

PROJECT UPDATE

NEW: INTERSECTION CLOSURE AT EAST GOODALE

This Monday, construction will move to the crosswalk at the intersection of East Goodale and High streets. Just as you've seen with other crosswalk construction, vehicles won't be able to turn onto East Goodale. This closure will last for approximately three weeks, with completion set for October 18.

Rerouting:

- The Goodale Garage will remain open and accessible from I-670 in addition to the Convention Center doors east of the intersection. Foot traffic will be able to access the garage at street level.
- Pedestrians will not be able to cross East Goodale between Black Point and the Greater Columbus Convention Center. Expect to route to the west side of the street near the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral and Hyde Park as an alternate.
- Vehicles should route via Convention Center Drive or Nationwide Boulevard to the south.

NOISE IMPACTS

Expect noise impacts to be pronounced at the beginning of excavation activities beginning Monday and last for two to three days. This will lessen afterward, when crews move to brick laying and other build-out activities.

INTERSECTION WORK

Intersection work at Spruce Street is finishing today and West Goodale Street is finishing Saturday. Thank you for your patience as the project team worked on multiple intersections concurrently to expedite completion. This allows crews to move to other intersections and accomplish a great volume of work before Highball.

MORE BETWEEN VINE AND GOODALE STREETS

- Please be cautious and watch for an increase in motorcycle and pedestrian traffic throughout this weekend for AIMExpo.
- Valet services at the Cap at Union Station are being maintained and are fully functional, but have been repositioned. Please follow signs and direction from staff when using valet services.
- On Wednesday Sept. 27, crews will move to the corner of High and Vine streets to work on the southwest corner of this intersection. They will remove the temporary sidewalk and install new concrete sidewalk, brick pavers and a bump-out. Martini will remain accessible, with a longer route than normal to access its front door for the majority of foot traffic. Valet services for Martini will continue to function as it currently does.
