**Incident Summary:** On December 23, 2023, at 6:12pm, Patrol Officers responded to a shooting inside the 900 Block of S. High St. Officers located victim #1, Abdus Turner M/B/23, who was unresponsive and suffering from a gunshot wound. CFD EMS 14 pronounced Victim #1 deceased at 6:20pm. Adult Victim #2 and Adult Victim #3 self transported to a local hospital with gun shot injuries. Victims #2 and #3 are expected to recover from their injuries.

Initial investigation indicates that an argument began that led to multiple suspect(s) discharging firearms inside the location.

The investigation continues:
