Artist Olga Ziemaska has returned to the Commission with a second public art proposal for Parsons Avenue. She was previously at the December 20, 2016 CAC hearing to present a proposal for artwork associated with a Department of Public Service (DPS) project on Parsons Avenue. DPS is undergrounding utilities as part of ODOT's project redesigning portions of I-70 and I-71. Ziemaska's 12/20 proposal (Proposal 1), was tabled after it was determined by the artist and DPS project engineer that the sidewalk width would not accommodate the art.
