Bid Waiver Justification: The Division of Fire has successfully implemented this specialized and unique program with RQIP Partners LLC to manage their CPR certifications via American Heart Association standards and does not seek an alternative solution at this time. The program has reduced personnel costs associated with backfilling positions once needed to manage these certifications in house, and done so in a more responsive manner given the portability of the technology used to manage these certifications.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes an expenditure of \$135,970.00 from the General Fund, where the expense for these services are budgeted. The Division of Fire expended \$124,840.00 in 2022, \$118,360.20 in 2021 and 2020 for this subscription.

APPLICANT: 5811 Olentangy River Road, LLC; c/o William Ghidotti, Atty.; 8000 Walton Parkway, Suite 260; New Albany, OH 43054.

PROPOSED USE: Boarding house.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The site is developed with a boarding house that contains a total of five guest rooms as permitted by Ordinance #2580-2013 (CV13-036). The applicant requests a new Council variance to permit the addition of three additional guest rooms, bringing the total number of guest rooms on site to eight. A Council variance is necessary because only certain apartment residential zoning districts permit this use, and a rezoning of this property is not appropriate in this instance. Although *The*

Northwest Plan (2016) recommends this site for "Low Density Residential" land uses, staff recognizes that the request is a modest expansion of an existing use, and that the property is of a sufficient size with high levels of screening so as to mitigate any potential effects of the proposal.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3332.027, RR rural residential district; and 3312.27, Parking setback line, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **5811 OLENTANGY RIVER RD**. (43235), to permit a boarding house with a reduced parking setback line in the RR, Rural Residential District, and to repeal Ordinance #2580-2013 (CV13-036) (Council Variance #CV22-072).

WHEREAS, by application #CV22-072, the owner of the property at **5811 OLENTANGY RIVER RD**. (**43235**), is requesting a Variance to permit a boarding house with a reduced parking setback line in the RR, Rural Residential District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.027, RR, Rural Residential district, does not permit a boarding house use, while the applicant proposes an expansion to a previously approved boarding house use on the property; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.27(3), Parking setback line, requires the parking setback line to be 25 feet from Olentangy River Road, while the applicant proposes a parking setback of zero feet along Olentangy River Road; and

WHEREAS, City Departments recommend approval of the requested Council variance because the request will permit a modest expansion of the existing boarding house use, and that the property is of a sufficient size with high levels of screening to mitigate the effects of the proposal; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance requires separate submission for all applicable permits and a Certificate of Occupancy for the proposed use; and

WHEREAS, said variance will not adversely affect the surrounding property or surrounding neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, the granting of said variance will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent properties or unreasonably increase the congestion of public streets, or unreasonably diminish or impair established property values within the surrounding area, or otherwise impair the public health, safety, comfort, morals, or welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, the granting of said variance will alleviate the difficulties encountered by the owners of the property located at **5811 OLENTANGY RIVER RD. (43235)**, in using said property as desired; now, therefore:

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to renew a multi-year demand response services agreement (the "Agreement") with NRG Curtailment Solutions, Inc. (NRGCS), a subsidiary of NRG Energy, Inc. Under the Agreement, NRGCS. will provide demand response services under the PJM emergency load response program for Division of Power retail customers.

RFQ013987 for the Department of Public Utilities' (DPU) Demand Response Services project was advertised from October 25, 2019 through November 22, 2019 and the city received four (4) responses. All proposals were deemed responsive and were fully evaluated by the Evaluation Committee on December 2, 2019, with NRG winning the bid award.

The Agreement, authorized by Ordinance No. 0224-2020, covered the period from June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2023, and permitted two renewals of 12 months each at the sole discretion of DPU. This ordinance authorizes the first of these two renewal options.

Under the Agreement, DPU agreed to enroll in NRGCS PowerPay! Program(s) and authorized NRGCS to be its exclusive demand response provider for all applicable demand response-related programs offered with PJM relating to energy, capacity, and ancillary services. The curtailment services, referred to as "demand responses services," are a planned reduction in electricity use during times of high demand that help maintain electric grid reliability by reducing the stress on the grid system. This demand response activity helps reduce wholesale electricity prices and reduce electricity usage to address environmental concerns.

Participating Division of Power retail electricity customers can receive performance payments from NRGCS if they choose to participate in the demand response program. No funding is required for these services.

This Ordinance is being submitted in accordance with the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of City Code pertaining to contract modifications and renewals.

This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a contract with Duke's Root Control, Inc. for a program to kill root growth in sanitary sewer lines 6" to 36" in diameter and inhibit root re-growth. The Division of Sewerage and Drainage (DOSD) wishes to enter into a contract to and including December 31, 2023.

DOSD determined that the chemical diquat dibromide is the most effective way to treat roots in sewers. Diquat dibromide, classified as non-carcinogenic and not considered a volatile compound, is approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for this use. Additionally, diquat dibromide has little or no effect on treatment plant processes, making this chemical preferred for use in the root control program. The Division has further determined that other chemicals are not acceptable for use in this program due to either ineffectiveness or the presence of metam sodium, which the US EPA classifies as a probable carcinogen.

Duke's Root Control, Inc. is the only commercial applicator licensed to apply diquat dibromide, which the company does through its proprietary product known as Razorooter. Duke's Root Control, Inc. is registered with the Ohio Department of Agriculture and its applicators are certified by the agency to perform pesticide applications to sewers.

While there are multiple ways to treat root growth and inhibit re-growth, the effectiveness of Razorooter and its classification as non-carcinogenic and not a volatile compound mean it is in the best interest of the City to waive the provisions of competitive bidding and enter into a contract with Duke's Root Control, Inc. for these services.

WHEREAS, the Sewer Maintenance Operation Center has a need for a sewer root control program to kill root growth in sewer lines and inhibit root re-growth; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Sewerage and Drainage determined that the chemical diquat dibromide is the most effective way to treat roots in sewers; and

WHEREAS, diquat dibromide, classified as non-carcinogenic and not considered a volatile compound, is approved for this use by the United States EPA and has little or no effect on treatment plant processes, making it the preferred chemical for use in the Division's root control program; and

WHEREAS, Duke's Root Control, Inc. is registered with the Ohio Department of Agriculture and its applicators are certified by the agency to perform pesticide applications to sewers; and

WHEREAS, it is in the City's best interest to waive the competitive bidding provisions of Chapter 329 of City Code and enter into a contract with Duke's Root Control, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Sewerage and Drainage wishes to enter into a contract from the date of execution by the City of Columbus to and including December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the expenditure of \$90,000.00, or so much thereof as may be needed, is hereby authorized in Fund 6100, Sewer Operating Sanitary Fund, in object class 03, Services, per the accounting codes in the attachment to this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Utilities, Division of Sewerage and Drainage, to authorize the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a contract for sewer root control services with Duke's Root Control, Inc.; **NOW**, **THEREFORE**,

1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a construction contract with Danbert, Inc., for the Greenway Avenue Area Water Line Improvements project, CIP #690236-100100, in an amount up to \$4,534,285.44, and to encumber funds with the Department of Public Service for construction administration and inspection services in an amount up to \$578,664.00, for a total expenditure of \$5,112,949.44. It also increases the amount of loan funding that may be sought to finance this project.

The work consists of rehabilitating approximately 10,300 linear feet of 2-inch copper, 6-inch, 8-inch and 12-inch water mains. The work will be primary performed along Greenway Avenue, Parkwood Avenue, Burt Street, Eastwood Avenue, Woodland Avenue, Rose Avenue, Gibbard Avenue, East Fifth Avenue, North Broadleigh Road, Maryland Avenue, Denver Avenue, McAllister Avenue, East Cherry Street, and English Way.

