Victory Circle

- Perinatal Case Management
 - Seeking care early
 - o Women/girls have better outcomes (who have participated in p.c.m.)

- Work on project (p.c.m.) continues after OET/CM TA ends (\$, sustainability)
- Connected to needed services (and this is tracked/monitored)
- o Tracking to make sure IM is not on the rise again
- Accessibility
- o Services are more individualized to pregnant women
- Culturally appropriate
- o Replication (fortitude and close to home)
- o Pioneering off hook to sign up!
- Other wraparound services in place/connections are real!
 - Coming back for post-partum visit (mom→baby)
- Natural supports in place
- o Replication (far and wide)
- o (Prepared to raise your child) parenting skills and education → lifelong, know the expectations
