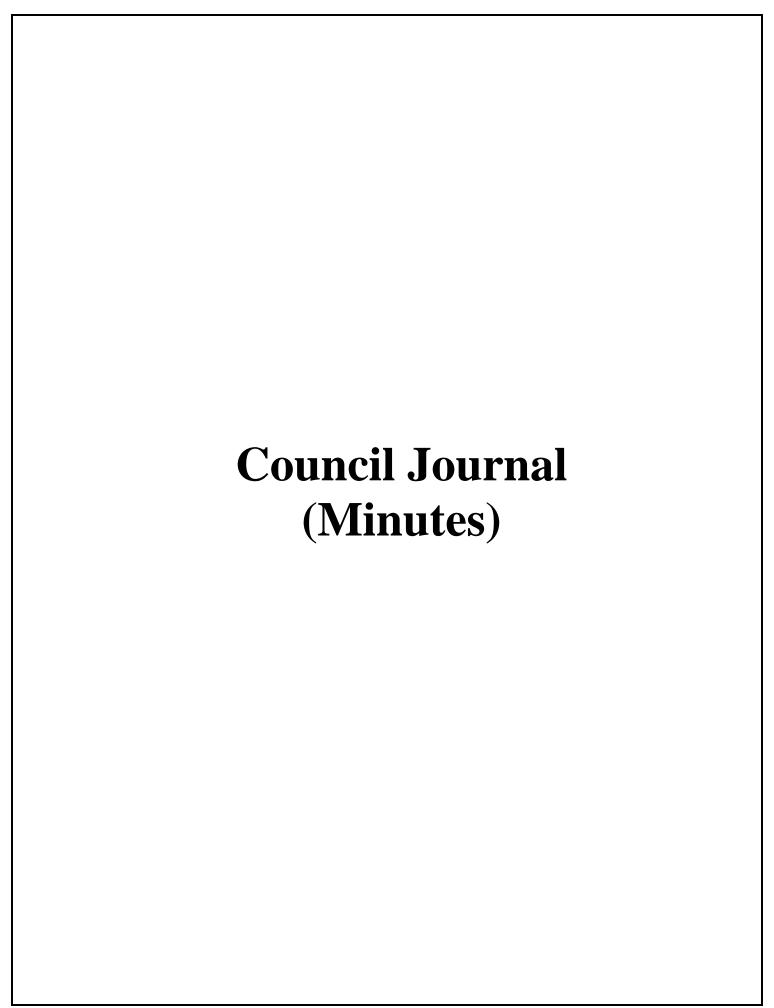
SIGNING OF LEGISLATION

(Legislation was signed by Council President Shannon G. Hardin on the night of the Council meeting, *Monday, June 5, 2023;* by Mayor, Andrew J. Ginther on *Thursday June 8, 2023* with the exception of 1726-2023 which was signed on *Tuesday June 6, 2023;* and attested by the City Clerk, Andrea Blevins on *Friday June 9, 2023* prior to Bulletin publishing)

Ordinance 1522-2023, "To authorize the Director of Recreation and Parks to enter into non-profit grant agreements with various organizations in support of summer programming to youth; to authorize the expenditure of \$242,775.00 from the Recreation and Parks Operating Fund. (\$242,775.00)", was defeated by Columbus City Council 6-0 and replaced with ordinance 1665-2023, "To authorize the Director of the Department of Recreation and Parks to enter into non-profit grant agreements with various organizations in support of summer programming to youth; to authorize the transfer of \$150,000.00 within the Recreation and Parks Operating Fund, to authorize the expenditure of \$442,775.00 from the Recreation and Parks Operating Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$442,775.00)"