Ordinance 1107-2022, passed 05/04/22, authorized the Department of Public Utilities to seek loan funding

through the Water Supply Revolving Loan Account (WSRLA) Loan Agreements, jointly administered by the Ohio EPA's Division of Environmental and Financial Assistance (DEFA) and the Ohio Water Development Authority (OWDA), for this project and several other projects. This ordinance seeks City Council approval to increase the loan amount that can be sought for this project to cover the entire cost of construction and any additional administration costs that may be associated with seeking and administering the loan.

The Community Area for this ordinance will be 99 - Citywide as work will be performed in 48 - Milo-Grogan, 49 - North Central, 50 - East Columbus, 57 - Mid East, and 56 - Near East.

2. ECONOMIC IMPACT/ADVANTAGES; COMMUNITY OUTREACH; PROJECT DEVELOPMENT; ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS/ADVANTAGES OF PROJECT

The goal of this project is to replace or rehabilitate the existing water lines that have a high break frequency. Replacement of these water lines will improve water service, decrease burden on water maintenance operations, and reduce water loss. The Neighborhood Liaison(s) has been contacted and informed of this project during the design phase. Further community outreach may result through the Neighborhood Liaison Program.

1. BACKGROUND

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) annually accepts applications to fund projects using Safe

Routes to School (SRTS) program funds. SRTS funds are available to communities as grants to be used to improve the ability of elementary and middle school students to walk and bicycle to school safely. A community may be awarded up to \$500,000.00 for an infrastructure project. March 3, 2023 is the deadline for the current Safe Routes to School application cycle.

The Department of Public Service is preparing a Safe Routes to School application, with a current focus on constructing a bike facility for Champion Middle School. This project is on Mt. Vernon Avenue, which is a priority corridor for Champion Middle School, and it would provide improve facilities for students biking to this school.

2. EXPECTED PROJECT

The Department of Public Service plans to submit an application for the following project:

Roadway - Multimodal Corridor - Mount Vernon Avenue - Hamilton Avenue to Winner Avenue: This project will consist of a two-way on-street protected bike facility from Hamilton Avenue to Winner Avenue on the south side of Mt. Vernon Avenue with floating bus stops in various locations and all construction occurring within the existing curb lines. A subsequent phase will construct a shared use path from Winner Avenue to Taylor Avenue on the south side of Mt. Vernon Avenue in order to replace the deteriorating sidewalk in this section and provide a connection to the on-road side path and ultimately to the Alum Creek Trail. The current project cost estimate for this phase is approximately \$3,116,733.00.

The Evolving Leader Development (ELD) Initiative is designed to provide tools, strategies and techniques to increase depth and capacity in becoming a more impactful leader through professional self-awareness and confidence, individual and workplace team engagement and management and organizational success outcomes. 1. BACKGROUND:

The Department of Public Service, Division of Traffic Management, is engaged in the Traffic Signal Installation - Columbus Traffic Signal System (CTSS) Phase F project which is the sixth phase in a series of projects to migrate all Columbus traffic signals to a new central traffic control system. This will allow the city to choose among multiple vendors for some of the commodities related to the Traffic Signal System and ideally receive better pricing for needed materials.

In the course of affecting the Traffic Signal Installation - Columbus Traffic Signal System (CTSS) Phase F project, it is sometimes necessary to force the relocation of utilities from privately held easements. These relocations are in areas where the city has previously allowed utilities, but due to this project there is a need to relocate them at the city's expense. Utility relocation estimates are normally included in the budget for each project, but occasionally estimates are insufficient and not always in the city's control. Ordinance 2158-2021 authorized an initial \$350,000.00 for utility relocations.

This ordinance will authorize an additional \$250,000.00 due to the need for more Joint Use work pole replacements. This will also allow the ability to attach to AT&T, Columbus Southern and AEP facilities. These additional funds will be used for the engineering, make ready work, and inspections after City infrastructure is installed. Facility owners invoice for the costs of this work. The Joint Use engineering and make ready work will continue through 2023 and the inspections will continue through 2024. This modification was anticipated based on the number of final pole attachments and impact of inflation since the original legislation passed in 2021.

The \$250,000.00 requested for this work is an estimate. Legislation requesting additional funds will be submitted for Council's approval if the estimate should be short of the actual expenses.

2. FISCAL IMPACT:

Funds in the amount of \$250,000.00 are available within the Streets and Highways Bond Fund, Fund 7704, of the Department of Public Service's 2022 Capital Improvement Budget. A transfer of appropriation is necessary to establish funding in the proper project.

1. BACKGROUND

This Ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to renew and increase the Professional Construction Management services contract with Black & Veatch for the Lower Olentangy Tunnel project, CIP 650724-100000, in an amount up to \$4,933,165.65, to pay for services while construction on the project continues.

Professional Construction Management (PCM) services are needed to ensure the requirements and specifications of the project design are followed and that the City receives an end product capable of providing the intended function. Existing City staff is not adequate to devote multiple qualified personnel full-time to management of the project construction activities so this work is contracted. Work performed under this contract includes full-time construction inspection, project coordination, reporting, budgeting, scheduling, document tracking, startup coordination, and other related tasks to ensure the City receives a quality product in conformance with the contract documents and project objectives of the Lower Olentangy Tunnel project. This planned renewal will add funds to continue PCM work for portions of years three and four of the contract.

Much of the project alignment generally follows Olentangy River Road. The Community Area for this project is "99-Citywide" since the project spans more than one Community Area.

1.1 Future Renewals/Modifications: The original agreement anticipated a contract term of approximately seven years, Ordinance No. 0247-2021. Originally there were four planned renewals over the seven years. Additional construction work was added to the project after the PCM contract was awarded. A fifth

The project is part of the Division of Sewerage and Drainage's 2015 Blueprint program which included significant community outreach. The project will improve water quality in the Olentangy River by substantially reducing wet weather overflows from seven CSO structures as well as three other sewer relief structures.

The invoice from AEP for 2023 annual rental fees, reflecting 15,469 attachments on AEP poles less 2,835 AEP attachments on City-owned poles, totals \$189,525.00. For annual rental fees going forward, the contract modification provides that funds will be approved annually by ordinance of City Council.

PROPOSED USE: Two two-unit dwellings.

SOUTH LINDEN AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The site consists of two undeveloped parcels in the R-3, Residential District that were formerly developed with two-unit dwellings. The requested Council variance will permit a two-unit dwelling on each parcel. A Council variance is required because the R-3 district permits only single-unit dwellings. Variances to lot width, lot area, and a parking reduction from four required to three provided spaces are included with this request. The site is within the boundaries of the *South Linden Land Use Plan* (2018), which recommends "Medium Density Residential" land uses at this location. Additionally, the Plan includes adoption of the *Columbus Citywide Planning Policies* (C2P2) Design Guidelines (2018). The guidelines recommend that the design and character of new development, including homes, additions, and garages, be appropriate and based on the principal and nearby structures in terms of height, width, setbacks, lot coverage, and roof pitch. As the proposed two-unit dwellings fits within the larger development pattern of the neighborhood, the request does not introduce an incompatible use to the area.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3332.035, R-3 residential district; 3312.49(C), Minimum numbers of parking spaces required; 3332.05(A)(4), Area district lot width requirements; and 3332.13, R-3 area district requirements, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **1477-1481 26TH AVE**. (43211), to permit a two-unit dwelling on each parcel with reduced development standards in the R-3, Residential District (Council Variance #CV22-151).

