My name is Gary Witte. I live at 180 N. Chase Ave. on the Westside. I am a retired Minister of the United Church of Christ.

I preface my remarks by stating that there are many fine officers of the Columbus Department of Police and I am grateful for their service to our community. However, my concern today is for the too many officers on the force who are out of control. Far too often officers arrive on the scene of an altercation or a threatening situation only to heighten the drama and raise the stakes of risk and harm. The scene becomes explosive with the risk of harm or death to someone. Instead of de-escalating a heated and threatening situation, officers begin using violence and even gun play resulting in injury or loss of life.

It is necessary to call for mandatory de-escalation and sensitivity training of all members of our police force. The objective of a good police force is to maintain the peace of the community. All personnel should be required to take training that teaches our officers how best to de-fuse a potential harmful and dangerous situation with tactics that de-escalates and control crisis situations. Lives can be saved and trust can be developed that our police force is truly in the business to "serve and Protect". Too many of our unarmed citizens are injured or gunned down because some officers prefer to use lethal force first.

The Westside is particularly challenging because the poverty and unemployment statistics for our community is high. Add to the mix the high use of dangerous drugs brings constant calls for the police to intervene. We are also aware of the poor reputation Sullivant Ave. has for a large volume of sex trafficking and drug addiction of young women being prostituted on that strip. Yet, it seems that our police force complicates the problem.

I have witnessed police officers soliciting young women along Sullivant Ave. I also hear many rumors from neighbors claiming that many of the known drug houses are owned by police officers themselves. Officer Andrew Mitchell is not the only police officer who owns several residences on the Westside. I call for an investigation into police officers who own homes in the area and whether there are illicit happenings at these homes. Officers should be prohibited from owning homes in the areas they patrol.

The overwhelming problem with our police force is the lack of accountability Of those officers involved in shootings and/or excessive force. We have seen officers who have kicked hand-cuffed, subdued

people and not be disciplined in any way. Excessive force and police shootings have left our community unable to trust and support our police because of the lack of accountability within our police department. In recent years the killings of Tyre King, Henry Green, Jaron Thomas, Chris Wade and Donna Dalton have demonstrated that our police department is out of control and are not accountable to the public it serves.

I believe we are at a tipping point in this community. The next incident of an unarmed person being shot by police could cause a community uproar and unrest. However, although people may want to grab torches and pitchforks, instead we will be grabbing clipboards and pens to begin a process of a ballot initiative that will create a true Civilian Oversight Board which will monitor and recommend action on police officers who break the law or are excessively violent. I urge all interested parties to look at what happened in Nashville, Tennessee last fall. The voters there supported the establishment of a Civilian Review Board by 59% of the vote. People there grew tired of excessive and lethal force being used on their citizenry. A Ballot Initiative may be just the remedy in Columbus to make our police force abide by good policing practices and makes an out of control police department accountability to the people it serves.

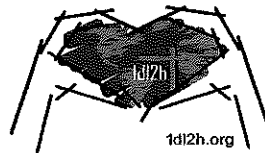

Hello Everyone. My Name is Esther Flores, a public servant an RN and founder of 1DL2H a 501c3 public charity who provides Christ Centered Care to the sick who have no access to healthcare via local & global compassionate messenger who deliver healing to the broken mind, body, soul, and spirit. We own 2 safe houses, The Hilltop Butterfly Garden, and operate a 4hr Drop-In Center. The DIC is a harm reduction model that is client centered. The victims are served a warm meal, a nurse cleans wounds and abscesses, they select and outfit, toiletries, and escort them to detox centers and linked to health care by Primary One. I would like to thank Commander Hyland and Sgt Brophy for helping us advocate for more safety in our streets and community and listening to some solutions. I would like to inform the city having 10-12 police officers in a 24hr period on Zone 3 is unsafe practices for an area with over 100,000 folks.

