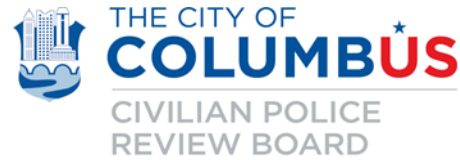

UPDATE FROM THE INSPECTOR GENERAL

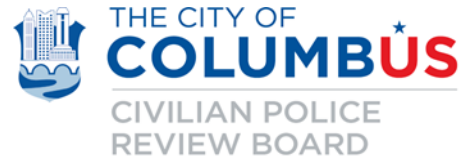
IG Hendricks reviewed the DIG March Monthly Report. This report was emailed to the CPRB prior to the meeting.

RESIDENT SPEAKER(S)

John Bellville: I have made several complaints to the DIG over the last couple years and feel that the they are not opening cases even though there's evidence.

Kyle Strickland: Do you have any specifics and is there anything that the board can do?

John Bellville: It is more on the DIG's office not the board for not responding or opening cases on the complaints made. There was an assault captured on the officer's bodycam. The department didn't review the BWC.

John Bellville: I called last week and one of the investigator's voicemail box is not set up.

Chair Burns took John Bellville's number and stated that she would contact him.

POLICE PROCESS/PROCEDURE/POLICY REVIEW

Chair Burns: During our last meeting we were discussing some BWC issues and Municipal Codes. Is there anyone who would like to start working on an initial draft of what the CPRB would pursue on proposing some amendment language or statute language?

Michael Fahy: I can share with you some of my thoughts via email or is it better to set up a committee now.

Attorney Tobias: Just to caution about emails, it okay to share thoughts but anything asking for input, thoughts or edits should be reserved for an open meeting.

Chair Burns: Dr. Ford couldn't attend today, but I know he would be interested in being on that committee with Michael Fahy and one more board member who would be interested in joining the Ad hoc committee.

Michael Fahy: Looking at the City Code, specifically 21 107.06 there is some provision for when the police officer would have the discretion and does not have to impound the vehicle or impose fees. The provision provides a wide net under which CPD could have a policy.

Michael Fahy: To backtrack this about CPD policy versus the City Code when cars are impounded. What is allowed through City Code and what is implemented through CPD policy. Currently in the CPD Policy there is an allowance for waiving fees for a couple of situations. Within one of the CPD policies there is a list of things that an officer can consider when thinking about impounding a vehicle. I will send the draft around and see what everyone's thoughts are.

Questions and Recommendations from the Civilian Police Review Board

- 2026-0016: The CPRB wanted to know if there were any violations by the dispatcher in this case. IG Hendricks is reaching out to the ECC to find out and will give the CPRB an update during the June meeting.
- 2026-0016: Is Dispatch that has civilians on it have the same policy as CPD?
- **RECOMMENDATION:** The CPRB would like to file a complaint regarding the Officer shooting of (victim) after an attempted traffic stop, if there has not already been a complaint filed. With the understanding that if there is a criminal investigation being done, that the CPRB/DIG investigations is paused.

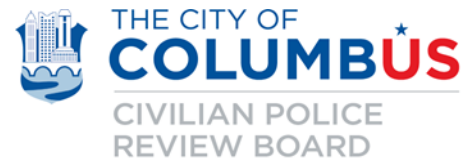
