




Infant Mortality...

- Is the death of a child less than 1 year of age
- Is a measure of a community's health and social condition
- Is affected by biological, behavioral, social, cultural, economic, and environmental factors
- Is mostly caused by
 - Being born too small or too soon, serious birth defects, unsafe sleeping conditions, and/or maternal complications of pregnancy
- Varies by person, place, and time


Infant Mortality Rate, 1990-2012




Infant Mortality Rate, 1990-2012







Infant Deaths per 1,000 Live Births 2005-2010






Infant Mortality Rate by Area and Race and Ethnicity, 2005-2010










Disproportionality, 2005-2010, Southside







Summary

- Infant mortality is a complex problem
- Franklin county's infant mortality rate is higher than Ohio's, which is higher than the national average
- Within Franklin county, infant mortality rates range from as low as 4 deaths per 1,000 live births to as high as 18 deaths per 1,000 live births by zip code
- Non-Hispanic Blacks typically have higher rates of infant mortality when compared to Non-Hispanic Whites
- Using a social determinants of health framework can help us get at the root causes of infant mortality




