<p>Discussion:</p>	<p>Susan G. Komen Columbus Breast Health Equity Initiative</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 10 year goal to reduce breast cancer deaths by 50% year 2026 Community- early detection, access to care, patient navigation, health equity Social determinants of health 80% breast health disparity among franklin county is by race Genetics and tumor biology disparity among race Triple negative more likely in African American women than white , treatment resistant , younger women Her2neu- treatment progress is new and may not be available in low resource areas Genomics- AA breast cancer patients who have had genetic testing are more likely to have BRCA mutations compared to other populations Less likely to have genetic testing Ohio is 4th in breast cancer mortality. Delays from diagnosis to treatment (14.7 days longer than private insurance on average in franklin county) Geography- 50% of deaths in African American women in Columbus are in 5 zip codes - north linden, Whitehall, northeast cols, Forrest park, southeast cols Quality of care and delays in treatment- lack of facilities linked to mortality disparities by zip code, Bexley, Whitehall, Linden. Accredited screening, diagnostic or treatment facilities. Delayed follow-up times and lack accreditation in these areas. Also these areas have high level of non-compliance Facilities are located outside the areas
