The amount of the deposit varies from property to property and is based on 200% of the average bill amount of that property for the previous 12 months of usage. The minimum deposit amount is \$100.00. are received in the Electricity Customer Deposit Fund, where interest is accrued. When a customer closes their electricity account with the City, any remaining deposit on hand is credited toward the balance on their account. They are also notified of any remaining credits on their account on their final bill. However, if their remaining deposit funds are in excess of the amount owed on the account, the excess money is not automatically refunded to the customer. The refund needs to be requested by the customer because the City does not always have access to a forwarding address and needs to make sure the money doesn't end up in the Since 2014, the refunds have been issued from the four enterprise operating funds, rather than directly from the Electricity Customer Deposit Fund. Because of this, the Electricity Customer Deposit Fund can accumulate large balances and any excess money in the fund needs to be transferred into the enterprise operating funds on an annual basis in order to balance the fund with actual deposits on hand.

FISCAL IMPACT: There are no expenditures associated with this ordinance.

In 1991, the EPA enacted the Lead and Copper Rule (LCR) under the Safe Drinking Water Act. The LCR requires tap water testing. For the past sixteen years, the Columbus Division of Water and Columbus Public Health were partners in a national pilot program dealing with lead in homes. That program expired in 2015. The Columbus Division of Water desires to continue to partner with Columbus Public Health to protect public health. Details of the services to be provided by Columbus Public Health to the Columbus Division of Water are contained in an agreement/memorandum of understanding dated November 24, 2015. These services will provide information to the Division of Water as to the effectiveness of its corrosion control program while continuing to assist Columbus Public Health with its Healthy Homes initiative. The Columbus Division of Water, with City Council and City Auditor approval has contributed \$300,000.00 per year since 2001. Revisions to the agreement will be evaluated in 2020.

The original contract was authorized by Ordinance 0906-2015 (passed 05/06/2015) and the contract had one modification authorized by Ordinance 3078-2015 (passed 12/16/2015). The second year of the contract was authorized by Ordinance 1378-2016 (passed 06/09/2016).

The cost will increase by approximately 2% in the third year. The total annual costs are: \$58,025.20 for the first year, \$62,514.96 for the second year, and \$63,762.72 for the third year. We were able to negotiate an extremely competitive price and lock it in for a three year period.

Ordinance 1585-2016 granted the Department of Education the authority to enter into contracts with organizations to provide early education programs as part of Early Start Columbus.

The purpose of Early Start Columbus is to expand high-quality prekindergarten services for 4-year-olds living in the City of Columbus. Children who participate in high-quality prekindergarten experiences significantly improve their early literacy, language and math skills. Ample evidence shows that children who enter school unprepared fall farther and farther behind. Students who get a poor start in their earliest years are likely to struggle in high school and, subsequently, fail to graduate.

Mayor Ginther's vision for Columbus, America's Opportunity City, is to create access to a high-quality prekindergarten education for every 4-year-old. Addressing early childhood learning means bringing awareness and resources to a critical learning stage in childhood development. Children who come to school ready to learn are more likely to succeed academically and in life.

For the 2016-2017 school year, Early Start Columbus program providers were appropriated funds based on the number of children that they expected to serve. In some cases, providers were not able to enroll enough students to reach their expected capacity. Because of this, the providers have funds that are unspent, but still encumbered by the original ordinance.

This new ordinance, 1053-2017, gives the Director of the Department of Education the authority to extend the contracts of these providers for up to one year. This extension will allow existing providers to continue providing prekindergarten services under Early Start Columbus until they have spent down their encumbered funds.

FISCAL IMPACT: No additional funds are needed to modify these agreements.

EMERGENCY DESIGNTION: Emergency designation is requested to ensure the contracts are extended before they expire.

1. BACKGROUND:

This legislation authorizes payment for utility relocation work by Columbia Gas, and other utilities as needed in an amount up to \$90,000.00.

The City of Columbus, Department of Public Service and the Department of Public Utilities, are engaged in the Pedestrian Safety Improvements - Moler Road Sidewalks project - (CIP# 590105-100065/3067 E).

