This course is designed for supervisors who are tasked with Drug Unit supervision and the planning of undercover narcotic operations. This is a high energy forty-hour course focusing on the first line supervisor and mid-manager. The course is designed to empower the student supervisor to supervise undercover operations effectively and safely. Covering such topics as tactical operation planning, undercover officer deployment, confidential informants, crisis management, documentation, integrity, and risk assessment. There is an emphasis on defining the difference between leadership and management and identifying their separate skill sets. Tools are provided that will assist students to work more effectively with their employees, both as individuals and as a team. This course will also address methods of minimizing risks in undercover operations.

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

Define the paradigm shifts related to their role as a leader of people.

Express reasons to accept responsibility for their personal leadership development.

Understand the supervisory responsibilities of undercover narcotics operations.

Influence the value and belief system of those they lead.

Distinguish leadership and management and leader and manager.

Utilize the Competent Supervisor assessment tool to assess communication and management styles.

Identify the reasons police officers fail in their operational performance.

Explain the importance of policy and procedure to the officer's performance.

Describe the importance of training to successful performance.

Develop and execute a tactical operation plan.

Employ the safe use of confidential informants.

Identify the rules for undercover officer safety and survival.

Implement and analyze crisis management methods.

Recognize and identify potential operational dangers.

Recognize potential operational hazards.

Recognize the psychological danger signs relating to undercover officers.

Apply de-confliction procedures.
