City of Columbus – Department of Public Service Projects

Celebrate1 – Blueprint Linden – Hudson McGuffey Sidewalks

This project scope consists of constructing sidewalks along the west side of Dresden Street from E. Hudson Street to Weber Road, and along the west side of Medina Avenue from Linden Park Drive to Weber Road.

Celebrate1 Sidewalks – Hamilton Ave – Minnesota Avenue to Weber Road

This project scope consists of constructing sidewalks along the west side of Hamilton Avenue from Minnesota Avenue to Weber Road. Installation of the sidewalk will include curb ramps and drive approaches and may include curb and stormwater drainage improvements in select areas.

Celebrate1 Sidewalks – Hamilton Ave and Briarwood Ave Along Linden Park

This project scope consists of constructing sidewalks along the east side of Hamilton Avenue from Briarwood Avenue to Linden Park Drive and along the north side of Briarwood Avenue from Hamilton Avenue to Linden Park Drive. Improvements on Hamilton Avenue will also include the installation of a parallel parking lane along the east side of Hamilton Avenue. Installation of the sidewalk will include curb ramps where necessary.

Roadway Improvements – Medina Ave from Hudson to Briarwood

This project will reconstruct Medina Avenue between Hudson Street and Briarwood Avenue. Medina Avenue, which will serve as a main entrance to the new Linden Park recreation center, will be replaced with a new curbed roadway, ADA compliant curb ramps, new storm sewer system, and sidewalks.

Slow Streets Linden

There are a number of one-way streets in Linden. There are also 24 to 26-foot wide streets in the neighborhood that are already two-way. Slow Streets will consider the feasibility of converting some one-way streets to two-way streets as an option for reducing vehicle travel speeds. Other strategies for reducing traffic speeds through residential areas will be considered where one-way to two-way conversion is not applicable or would not be recommended.

UIRF South Linden Sidewalks 2017

This project includes sidewalks in South Linden on McGuffey Road from Clinton Street to Hudson Street; Dresden Street from the alley south of Duxberry Avenue to the alley north of Duxberry Avenue; 24th Street from Medina Avenue to Cleveland Avenue; 23rd Avenue from Hamilton Avenue to Cleveland Avenue; 22nd Avenue from Hamilton Avenue to Cleveland Avenue; Hamilton Avenue from 13th Avenue to 17th Avenue; and Grasmere from 22nd Street to 26th Street. Installation of sidewalks is funded through the Urban Infrastructure Recovery Fund (UIRF).

Blueprint Linden – Hudson/McGuffey

This project will look at the combination of gray/green solutions to remove/reroute inflow/infiltration from the sanitary sewer to relieve WIBs and DSRs in the Linden bound area.

Dresden St. Area Waterline Improvements

This project provides for general rehabilitation of the area's water distribution system and includes construction of new water mains, abandoning existing water mains, and transferring water services. The purpose of the project is to improve flow and water quality and to replace water mains that require repeated maintenance.

Manchester Avenue Waterline Improvements

Linden Community Center

Linden Community Center is currently undergoing a total reconstruction, complete with a new 55,000 square-foot facility and 20-acre park. The new Linden Community Center and Park is expected to open in fall 2020.

Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) projects

Intersection Improvements – Cleveland Avenue at Hudson Street (FRA-3-19.38, ODOT PID 110587)

A safety study was completed in 2019 after the intersection was designated a high crash location on the 2017 Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP). The study determined the following solutions for mitigating the rear end, angle, and sideswipe-passing crashes that predominated there: reconstruct the signal to improve signal head visibility, add northbound and southbound left turn lanes, add a westbound right turn lane, and improve pedestrian safety along the south side of Hudson Street. In Spring 2019, the Governor's top 150 list identified this location as a priority safety intersection and allocated funding to construct an improvement. This project is being led by ODOT.