This project will install a sidewalk and curb ramps along the south side of Moler Road between Lockbourne

Road and Holburn Avenue. This project also includes a detention basin on the north side of Moler Road at the approximate station of 24+50. New storm sewer and grading will be installed from station 24+50 to Berkeley Road and from Fairwood Avenue east to station 38+50.

2. FISCAL IMPACT:

Funds for this project are available within the Storm Sewer Bonds Fund, Fund 6204.

BACKGROUND:

This ordinance approves the acceptance of certain territory (AN16-011) by the city of Columbus. The Ohio Revised Code stipulates that to be effective, City acceptance must take place a minimum of 60 days from the receipt by the City Clerk of the approval notice from the county. If City Council does not accept the ordinance within 120 days of its first consideration, the annexation will be considered rejected. This petition was filed with Franklin County on January 12, 2017. City Council approved a service ordinance addressing the site on January 23, 2017. Franklin County approved the annexation on February 14, 2017 and the City Clerk received notice on February 21, 2017. Annexation of this site is outlined in an agreement between the City of Columbus and the Columbus Regional Airport Authority. Columbus City Codes section 3310.09 stipulates that, upon

annexation, territory covered by the agreement be assigned the zoning classification most comparable to the zoning classification applicable to such property immediately prior to annexation. This site is zoned General Industrial within Franklin County. The sites will be given the zoning classification of M, Manufacturing upon annexation.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Provision of municipal services does represent cost to the City; however, the annexation of land also has the potential to create revenue to the City.

To accept the application (AN16-011) of Columbus Regional Airport Authority for the annexation of certain territory containing 5.17± acres in Madison Township.

Situated in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin, Madison Township, and lying in Section 6, Township 10 North, Range 21 West, Congress Lands, being all of 5.177 acre tract as conveyed to the Columbus Regional Airport Authority by a deed of record in Instrument Number 200708230149000 (all records herein of the Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio), being bounded and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at an angle point on the existing City of Columbus corporation line as established by Ordinance Number 2221-2016, and recorded in Instrument Number 201611150157001, being the northwesterly corner of the said 5.177 acre tract, a common corner to a 6.439 acre tract as conveyed to Columbus Regional Airport Authority by deed of record in Instrument Number 200708230148997;

Thence the following courses and distances along the 5.177 acre tract:

BACKGROUND: The Shawnee Police Department is in need of any surplus/vehicle equipment. Providing the Shawnee Police Department with any equipment would greatly improve their agency's operations as well as increase officer safety, productivity, and communication. This equipment will give their officers access to basic law enforcement tools resulting in more effective patrols on the throughways connecting their community with ours.

Officer Greg Colarich, Technical Services Bureau within the Division of Police has identified eight (8) Panasonic Toughbooks, four (4) Toughbook Mounts/Stands, four (4) Direction Arrows, four (4) control Boxes, four (4) Siren Boxes, four (4) Center Consoles, four (4) Shotgun Racks, and four (4) Blue & Red Light Bars

that can be donated to the Shawnee Police Department. The Panasonic Toughbooks have reached their end-of-life and have since been replaced with new Fujitsu laptops. The Toughbooks currently fail to meet the minimum specifications within the Columbus Division of Police and would offer minimal value to any other City of Columbus agency given the current technology platform already in use throughout the city. The Division of Police and the Department of Technology have no plans to relocate the Toughbooks or their mounts/stands for any future City of Columbus technology initiative. The light bars, control boxes, siren boxes, center consoles, and shotgun racks that are to be donated do not fit the current Columbus Division of Police cruiser platform since the police fleet has been upgraded. Fleet Management has determined that there is no need or plan for future deployment of these light bars.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact to the city from the donation of these items.

