street on the east, the building is located on a 1/2-acre lot bounded on the south by East Eighth Avenue, on the west by an alley and on the north by residential properties.

The present building consists of three sections—the original three-story flat-roofed, rectangular brick building constructed in 1929; a two-story brick addition built in 1956 at the west end of the north elevation; and a second two-story brick wing added in 1962 to the east end of the north elevation.

The three-bay main facade of the original building demonstrates the influence of the neo-classical revival of the early twentieth century. However, the style of the facade also owes a great deal to the desire to exhibit the decorative potential of ceramics. The most obvious examples of both of these influences are found in the two-story Corinthian portico and the elaborate main entrance. In the latter a band of terra cotta patera frames the leaded glass transom and sidelights that surround the single leaf door. Above this band is a concrete frieze containing the inscription "Ex Argilla Ad Argillam"; terra cotta lamps of wisdom flank the inscription while terra cotta festoons are found along the top of the frieze. Above the frieze is a cornice featuring a band of acanthus leaves as well as individual leaves atop the cornice. Above the portico, which contains a cornice like that above the entrance, is a pair of terra cotta medallions bearing the profiles of Antony and Cleopatra. Other classical elements of the main facade include a plain concrete frieze and molded cornice above the second story and a second cornice above the third story with fretwork to either side of the inscription "Orton Memorial Laboratory". Also decorating the main facade are patterned brick spandrels between the first and second story windows and brick quoins. Windows are metal casement with two by three lights.

Each side elevation features six bays containing three by three metal casement windows recessed between brick pilasters. Spandrels between the second and third stories contain terra cotta medallions and festoons. The frieze and cornices of the main elevation are extended along each side elevation.

Since the building was used to manufacture pyrometric cones and to conduct research for the ceramic industry, the interior contains little that is decorative. The exception is the small entrance hall with niches that were to contain busts to commemorate outstanding men of ceramic scientific attainments. These are now empty.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Criteria B & C

The Orton Memorial Laboratory is significant for its association with Edward Orton, Jr.'s pioneering work in the production of pyrometric cones and in research to benefit the ceramic industry.

Son of Dr. Edward Orton, first president of the Ohio State University and first state geologist, and Mary Jennings Orton, Edward Orton, Jr., was brought to Columbus by his father after his mother's death in 1873. After receiving his Engineer of Mines degree from OSU(then known as the Ohio Agricultural and Mechanical College) in 1884, Orton was employed in metallurgical industries and for six years worked in various iron and coal mines, blast furnaces and steel works. In 1890, he became superintendent of a plant manufacturing paving bricks. When the plant continued to be unprofitable, Orton began studying the reasons. Around 1892 Orton was employed to revise and enlarge a report on clay industries in Ohio that he had prepared in his junior year at OSU. After collecting information from the best trained men in the industry, he discovered a large deficiency in knowledge about clay manufacturing. Supported by a number of companies in the ceramic industry, Orton prepared a bill requiring the Board of Trustees of the Ohio State University to establish a department of ceramics. He did this without any interest or assistance from the university, since there was no precedent in this country for such a course of study. Introduced in February 1894, the bill was at first ridiculed but eventually passed on April 20, 1894, on the basis of strong support by the ceramic industry. Orton was named to head the department, which opened in September 1895 with eleven students. This was the first attempt outside Europe to teach ceramics.

In 1896, during his tenure at OSU, Orton perfected the standard pyrometric cone, now used extensively in ceramic industries for the heat treatment of clay products. Prior to this breakthrough, there had been no effective way to measure the temperatures in furnaces and kilns. Orton's solution to a serious problem insured that the business of producing cones would fluorish. He established the Standard Pyrometric Cone Company, for a while the sole producer of cones in the United States. It supplied approximately ninety-five per cent of all cones used in this country and a large percentage of cones used abroad. After service in the army reserve during World War I, Orton left the university to devote full time to his business interests.

In 1929 the Orton Memorial Laboratory was built at 1445 Summit Street to house the firm's various activities. In order to insure that these activities would continue after his death, which occurred February 10, 1932, Orton's will created the Edward Orton, Jr. Foundation. The foundation had two purposes: to continue the manufacture and sale of pyrometric cones and to use the profits from those sales to provide a research organization to advance "the ceramic arts and industries".

The Orton Foundation continued to occupy the Summit Street site until November 1, 1981, when it moved to a new location in Westerville. The present occupant is Dynamic Telecom Systems, Inc.

The Orton Memorial Laboratory is architecturally significant as both an example of an industrial building integrated into a residential neighborhood as well as an example of the work of Columbus architect Howard Dwight Smith.

By Mr. Orton's order, the building which was to house his company should be compatible with the adjacent structures. To accomplish this Howard Dwight Smith employed classical ornamentation. Naturally a ceramic product, terra cotta, was used for many of the decorative elements such as lamps, festoons, acanthus leaves, patera and medallions. Other classical elements include a two-story Corinthian portico, a frieze and projecting cornice above the second story and a frieze and cornice above the third story. these latter features were of concrete, the building as a whole demonstrates the variety of ways in which ceramic products can be integrated into a structure. For example, brick is used for facing material, quoins, spandrels and window surrounds.

As was mentioned previously, the building was designed by Columbus architect Howard Dwight Smith. Educated at the Ohio State University and Columbia University, Smith worked in the office of New York architect John Russell Pope. Pope was noted for his work in the Neo-Classical Revival, including the National Gallery in Washington, D.C. Returning to Columbus, Smith joined the architectural firm of Miller and Reeves. He then became architect for the Columbus School Board from 1921 to 1929 and designed West High School, South High School and Indianola Junior High School, previously listed in the National Register of Historic Places. During this period Smith also designed Ohio Stadium, the first horseshoe shaped, double deck stadium erected in the United States. His imaginative design won an AIA gold medal for public works. This structure too is listed in the National Register. Other buildings designed by Smith for OSU (he would later serve as university architect from 1956 to 1965) include St. John's Arena, Mack Hall (a woman's dormitory in the Jacobethan Revival Style), the Faculty Club and the 1951 addition to the OSU Library. Smith was also supervising architect for the First Congregational Church, designed by John Russell Pope. This may have influenced Orton's decision to retain Smith since Orton was a member of First Congregational. Smith liked to experiment and thus cannot be identified with one particular style. However, the influence of Pope can be seen in his recurring use of classical elements, not only in the Orton Laboratory but also in Ohio Stadium, the Faculty Club and several of his school designs.
