Vision Zero Columbus is a multi-agency traffic safety initiative committed to ending crash-related fatalities and serious injuries on Columbus streets through a holistic, data-driven approach to engineering, education, evaluation and community engagement.

Vision Zero Columbus is part of the national Vision Zero Network helping cities across the nation mobilize to end traffic violence that results in approximately 40,000 traffic deaths and millions of injuries annually in the U.S. Vision Zero Columbus is working to build a community of safe drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists to help ensure that they all complete a safe trip every time they travel along city streets.

At a Glance

- 61 people killed in 58 crashes on Columbus streets in 2020
- 73 people killed in 72 crashes on Columbus streets in 2021
- 3 bicyclists and 13 motorcyclists were killed in crashes in 2021
- 65% of severe or fatal crashes happen on 10% of Columbus streets
- 25% of Ohio's fatal crashes involve a driver under 25
- The number of people killed on Columbus streets has nearly doubled since 2015

Almost half of people killed in crashes on Columbus streets are vulnerable road users — people walking, biking or riding a motorcycle – not protected by the steel frame of a vehicle. It is vitally important for each of us to practice safe driving habits, not be distracted, and be aware of others when traveling by any mode on our city streets.


Vision Zero In Action

Vision Zero Columbus has been implementing strategies outlined in our Action Plan 1.0 to begin to reduce and eliminate crash fatalities and serious injuries. The initial two-year Action Plan will be carried out through March 2023, and the next phase of the Action Plan is being developed.

So far, Vision Zero has:

- Installed or upgraded 136 crosswalks, exceeding the first Action Plan goal by more than double
- Made safety improvements at 20 intersections, exceeding the initial goal
- Converted all traffic signals previously on night flash operation to fully operational
- Evaluated 69 fatal crash sites for potential short-term improvements
- Evaluated 121 locations for safe sight distance needs
- Converted 27 residential streets from one-way to two-way traffic to encourage slower speeds
- Spent **\$6 million** on Vision Zero infrastructure improvements

These actions are just the start of the Vision Zero initiative. Moving forward, we will continue to evaluate efforts and



implement strategies that prove to be the most effective in eliminating crash deaths and serious injuries on Columbus streets.
