Prior high quality evaluation of work with CRPD and other city departments.

This ordinance will enable the Director of Recreation and Parks to enter into a design/build contract with Metropolitan Environmental Services, Inc./Oxbow River and Stream Restoration, Inc. in connection with Clover Groff Steam Restoration - Phase II. The funding has been awarded to restore Clover Groff Ditch to a functioning natural stream, from Roberts Road to Spindler Park. The target completion date for this project is December, 2010. Explanation

BACKGROUND: This Ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to modify and increase the construction contract with Shelly & Sands, Inc., for the Champion Ave. 24" Water Main Project, for the Division of Power and Water.

This project consisted of constructing a 24-inch water main along Champion Avenue from Maryland Avenue to Main Street. During the construction, a number of unexpected underground utility conflicts were encountered that significantly increased the construction cost of the project. They included an abandoned gas main and a sanitary sewer which were in conflict with the alignment of the water main. Due to other utility constraints the proposed water main could not be relocated to avoid the abandoned gas main. This necessitated the removal of the gas main. There wasn't a record of the sanitary sewer, so it did not appear on the construction plans, nor was it evident in the field during construction of the water main. After the Contractor had constructed the water main, it became apparent that a sanitary sewer had been damaged by the construction. The contractor repaired the sanitary sewer, but the cost to do so, was not a part of the original contract. Finally, the Department of Public Service requested additional pavement replacement above and beyond the quantity shown on the plans approved by the Department of Public Service.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Finance and Management Director to renew a contract with S. A. The cost of this renewal is \$198,000.00. The overrun will be funded by reducing monies budgeted for unexpected emergencies. In years past, most emergencies addressed by the Facilities Management Division were caused by extreme cold weather. To date in 2010, no significant emergencies have arisen.

The City of Columbus, Finance and Management Department, Fleet Management Division, has been awarded a grant from the United States Department of Energy through the local Clean Cities Coalition designee, Clean Fuels Ohio. The funding opportunity is titled "Clean Cities FY09 Petroleum Reduction Technologies Projects for the Transportation Sector", Area of Interest 4, and was created through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 to fund cost-shared projects that expand the use of alternative fueled vehicles and advanced technology vehicles as well as the installation or acquisition of infrastructure necessary to directly support an alternative fueled vehicle or advanced technology vehicle.

Local governments must be in partnership with an active designated Clean Cities Coalition in order to be eligible for funds. Clean Fuels Ohio is the Clean Cities Coalition designee for Columbus. Clean Fuels Ohio was the grant applicant and will serve as the fiduciary for grant funds. The City of Columbus is a partner in the grant and will be responsible for the administration of its portion of grant funds received. Ordinance #0651-2009 (passed on May 4, 2009) authorized the Finance and Management Director to enter into partnership with Clean Fuels Ohio for the purpose of applying for this grant. This ordinance is now needed to enter into contract with Clean Fuels Ohio and to accept and appropriate \$1,273,250 in grant money to fund Fleet Management's portion of this project for the period February 1, 2010 through December 31, 2011.

This is a two-year project, beginning in 2010 and continuing through 2011. The project is comprised of 3 interrelated areas: equipment purchases, training of mechanics, and construction. Equipment purchases require a 25% match, contractual services (training) and construction require a 50% partner match. Fleet Management's equipment purchases include six (6) heavy duty CNG vehicles and five (5) hybrid heavy duty vehicles to be located in the Department of Public Utilities, Division of Refuse Collection and the Division of Mobility Options. The grant funds 75% of the *incremental* cost to make a vehicle alternative fueled or hybrid. The City is responsible for the base cost of the vehicle. Contractual services involve the training of mechanics in CNG and hybrid vehicle maintenance as well as special training needed for the specific equipment being purchased. Fleet Management's construction portion of the grant award will fund the design and construction of a CNG fueling station to be located at the current Fleet Management main facility at 4211 Groves Road as well as facility modifications to buildings at Groves Road and Fairwood Ave. that are expected to house CNG vehicles.

Fiscal Impact: The total cost of this project is \$4,442,500 (equipment purchases \$2,856,000, contractual services \$9,500 and construction \$1,577,000). The City's contribution includes our match (\$953,250) plus the base price of the vehicles (\$2,216,000) for a total of \$3,169,250. The federal award totals \$1,273,250. The matching portion for the construction and contractual services will be budgeted in Fleet Management's 2010 and 2011 operating and capital budgets. Vehicle purchases have been budgeted in divisions' 2010 and 2011 capital and operating budgets.

Emergency action is requested to expedite the project and stay within the timeframes required by the U.S. Department of Energy.

Explanation

BACKGROUND: The purpose of this ordinance is to authorize an agreement between the Columbus Department of Development and the Ohio Department of Development to receive and administer a grant of up to \$300,000 under the Clean Ohio Assistance Fund and to authorize an agreement between the Columbus Department of Development and Wagenbrenner Development for site assessment activities at the former 3M site (aka, former Auld site) at 1206 N. The former 3M site was used for metal finishing operations from 1920 to 2000 when operations closed. It has remained vacant since 2000 and, since that time, has been a blighting influence in the Weinland Park Neighborhood of Columbus.

Recently, the Columbus Department of Development, in partnership with Wagenbrenner Development, submitted an application for a \$3 million Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund grant, but upon review by the Ohio EPA, concern was expressed that the site may be more contaminated than originally understood. As a result, Ohio EPA suggested that Columbus' application be withdrawn until further assessment of the site could be undertaken. In cooperation, the Ohio Department of Development offered Columbus an opportunity to apply for a grant of up to \$300,000 in Clean Ohio Assistance Funds to conduct additional environmental assessment of the site and invited the city to resubmit the \$3 million Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund application in mid-2010.

The application for the Clean Ohio Assistance Fund grant has been approved and both the Columbus Department of Development and Wagenbrenner Development agreed to follow the recommendation of the Ohio EPA and accept the offer of assistance from the Ohio Department of Development contingent on Columbus City Council approval.

This legislation is submitted as an emergency to begin entering into the aforesaid agreements and acquire the grant so work may commence as soon as possible.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding for this legislation is provided by a Clean Ohio Assistance Fund grant from the Ohio Department of Development in the amount of \$300,000.00.

Explanation1. BACKGROUND

The Division of Mobility Options has a contract with ACS State and Local Solutions Inc. to provide parking ticket processing services for the City of Columbus. This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Service to modify and extend the contract between ACS State and Local Solutions and the Department of Public Service, Division of Mobility Options, from April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011.

The first of six years of the agreement between ACS State and Local Solutions and the Department of Public Service, Division of Mobility Options was authorized by Ordinance 0217-2008. The first of five renewal options for this contract was authorized by ordinance 0392-2009. This is the second of five renewal options for this contract.

This contract is a complete turnkey system that includes all software, hardware, licenses, and maintenance necessary to process parking citations on a transaction fee basis. It presently includes: a cash remittance system that incorporates walk-in, US Mail, pay-by-web, and pay-by-phone technologies; data entry, data processing, mailing of notices; a registration hold interface with the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles; and a secondary collection effort for tickets that remain unpaid after going through the entire noticing process and still remain outstanding. The net funds collected under this effort are deposited in the General Fund, while a collection percentage fee is deposited in the Collection Fees Fund, established by the City Auditor and Department of Finance and Management through Ordinance 0474-2003.

Searches in the Excluded Party List System (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery list (State) produced no findings against ACS State and Local Solutions.

ACS State and Local Solutions (ACS) contract compliance number is 131996647 and expires 06/10/2010.

3. FISCAL IMPACT

This legislation represents various programs funded following the Emergency Human Services (EHS) application process as well as the Department of Development's application and evaluation process for General Fund assistance. The legislation targets social service agencies that will provide help to families and households through day care, substance

abuse prevention programs, refugee and resettlement programs, senior care, mediation services, services for the disabled, material assistance and food programs, workforce development, youth programs and other services by assisting with the operating needs of the agency. In addition, the city supports programs and activities so that the greater population is assured access to other community assistance. This funding will allow the process to continue much needed services.

Emergency action is necessary to avoid causing interruptions in the delivery of program services.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes the expenditure of \$789,872.00 from the Emergency Human Services Fund and \$2,116,228.00 from the General Fund for a total of \$2,906,100.00. In 2010, a total of \$902,000.00 in Emergency Human Services Funds and \$2,466,517.00 in General Funds has been allocated to fund social service programs. Companion legislation authorizes the expenditure of the balance of the funds.

The City of Columbus, Department of Public Service, Division of Design and Construction, is engaged in many projects involving the rehabilitation and reconstruction of roadways within the City of Columbus. BACKGROUND: This ordinance establishes the 2010 Capital Improvement Budget (CIB). The budget presented herein represents a plan for the expenditure of monies in 2010 for a variety of capital improvement projects.

The new funding amount of the total CIB is \$515.5 million, but \$384.8 million of this amount, or nearly 75%, is supported by enterprise revenues and miscellaneous smaller revenues such as internal service fees and federal and state funding sources, not the set-aside of income taxes.

FISCAL IMPACT: Appropriation authority for new money is granted at the time debt is issued, not with this ordinance.

Title

To adopt a Capital Improvements Budget for the twelve months ending December 31, 2010 or until such a time as a new Capital Improvements Budget is adopted, establishing a project budget for capital improvements requiring legislative authorization in 2010, to repeal Ordinance No. 0806-2009, as amended, and to declare an emergency.

Body

WHEREAS, Chapter 333 of the Columbus City Code requires the annual submission of a Capital Improvements Budget to City Council for consideration and adoption; and

WHEREAS, the following sets forth capital projects proposed for the City of Columbus in 2010, the proposed source of funds for each project, and a maximum budget for the 12 months beginning January 1, 2010 and ending December 31, 2010, or until such time as a new capital improvements budget is adopted; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the various city departments in that it is immediately necessary to budget capital projects and proposed funding by the adoption of a Capital Improvements Budget for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety and welfare; Now, Therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That from the monies in each of the subfunds, the source of which is identified for each project, there be and hereby are budgeted for the following capital projects (see attached files), the following sums of money for the 12 months from January 1, 2010 to December 31, 2010 or until such time as a new capital improvements budget is adopted. THE FOLLOWING PAGES ARE INTENTIONALLY LEFT BLANK FOR PAGE NUMBERS TO BE PUT ON INSERTED PAGES

SECTION 2. That for the purposes of amendment and review of legislation for conformance to the Capital Improvements Budget each project budget identified by the "Project Number" listed on this Ordinance shall be regarded as a separate and distinct section of the Capital Improvements Budget.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to Section 333.03 of the Columbus City Codes, all ordinances relative to the issuance of notes or bonds, appropriating money from general bond funds or any other funds listed therein in any way relating to the Capital Improvements of the City of Columbus shall be forwarded to the Department of Finance and Management for written approval prior to submission to the City Council. Each ordinance concerning Capital Improvements shall be designated as in "conformance" or "non-conformance" with the approved Capital Improvements Budget for the ensuing year. If designated in "non-conformance" an explanation including the reasons for, and the specific effects of the "non-conformance" shall be affixed to the ordinance.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to Section 333.04 of the Columbus City Codes, ordinances not conforming to the Capital Improvements Budget shall not be passed until said budget is amended. No amendments to the Capital Improvements Budget shall be made except as follows:

All requests for modification pertaining to the Capital Improvements Budget shall be submitted to the Director of Finance and Management for recommendations before such changes shall be submitted to City Council for adoption.

SECTION 5. Among the responsibilities of the Department of Finance and Management shall be the integration of the Capital Improvements Budget into the City's annual operating budget, the preparation of quarterly reports on Capital Improvement expenditures, the preparation of long-range Capital Improvement fiscal requirements, the establishment of a city-wide uniform budgeting and record-keeping system for Capital Improvement projects, and the monitoring of capital improvement ordinances for their conformance with the Capital Improvements Budget.

SECTION 6. That the City Auditor is hereby authorized to establish and implement proper project and fund accounting systems and procedures for Capital Improvements as well as the identification and monitoring of the objects of expenditure of all transactions. The City Auditor shall report monthly a summary of all Capital Improvement transactions.

SECTION 7. That the City Auditor is hereby authorized to transfer the unencumbered balance in a project account to the unallocated balance account within the same fund upon receipt of certification by the Director of the Department of Finance and Management and the Director of the Department administering said project stipulating that the project has been completed and the monies are no longer required for said project, except that no transfer shall be made from a project account funded by monies from more than one source.

SECTION 08. That it is understood that this Council is not making specific allocations for each minor object of a project account herein before contained but only for the project accounts within the stated funds. The allocations herein made shall constitute limitations on each project account and no official or employee of the City shall make or authorize expenditures beyond such limitation nor shall be authorized to make expenditures from an improper project account. It is provided, however, that transfers may be made from one project account to another within the same fund.

SECTION 09. Subsequent legislation affecting the various projects contained herein will be submitted to this Council transferring and/or originating necessary funds.

SECTION 10. That Ordinance No. 0806-2009, as amended, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 11. In accordance with Section 27 of the Columbus City Charter detailed schedules of all changes from the Mayor's Estimate shall be placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk.

RESOLUTION 10-08

To amend Chapter 225 of the Columbus City Health Code regarding regulations and fees for household sewage treatment systems and small flow on-site sewage treatment systems.

WHEREAS, the household sewage system permit fees have not been revised since 2006; and,

WHEREAS, there has been an increase in the costs of administering the Household Sewage Program; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 225 of the Columbus City Health Code is not in accordance with the Chapter 3701-29 of the Ohio Administrative Code; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 3701-29 will become the minimum standard for the installation of household sewage treatment systems and small flow on-site sewage treatment systems; and,

WHEREAS, the fee categories specified in Section 3701-29-06(D) do not fully correspond with those

in Chapter 225 of the Columbus City Health Code; and,

WHEREAS, changes in the Columbus City Health Code have been recommended by the staff of the Columbus Public Health in order to continue efficient use of available resources in light of increased costs and to comply with Ohio Administrative Code, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. That Chapter 225 of the Columbus City Health Code be retitled, **Household Sewage Treatment Systems**, and be amended to read as follows:

225.05 FEES.

There is levied and assessed in each fee category specified in Chapter 3701-29 of the Ohio Administrative Code that amount as specified in Chapter 3701-29 of the Ohio Administrative Code which is required to be transmitted to the State of Ohio, plus the following fee:

- (a) Application fee for the installation, replacement, or alteration of a household sewage treatment system, one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) for household and application fee for a small flow sewage treatment system, two hundred dollars (\$200.00).
- (b) Permit fee for the installation or replacement of a household sewage treatment system, two-hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225.00).
- (c) Permit fee for the installation or replacement of a small flow on-lot sewage treatment system, five-hundred dollars (\$500.00).
- (d) Permit fee for the alteration of a household sewage treatment system, two-hundred dollars (\$200.00).
- (e) Permit fee for the alteration of a small flow on-lot sewage treatment system, two-hundred-fifty dollars (\$250.00).
- (f) Annual permit fee for the operation of an on-lot household sewage treatment system that utilizes any electrical motor or other electrical device, fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- (g) Annual permit fee for the operation of an off-lot household sewage treatment system, fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- (h) Annual permit fee for the operation of a small flow on-lot sewage treatment system, seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).
- (i) Annual registration fee for installers, service providers, and septage haulers, one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00).
- (j) Annual vehicle permit fee for septage haulers, fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- (k) Sewage system inspection with written report that is requested for real estate purposes, one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
- (l) Application fee for a variance under rule 3701-29-20 of the Ohio Administrative Code (\$150.00).
- (m) Permit fee for septic tank abandonment, seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).
- (n) Permit fee for sewer tap extension application, fifty dollars (\$50.00).
