GENERAL INFORMATION

What to bring to camp:

- Participant Medical Waiver Form- completed for each camper
- Snacks one afternoon snack will be provided but we suggest additional snacks for throughout the day
- Water bottle- all sites have drinking fountains for refills
- Weather appropriate outdoor clothing
- Closed toe athletic shoes
- Complete change of clothes
- An extra pair of closed toe shoes- expect clothes and shoes to be wet and dirty
- Jacket for cool or wet days
- Backpack or bag to hold items
- Swimsuit and towel- optional
- Sunscreen- must be able to self-apply
- Bug Spray- must be able to self-apply

*Please label camper items with first and last name to ensure that all items are returned to their owner.

What not to bring to camp:

- Items of value
- Electronics including cell phones, video games, etc.
- * We are not responsible for any missing or stolen items.

Drop Off & Pick Up

All campers must be signed in and out of camp each day. Campers cannot be dropped off on their first day of camp without a completed Participant Medical Waiver Form.

Campers will only be permitted to leave camp with a person on the authorized pick-up list. Check to include yourself on the list even if your register, it will not automatically fill your name in. A photo ID must be presented during sign out every day, absolutely no exceptions. To add a name to your pickup list email OutdoorEducation@columbus.gov with your child's name and the additional names to be added to the pickup list. You may also add names in person during drop off and pick up times. Please be sure to list the names, as they appear on a photo ID. Avoid nicknames.

If dropping off late or picking up early, please visit the camp office to sign the participant in/out. Since our camp days include times where participants are doing activities in the woods or our on water, please notify staff at drop off if you plan to pick up early so that we can arrange to have the participant back in the office on time to be picked up.

Late Fees will be charged for children not picked up by 6 pm. Fees are \$10 after 15 minutes and \$1 for each additional minute. Example: A pick up at 6:20 will be a charge of \$15.

Please remember to drive slowly through the park during pick up and drop off. Thank you!

GENERAL INFORMATION

Lunch

Lunch is provided for campers via the CRPD Summer Foods Program. https://www.columbus.gov/recreationandparks/programs/Free-Meal-Programs/

All components found in the provided meals meet the USDA Summer Feeding program requirements. No peanut or pork products are served. Campers are welcome to pack a lunch if they prefer- refrigeration not provided.

Indian Village Preschool participants will receive one snack but are not served lunch as part of the program. However, free lunch is available between 12 pm and 1 pm as you leave/arrive for camp. Parents must remain on site to supervise children during this time. Ask our camp director for details.

Lunch not provided at Discover Boating.

Snack

Each camp will take a morning and afternoon snack break. Only an afternoon snack is provided via the CRPD Summer Food Program. Campers will be active throughout the day and need energy, please pack extra snacks for morning snack time.

Camp Themes

Each week of camp offers traditional camp activities, regardless of the theme including: games, crafts, unstructured nature based play, and exploration. Camp is carefully planned and offers a balance of organized staff lead activities and child directed choices.

Each camp has a daily schedule that we follow, however, activities may be moved around throughout the week to meet the current needs of the day. It is important for us to keep campers engaged and having fun throughout the week.

Age Policy

There are no exceptions to our age policies. Your child must be six years old by the first day of camp to attend Indian Village, Camp Terra, or Camp Turnberry. Your child must be four years old by the first day of camp to attend Indian Village Preschool and at least 10 years old by the first day of camp to attend Discover Boating Camp.

Archery & Canoeing

Campers who are 8+ will have the opportunity to participate in archery (Indian Village, Camp Terra, & Camp Turnberry) and canoeing (Indian Village & Camp Terra only). Canoeing is subject to weather and may be cancelled or rescheduled.

Camper Groups

Campers are assigned to groups based on age. Camp is a great place to meet new friends. We maintain a 1:12 ratio of staff to campers and a 1:6 for preschool camp.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Camp Rules

Responsibility – You are responsible for what you bring to camp. Do not bring anything of value.
Environment – Please respect nature by not picking leaves off trees, or killing bugs on purpose.
Safety – Stay away from the river/lake. Stay within eyesight and earshot of your counselor.
Participate – We ask that you try everything we have planned. You might try something new, and like it!
Educate – Each week has a theme. We will participate in themed activities, and learn something new.
Communicate – If there's a problem, tell us! Don't wait until Friday.

Teamwork – You will be working as a team in your small group, and the whole camp is a team. **Respect** – The building, the grounds, your counselors and CITs, and each other. Be kind and helpful.

Camp Discipline Policy

First Warning – Child receives a notification of inappropriate behavior from the counselor who helps to guide to corrections
Second Warning – Child receives a timeout within their group
Third Warning – Child receives a timeout in the office and a parent is called
Fourth Warning – Child is sent home for the remainder of the day
Fifth Warning – Child is sent home for the remainder of the week

Immediate expulsion from camp for the remainder of the week for any of the following: intentional nudity, violence (hitting, kicking, spitting), bringing weapons to camp, bullying, cursing, leaving the grounds without permission.

If your child is sent home for the week twice during the camp season they will not be able to return to camp for the remainder of the season with no refund.

Financial Assistance

Payment Plans are available for all campers. Choose a payment plan when you register. One quarter of your camp fees must be paid at the time of registration. Remaining fees will be divided equally and your credit card will be charged automatically when payments are due. All payments are due prior to June 8, 2020.

P.L.A.Y. Grants are available for children who qualify. Proof of Eligibility must be provided by the legal guardian and it can be one of the following: most recent federal income tax return showing adjusted gross income and number of dependents, a copy of your Medicaid/CareSource/Molina health card, or copy of your EPPICard and/or Ohio Works First. Grants cover one session of camp per child. The maximum amount awarded is \$90 per child. Grants must be approved before you register for camp. Eligible PLAY applicants will need a coupon code to register for camps online.

Waiting List

If a spot becomes available in the session you would like to register for, we will email you. You will be given 72 hours to respond before your spot is offered to the next person on the list. Please make sure you have a current email address linked to your Active Net account to receive notification.

Cancellations & Requests for Refunds

In order to receive a refund, a request must be emailed to Outdooreducation@columbus.gov ten business days prior to camp session. These requests should include the participant name and which week of camp you wish to cancel. Refunds requested between six and 10 business days prior to camp session will receive a 50% refund. Requests received less than five business days prior to camp session will not receive a refund. Refunds take 6-8 weeks to process. A \$15 processing fee will be assessed for each refund request.

Weather

Campers will spend most of their day outside. In the event of severe weather, summer camp will still be held. We have many "rainy day" activities to play indoors. On heat advisory days we will take frequent breaks indoors and/or in the shade to cool down.

Camp Photos

Each week group photos will be taken of camp groups and will be available to purchase (digital copy). Order forms can be found at the front desk and are due with \$5 by noon on Wednesday. This fundraiser that benefits the Friends of Outdoor Recreation.

Inclusion, Accommodation, & Special Needs Support

We offer reasonable accommodations to enable an individual's successful participation in our camps. We offer inclusion support staff to assist with campers participating in camp. Campers may bring their own support person, but must pass a criminal background check.

Steps to access this service:

1.Contact Mary Beth Moore by email-MBMoore@Columbus.gov and request an Inclusion, Accommodation, & Special Needs Request Form.

2.Complete the form and email back at least 14 days prior to the start of camp. There is limited availability for this service. All requests will be reviewed and acted upon based on the need and availability of Inclusion Support staff.

3. Once accepted, an inclusion support staff will contact you to discuss accommodation options.
