Indicator Descriptions

Biodiversity: The level of focus and commitment to decreasing habitat fragmentation and habitat destruction while increasing the population of native species.

Energy: The level of focus and commitment to decreasing nonrenewable energy use and increasing renewable energy consumption.

Collaboration: The extent to which all members of the community (regardless of race, socioeconomic class, etc.) are included in the sustainability process.

Materials: The level of focus and commitment to building future communities, and improving existing communities, usage of green construction products.

Waste: The level of focus and commitment to decrease the amount of waste diverted to landfills and increase reuse/ recycling within the community.

Transportation: The level of focus and commitment to decrease high emission transportation while increasing public transportation and green options, such as biking.

Health/ Well-being: The level of focus and commitment to improving the social pillar of sustainability via the physical and mental health of community members.

Water: The level of focus and commitment to decreasing water pollution and increase awareness of community members' water usage.

Community Outreach: The extent to which community members are involved in the implementation process and their capacity to understand consequences of individual actions via education and awareness.

Cost: The expense associated with implementing the program on ranges of personal to community scales.

Existing Process: The extent to which a process, which can be easily mimicked, is obtainable by community members to discuss the possibility of implementation.

Outcome: The associated benefits to be generated by execution of the program.