WHEREAS, by application #CV22-151, the owner of property at 1477-1481 26TH AVE. (43211), is requesting a Council variance to permit a two-unit dwelling on each parcel with reduced development standards in the R-3, Residential District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.035, R-3 residential district, lists single-unit dwellings as the only permitted residential use, while the applicant proposes a two-unit dwelling on each parcel; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.49(C), Minimum numbers of parking spaces required, requires two parking spaces per dwelling unit, or four spaces for each two-unit dwelling, while the applicant proposes three parking spaces on each parcel; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.05(A)(4), Area district lot width requirements, requires a minimum lot width of 50 feet in the R-3, Residential District, while the applicant proposes to maintain a lot width of $35\pm$ feet for each parcel; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.13, R-3 area district requirements, requires that a single-unit dwelling or other

principal building shall be situated on a lot of not less than 5,000 square feet in area, while the applicant proposes a reduced lot area of $3,675\pm$ square feet for each parcel; and

The intended use for the portion of right-of-way is to build a duplex on the two parcels they own at this location and this portion of right-of-way added to the parcels will allow for more room for the new build. The Department of Public Service has agreed to sell the right-of-way as described and shown within attached legal description and exhibit, and extinguishes its need for this public right-of-way.

Per current practice, comments were solicited from interested parties, including City agencies, private utilities and the applicable area commission, before it was determined that the City will not be adversely affected by the transfer of this right-of-way. There will be no General Utility Easement retained over the portion.

The Department of Public Service submitted a request to the City Attorney's Office, asking that they establish a value for this right-of-way, and a value of \$21,840.00 was established. BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health ("CPU") has been awarded the Harm Reduction and Academic Detailing (HRAD) Grant from the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) through Alosa Health, for the Alcohol and Drug Services (ADS) Division. This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate \$6,000.00 in grant money for the period of January 1, 2023 through July 31, 2023.

This ordinance is submitted as an emergency as the grant period began January 1, 2023 and as to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the City's accounting system as soon as possible to spend the awarded funds within time frame of the grant as the grant ends July 31, 2023.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: The Harm Reduction and Academic Detailing (HRAD) Grant is fully funded by NACCHO through Alosa Health and does not require a City match.

One such example when this occurs is streets included in the Columbus Thoroughfare Plan. Streets listed within the Plan have a pre-defined amount of required right-of-way. If that right-of-way width is lacking for a particular property, then the additional right-of-way must be deeded to the City when that property is sold or is being redeveloped. Another example is when developers install sidewalks, turn lanes, etc., on a property within the public right-of-way. If any part of such improvements are outside of the public right-of-way, the developer must deed that part of the land to the City. Many of the deeded amounts are for very small pieces of land. All of the deeded land transactions go through the City Attorney's Office.

The Department of Public Service maintains a list of the deeded land and periodically submits the list to City

Council for acceptance of the deeded land. Ohio Revised Code Chapter 723.03 requires that property proposed for use as a public street or alley must be accepted and dedicated as public right-of-way by an ordinance specifically passed for such purpose. This Ordinance provides for the City to accept deeds for various parcels of real property, to dedicate the parcels as road right-of-way, and to name the parcels as public roadways to comply with Ohio Revised Code Chapter 723.03. Passage of this Ordinance also exempts the property deeded to the City from property taxes.

The Department of Public Service, Division of Refuse Collection, utilizes 96 gallon, 300 gallon, 8 cubic-yard, roll-off containers, and other types as-needed, in its mechanized collection system for residential trash collection. The Division also requires replacement parts for containers that are not covered by warranties. This ordinance is required by the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) as enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio. An annexation petition has been filed with Franklin County for this property. A service ordinance must be passed before the annexation meeting takes place before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County. Information regarding municipal services that would be available, should the subject site be annexed, has been compiled and is reflected in this ordinance. Should the petition be approved by the County Commissioners, a second City ordinance accepting the annexation will be required to complete the process. The time frames specified in the ORC require that this legislation be filed as emergency.

FISCAL IMPACT: The statement of municipal services and zoning conditions for a proposed annexation

area has no fiscal impact. While provision of the stated services does represent cost to the City, annexation of land also has the potential to create revenue to the city.

To set forth a statement of municipal services and zoning conditions to be provided to the area contained in a proposed annexation (AN23-008) of $0.8\pm$ Acres in Jackson Township to the City of Columbus as required by the Ohio Revised Code and to declare an emergency.

Section 1. That the City of Columbus will provide the following municipal services for $0.8\pm$ acres in Jackson Township upon the annexation of said area to the city of Columbus:

Public Safety: The City of Columbus, Department of Public Safety will be able to provide the appropriate level of safety related services to the proposed annexation area. Such services will include police and fire protection as well as emergency medical service to the subject property.

While the petitioner for annexation may have proposed future development plans for the property in question, the Department of Public Safety requests that the City exercise its discretion in the coming development planning and review process to ensure any future development will be properly served by the Department of Public Safety. Discussions between the City and the present property owner or any future developers regarding post annexation changes in zoning or other changes to the property should include the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Development to ensure any proposed development of the annexation property may be adequately accommodated. Specific details for safety services are dependent upon the parameters of future development that is ultimately approved by the City.

Sanitation: Residential refuse collection services will be available upon annexation of the property.

Transportation: Maintenance will be available for any additional right-of-way that may be included in this annexation request. If this annexation contains existing signalized intersections, those intersections and signals are subject to Transportation Division Policy, which appeared in the December 6, 2003 Columbus City Bulletin, and any subsequent updates thereto.

Water: The site will be served by an existing 12" water main located in Demorest Road, the connection to which will be made the owner's expense.

Sewers: All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners and developers at their own cost and expense with no cost to the City.

Sanitary: This site can be served but an extension would be required to get sanitary sewer to the site, which will be made the owner's expense. Sewer plan: RP-7426

Storm: All storm sewers necessary for development/redevelopment of the area shall be designed in accordance with design policy and zoning codes in effect at the time of development.

All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners/developers at their own expense with no cost to the city.

Section 2. If this 0.8± acre site is annexed and if the City of Columbus permits uses in the annexed territory that the City of Columbus determines are clearly incompatible with the uses permitted under current county or township zoning regulations in the adjacent land remaining within Jackson Township, the Columbus City Council will require, in the zoning ordinance permitting the incompatible uses, the owner of the annexed territory to provide a buffer separating the use of the annexed territory and the adjacent land remaining within Jackson Township. The site consists of three parcels developed with two parking lots in the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District and ARLD, Apartment Residential District. The applicant proposes the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District to permit a mixed-use development containing up to 3,000 square feet of commercial space, 51 apartment units, and a new parking lot. The CPD text establishes use restrictions and supplemental development standards addressing density, setbacks, site access, landscaping, building design, lighting, and graphics commitments. Included in the text are code modifications to building height, minimum number of parking spaces required, parking setback,

vision clearance, and building design standards. Additionally, the text includes commitments to develop the site in accordance with the submitted site plan and building elevations. The western portion of the site is located within the boundaries of the Parsons Avenue/Olde Towne Quarter Urban Commercial Overlay, and a portion of the site is located within the boundaries of the *Near East Area Plan* (2005), which recommends "Higher Density Residential/ Mixed Use" land uses. The Plan also encourages higher residential densities designed such that they ensure an appropriate transition to lower densities in the surrounding neighborhood. The proposed mix of uses, building elevations that focus most intensity onto Parsons Avenue, and a site plan that demonstrates a buffer from neighboring residential uses to the east are all consistent with the Plan's recommendations. Staff is also supportive of the requested parking reduction as the site is in an established urban area with access to multiple modes of transit consistent with Plan guidelines recommending a balance of parking with the need to maintain the area's historic fabric. Linthwaite was a resident of Olde Towne East and owned a home located at 781 Franklin Avenue. This Applicant proposes a mixed use development called The Cumberland. The Cumberland's design takes its architectural cues from another one of Mr. Linthwaite's designs, the old Columbus Dispatch building, (upper right and right images) located at the northeast corner of North High Street and East Gay Street in downtown Columbus.

