James Rd at Livingston Ave

INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Public Investment: \$3.65 Million

- Design: \$430,000
- ROW Acquisition: \$321,000
- Construction: \$2.9 Million

Project Schedule

- Design: Present to Summer 2019
- ROW Acquisition: Early 2019
- Construction Start: Summer 2020

Improvements to be made:

- Construct right turn lanes on Livingston Ave
- Lengthen right turn lanes from James Rd to Livingston Ave
- Replace existing traffic signals with mast-arm style signals
- Rebuild sidewalk sections, curb ramps and pedestrian signals
- Construction of concrete medial along James Rd to prohibit left-turns into the private driveways adjacent to the intersection

James Rd at E. Broad Street

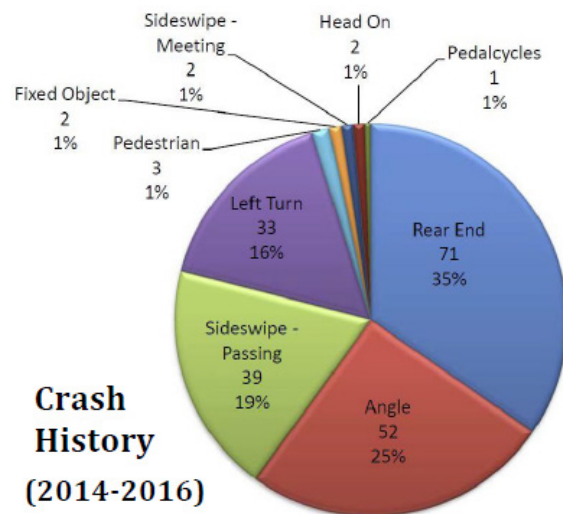
INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Public Investment: \$3.86 Million*

*project scope is pending as the Department seeks ODOT Safety Funds

Project Schedule: TBD

- **Tentative Start: Late 2022/Early 2023**



Proposed Improvements:

- Construct dual southbound left-turn lanes and provide protected-only southbound left-turn phasing
- Construct exclusive right-turn lanes on northbound and southbound intersection approaches
- Reconstruct existing signal and install signal backplates
- Modify signal timings to reduce backups and stops on James Road approaches
- Install advanced street name signs along the southbound approach
- Install medians and Qwick Kurb along James Road

Livingston Ave at Barnett Rd

INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Public Investment: \$1.91 Million

- Design: \$261,706
- ROW Acquisition: \$350,000
- Construction: \$1.304 Million

Project Schedule:

- Construction: Jan 2019 to Nov 2019

Proposed Improvements:

- Construction of left-turn lanes along Barnett Rd to improve safety and reduce the delay for left-turning vehicles
- Construction of sidewalk along the east side of Barnett Rd between Livingston Ave and the Barnett Rec Center
- Reconstruct the traffic signal at the intersection for improved visibility

James Rd - Livingston to Main

Arterial Street Rehabilitation

Public Investment: \$7.9 Million

- Design: \$1.4 Million
- ROW Acquisition: \$600,000
- Construction: \$5.9 Million

Project Schedule:

- Design: Finish early 2019
- ROW Acquisition: Complete
- Construction: Summer 2019 to Fall/Winter 2020

Project Scope:

- Full roadway rebuild
- curb replacement
- full replacement of sidewalks
- Remove all non-compliant ADA ramps and install 42 new ADA compliant curb ramps
- install 6 ADA compliant COTA landing pads
- Replace existing street lighting with new LED luminaires

Main Street and James Rd

Water Line Improvement Project

Public Investment: \$4.24 Million

- Engineering: \$249,787
- Construction: \$3.99 Million

Project Schedule

- Design: Finish Jan 2018
- ROW Acquisition: Complete
- Construction - Main Street
-Complete
- Construction - James Rd
-July 2019 to September 2020

Project Scope:

- Main Street: Bexley corp limit to Whitehall Corp limit & James Road: Livingston to Main
- Replacement of 16" water main on Main Street
- Replacement of water line on James Rd
- Will improve reliability of water access and water pressure

South Broadleigh Road

Public Investment: \$5.07 Million

- Engineering: \$223,743
- Construction: \$4.3 Million

Project Schedule

- Design: Finish Spring 2019
- Construction: Fall 2019 to Fall 2020

Decorative Streetlight Project

Public Investment: \$1.06

- Engineering: \$66,090

- Decorative LED street lighting will be added along Main St from S. Gould Rd to Barnett Rd

Project Schedule

- Design: Underway
- Construction Start: Summer 2019

Special Projects

Urban Infrastructure Recovery Fund

About UIRF

- UIRF is more than 25 years old. It was established to fund capital improvements in Columbus' central city neighborhoods
- UIRF is unique in that it is a capital improvement program that identifies projects through a partnership between the city and community. This partnership involves 4 city departments and 21 communities.
- Projects are implemented by the following departments: Development, Public Service, Public Utilities, and Recreation and Parks
- In 2014, an updated UIRF program was implemented to identify a five year budget and associated projects for each UIRF area
- Community engagement for the 2015-2019 UIRF funding period included community meetings, a project website and public outreach which resulted in 1500 project suggestions from residents, business owners and community groups

Current Projects: \$1.9 Million

- New sidewalks on the east side of Barnett from Livingston Avenue north to Astor or Fulton (\$500,000)
- New decorative lighting on East Main Street from Bexley to Whitehall (\$1.06 Million)
- Curb repair on portions of East Broad Street and North Gould (\$285,000)
- Trees and improvements to "Little Broad" open space (\$60,000)
