Project: Livingston Park Public Art Project

Location: Livingston Park (immeadiately south of Nationwide Children's Hospital)

Applicant: Neighborhood Design Center and Columbus Public Art Program

Presenter: Isabela Gould, Executive Director, Neighborhood Design Center (NDC)

The design and placement of artist, Tom Hubbard's trolley-themed public art proposal for Livingstion Park was approved by the CAC on May 24, 2016. At the request of Nationwide Children's Hospital, applicants have returned to the CAC to seek approval to move the artwork. The previously approved site is located over a portion of the park that will cap a new underground garage, the construction of which would force the artwork to be temporarily relocated and/or placed in storage. A new site location has been selected farther east along Livingston Avenue. The public art project is under the management of the NDC.

Action Requested:

Approval to relocate the public artwork by artist Tom Hubbard to location farther east along Livingston Avenue per Columbus Code Chapters 3115.04 (A) & (B)

Project: Harrison Park Public Art Project

Location: Harrison Park

Applicant: Columbus Public Art Program and Harrison West Society

Presenter: Lori Baudro, Columbus Public Art Program

On September 22, 2015, the CAC conceptually approved artist Todd Kime's proposal, *Through*, a handcrafted glass and steel gateway. At the time, conceptual approval was requested because the exact location of the artwork had yet to be determined. Since that time, staff, the artist, and representatives from the community and Recreation and Parks met at the Park to determine a location for the art. A location has been selected that is

north and back (west) from the sidewalk on a small knoll near new condiminiums constructed at the north end of the Park. The artist's renderings depict this location, as well as trees that are proposed to the west of the art.

Approval of the design and placement of the public artwork, *Through*, by artist Todd Kime at Harrison Park, per Columbus Code Chapters 3115.04 (A) & (B)