The site consists of three parcels located at the south-east corner of Parsons Avenue and East Capital Street. The site is currently zoned CPD and ARLD and used for surface parking lot. The property is located within the Near East Area Commission and the boundary of the *Near East Area Plan*. The Plan recommends higher density residential uses and mixed use development for the property. The Plan also identifies the site as the Parsons Avenue commercial district node. Lastly, the part of the site fronting Parsons Avenue is located within the Parsons Avenue Olde Towne Quarter Urban Commercial Overlay.

The Applicant proposes rezoning the property from CPD and ARLD to CPD to allow the development of the surface parking lots with a mixed-use commercial and residential development. The proposed development will provide up to 3,000 square feet of commercial use, up to 51 apartment units, and surface parking lot improvements.

II. Permitted Uses:

A. Those uses permitted within Section 3356.03, C-4, Permitted Uses, of the Columbus City Code shall be permitted.

B. This rezoning application is filed in companion with council variance application CV22-118 which requests to permit ground floor residential and accessory uses in the CPD district.

III. Development Standards: Unless otherwise indicated in this Text or on the submitted development plan ("CPD Site Plan"), the applicable development standards are contained in Chapter 3356, C-4 Commercial District of the Columbus City Code shall apply.

- 1. The parcels proposed for the surface parking lot shall be combined.

2. The minimum number of required parking spaces for the entire site shall be 65.

3. Use of the proposed surface parking lot located on a separate parcel from the proposed building shall be limited to serving the proposed developments uses.

C. Buffering, Landscaping, Open Space and/or Screening Commitments:

1. The perimeter parking lot screening for parcel 010-216928 shall permit a six-foot wood fence.

2. Interior parking lot trees shall not be required.

3. The perimeter parking lot screening shall not be required for the north, west, and south perimeters of the surface parking.

D. Building, Design, and/or Interior-Exterior Treatment Commitments:

1. Building, design, and exterior treatments shall substantially conform to the submitted Elevations.

2. The minimum amount of clear/non-tinted window glass between a height of two feet and ten feet shall be 37 percent for the Parsons Avenue façade and 31 percent for the East Capital Street facade for the first ten feet from Parsons Avenue.

E. Dumpsters, Lighting, Outdoor Areas, and/or other Environmental Commitments:

F. Graphic and Signage Commitments:

All graphics shall conform to Article 15 of the Columbus Graphics Code, as it applies to the C-4, Commercial District. Any variance to applicable sign standards shall be submitted to the Columbus Graphics Commission.

G. CPD Criteria:

1. Natural Environment. The site is a surface parking lot with no natural features.

2. Existing Land Use. The property is zoned CPD and ARLD and currently used as surface parking lots.

3. Transportation and Circulation. The site shall be accessed from East Capital Street, Agate Alley, and the adjacent parking lot to the south. The internal circuity shall be as shown on the submitted CPD Site Plan. The proposed surface parking lot located on a separate parcel from the proposed building shall be limited to serving only the proposed development.

4. Visual Form of the Environment. The environment is a mixed-use urban neighborhood. The proposed development will match the visual form of the neighborhood.

5. View and Visibility. The site is visible from East Capital Street and Parsons Avenue.

6. Proposed Development. The proposed development will provide up to 3,000 square feet of commercial uses permitted by Section 3356.03, up to 51 apartment units, and surface parking lot improvements.

3. Section 3312.21(A) - Interior parking lot landscaping. This section shall be modified to waive the requirement for interior surface parking lot trees.

4. Section 3312.21(B) - Perimeter parking lot screening. This section shall be modified to waive the requirement for perimeter parking lot screening for the north, west, and south perimeters of the surface parking lot.

5. 3312.27 - Parking setback line. This section shall be modified to reduce the minimum parking setback from South Garfield Avenue from 10 feet to 4 feet.

6. Section 3372.605(D) - Glass. This section shall be modified to reduce the minimum amount of clear/non-tinted window glass between a height of two feet and ten feet from 60 percent to 37 percent for the Parsons Avenue façade and 31 percent for the East Capital Street façade for the first ten feet from Parsons Avenue.

7. Section 3372.607(B) - Fence. This section shall be modified to permit a six-foot wood fence to satisfy the perimeter parking lot screening requirement for parcel 010-216928.

I. Miscellaneous Commitments:

1. The site shall be developed in accordance with the submitted site plan titled "CPD Site Plan," excluding floor plans. The Site Plan may be slightly adjusted to reflect engineering, topographical or other site data developed at the time that development and engineering plans are completed. Any slight adjustment to the Site Plan shall be reviewed and may be approved by the Director of the Department of Building and Zoning Services, or a designee, upon submission of the appropriate data regarding the proposed adjustment.

2. The buildings shall be constructed in accordance with the submitted building elevations titled, "Elevations". The building elevations may be slightly adjusted to reflect engineering, topographical, or other site data developed at the time of the development plan and when engineering and architectural drawings are completed. Any slight adjustments to the building elevations shall be subject to review and approval by the Director of the Department of Building and Zoning Services, or a designee, upon submission of the appropriate data regarding proposed adjustment.

Ohio Machinery Company dba Ohio Peterbilt is not debarred according to the Excluded Party Listing System of the Federal Government or prohibited from being awarded a contract according to the Auditor of State Unresolved Findings for Recovery Certified Search.

2. CONTRACT COMPLIANCE INFORMATION

The contract compliance number for Ohio Machinery Company dba Ohio Peterbilt is CC006428 and expires 6/8/2024.

3. FISCAL IMPACT:

Additional grant funds are being made available to the Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging from the Ohio Department of Aging for the remainder of the period from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION:

Emergency action is requested in order to meet the conditions of the grant so that providers can be paid within 30 days of providing service, and so that services can continue until June 30, 2023, without interruption.

Fiscal Impact:

\$13,400,000.00 in funds have been made available to the Recreation and Parks grant fund. \$13,400,000.00 is required and budgeted from the Recreation and Parks Grant Fund to meet the financial obligation for said contracts.

To authorize the appropriation and expenditure of up to \$13,400,000.00 from the Recreation and Parks Grant Fund; to authorize the Director of Recreation and Parks to increase various contracts for PASSPORT home care and Assisted Living services; and to declare an emergency. (\$13,400,000.00)

BACKGROUND: The purpose of this ordinance is to authorize the expenditure and payment of \$500,000.000

to The Breathing Association for the purpose of funding a multi-media campaign aimed at increasing awareness of tobacco cessation programs in the City of Columbus for the period of March 1, 2023 to February 29, 2024. The Breathing Association is a Not for Profit vendor.

