Asian American Community Services

About the agency: To improve the well-being and quality of life of Asian Americans and Asian immigrant families in Ohio by providing social services and empowering individuals through education, training and leadership. The services include family support program, youth programs, senior outreach, health care & prevention, interpretation & translation services, computer literacy & ESL classes.

ASPIRE

About the agency: Ohio's Aspire programs provide free services for individuals who need assistance acquiring the skills to be successful in post-secondary education and training and employment. Local programs offer classes at flexible locations and times to meet the diverse needs of adult learners. All students are required to attend orientation, where an assessment is given to help determine the individual's educational plan and goals. Services available include: basic math, reading, and writing skills, Adult Secondary Education / High School Equivalence preparation, English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), life skills, employability skills, computer literacy, and workplace education, distance & corrections education.
