HAPPY SPRING!

The weather is getting warmer, and the sky is getting bluer. Spring is here! This is a good time to get out, enjoy the weather and of course spread the word about infant mortality on the South Side. Let us use every opportunity we have to let clients, neighbors, and family know how to protect our babies!

Please also take the time out, if you have not already, to get up to date on your vaccinations. As you may have heard, there have now been over 100 cases of Mumps reported in Franklin County and it has spread beyond the campus of OSU.

So you may be asking yourself how this relates to infant mortality. Well, prevention of infectious disease is one major way we can protect babies.

Prevention of Mumps:

- 1. Get up to date on your Measles Mumps Rubella (MMR) vaccine.
- 2. Cover your cough or sneeze.
- 3. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water.

What to Do if You Become Infected with Mumps:

- 1. Contact your medical provider
- 2. Stay at home for five days after symptoms begin.
- 3. Cover your cough or sneeze.
- 4. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water.


South Side Area Health Advisory Committee Meeting
