**CAC Application # 17-11-01**

**Project:** *COTA Bus Shelter Window Scrim*

**Location:** High Street in front to the Convention Center (See Packet Materials)

**Applicant:** Franklin County Convention and Visitor Authority (FCCVA)

**Presenter:** Scott Reed, FCCVA

The FCCVA recently celebrated the reopening of the Greater Columbus Convention Center (GCCC), which celebrates Ohio artists through the creation of a center-wide, curated gallery of original artworks. The proposed bus shelter art consists of images from the GCCC art collection arranged on panels of scrim placed on the four glass panels at the back of the shelter.

**Action Requested:**

Approval of the design and proposed placement of bus shelter art depicting images of original artwork located in the GCCC and placed in the back of the COTA bus shelter located in front of the Convention Center by Spruce Street per Columbus Code Chapter 3115.04 (C) and (D).

Note:

- The art may require a Right of Way Permit from the Department of Public Service;
- Changes to the submitted application:
  - Both Design and *Placement* approval required;
  - The art will be located in the public right of way, not on property owned or leased by Columbus; and
  - Art to be placed on a COTA bus stop. It will not be owned or maintained by the City of Columbus; rather it will be privately owned and maintained.

**Location:** The Department of Public Service (DPS) High Street Streetscape Project Area from Poplar Street to Ninth Avenue

**Applicant:** Designing Local and the Columbus Public Art Program

The City released a Request for Proposals (RFQ) for the creation of a public art plan for the High Street Corridor located within the DPS High Street project area. The Columbus firm Designing Local was retained to lead this process. Their team included former art administrator, artist and curator, Marc Pally, Landscape design and planning firm, MKSK Studios, and strategic visual communication and architectural graphic design firm, Kolar Design, Inc. Consultants were tasked with a three month goal for completion of the Art on High Strategic Public art Master Plan. To support this effort, an advisory committee was formed, surveys were taken and numerous other public participation activities were undertaken. For the purposes of Conceptual Approval, Commissioners are being asked to review and provide comment on the draft text and Request for Qualifications/Artist Call.

**Action Requested:**

Conceptual Approval of the draft language of the Art on High Strategic Public Art Master Plan and RFQ/Artist Call.
