THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Department of Public Safety is the city's largest department with more than 3,500 employees and a budget which represents approximately 70% of the city's general fund budget at over \$558,000,000. The Department maintains national CALEA Accreditation with Excellence using the Gold Standard in Police, CFAI accreditation in Fire and ASCLD/LAB Accreditation for the Crime Lab. The City of Columbus is responsible for providing police and fire services to more than 227 square miles as well as adjoining areas through mutual aid and automatic response agreements.

THE OPPORTUNITY

The City of Columbus is seeking a strong manager and a collaborative and innovative leader with previous executive leadership experience to serve as the Director of the Department of Public Safety. Public safety experience is desired but not required. This position will serve as an advisor to the Mayor on public safety activities at the cabinet level. This position is responsible for managing daily operations and planning for long-term improvements for the Division of Police which has the primary duty of preserving the peace, protection of persons and property, and the enforcement of all ordinances of the City of Columbus and all criminal laws of the State of Ohio and the United States of America; the Division of Fire, which has the primary duty of ensuring the proper execution of a fire service program designed to facilitate fire suppression, prevention, inspections, EMS, fire and rescue response, water supply, hazardous material response and bomb disposal; and the Division of Support Services which has the primary duty of planning, designing and managing the public safety communications systems (Computer Aided Dispatch), enforcing the weights and measures code, and the business regulation and licensing code.

The Director represents the Department of Public Safety at City Council meetings, intergovernmental meetings and other various community and board meetings. There is an expectation that this position will be innovative in identifying, promoting and advancing public safety initiatives, activities and practices. This position works as part of an overall team with the Mayor, his staff and Cabinet to advance the objectives of the City of Columbus.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

A unique blend of skills, knowledge and experience will be required for this challenging and rewarding position. The successful candidate will possess the following:

- Ability to think innovatively on new initiatives, budgeting and departmental practices.
- Strong, executive level leadership skills.
- Strong background, knowledge and experience in budget preparation, business management and expenditure control.
- Ability to collaborate with a team of peers on a common goal.



- Experience in strategic planning.
- A broad knowledge of personnel management (i.e. creating a diverse, employee-supportive work environment, leading others effectively, interpersonal communication, etc.).
- Ability to work effectively with governmental entities and community groups.
- Public speaking skills and superior communication skills, both oral and written.
- Awareness and understanding of working in a political environment (experience is a plus).
- The ability to encourage collaborative attitudes and address conflict in an open, positive and impartial manner.
- The ability to be accessible as a resource, provide coaching, mentoring and empowerment to staff.
- Experience in a public sector labor relations environment is desirable.