Pursuant to City Code 329.30, Columbus Public Health negotiated a not-for-profit contract with The Breathing Association to develop and implement a multi-media campaign focused on awareness of and participation in existing cessation programs in Columbus, including the Ohio Tobacco Quit Line. Targeted populations include middle and high school nicotine users, African American smokers, low-income neighborhoods with high density of tobacco retailers, and LGBTQ tobacco users. The goal is to capture people's attention at the moment of motivation to quit and help guide them to resources. The Breathing Association has the resources and expertise to facilitate this campaign above and beyond the capabilities of Columbus Public Health staff alone. This ordinance is submitted as an emergency in order to avoid a delay in payment to the vendor for this essential tobacco cessation awareness campaign and for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety due to the dangers of tobacco in our communities.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding to provide these services is budgeted in the 2023 Health Special Revenue Fund, No. 2250. (\$500,000.00)

This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Safety to make payment to Division of Police Student Intern (Cadet) Jordan Thompson as back payment for work performed as a Cadet. Student Interns in the Divisions of Police and Fire, also referred to as Cadets, were awarded a wage increase effective January 8, 2023. However, Jordan Thompson's increase was not effective until February 5, 2023. This was an inadvertent omission and this legislation is requesting to pay back total wages of \$490.87 owed to the cadet from the period 1/8/2023 to 2/5/2023. Wages for the Cadets were increased from \$14.93 to \$18.50 effective 1/8/2023.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes the payment of \$490.87 as back payment to Jordan Thompson for the inadvertent omission from wage increases awarded to all Police and Fire Cadets effective 1/8/2023. Fringes associated to this back pay amounts to \$85.66 for a total legislated amount of \$576.53.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: This legislation is presented as an emergency measure to ensure fairness and equity for Jordan Thompson in the shortest possible time.

DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval (6-0) on February 9, 2023.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The 35.17± acre site consists of two parcels in the R, Rural District, R-1 Residential District, and M-2, Manufacturing District developed with a parking lot for the John Glenn Columbus International Airport. A portion of the site is subject to Council Variance CV07-014; Ordinance #1068-2007, which permits a parking lot. That ordinance was conditioned on the applicant filing a rezoning application for the subject property and any adjacent properties owned and /or operated by the Columbus Regional Airport Authority within ten months from the effective date of the ordinance (6/29/2008). The requested M, Manufacturing District will permit the continued use of the parking lot and satisfy the condition of Ordinance #1068-2007. PROPOSED USE: Parking lot.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The applicant has received a

recommendation of approval from Staff and the Development Commission for a concurrent rezoning request to the M, Manufacturing District (Ordinance #1038-2023; Z22-062) to maintain an existing parking lot for the John Glenn Columbus International Airport. The requested Council variance will conform existing site conditions and includes variances to landscaping and screening, maneuvering, and parking space requirements, some of which are necessary because the parking lot is comprised of parcels in two different taxing districts. Staff supports the variances as they are consistent with parking lots in the airport complex and will conform existing site conditions.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3312.21(A)(B)(D), Landscaping and screening; 3312.25, Maneuvering; and 3312.29, Parking space, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **1115 STELZER RD. (43219),** to permit reduced development standards for a parking lot in the M, Manufacturing District (Council Variance #CV22-083).

WHEREAS, by application #CV22-083, the owner of property at 1115 STELZER RD. (43219), is requesting a Council variance to permit reduced development standards for a parking lot in the M, Manufacturing District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.21(A)(B)(D), Landscaping and screening, requires that interior parking lot trees shall be planted in landscaped islands or peninsulas containing a minimum soil area of 145 square feet with a minimum radius of 4 feet per tree; that screening be provided for parking lots located within 80 feet of residentially zoned property within a landscaped area at least 4 feet in width; and that headlight screening be provided along public streets within a landscaped area at least 4 feet in width, while the applicant proposes no landscaping and screening, conforming existing conditions, as demonstrated on the submitted site plan; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.25, Maneuvering, requires sufficient maneuvering area on the parcel for the parking spaces for which it serves, while the applicant proposes parking spaces to maneuver over parcel lines as the parcels cannot be combined due to their tax identification numbers, but will provide the minimum maneuvering area; and

Bid Information: This software was bid originally in 2006 and there were four bidders. MCM Technology, LLC was the lowest and most responsive bidder. The annual maintenance since then has been processed and paid for by the Department of Technology. This ordinance is requesting that this upgrade be awarded via the Sole Source provisions of the City Code Chapter 329 as MCM Technology is the sole distributor of current software. CommSHOP 360 is the only software that incorporates all the necessary elements that the Division of Support Services needs to properly track and manage the City's radio assets, control the radio ID's, manage the radio assets of other agencies, and provide the billing of radio services to other agencies.

BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to execute grant agreements with numerous not-for-profit, social service agencies for the provision of human services programming for a 12 month period from January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, in an amount up to \$4,420,000.00, for the Elevate 2.0! Program.

The Elevate 2.0! Program is a rebranding of the Department's Human Services Grant program due to COVID-19. Prior year investment strategies included: Income through Employment, Job Quality, Education and Training, Financial Capability, and Stabilization and Resource Support. COVID-19 significantly impacted not-for-profit organizations and the residents of Columbus. There was an increase in homelessness, housing instability, lost jobs, increase in violence, and increase in health issues. Not-for-profit agencies were challenged to address these needs as donations dropped off. To address these issues, the Department of Development will

focus on supporting not-for-profit organizations providing human services programming in the following areas: Infant Vitality, Homelessness, Housing Stability, Finance Security, Workforce Development, Violence Elimination, Re-entry, Neighborhood Building, and Chronic Disease Prevention. All of the focus areas are tied to Mayor Ginther's Equity Agenda/Opportunity Rising.

The Elevate! 2.0 NOFA (Notice of Funding Availability) was made available to local not-for-profit organizations from September 12, 2022, to October 3, 2022. The Department received 142 applications with requests for funding totaling \$14,050,000.00. Proposals were reviewed by a 24 member team. Sixty-six programs were selected for funding in 2023.

The awards are given with an anticipated renewal in FY2024 and FY 2025, pending availability of funds and program performance per agreements with each agency. See Exhibit A, attached to this ordinance, for a list of organizations to be awarded under this piece of legislation.

This ordinance includes authorization for nine program areas with 60 agencies, with authorization for others agreements being submitted as separate pieces of legislation. Each will be a "grant agreement" with the agency because funding will be advanced to the agency on a predetermined schedule. Advancement of funds is needed because many of the organizations do not have funding available to be reimbursed for program expenses. The first advance will occur after confirmation of the Purchase Order. Before the second advance is made, the agency shall provide reports and documentation indicating how the funds were used to fulfill the scope of services in the grant agreement. This will continue throughout the term of the grant agreement. Additionally, some programs/grant agreements may include food for participants of the programs (e.g. Mid-Ohio Foodbank).

