**CAC Application # 14-04-01**

**Project:** Gateway History Mural – Cooke Road  
**Location:** Walls of the railroad underpass along Cooke Road, between Interstate 71 and Indianola Avenue  
**Applicant:** Clintonville Historical Society

In 2012 the Society successfully worked with the Department of Public Utilities and Artist Greg Ackers to complete a history themed mural on the railroad underpass at North Broadway. The Society is now undertaking a mural project on the Cooke Road railroad underpass. This mural will be Native American themed – the Clintonville area was once home to Woodland Native Americans. The project artist is Danielle Poling.

**Project:** Gateway Mural at Hudson Street  
**Location:** Walls of the railroad underpass on Hudson Street near I-71 between Silver Drive and 4<sup>th</sup> Street  
**Applicant:** Clintonville Historical Society

In 2013 Keep Columbus Beautiful and the Columbus Crew Soccer team sought approval for a mural on the east side of the railroad underpass on Hudson Street. The Commission supported the idea of a mural, but declined approval of the specific image presented, which was a clip art silhouette of a soccer player. The project was to be a beautification project. Because of the Clintonville Historical Society's success with the North Broadway mural and interest in completing additional murals near the I-71 gateways into Clintonville, Commission Staff mentioned the Hudson Street mural project to Mary Rogers. The Society was approached by David Salter, an air brush artist seeking a mural

opportunity. Salter has sketched out a soccer themed mural featuring the Columbus Crew and fans that the Society is in the process of vetting within the community and with the Columbus Crew.
