This newsletter provides information and updates on the Livingston Avenue Improvements Study.

Project Background

Livingston Avenue is on the Vision Zero Columbus High Injury Network. The corridor has a higher density of fatal and serious injury crashes that threaten the safety of pedestrians, cyclists, transit users and drivers. The city is addressing this issue along the corridor, with the Livingston Avenue Improvements Study focused on the section from 18th Street to Nelson Road to promote safety for all roadway users and reduce vehicle speeds and severe crashes.

Current Status

Steering Committee Meeting #1 Take-Home Survey

At the conclusion of the first meeting, steering committee members were tasked with asking members of their community a series of survey questions identifying issues and improvements for Livingston Avenue (results below). The results lead to a larger discussion about prioritizing goals for the study discussed at the first meeting.

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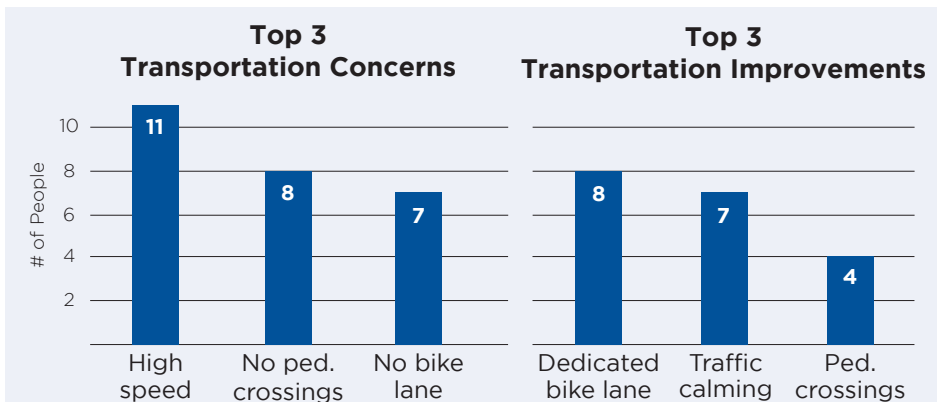

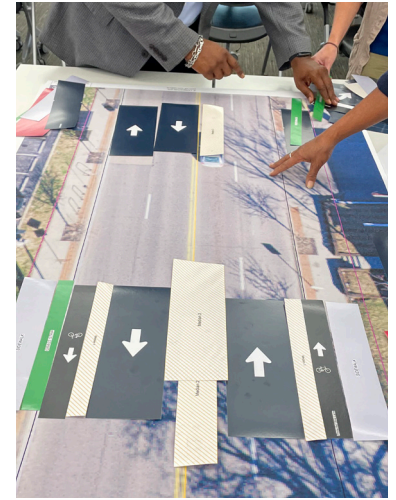

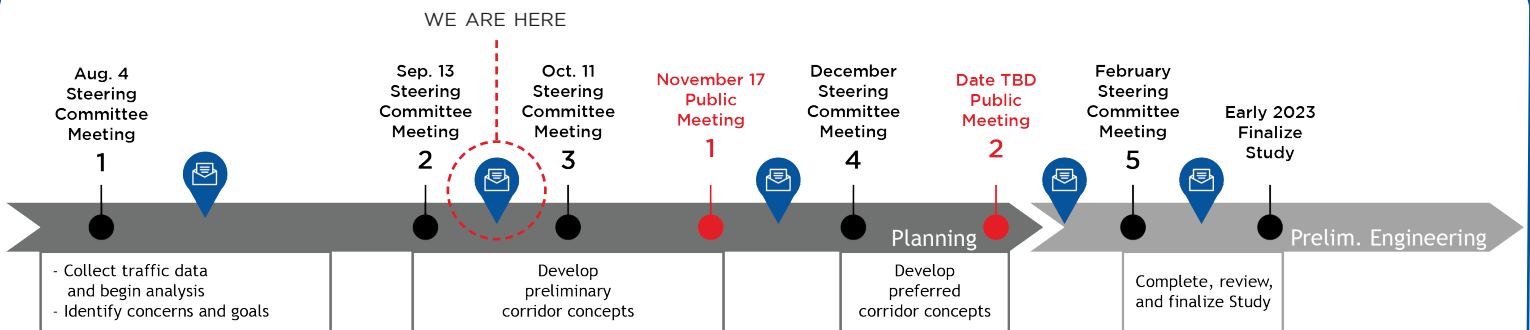
Steering Committee Meeting #2

During the second meeting, a "design toolbox" was presented that explained a variety of roadway strategies to help improve transportation safety issues on Livingston Avenue. After the presentation, committee members were split into groups and tasked with making different "ideal" layouts for two types of sections of Livingston Avenue: an intersection approach and a mid-block segment. Examples of some of the ideal layouts created are shown to the right. Based on committee feedback and technical data collected so far, the team plans to present preliminary conceptual layouts for the corridor at the next steering committee meeting.