Emergency action is requested to reimburse for approved expenses incurred since January 1, 2023, to prevent each organization from experiencing a financial hardship.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding for these expenditures is allocated from the Emergency Human Services Fund 2023 budget (Fund 2231), up to \$2,639,000.00, and the Administration Division's 2023 General Fund budget, up to \$1,781,000.00 (Fund 1000). Funds were budgeted in object class 03, but will be transferred to object class 05.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: See attached Exhibit A for a list of social services agencies and the vendor registration and contract compliance data.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to execute grant agreements with numerous not-for-profit, social service agencies in an amount up to \$4,420,000.00 for the Elevate 2.0! Program; to authorize the provision of services for a 12 month period from January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023; to authorize payment for reasonable food and non-alcoholic beverages for participants of programs included in the grant agreements; to authorize the advancement of funds on a pre-determined schedule during the term of the agreement; to authorize the expenditure of up to \$2,639,000.00 from the Hotel Motel Tax Fund and up to \$1,781,000.00 from the General Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$4,420,000.00)

All of the focus areas are tied to Mayor Ginther's Equity Agenda/Opportunity Rising; and

WHEREAS, 60 organizations are included in this piece of legislation with authorization for others agreements being submitted as separate pieces of legislation; and

WHEREAS, the grant agreements will be funded with a combination of Emergency Human Services Funds and General Funds; and

WHEREAS, the grant agreements will include advance payments to the organizations and some programs will provide food and non-alcoholic beverages to participants; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Development in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Director to enter into grant agreements with various not-for-profit, social service agencies to avoid causing interruptions in the delivery of program services by organizations as that may have a negative impact on the people served, all for the preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety, and welfare; NOW, THEREFORE,

In this event that there is not sufficient cash in the fund to cover the obligation set forth in this contract, the City Auditor shall have the authority to make all necessary adjustments at her discretion.

SECTION 9. Funds are hereby deemed appropriated and expenditures and transfers authorized to carry out the purposes of this ordinance and the City Auditor shall establish such accounting codes as necessary.

SECTION 10. That the City Auditor is authorized to make any accounting changes to revise the funding source for all contracts or contract modifications associated with this ordinance.

The site is 0.065 +/- acres located at the southeast corner of S. Princeton Avenue and W. Capital Street. The Site is zoned "R4" Residential and is currently vacant lot parcel. The applicant is requesting the rezoning to CPD with C-4 uses, limited to parking, so that it can be developed as a private parking lot, so the parking spaces can be tied to 1251 West Broad Street (PID: 010-025047-00). 1. PERMITTED USE: C-4 Parking as Defined in Chapter 3356 C-4 Regional Scale Commercial District, excluding all other uses of the C-4 zoning classification, located within the Columbus City Code.

2. DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS: Except as otherwise noted above and herein, the applicable development standards of Chapter 3356, C-4: Regional Scale Commercial District and Chapter 3312: Off-Street Parking and Loading Standards shall apply.

A. Density, Lot and/or Setback Commitments.

Parking setback from the west property line shall be eight feet (8.0'). This is a requested modification to the ten-foot minimum as defined per CCC 3312.27.

Care provided by ROOTT doulas is supplementary to and in conjunction with the additional care a mother receives through her primary care provider, OB-GYN, and/or midwife.

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These Bylaws establish the procedure under which the Mideast Area Commission shall execute those duties and functions set forth in and with authority granted under Chapter 3109 and 3111 of the Columbus City Codes (herein abbreviated as C.C.).

Article I – Name

A. The name of this organization shall be the Mideast Area Commission, herein referred to as the "Commission" or "MAC".

Article II - Area

Northern Boundary: The centerline of the Columbus & Ohio Railroad running from the Bexley (W) to Whitehall (E) city boundaries, then following the Whitehall city boundary south and then east to the

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centerline of the Big Walnut Creek.

Eastern Boundary: The centerline of the Big Walnut Creek running from East Main Street (N), to Interstate I-70 (S), then west to the centerline of South Hamilton Road and following it south to HWY-270.

Southern Boundary: Following HWY-270 from the centerline of South Hamilton Road (W) to HWY-33, then following HWY-33 to the centerline of Frank-Refugee Expressway and turning west to the center line of Alum Creek.

Western Boundary: The centerline of Alum Creek running north from the centerline of Frank-Refugee Expressway to the Bexley city boundary at Livingston Avenue, and then continuing along the Bexley city boundary north to the centerline of East Main Street, then east to the centerline of James Road, then north to the centerline of East Broad Street, then west to the Bexley City border and following it north to the Columbus & Ohio Railroad right-of-way.

Article III – Purpose

A. The Mideast Area Commission is created to afford voluntary citizen participation in an advisory capacity within our boundaries. The Commission shall engage with Columbus City Council, City of Columbus officials, City of Columbus departments, adjoining Area Commissions, the adjoining cities of Whitehall and Bexley, business owners, schools, and commercial and residential developers to facilitate communications, understanding, and cooperation between neighborhood groups. This Commission will enhance and empower the importance of existing neighborhood organizations within its boundaries, making them more efficient and effective. As a commission, we will seek direct community input before decisions or recommendations are made that could affect our communities' safety, aesthetics, property values, or quality of life.

The MAC seeks to show UNITY and STRENGTH by working together in finding solutions toward a common goal of building a better, safer, & stronger community. The Commission embraces the belief of community empowerment through collaboration. Together with our partners in city government, code enforcement, and public safety we will work to improve OUR community. We believe in the philosophy of the MAC, having the power of many voices, which fights for the core values of a community collectively.

Through this process our core values will not change.

- Each neighborhood would continue to sit at the table. Equal representation for all!
- Each neighborhood will make its own decisions concerning internal matters.

- Support will be offered when requested. This could be in form of, but not inclusive to: MAC wide or individual community support letters, attendance at hearings and calling mass meetings to raise awareness and show strength in numbers for that particular issue or concern.
- Promote mass meetings of general interest for all the residents of all member organizations.
- B. The Commission shall:
 - 1. In the interests of local planning for local needs, identify and study problems and requirements of the Commission area in order to:
 - a. Create plans and policies which will serve as guidelines for future developments of the area,
 - b. Bring the problems and needs of the Area to the attention of appropriate government agencies or residents and local officials, and
 - c. Recommend solutions and/or legislation.
 - 2. Aid and promote communication within the Commission area and between it and the rest of the City by means of:
 - a. Regular, interim and special meetings of the Commission, which are open to the public,
 - b. Public forums and surveys to provide an opportunity for area residents, businesses and organizations, institutions and governments to comment,
 - c. Initiating proposals and supporting those introduced by individual citizens or area organizations that will enhance the quality of life enjoyed by area residents and preserve the unique residential and commercial mix of the area, and
 - d. Promoting and encouraging business functions, methods of operation, architectural appearance, and locations are consistent with the character and requirement of the area.
 - 3. Initiate, review and recommend criteria and programs for the preservation, development, and enhancement of the Commission area, including but not limited to parks, recreation areas, sidewalks, streets and traffic by means of:
 - a. Reviewing the proposed capital improvements budget and proposing new items and changes relating to the area,
 - b. Making recommendations for restoration and preservation of the historical and environmental elements within the area, and
 - c. Receiving and reviewing for recommendation prior to the adoption by governmental bodies, any new or revised comprehensive plan affecting the area.

- 4. Recommend priorities for and review government services and operation of the various government departments in the Commission area by means of:
 - a. Requesting and receiving from departments or agencies periodic reports concerning governmental services in the area,
 - Meeting with administrative heads of any department or agencies or any of their subordinates to obtain additional information deemed necessary for the Commission to fulfill its functions,
 - c. Requesting and receiving from departments or agencies, prior to implementation, full reports on any proposed changes,
 - d. Reviewing and evaluating pending legislation substantially affecting the area prior to its consideration by Columbus City Council, and
 - e. Review and comment on zoning issues and demolition presented to the Commission.
- Recommend persons from Commission area for nominations to membership on City Boards and Commissions that make decisions or recommendations affecting the Commission area. The Commission shall not endorse any candidate for public office.

