- The AT&T Tower is the largest building in Tennessee and since its highest points resemble bat ears, it's been nicknamed the "Batman building."

- Nashville's Centennial Park is home to the only exact replica of the Greek Parthenon.

- Nashville native William Walker became the president of Nicaragua in 1856. No other American has become president of another country since.

- "Jingle Bell Rock," and "Hokey Pokey" were recorded in Nashville.

- Oprah Winfrey's path started in Nashville TV when she became the first female and African American news anchor while attending Tennessee State University.

- Nashville Zoo has two extraordinary exhibits, Gibbon Island and Meerkat Habitats that the Animal Planet network recognized as the best in the country.

- At the 1960 Rome Olympics, Nashville native Wilma Rudolph became the first American woman to win three gold medals in one Olympics