Our Love Tribe serves destitute folks who are called prostitutes we call them Street Sisters. We serve children, teens and transgender folks primarily on the west side known as the RED-LIGHT District since it's the epicenter of human trafficking, opiate addiction and the highest infant mortality rate and low life expectancy of 61. On the Hilltop we operate a 4 hr Drop-In Center we began in Mid Sept of 2017 for 2 hrs and served 150 females, 20 children, 2 transgender folks. On 2018 we increased to 4 hrs and served 1250 females, 12 transgender folks & 50 Children. We had 15 deaths and 9 of them were women murdered by cops. On the good note there were 8 women who are sober and out of Sullivant Ave. The Hilltop Street Outreach reached 1350 folks including women, children, teens, and transgender folks.

The Hilltop has a diverse ethnic indigenous populations from Africa, Asia, Middle East, South and Central America. Unfortunately, sexual violence is kept silent. It is a good example of the diversity in our nation, so we need to look at solutions that consider cultural practices.

Here are some recommendations:

1. Do not reward disruptive stupidity like to place at the GHAC meeting on the April 2nd by Lisa Boggs and a few of her neighbors who opposed our purchase of a land bank house that is located on the side of the school to be used as DIC. Mind you we have been in front of the school for the last 2 yrs operating AFTER hrs. The house is in the midst of 12 dope and trap houses and a few clandestine labs. The Hilltop DIC on Sullivant Ave would improve the Infant Mortality Rate but ending the cycle of violence towards women and save lives since the women are the dream bearers. It will minimize violence towards transgender folk. I ask city council I NEED the house on Sullivant Ave since the Mayor Ginther refuses to respond to my calls or emails. Let us save lives instead of brushing them away to the suburbs.
2. The police academy should teach de-escalation strategies and to be trauma informed and responsive to reduce the trigger-happy cops. *Instruct them of Random Drug testing*
3. Criminalize the purchase of sex
4. We need a John School *on the West Side*
5. Use retire cops as auxiliary cops to run the license plate #s of the Johns
6. Cops need to be rewarded and have a confidential hotline for turning cops in, we have some season vigilante cops

7. City officials need to implement a program like DARE in the schools to teach about human and drug trafficking, and domestic and gun violence. Especially not to bring toy or BB guns to schools or outside their homes.
8. A Sgt who publicly states not all human trafficking victims are victims should not be wearing a badge like it happened on the GHAC meeting. It took over 20 yrs to indict a cop for the murder and voluntary woman slaughter and for tampering with evidence and other charges. Where are the other cops? Why do taxpayers need to pay for dirty cops on administrative leaves or forced to retire early?
9. Elevate the CPD education background to an associates or bachelor's degree in forensics, law, sociology, psychology or subject matter that is useful in policing
10. CPD need to recruit more women and people from different ethnic backgrounds.
11. ***Harm Reduction methods need to be incorporated in policing and it is Defined as: A non-coercive approach and non-judgmental relationship with clients. Harm Reduction is client-centered; it "meets the participant where he/she is at" The intervention is tailored to the needs and ability of the participant and success is achieved through the setting of self-identified, attainable goals.***
12. The research on Women Drop-In Centers that are child friendly that provide individualized care with peer support and focus group had positive outcomes in the community are successful in meeting the needs of women with high risk behaviors. Prostitution, addiction HIV, Hepatitis C and other type of infections dropped significantly. This type harm reduction approach contributed to good parenting skills, sobriety, and empowerment and women retain their children. Women overcame the stigma obtained from hospital health care workers that made them reluctant, worthless, and develop a low self-esteem which diminished their interest to seek addiction treatment. Furthermore, Sakha stated Drop-In Centers that serve women who were IV drug users depended on the commitment and dedication of harm reduction service providers to deliver outreach services, counseling, Sexually Transmitted Infection (STIs) services, syringe exchange program (SEP), as well as educational, training and skills programs. There are multiple studies that agrees with the above findings in both rural and urban areas in developing countries and in the United States. Franklin County has none

If the Chairperson determines these rules are not being followed, one warning will be given. Speaker's conduct shall be subject to the right of the Chairperson to preserve the order and decorum of the forum. If the rules continue to be violated after one warning, the Chairperson may revoke the individual's speaking privileges.