Article IV – Membership

- A. Appointment: All Commissioners shall be appointed by the Mayor of the City of Columbus with concurrence of City Council in accordance with C.C. 3109. The Secretary shall notify the Mayor of all nominations, elections, and vacancies within ten (10) days of such action.
 - 1. Should the Mayor neither approve nor disapprove the action within thirty (30) days of notifications, the actions shall be deemed approved until notice from the Mayor as specified in C.C. 3109.
 - 2. A copy of each notice shall be sent to the City Council in care of the City Clerk.
- B. Members: The Commission shall consist of seventeen (15) Commissioners. Each
 Commissioner shall reside, work, or own property within the boundary of the commission.
 - Twelve (12) Resident Commissioners shall be selected. One (1) from each of the Civic Association and Block Watch areas, with the exception as noted below for neighborhoods that have been designated to share a Commissioner.
 - a. Neighborhood Areas with Exclusive Resident Commissioner Representation (9): North Eastmoor, South Eastmoor, Mayfair Peacekeepers, Berwick, Berwyn East, Easthaven, Remington Ridge, Thunderbird Acres, and Beechwood.
 - b. Neighborhood Areas with Shared Resident Commissioner Representation (3):

- i. East Hampton, Barnett, and Livingston Heights
- ii. Pinecrest and Sherwood
- iii. Leawood Gardens and Willis Park
- c. Each Resident Commissioner shall reside within the boundaries of the Neighborhood Area they represent. Resident Commissioners must maintain residence in their Neighborhood Area until the completion of their term. The selection of twelve (12) Resident Commissioners shall take place in September in accordance with the selection rules adopted by their Civic Association and/or Block Watch.
- d. If a consensus cannot be reached for selection of a Shared Resident
 Commissioner, a majority vote of the Commission will place the tie-breaking vote.
- 2. Three (3) At-Large Resident Commissioners shall be selected by the Commission in September by an Advisory Council comprised of the Presidents from each of the member Civic Associations and Block Watches. Each Commissioner shall reside within the boundaries of the Commission area. Commissioners must maintain residence in the Commission area until the completion of their term.
- One (1) At-Large Commissioner shall be a Board Member nominated by the East Main Street Special Improvement District (SID) in September.
- Any Commissioner seats left vacant by lack of selection by their Neighborhood Area or the SID shall be selected from that area by a majority vote of the Commission at the October Regular Meeting.
- All Commissioners shall be required to attend at least one Area Commission Training opportunity provided by the City of Columbus within one (1) year of appointment and report their participation to the Department of neighborhoods and the Commission Secretary.
- C. Terms: Members of the Commission shall serve without compensation for a term of three (3) years. All terms shall begin January 1, the year following their appointment and expire December 31 in the year that the term expires.
 - Upon first establishment of the Commission, initial terms shall be staggered as determined by lot, one-third (1/3) of the initial Commissioners shall serve for one (1) year; one third (1/3) for two (2) years; and the remaining one-third (1/3), for three (3) years or until their successors are appointed. Upon expiration of each initial Commissioner's term and thereafter, each Commissioner shall serve as described in Article IV Sections B to maintain continuity of experienced representation.
- D. Commission Representation: No Commissioner, except the Chair or the Chairs designee shall represent the Commission in its official actions before any other public body or official, except

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as specifically authorized in writing by the Commission. This shall not be construed as a restriction upon the right of the individual Commissioners to represent their own views before public or private bodies, whether in agreement or disagreement with the official action of the Commission.

- E. Disgualification: Commissioners shall maintain their residence, employment or business in the Commission area from which they were elected or appointed. Failure of a Commissioner to maintain his or her residence, employment or business in the Commission area, shall be deemed a resignation and the Secretary shall notify the Mayor, City Clerk and the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods within the ten (10) days of such action.
- F. Attendance: The year starts with the annual meeting in January. Commissioners shall, so far as possible, be regular in attendance. A Commissioner's absence from three (3) regular meetings in any one (1) calendar year (January to December) shall be deemed a resignation from the Commission unless a written petition has been received by the Chairperson of the Commission. The Commission must act upon the petition when it is received at either the next regularly scheduled meeting or the following regularly scheduled meeting. The petition must be made in writing and received by the Chairperson at least seven (7) days prior to the next regular meeting following the third absence. The petition is to request that some or all the absences be excused due to extenuating circumstances. The nature of the extenuating circumstances shall be explained. If the Commission accepts, by majority vote, all or a portion of the absences may be excused. If a petition is not received, it shall be deemed a resignation from the Commission and notice of such will be communicated to the City of Columbus by the Secretary within ten (10) days. After the second missed meeting, the secretary will remind the Commissioner of the attendance policy in writing within seven (7) days after the second missed meeting. After the third missed meeting, the Secretary will remind the Commissioner in writing within seven (7) days after the third missed meeting about the need to submit a petition to the Chairperson if the Commissioner would like to maintain their position. Commissioners shall, as soon as possible, inform either the Chairperson or the Secretary, prior to the meeting, when they know they will be absent.
- G. Removal: Any Commissioner can be removed for cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all Commissioners then in office, at any regular or special meeting of the Commission. The process of Commissioner removal shall be initiated by the Chairperson providing a notice by Registered Mail to the Commissioner proposed for removal of the reason or reasons for removal at least thirty (30) days before any final action is taken by the Commission. If the Commissioner proposed for removal is a Resident Commissioner as defined under Article IV, Section B-1, their nominating Civic Association and/or Block Watch shall receive a copy of the statement by Registered Mail. This statement shall be accompanied by a notice of the time when, and the Mideast Area Commission Bylaws

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place where, the Commission is to take action on the removal. The Commissioner shall be given an opportunity to be heard and the matter considered by the Commission at the time and place mentioned in the notice.

H. Vacancies: The Commission shall nominate one (1) or more candidates to fill any vacancy caused by death, resignation, disqualification, removal or other means for the remainder of the unexpired term by letter to the Mayor pursuant C.C. 3109. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by the Chairperson within thirty (30) days of the declared vacancy, with approval by the Commissioners by majority vote.

Article V – Officers

- A. The officers of the Commission shall be: Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Zoning Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer. At the first meeting of the Commission, officers shall be elected by majority vote of the Commissioners. Thereafter, election of officers shall be at the January meeting annually. Officer terms shall be one (1) year, or until a successor is elected. A Commissioner may serve a maximum of three (3) consecutive terms as Chairperson, with the requirement that only one additional year can be requested if no successor is elected (2022). A Commissioner may serve a maximum of six (6) consecutive terms as Vice-Chairperson, Zoning Chair, Secretary, or Treasure. A term limited Commissioner may be re-elected after a gap of at least 3 consecutive years. Each officer shall have the right to vote on any question barring any conflict of interest (see Article VII, Section I). All officers shall be Commissioners.
- B. Chairperson: The Chairperson shall be a resident of the City of Columbus within the Mideast Area Commission boundaries, and will preside at all meetings of the Commission; prepare the agenda for each meeting; in consultation with other Commissioners, appoint standing and special committees of the Commission; serve as an ex-officio member of all committees; coordinate the action of officers and committee chairpersons; and perform other duties associated with the office as required. The Chairperson shall, from time to time, be asked or feel the need to write a letter of support or concern to agencies or about issues pertaining to the MAC. A draft of this letter will be distributed to the area commissioners for edit and approval.
- C. Vice-Chairperson: The Vice-Chairperson shall be a resident of the City of Columbus within the Mideast Area Commission boundaries; shall assist the Chairperson; perform all the duties of the Chairperson in her or his absence, or at the request of the Chairperson; and perform other such duties as may be assigned by the Commission.
- D. Zoning Chair: The Zoning Chair shall be a resident of the City of Columbus within the Mideast Area Commission boundaries; shall Chair any Zoning & Development Meeting; Act as primary contact for any zoning or development inquiries brought before the Commission; and ensure all Page 7 of 11

Commission Members, Civic Association Boards, and Block Watch Organizers receive information about zoning and development inquiries brought before the commission.

