
SUMMER IS FINALLY HERE...

We've covered so much in the past months; we thought it would be a good time to review all the progress we have made thus far. 
November 2013

We discussed the rates of infant mortality on the South Side and compared the data to Franklin County, Ohio, and the United States. We also introduced the Social Determinants of Health and the Lifecourse approach: the ideas that all of our experiences contribute to our health and particularly our birth outcomes.

February 2014 In February, we reviewed the Perinatal Periods of Risk (PPOR) map. PPOR showed us that the biggest contributors to infant mortality among South Side residents are issues and conditions related to maternal health and prematurity. As a group it was decided to make the health of the mother/prematurity our focus.



March 2014 Because published data can only provide us with a piece of the picture, in March we created our own community problem map that showcased the contributing factors and consequences of infant mortality the way we see it in our neighborhoods.



<u>April</u> 2014

We took a "tour" of some model cities in April to find out what they were doing to curtail the infant deaths in their communities.



May 2014

In May, we narrowed down our focus to working with families for our upstream initiative and women of childbearing age for our downstream initiative.

<u>June</u> 2014 During our June meeting we spent the entire meeting deliberating over which interventions we would choose for our upstream and downstream initiatives. The group has decided that our interventions will be:

•Upstream: Families- Community Building/Civic Engagement & Parenting Education/Mentoring

•Downstream: Women of Childbearing Age- Perinatal Case Management

July 2014
