








Strategic Funding - Updates

Strategic Funding - Recommendations

Recommended priorities:

- Columbus Foundation
- Ohio / Franklin County Farm Bureau
- Ohio Grocers' Association
- Ohio Restaurant Association
- Community Investment Groups at Large Banks

Recommended general messaging approach:

- Provide General guidance on work of LFAP/LFB
- Ask about effective projects / funding efforts in their org
- Ask how LFAP/LFB can inform existing projects
- Ask how LFAP/LFB can inform, facilitate, promote future projects
