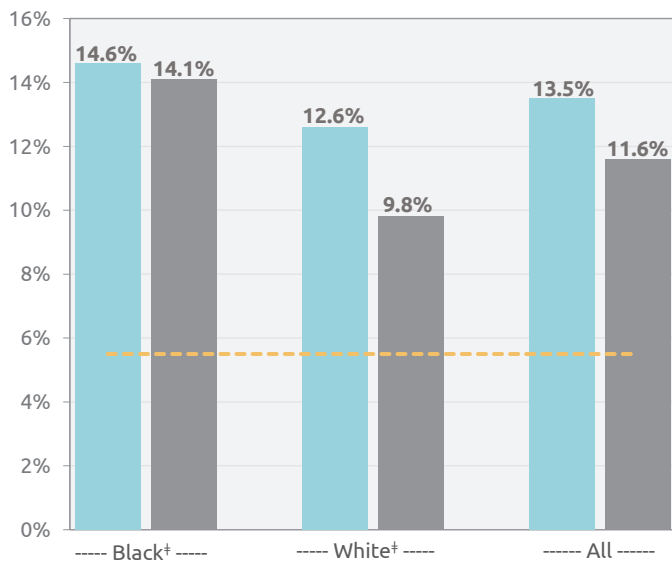

Births (2021 YTD)

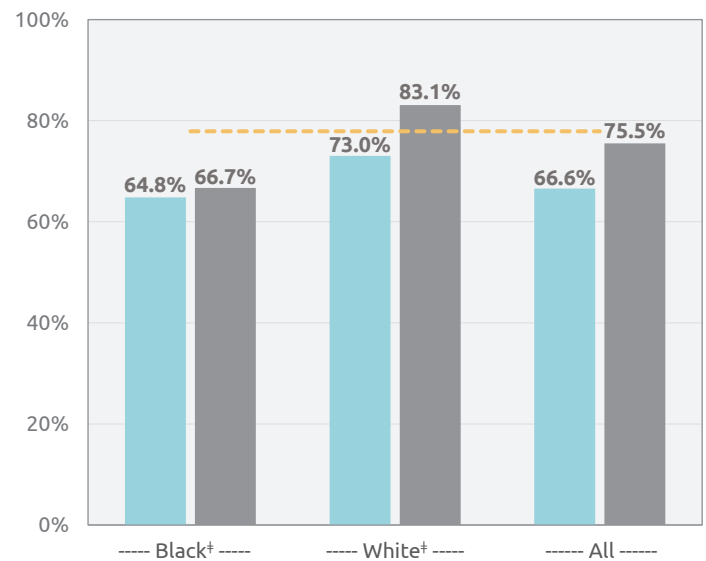
Percent of Births Preterm (<37 weeks)

