### **Columbus Water & Power Encourages Drinking Tap Water on National Hydration Day**

On National Hydration Day, Columbus Water & Power encourages its water customers to learn more about their tap water quality. The city's annual drinking water quality report, known as the Consumer Confidence Report, is posted on the website and customers may request a printed copy. The report is newly expanded this year to include more information that customers often request.

The report shows that water delivered to 1.4 million water consumers in the City of Columbus and contracted suburban service areas meets or exceeds national Safe Drinking Water Act requirements and all other state and federal standards. Based on testing data from last year, it includes water quality details from the city's three water plants: Dublin Road on the Scioto River, Hap Cremean on Big Walnut Creek, and Parsons Avenue which uses wellfields. To ensure regulatory compliance and customer safety, the Division of Water's Water Quality Assurance Laboratory staff complete thousands of tests each year related to different organic, inorganic and microbiological water quality parameters. The EPA requires that all water utilities publish annual reports on source and treated water quality to their customers.

"The City of Columbus has greatly benefitted from adequate water supplies and our history of proactive water resource and treatment/distribution planning," said Director Kristen Atha. "Columbus Water & Power continues that tradition today with informed investment into our infrastructure, which has positioned the city well for continued growth in the region. Our fourth water plant, the Home Road Water Plant, is currently under design, set to break ground this fall in southwestern Delaware County."
