Safe Needle & Medicine Disposal

It is important to safely get rid of used needles and lancets (sharps) to protect yourself and others. Used needles can hurt people and spread diseases. Never throw a used needle or sharp into the trash.

To safely dispose of used needles/sharps:

Always Put Needles In a Safe Sharps Container

• Use a hard plastic bottle with a screw top such as a bleach or laundry detergent bottle or a coffee can. *(Do not use a glass jar because it can break.)



- Seal the cap tightly and use duct tape if necessary to keep the lid from coming off.
- Label the bottle "Danger. Needles Inside."
- **Place** the bottle in a tied trash bag and put it in a trash can.
- Use an outdoor needle drop box (map below).
- If you find needles in your neighborhood, call 311.
- Buy a sharps container at the pharmacy.

Unused or unwanted medicines can harm families, the community and the environment. Drugs can be abused (accidentally or intentionally) and flushing them poses the threat of chemicals entering our lakes, rivers, streams and drinking water. Be sure you know how to properly dispose of medications.

Safely Dispose of Medicines In Household Trash

• Mix medicines (do not crush tablets or capsules) with an unpalatable substance such as dirt, kitty litter or used coffee grounds.




- **Place** the mixture in a container such as a sealed plastic bag.
- Throw the container in your household trash.
- Scratch out all personal information on the prescription label of your empty pill bottle or packaging to make it unreadable, then dispose of the container.