Percent of Births with 1st Trimester Prenatal Care

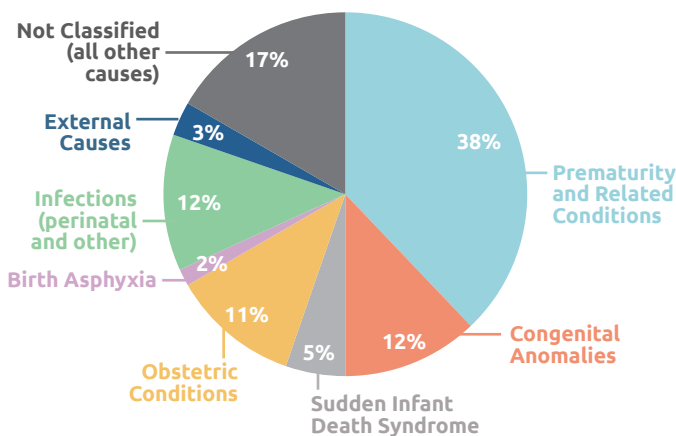

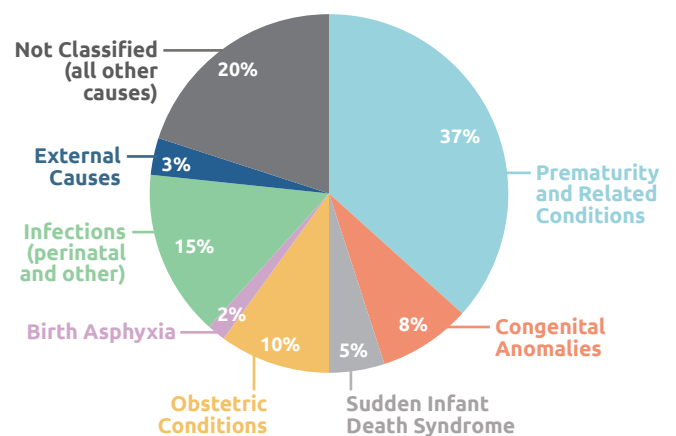
Franklin County average percent of births with 1st trimester prenatal care (2019-2020) is 74.1%.

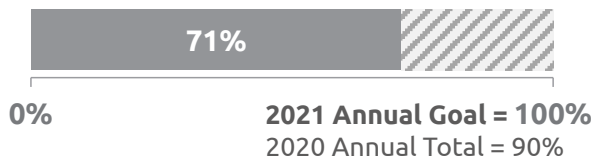

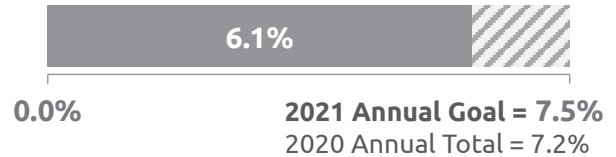
Ohio Better Birth Outcomes Clinics (2021 YTD)

The Ohio Better Birth Outcomes (OBBO) collaborative is dedicated to reducing the infant mortality rate in Franklin County by improving the delivery of health care services for women and their families using quality improvement science to guide our work. OBBO consists of four hospital systems in Central Ohio, as well as Columbus Public Health and PrimaryOne Health.

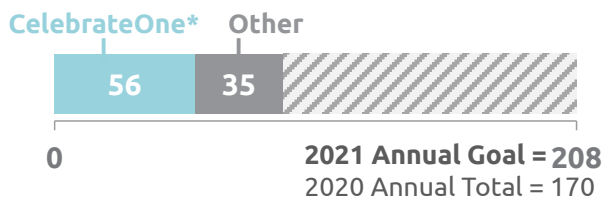


Baby & Me Tobacco Free (2021 YTD)

Baby and Me Tobacco Free (BMTF) is a program to assist pregnant women with quitting smoking. Women and their partners receive smoking cessation sessions at no cost. Incentives are provided to encourage successful participation.

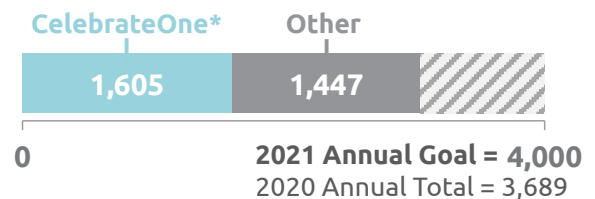
- 95% of BMTF new moms are smoke-free at 1st visit after birth.



StepOne (2021 YTD)

StepOne is a centralized system that connects women with affordable, timely and convenient prenatal care, and resources for a healthy pregnancy.

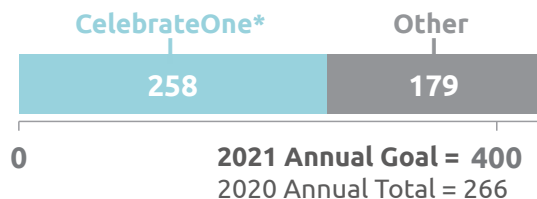


Moms2B (2021 YTD)

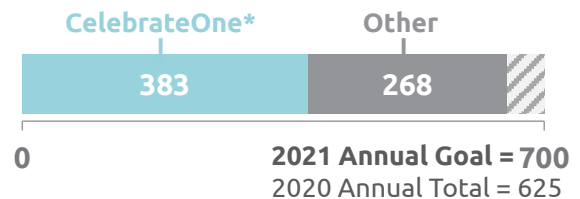
Moms2B provides weekly education and support sessions to promote healthy lifestyle choices and link Moms with support services. A wide variety of education topics are covered, incentives are provided, and women are connected to resources in the community.
