Project: *The Search for Community*, South Side Settlement 1899-2011

Location: The Reeb Center, 280 Reeb Avenue

Applicant: Reeb Center Board/Columbus Department of Finance

Presenters:

Applicants seek approval of a series of photo collages created by artist John Sunami for the Center market and café. Former Southside Settlement Board members helped to select the photos and materials used by the artist around the themes of: Work; Celebration; Art & Ideas; and Social Justice. The artwork will be loaned to the City of Columbus. The artwork is complete and has been placed in the market/café.

The art is a mixed-media mural created to commemorate the philanthropy of Don and Nancy Kelly, and to celebrate the rich cultural heritage of the Southside. The mural was created and installed by April Sunami.

Action Requested: Approval of the design and long-term placement of the artwork, *Southside Rising* by artist April Sunami at the newly renovated and dedicated Reeb Center at 280 Reeb Avenue, on the Southside of Columbus per Columbus Code 3115.04 (A) & (B)

Project: *Art From Nature*

Location: Iuka Park, 2057 Iuka Avenue

Applicant: University District Organization (UDO)

Presenters: Matt Hanson, Executive Director, UDO

The UDO released a Call for Entries on August 10, 2016, seeking qualifications from individuals and teams to create an environmental art piece in Iuka Park that integrates with the landscape. The Call stated that the art should use natural materials that will degrade over time. Consideration was given to projects that include community participation in the art process. Prospective artists were directed to seek inspiration from the Community Character Framework document found at www.universitydistrict.org/character . Applicants have selected Columbus artist, Walter Herrmann for the project. Artist's response/statement, examples of work and proposal are included in the submission packet.

Action Requested: Approval of the design and temporary placement of the Art From Nature proposal by artist Walter Herrmann at Iuka Park per Columbus Code 3115.03 (A), 3115.04 (A) & (B)

Project: *Reach Out* Relocation Project
Location: Franklin Park Conservatory Grounds
Applicant: Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens (FPC)
Presenters: Anita Burton, Collections Associate, FCP

FCP is in the midst of a capital improvement campaign, the heart of which includes the development of a new two-acre Children's Garden. The piece, *Reach Out*, by artist Alfred Tibor, was sited in 1992 during Ameriflora. The artwork was created in memorium of those who have died or are living with HIV/AIDS. The sculpture is located within the two-acres that will become the Children's Garden. FCP has consulted with the Artist's daughter, Eva Tibor, regarding the move and the work will be completed by Carmine Menduni, the family's recommended contractor.

Action Requested: Approval of the removal and relocation of Alfred Tibor's *Reach Out*, artwork to a new location with the grounds of the Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens, per Columbus Code 3115.03 (C).

Project: Scioto Peninsula Garage and Park Art Relocation Project
Location: West entrance to COSI
Applicant: Capital South Urban Redevelopment Corporation/MKSK Studios
Presenters: Tom Stephens, MKSK Studios

Applicants seek Commission approval to relocate the artwork, *Spectrum*, by artist William Wainwright (1991). The sculpture is located in what will become a fire lane as part of the Scioto Peninsula redevelopment. Applicants wish to relocate the art to a more prominent location (Site plan included).

Action Requested: Approval of the removal and relocation of William Wainwright's sculpture, *Spectrum*, to a new park location as shown in the submitted site plan, per Columbus Code 3115.03 (C).