To authorize and direct the Director of the Department of Public Safety to donate to the Shawnee Police Department Panasonic Toughbooks, Toughbooks Mounts/Stands, Directional Arrows, Control Boxes, Siren Boxes, Center Consoles, Shotgun Racks, and Blue & Red Light Bars which have no further value to the Division of Police; to waive the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 relating to the Sale of City Owned Personal Property; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Shawnee Police Department is in need of surplus/vehicle equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Columbus Department of Public Safety, Division of Police, has eight Panasonic Toughbooks, four Toughbooks Mount/Stands, four Directional Arrows, four Control Boxes, four Siren Boxes, four Center Consoles, four Shotgun Racks, and four Blue & Red Light Bars to donate to the Shawnee Police Department; and

WHEREAS, no City of Columbus Government Agency can accept Police out-of-service equipment; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds it to be in the best interest to waive the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 relating to the Sale of City Owned Personal Property; and

A service ordinance must be passed before the annexation meeting takes place before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County. Information regarding municipal services that would be available, should the subject site be annexed, has been compiled and is reflected in this ordinance. Should the petition be approved by the County Commissioners, a second City ordinance accepting the annexation will be required to complete the process. The time frames specified in the ORC require that this legislation be filed as emergency.

FISCAL IMPACT: The statement of municipal services and zoning conditions for a proposed annexation area has no fiscal impact. While provision of the stated services does represent cost to the City, annexation of land also has the potential to create revenue to the city.

To set forth a statement of municipal services and zoning conditions to be provided to the area contained in a proposed annexation (AN17-005) of 4.80± Acres in Jackson Township to the city of Columbus as required by the Ohio Revised Code and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Jackson Township was duly filed on behalf of Bobby C. Schulz, et al. on April 26, 2017; and

WHEREAS, a hearing on said petition is scheduled before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County on May 30, 2017; and

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS

Section 1. That the city of Columbus will provide the following municipal services for $4.80\pm$ acres in Jackson Township upon the annexation of said area to the city of Columbus:

Public Safety: The City of Columbus, Department of Public Safety will be able to provide the appropriate level of safety related services to the proposed annexation area. Such services will include police and fire protection as well as emergency medical service to the subject property.

While the petitioner for annexation may have proposed future development plans for the property in question, the Department of Public Safety requests that the City exercise its discretion in the coming development planning and review process to ensure any future development will be properly served by the Department of Public Safety. Discussions between the City and the present property owner or any future developers regarding post annexation changes in zoning or other changes to the property should include the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Development to ensure any proposed development of the annexation property may be adequately accommodated. Specific details for safety services are dependent upon the parameters of future development that is ultimately approved by the City.

Sanitation: Single family homes would qualify for city provided 90-gallon front curb or 300-gallon alley refuse service, the method of which to be determined by Division of Refuse Collection management. Any other development would require compliance with Title 13 requirements; Commercial/business uses are required to provide their own refuse collection.

Transportation: Maintenance will be available for any additional right-of-way that may be included in this annexation request. If this annexation contains existing signalized intersections, those intersections and signals are subject to Transportation Division Policy, which appeared in the December 6, 2003 Columbus City Bulletin, and any subsequent updates thereto.

Water: The site will be served by an existing 16" water main located in Gantz Road.

Sewer: This site can be served by an existing 10" sanitary sewer situated within an easement along the west property line in the abutting subdivision. Sewer plan: RP-7179 (10")

All storm sewers necessary for development/redevelopment of the area shall be designed in accordance with design policy and zoning codes in effect at the time of development.

All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners/developers at their own expense with no cost to the city.

Section 2. If this $4.80\pm$ acre site is annexed and if the City of Columbus permits uses in the annexed territory that the City of Columbus determines are clearly incompatible with the uses permitted under current county or township zoning regulations in the adjacent land remaining within Jackson Township, the Columbus City Council will require, in the zoning ordinance permitting the incompatible uses, the owner of the annexed territory to provide a buffer separating the use of the annexed territory and the adjacent land remaining within Jackson Township. The Board of Review of General and Home Improvement Contractors reviewed and recommended approval at its monthly public meeting on March 2, 2016. The Columbus Building Commission voted to recommend approval of this code revision at its monthly public meeting on April 19, 2016

FISCAL IMPACT: No funding is required for this legislation.

