Checklist for Selecting a Licensed Lead Abatement Contractor

Use this checklist to make sure your contractor is licensed, experienced and qualified to safely fix lead hazards in your home. Only a licensed lead abatement contractor can correct hazards listed in a Lead Hazard Control Order from Columbus Public Health. Get three or more quotes before making your decision.

Contractor Credentials

- ☐ Contractor is licensed in Ohio for lead abatement.
- ☐ License is current (not expired).
- ☐ Contractor has years of experience working with lead hazards.
- ☐ Contractor gave three recent references from past jobs

Insurance & Protection

- ☐ Contractor has general liability insurance.
- ☐ Contractor has errors & omissions (E&O) insurance.

Contract & Work Quality

- ☐ Contract is in writing and lists all work details and costs.
- ☐ Contract says project must pass a dust clearance test.
- ☐ Contractor will pay for recleaning and retesting if clearance fails.
- ☐ Contractor follows Ohio laws and HUD Guidelines.
- ☐ Contractor provided an example of a final report.

Project Planning

- ☐ Contractor gave a written project schedule.
- ☐ Contractor gave a clear budget estimate.