- E. Secretary: The Secretary shall be a resident of the City of Columbus within the Mideast Area Commission boundaries; shall call and record roll; remind a Commissioner of his or her absences per Article IV, Section F; record and maintain accurate voting records and meeting summaries that shall be open to public examination; maintain such other records as the Commission may direct; notify the Mayor of any Commissioner vacancies and nominations; perform related duties as may be assigned by the Commission; and in the absence of both the Chairperson and the Vice-Chairperson, call the meeting to order and preside until the immediate election of Chairperson pro tempore. The Secretary shall also maintain Public Records such as (emails, memos, meeting notes, minutes, etc.) that the Commission creates as the Commissioners go about Commission business. The records shall be available to the public at request. The Commission shall also abide by the City of Columbus's Record Retention schedule, which describes the dates and process for retaining and destroying documents.
- F. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall receive all funds and disburse all funds with the Commission's approval; insure all financial records of the Commission are maintained and reported to the Commission at each regular meeting and to the City of Columbus as required; be responsible for ensuring sound financial practices are maintained; and perform any other duties the Commission may require. The Commission shall provide for a reconciliation of the financial records of the accounts prior to each annual meeting.
- G. Vacancies: A vacancy in the office of the Chairperson shall be filled by the Vice-Chairperson. A vacancy in any other officer position shall be filled in the same manner as the original selection.

Article VI- Meetings

- A. Regular Meetings: Regular monthly meetings of the Commission shall be held the third Tuesday of each month, except for August and December, unless otherwise directed by the majority vote of the Commission present in sufficient time to notify constituents and the City Administration of such change. Each meeting shall be held in the Commission area unless suitable facilities are unavailable. Commissioners may seek suitable facilities contiguous to the Commission area. The facility will have an appropriately large room convenient for Commissioners and the public and will be chosen by the Commission as its regular meeting place unless otherwise specified at least fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting. Notice of the meeting with an agenda shall be published on the official Commission website prior to changing meeting time or location.
- B. Zoning & Development Meetings: Meetings shall be held as required by caseload of zoning and development issues before the Commission. The Zoning Committee shall make all efforts to

contact the affected MAC Civic Association(s) members to request input and recommendations which will be discussed and voted at the Zoning committee meeting. Notice of the meeting with an agenda shall be published on the official Commission website prior to changing the meeting time or location. Anyone wishing to present an issue for review by the Zoning & Development District must do so at least 30 days prior to a scheduled meeting.

- C. Interim Meetings: Interim meetings are held on a monthly basis with the primary purpose of conducting committee business.
- D. Annual Meeting: The annual meeting shall be the first regular meeting in October.
- E. Special Meetings: Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson or by a majority of Commissioners present at any Commission meeting. The person or persons calling a special meeting shall give written notice of the special meeting's purpose, date, time, location and agenda to all Commissioners. No business will be considered at the special meeting unless it was stated when the meeting was called. Except in cases of emergency, seven (7) days' notice shall be given for a special meeting. The Commission shall maintain a list of persons who have requested to be contacted prior to a Special meeting being called.
- F. All meetings shall be open to the public, and notice shall be published, when possible, at least seven (7) days in advance on the web site unless stated otherwise in these by-laws.
- G. Quorum: A simple majority of the current Commissioners shall constitute a quorum for conducting business
- H. Voting: A simple majority of the Commissioners present and voting shall be required to approve any action other than to override the recommendation of Zoning & Development. A vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the seated Commissioners present is required to override the recommendation of a Zoning & Development. A tie vote is disapproval. The Chairperson shall state each issue in a positive form such as "The question before the Commission is," "Shall the application for ______ be approved?" and "Request approval for ______ be approved?" All votes shall be public and recorded, including Commissioner name and "yay" or "nay" vote. Area Commission members must be present in person at a meeting in order to be considered present or to vote at the meeting.
- I. Conflict of Interest: Each Commissioner shall determine for themselves when they have a conflict of interest that warrants their recusal from participating and voting on a particular matter before the Commission. A conflict of interest generally exists when an area commission's decision may produce a benefit, or detriment, for the area commissioner or a commissioner's family member. Should a 'conflict/recusal' issue arise in an open Commission meeting, the meeting shall include full discussion, noting any motion, voting and reporting in the Minutes.
- J. The order of business may be determined by the Chairperson.

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- K. The Chairperson shall recognize members of the public who wish to address the Commission concerning issues under discussion. The Chairperson shall uniformly limit debate to an equal amount of time for each speaker on an issue. Time limits may be set by the Commission. When appropriate, further action on the issue may be deferred to the next Commission meeting.
- L. Dissenting or non-concurring reports may be filed with the Secretary by any Commissioner and shall be attached to the majority report.
- M. Individual citizens or Commissioners may be asked to research a specific topic and report findings to the Commission.
- N. Agenda: The agenda for each regular meeting shall set forth all matters for discussion. When possible, all matters for the agenda, including previous meeting's minutes and committee reports shall be submitted in writing to the Chairperson at least ten (10) days prior to a meeting. When possible, the Chair shall send all Commissioners a notice of the meeting including the agenda, minutes, and committee reports at least seven (7) days prior to the Commission meeting.
- O. Discussion Limitation: Persons present at meetings who are not Commissioners shall have the right to participate in discussions of matters for consideration by Commission and the Chairperson shall recognize them for that purpose. The Chairperson shall determine the limitation of discussion.
- P. Guests' Speaking Time Limit: When guests are invited to speak to the Commission, time will generally be limited to fifteen (15) minutes, or at the discretion of the Chairperson.
- Q. Meeting Time Limit: Commission meetings shall be limited to not more than ninety (90) minutes unless deemed appropriate and approved by a majority of the Commissioners present.

Article VII – Committees

- A. The Chairperson shall appoint Commissioners to standing committees giving due consideration to their individual preferences and subject to approval by a majority vote of the Commissioners.
- B. The Chairperson shall appoint Commission residents to committees from recommendations by Commissioners appointed to that particular committee subject to approval by a majority vote of the Commissioners. Residents appointed shall have full voting privileges in all proceedings of the committee to which they are appointed.
- C. Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the Chairperson and their appointments shall expire December 31 unless extended by the Chairperson.
- D. The Chairperson shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.
- E. After appointments are approved, the members of each committee shall select a Committee Chairperson from among the Commissioners appointed to the committee.

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- F. Notice of all committee meetings and copies of all committee correspondence shall be filled with the Secretary and the Chairperson of the Commission. Committees findings that propose action or resolution shall be submitted at a regular meeting of the Commission for consideration.
- G. Current Committees:
 - a. Zoning
 - b. Communications
 - c. Traffic and Safety

Article VIII – Amendment of Bylaws

A. These Bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Commission by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Commissioners present provided the amendment was submitted in writing and read at the previous regular meeting. The Secretary shall file any approved amendment immediately after its adoption with the City Clerk for publication in the City Bulletin. Such amendment shall take effect ten (10) days after such publication per C.C. 121.05.

It has been brought to my attention by the City Attorney's office related to the City code sections referenced below that Area Commission bylaws filed with the clerk (and for publication in the City Bulletin) need to be "certified" copies. To accomplish that, each of them (going forward) needs to have a signed statement from the Chairperson stating:
