WHEREAS, Ohio's food-service industry is the third largest private sector employer in Ohio, with over 532,000 employees and 21,000 locations that generate more than \$500 million in state sales tax revenue, and

Explanation Background: This Ordinance authorizes the Public Utilities Director to enter into an agreement with and to authorize payment to the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) for the installation of three street lighting poles near the Bridge Rehabilitation - US 23 (4th Street) over Convention Center Connector and Railroad project (ODOT FRA-23-12.11 PID 77565), in ODOT District 6.

This ordinance also authorizes the Director of Public Service to enter into agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation necessary for the rehabilitation of this bridge and provide for payment for pavement markings for the project.

This project will rehabilitate the US 23 (4th Street) bridge over Convention Center Connector and Railroad by redecking and repainting structural steel and include limited resurfacing, sidewalk improvements, and installation of three of the City's lighting poles near the bridge that are in need of repair due to age and deteriorating pole foundation structure and circuitry.

The Department of Public Service, Division of Design and Construction has also requested that the State include an alternate bid item in the project for pavement markings on the bridge that are typically utilized by the City and differ from those utilized by the State in their increased durability. The expenditure of \$7,000.00 for these pavement marking is also authorized within this ordinance.

ODOT plans on bidding this project in May 2011 and requires pre-payment for the estimated construction cost of lighting.

This agreement consists of the City committing to pay an estimated amount as prepared by the Ohio Department of Transportation, Office of Estimating; that the total cost and expenses of the lighting portion of the project are only an estimate and may be adjusted by the State; that the City agrees that change orders and extra work contracts related to the lighting portion may be required to fulfill the construction contract and shall be processed as needed; and that the State shall not approve a change order or extra contract work related to the lighting portion of the project until it gives notice, in writing, to the City.

Emergency action is requested in order to return necessary paperwork to meet ODOT's schedule to bid this project by May 2011.

Fiscal Impact: A transfer of \$15,790 within the Electricity Voted Bonds Fund and an amendment to the 2011 Capital Improvements Budget is needed to provide sufficient cash and authority in the proper project for the aforementioned expenditure.

The Department of Public Service has requested the City include an alternate bid item for pavement markings. This will require an amendment to the 2011 Capital Improvements Budget to establish authority in the correct project for this expense. This expense can be accommodated by appropriating and transferring funds needed in the amount of \$7,000.00 from the Special Income Tax Fund. Bonds have yet to be sold for the whole project, necessitating a certification of \$7,000.00 against the Special Income Tax Fund. Upon sale of bonds, this will be reimbursed.

3. Development Standards: Except as otherwise noted above and herein, the applicable development standards of Chapter 3356 (C-4) shall apply to this site.

A. Density, Lot, and/or Setback Commitments.

1. Setback from North High Street shall be twenty-five (25) feet for parking, loading and maneuvering areas and 100 feet for buildings.
2. Setbacks from Lazelle Road West shall be twenty-five (25) feet for parking, loading and maneuvering areas and sixty (60) feet for buildings.

B. Access, Loading, Parking and/or Other Traffic Related Commitments.

1. There shall be a full service curb cut for a private access point on Lazelle Road West subject to the approval of the Division of Planning and Operations. There will be no additional curb cuts on High St.
2. The developer shall make improvements to the intersection of North High Street and Lazelle Road such that the eastbound and westbound left turn movements shall be aligned and the eastbound and westbound left turn movements can be made concurrently. The intention is to eliminate the split phasing operation that currently exists at this intersection.
3. The developer shall be responsible for signal modifications that will eliminate the split phasing operation of the eastbound and westbound movements at the intersection of North High Street and Lazelle Road and add right turn overlap phases for any legs of this intersection with dedicated right turn lanes.

4. The developer shall restripe the northbound left turn lane at the intersection of North High Street and Lazelle Road to have a length of 443 feet, which includes a 50 foot taper.

C. Buffering, Landscaping, Open Space and/or Screening Commitments.

1. A tree row shall be established along Lazelle Road West containing one street / deciduous tree for every 30 feet of roadway frontage.
2. All vehicular use areas shall be screened from adjacent public right-of-ways with a continuous planting hedge, wall or earth mound a minimum of four (4) feet in height.
3. The north and south property lines shall be landscaped in accordance with the submitted landscape exhibit titled "Perimeter Landscape Buffer Plan." At the time of development, a construction fence shall be installed within the setback along the north property line, when the landscaping and mounding are installed, then the fence must be removed. The landscaping and mounding along the north and south property lines shall be installed at the beginning of development of this site.
4. A row of evergreen trees, 20 feet on center, shall be installed along the west property as shown on the submitted "Perimeter Landscape Buffer Plan" exhibit. The developer shall install a six foot wood fence along the west side of the commercial area beginning at the north end of the mounding at the south property line and extending northward to the south end of the mounding along the north property line except in the area where the driveway connects the two portions of the site.
5. Adjacent to the city's park property the applicant shall install 3 deciduous and 1 evergreen tree per 100 linear feet within the setback area along its common property line with the park.
6. All trees and landscaping shall meet the following minimum size requirements at the time of planting: 2.5" caliper for deciduous trees; 6 foot high for evergreens (spruce or norway); 1.5" caliper for ornamental trees; and shrubs shall be two (2) gallon in size. Tree caliper is measured six (6) inches above the adjacent grade.
7. All trees and landscaping shall be well maintained. Dead items shall be replaced within six (6) months or the next planting season, whichever occurs first.

D. Building Design and/or Interior-Exterior Treatment Commitments.

1. The buildings will be built of one or any combination of the following: brick, stone, synthetic stone, wood, engineered wood siding, vinyl, metal and glass. The above referenced vinyl shall be limited to trim purposes and vinyl siding shall not be allowed. The brick to be used in construction of the buildings shall be the "Harmar #790" or a comparable brick as reviewed and approved by the Director of the Department of Building and Zoning Services or his/her designee. Any hotel or multi-use shall have a water table of either stone, synthetic stone or brick (minimum of ten feet in height) of each side of every multi story building elevation.
2. Mechanical equipment or other utility hardware on the roof of a building shall be screened from view by the same materials utilized on the buildings roof or exterior. Color shall also match the buildings exterior or roof. Mechanical or other utility equipment shall be fully screened from offsite view by a fence, landscape material or a wall utilizing the same material of the buildings.
3. Blank facades on the rear of buildings are prohibited. Therefore, articulating such facades with recesses, fenestrations, fences or pilasters is required.
4. Building illumination shall be permitted provided such light source is concealed. No colored light shall be used to light the exterior of any building.

5. No materials, supplies, equipment shall be stored or permitted to remain on any portion of the parcel outside the permitted structure (except for utility and HVAC equipment).

G. Miscellaneous Commitments.

2. The developer shall install a sidewalk along the connecting driveway to Lazelle Road West so that a person may walk from the L-AR-12 subarea to Lazelle Road West.

1. **Introduction:** The site is located west of High Street between Highbluffs Blvd. and Lazelle Road West.

2. **Permitted Uses:** Those uses permitted in Section 3333.02, AR-12 of the Columbus City Code.

2. The building and parking setback from the west property line shall be 60 feet. The building and parking setback from the north property line shall be 60 feet until the northeast corner of the L-AR-12 site where the building and parking setback shall be 25 as shown on the submitted exhibit.

Snow fencing shall be installed along the east side of the 60 foot buffer during the construction of the multi family units.

2. All trees and landscaping shall be well maintained. Dead materials shall be replaced within six (6) months or the next

planting season, whichever occurs first. All trees shall meet the following minimum size at the time of planting:

Shade trees 2 1/2" caliper; Ornamental trees 1 1/2" caliper; Evergreen trees 5 feet in height. Tree caliper is measured six (6) inches from the ground.

D. Building Design and/or Interior-Exterior Treatment Commitments.

1. The buildings will be built of one or any combination of the following: brick, stone, synthetic stone, wood, engineered wood siding, vinyl, metal and glass. Notwithstanding the building materials listed in 3D1 above the building materials for the buildings which are adjacent to the west property line shall be brick and vinyl and the water table area shall be constructed of a decorative split face block. The brick used in construction of the buildings shall be the "Harmar #790" or a comparable brick as reviewed and approved by the City's Director of the Department of Building and Zoning Services or his/her designee. The front façade shall consist of a minimum of 46% of the designated brick. The style of the building units adjacent to the west property line shall be two story townhouse units (same style as the units at The Traditions at Highbluffs). **For the units that are adjacent to the west property line the minimum net floor area for living quarters is 1,100 square feet.**

The third project, a 9,300 square foot Production Greenhouse, is in the construction stage and will be completed by the end of July, 2011.

WHEREAS, it is therefore necessary to assess the cost of such demolitions against the properties which were the subject of the abatement actions; and

WHEREAS, a procedure to be followed in certifying and assessing such demolition costs is for the City of Columbus to certify such costs to the County Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio and have them levied as a special assessment against the property which was the subject of the demolition abatement action, and recovered in the manner provided for the recovery of special assessments; **now therefore**,

As a consequence, the Court asks that the competitive bidding provisions of the Columbus City Code be waived so that the Court can enter into contract with AMS for continuation of alcohol monitoring services.

Alcohol Monitoring System's contract compliance is 300137963 and expires 12/17/11.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funds are available within the 2011 indigent driver alcohol treatment fund and the electronic alcohol monitoring fund for this purpose.

**OFFICIAL NOTICE
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
PUSHCART RULES AND REGULATIONS**

PUBLISHED MAY 16, 2011----- EFFECTIVE MAY 30, 2011

Pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 121 of Columbus City Codes, 1959, this notice is submitted as a certified copy of the rules and regulations published December 13, 1997, to **amend Section B (9) May, 2011.**

A. Pushcart Standards

1. Generators on pushcarts powered by gasoline are prohibited. Only generators powered by propane are acceptable. Generators shall not be placed on the ground, or placed so as to extend the allowable dimensions of the cart.
2. The braking mechanism on a pushcart shall be affixed in such a manner that it is not readily removable. The use of ropes and chocks as the sole braking mechanism is prohibited.
3. Unsecured weather guards on pushcarts are prohibited. Weather guards shall be included as part of the allowable measurements of the cart.
4. With the exception of merchandise or food items to be sold, pushcarts presented for inspection shall be exactly as they will appear when operating on a public right-of-way, including any food rack.
5. No modification, even if such modification does not violate measurement requirements, shall be made to a pushcart that violates any health or safety regulation or law.
6. Umbrellas, canopies, or other covers used on pushcarts shall be clean and well maintained, with no holes or tears. Pushcart owners shall have ninety (90) days to comply with this requirement where it is necessary to replace the umbrella or canopy. Pushcart owners shall have a period of five (5) days to comply with this requirement where it is necessary only to repair or clean an umbrella or canopy. These time frames shall not apply where holes, tears, and cleanliness are found to be a violation of the Health Code. In these cases, pushcart owners shall comply as ordered by the Health Department.
7. Pushcarts shall be maintained in such a manner that prevents the spilling or splattering of grease, water, food, or trash on any public right-of-way where the cart is placed.

8. Unsecured menu boards are prohibited on pushcarts. The measurements of the menu board shall be included as part of the allowable size of the pushcart.
9. A three foot by five foot (3' x 5'), National Sanitation Foundation (NSF) approved mat shall be used with pushcarts from which foodstuff is sold. The mat shall be placed flush with the pushcart, beneath the food preparation area in such a manner to prevent any foodstuff or grease spillage.
10. Pushcarts shall have a clean appearance at all time.

B. Pushcart Operations

1. No pushcart shall be left unattended on a public right-of-way for longer than thirty (30) minutes.
2. Pushcart owners shall be responsible for the cleaning and repair of any public right-of-way soiled, stained, or damaged by the placement and operation of their pushcarts. Such cleaning or repair shall be done in such a manner so as to return the area to its original state, and shall be at the expense of the pushcart owner. The License Section may conduct an inspection of any such area to determine if the repair or cleaning is satisfactory.
3. Pushcarts are prohibited from operating on any public right-of-way where public safety is jeopardized, as determined by the Director of Public Safety or the Divisions of Police or Fire.
4. Any pushcart found to cause consistent, justified complaints from the general public in the area where operating, shall be prohibited from operating in that area. This shall include, but not be limited to failing to maintain a clean working area, damaging sidewalks or buildings with foodstuff and wrappers, spilling of grease on the sidewalk, or failing to respect the rights of building occupants. Any finding against a pushcart owner shall be made through the process of investigations and a hearing before the License Section Manager.
5. Pushcarts with propane tanks are prohibited from operating under any skywalk or roof extended over a sidewalk from a building.
6. Propane tanks on pushcarts shall not be changed while resting on any public right-of-way.
7. No pushcart shall carry more than a forty (40) pound supply of propane on a public right-of-way. This maximum supply of propane must be manifolded to appliances where such supply is contained in more than one tank.
8. No pushcart shall be placed within ten (10) feet of any fire hydrant.
9. **Pushcart placement and peddler sales of any kind are prohibited in any City**

park, on any public right-of-way immediately adjacent to a City park, or any property leased from the City without written permission from the operating authority.

10. Pushcart placement on public rights-of-way in the Brewery District, Franklin County Courthouse and the Nationwide Arena area shall be designated and distributed through a computerized lottery system supervised by the License Section Manager.

a. **BREWERY DISTRICT**

- The Brewery District shall include the area bordered by Sycamore Street on the south, I-71 on the north, Short Street on the west, and Pearl Street on the east.
- The following designated spaces shall be distributed through a computerized lottery system:
 - Four (4) spaces shall be designated on the west side of Front Street between the streets of Livingston and Beck.
 - Three (3)spaces shall be designated on the east side of Front Street between the streets of Livingston and Beck.
 - Three (3) spaces shall be designated on the west side of S. High Street between the streets of Livingston and Hoster.
 - One (1) space shall be designated on the east side of S. High Street between the streets of Livingston and Hoster.

b. **FRANKLIN COUNTY COURTHOUSE**

- The Franklin County Courthouse area shall include the area bordered by I-71 on the south, Mound Street on the north, Front Street on the west, and Third Street on the east.
- The following designated spaces shall be distributed through a computerized lottery system:
 - Four(4) spaces shall be designated on the west side of S. High Street between the streets of Fulton and Mound, in front of the Franklin County Courthouse.
 - Four (4) spaces shall be designated on the east side of S. High Street between the streets of Fulton and Mound, directly across from the Franklin County Courthouse.

c. **NATIONWIDE ARENA AREA**

- The Arena District shall include the area bordered by Goodale Avenue on the north, Spring Street on the south, Neil Avenue on the west and N. High Street on the East. Spaces as designated.
- d. No person shall place or operate any pushcart in any undesignated Area.
 - f. No person shall occupy any designated space not awarded to that pushcart owner through the lottery system.
 - g. The number of designated spaces in all specified areas are subject to change where public safety concerns exist as determined by the Director Public Safety or designee.
 - h. Maps of the designated areas shall be available in the License Section.

C. Lottery Procedures

1. A separate lottery shall be conducted for each of the following locations:

Brewery District
Franklin County Courthouse Area
Nationwide Arena Area

2. The computer will randomly select the designated position for each pushcart.
3. Each space awarded shall be occupied for the following time periods:

Brewery District – One (1) Month
Franklin County Courthouse – Two (2) Weeks
Nationwide Arena Area – Two (2) Weeks

4. Eligible pushcart owners may register for one or all of the lotteries.
5. Only one (1) pushcart per owner or business may be registered for each lottery.
6. No pushcart owner shall register for another owner for any lottery.
7. All eligible pushcart owners shall be provided with a copy of the registration procedures for entering the lotteries.
8. All pushcart owners awarded a space in the lottery shall sign a “Notice of Policy” acknowledging that they received, understand, and agree with the policies and penalties regarding pushcart operations in all designated areas.

D. At no time shall any person operate or cause to be operated any pushcart upon any public right-of-way constructed of brick, marble, or granite.

E. Penalties

Failure to comply with these rules and regulations shall be cause for a hearing before the License Section Manager for the possible suspension or revocation of the pushcart license.