To amend various sections in Chapter 4114 of the Columbus City Code in order to create testing requirements to obtain a license for Home Improvement General Contractors.

WHEREAS, this ordinance amends various sections in Chapter 4114 of the Columbus City Code in order to create testing requirements for applicants seeking to obtain a Home Improvement General Contractor's license; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will not affect applicants seeking to obtain a Home Improvement Limited Contractor's license; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Review of General and Home Improvement Contractors reviewed and recommended approval of this amendment at its monthly public meeting held on March 2, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Columbus Building Commission voted to recommend approval of this amendment at its monthly public meeting held on April 19, 2016; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary in the usual daily operation of the City to amend various sections of Chapter 4114 of the Columbus City Code in order to create testing requirements for applicants seeking to obtain a Home Improvement General Contractor's license; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That existing section 4114.305 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby amended to read as follows:

4114.305 - Duties and powers of the boards of review.

(A) General Duties and Powers. Each board of review shall have the following general duties and powers:

- (1) To make, adopt, and from time to time, alter its own rules or procedures for the conduct of its meetings and proceedings;
- (2) To select its own officers in accordance with the by-laws adopted by the board;
- (3) To perform other related duties required either by this Building Code or as directed by the chief building official or the department;
- (4) To adjudicate a complaint filed with the appropriate board of review against a department-registered OCILB licensed specialty contractor, the holder of a department-issued license or other department contractor registration. Such a complaint, however, shall be within the limits of the authority, competence, concern, intension, or responsibility of the board of review receiving the complaint;
- (5) To suspend or revoke the relevant department-issued license or registration of a contractor who, after notification and hearing:
 - (a) Shall have been found to have violated the terms of this chapter, or
 - (b) Shall have failed to obtain proper permits or failed to obtain a registration certificate or failed to obtain inspection as provided by law as required by the applicable building code relating to the inspection and approval of such work, within the city; or
 - (c) Shall have been shown to be persistent and habitual violators of the laws of the state, the provisions of this Building Code or other ordinances of the city relating to the construction, installation, or repair of buildings within the City of Columbus.
- (B) Specific Duties and Powers. The boards of review shall have the additional specific duties and powers as hereinafter indicated in this subsection:
 - (1) The board of review of general and home improvement contractors is authorized and empowered to review the qualifications as established in Section 4114.505, of all applicants who have passed the appropriate written examination(s), if required as a prerequisite and thereupon have made proper application for the department's license to engage in the business of a general or limited home improvement contractor. For those applicants who the board has found to meet all such qualifications, the board shall certify their names to the department for the issuance of the appropriate home improvement contractor's license.
 - (2) The board of review of general and home improvement contractors shall review the qualifications as established in Section 4114.903, of all applicants who have made proper application to obtain a demolition contractor registration from the department. For those applicants who the board has found to meet all such qualifications, the board shall certify their names to the department for the issuance of a demolition contractor's registration.
 - (3) The board of review of general and home improvement contractors shall adjudicate matters pertaining to a department-issued home improvement general or limited licensed contractor, department-registered general contractor, and/or a department-registered demolition contractor.
 - (4) The board of review of plumbing and sewer contractors and of journeyperson plumbers, is authorized and empowered to review the qualifications as established in Section 4114.505, of all applicants who have made proper application for a department-issued license as a sewer, water or combination sewer/water contractor or a journeyperson plumber. For those applicants who the board has found to meet all such qualifications, the board shall certify their names to the department for the issuance of the appropriate license for which the application was made.
 - (5) The board of review of plumbing and sewer contractors and of journeyperson plumbers shall adjudicate matters pertaining to a department-issued licensed sewer contractor, a department licensed water contractor, a licensed journeyperson plumber, a department-registered OCILB licensed plumbing contractor, a department registered backflow technician, and a department-registered fire protection/suppression company.

Exception: The board of review of warm air heating and air conditioning (HVAC) contractors shall adjudicate matters pertaining to a department-registered fire alarm and detection equipment

and/or fire protection/suppression company pertaining to kitchen exhaust systems.

