- Provided learning sessions about minority cultures, health beliefs and barriers for all Columbus Public Health (CPH) staff.
- Worked with CPH's Alcohol and Drug Services to facilitate discussions about the impact of drug addiction and opioid use.
- Worked with CPH's Maternal Child Health to facilitate discussion about infant mortality and provided Safe Sleep Ambassadors training.
- Participated in CPH's Diversity and Equity Committee by attending health equity trainings, providing speakers and presenters, and giving feedback and insight.
