Affordability by Supply

- We have enough housing
- · We have a diversity of age and type of housing
- We have housing near opportunities

Affordability by Design

- Smaller scale housing ADUs, duplexes, tiny homes
- Innovative manufacturing modular construction, new materials, prefabrication
- Dense, efficient projects on corridors

Affordability by Subsidy

- Columbus Affordable Housing Bond Packages
- Low Income Housing Tax Credits
- Franklin County Magnet Fund
- Rental subsidies

BUILD

Double the number of units built over the next 15 years

- Make residential construction easier
- Diversify the types of housing available
- Support small and medium sized developers and new, innovative building products



PRESERVE

Ensure residents are stably housed.

- Support renters and low-income homeowners to stay housed
- Prevent evictions
- Preserve existing affordable units
- Minimize displacement in changing neighborhoods



INVEST

Fund new affordable housing and support for households that make less than \$50,000/year.

- Fund new affordable housing
- Fund affordable homeownership
- Fund human services and the shelter system.
- Advocate for increased state and federal funding for affordable housing.



INCLUDE

Ensure all our neighborhoods are economically diverse and everyone has access to opportunities.

- Encourage regional solutions
- Implement inclusive housing policies
- Invest in Black homeownership
- Align housing investments with other public investments