- (6) The board of review of electrical contractors shall adjudicate matters pertaining to a department-registered OCILB licensed electrical contractor, and/or a registered fire alarm and detection equipment company.
- (7) The board of review of refrigeration contractors shall adjudicate matters pertaining to a department-registered OCILB licensed refrigeration contractor.
- (8) The board of review of warm air heating and air conditioning (HVAC) contractors shall adjudicate matters pertaining to a department-registered OCILB licensed warm air heating and air conditioning contractor (HVAC), a department-registered OCILB licensed hydronics (steam and hot water) contractor, and a fuel gas piping contractor.
- (9) The appropriate board of review of general and home improvement contractors and the board of review of plumbing and sewer contractors and of journeyperson plumbers, are empowered to review the qualifications, as established in Section 4114.505, of all applicants who have filed a completed action and, if required as a prerequisite, have passed the relevant written examination(s) for a department issued license.
- (C) In the event there ceases to be an approved testing agency to provide the examination(s) required by C.C. 4114, the director shall immediately notify, in writing, the board of review of general and home improvement contractors of this fact. The director shall also issue a statement, in writing, of policy and procedure to be used until such time an approved testing agency has been identified by the director.

SECTION 2. That existing section 4114.503 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby amended to read as follows:

4114.503 - Application for department-issued license.

- (A) A person desiring to be a department-licensed contractor, including a journeyperson plumber, shall apply to the department on an application form prescribed therefor for such license, together with the nonrefundable fee prescribed by the fee schedule.
- (B) The application for a department-issued license shall be confirmed and signed under oath by the applicant. The application for a license shall contain the following information:
 - (1) Name of the applicant;
 - (2) Date of birth;
 - (3) Current residence and business address(es) of the applicant;
 - (4) Current residence and business telephone number(s) of the applicant;
 - (5) Dates of previous licenses or registrations with the department, if any; and
 - (6) Other information deemed necessary by the department.
- (C) The application for a license; that, as a prerequisite, requires an examination; or examinations, shall be submitted to the department no later than one (1) year after the date on which a passing score was achieved on any required examination given by an approved testing agency. After one (1) year from the date that a passing score was achieved on any required examination for a department issued license, the passing score for that examination shall become invalid. When more than one (1) examination is required for a department issued license, all examination scores shall be valid. Only valid examination scores shall be acceptable when making an application to the department. Additionally, the application shall be submitted at least seven calendar days prior to the date of the meeting of the relevant board of review.
- (D) In addition, the applicant shall also furnish a statement of experience with the application for a department-issued license. The statement of experience shall encompass the period of required experience as set forth in the qualifications for the type of license for which the application is made. The statement shall clearly and concisely provide the following information:
 - (1) List of employer or projects with dates of same as applicable; and
 - (2) Detailed work-related information about the employment or projects so listed; and

- (3) The length of time devoted to each such employment or project listed; and
- (4) The name of the employer or other responsible person with direct knowledge of the work performed by the applicant during such employment or project listed; and
- (5) A statement, made by the applicant, of the schooling and training the applicant has obtained shall also be included.
- (E) The statement of experience shall be notarized.
- (F) Before an application may be approved for any applicant, the applicant shall meet the following requirements:
 - (1) Be not less than 18 years of age; and
 - (2) Be a United States citizen or national, a lawful permanent resident, or an alien authorized to work in the United States.

SECTION 3. That existing section 4114.507 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby amended to read as follows:

4114.507 - Examinations required for a department-issued license.

No examination shall be required.

- (A) Before submitting an application to the department to become a department licensed home improvement general contractor, an applicant shall have satisfactorily completed and passed, with a grade of at least seventy (70) percent, all written examinations as prescribed by the board of review for the type of license for which an application will be made with the department. The required examinations shall be administered by an approved testing agency identified by the director.
- (B) After one (1) year from the date that a passing score was achieved on any required examination for a department issued license, the passing score for that examination or examinations shall become invalid.

SECTION 4. That prior existing sections 4114.305, 4114.503, and 4114.507 of the Columbus City Code are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period provided by law.