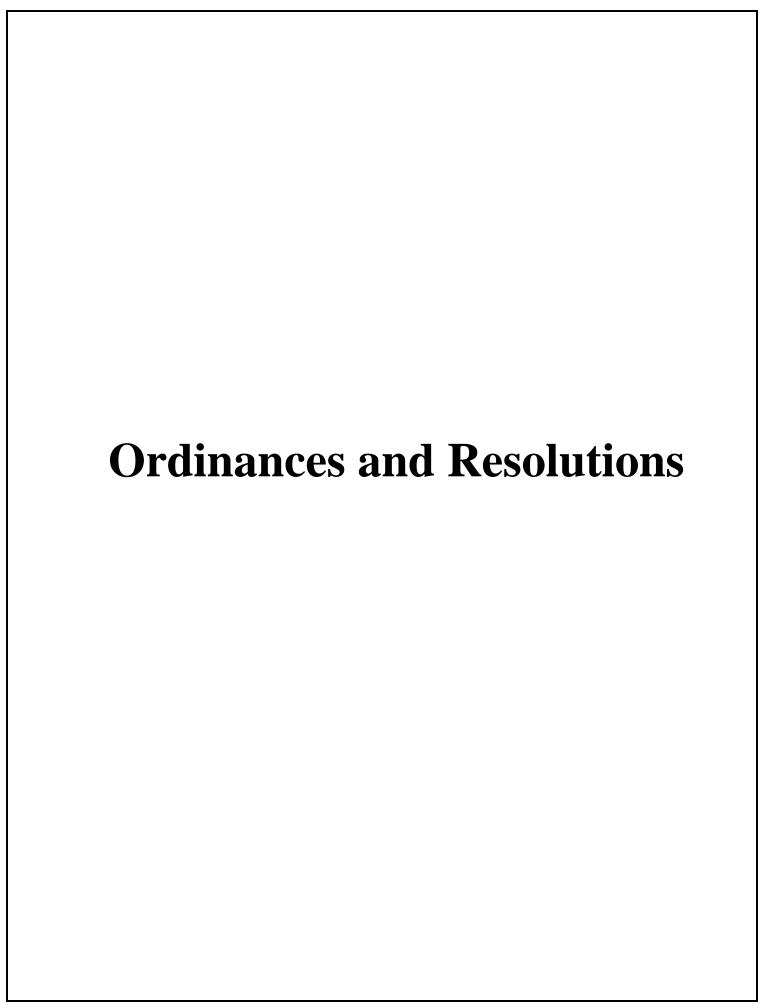

This ordinance authorizes the appropriation and expenditure of \$700,000 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

The following Purchase Agreement association requires approval by City Council in order for the Division to expend more than \$100,000.00 in a fiscal year per City Code 329.19(g):

Paris Site Furnishings and Outdoor Fitness: Universal Term Contract Purchase Agreement to be determined after the authorizing Ordinance 1471-2023, has passed.

Paris Site Furnishings and Outdoor Fitness is not debarred according to the Excluded Party Listing System of the Federal Government or prohibited from being awarded a contract according to the Auditor of State Unresolved Findings for Recovery Certified Search.

WHEREAS, the Division of Refuse Collection needs to replace right-of-way litter and recycling containers throughout the City that are damaged, have been removed, or have reached the end of their useful life; and

WHEREAS, the City has budgeted \$700,000.00 of Community Development Block Grant funding within the 2022 Annual Action Plan for the purpose of replacing litter and recycling containers in areas serviced with public transportation and large volumes of pedestrian and multi-modal transportation options; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to authorize the expenditure of up to \$700,000.00 from the Community Development Block Grant, Fund 2248, to purchase these litter containers; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to appropriate the funds; and

BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health has been awarded the Alcohol Use Disorder (AUD) Treatment grant from the Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health (ADAMH) Board of Franklin County, for the Alcohol and Drug Services (ADS) Division. This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate \$55,992.54 in grant money for the period of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

In 2022, Columbus Public Health's Alcohol & Drug Services (ADS) team was a recipient of the Alcohol Use Disorder (AUD) grant. The purpose of this grant was to provide outreach throughout Columbus to link and support individuals who abuse, misuse and/or are diagnosed with alcohol use disorder and/or substance use disorder. Staff under this grant engaged people that needed assistance linking to treatment and recovery services. Although the grant ended on March 14, 2023, carryover funds were allowed for an additional year and will be used to provide engagement supplies at summer Walk in for Recovery events. Supplies will include things such as birth certificates and bus passes to remove barriers to them seeking services. The population of focus remains adults that misuse alcohol and other substances.

This ordinance is submitted as an emergency as the grant period began January 1, 2023 and as to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the City's accounting system as soon as possible to expend the awarded funds and achieve the grant outcomes within the timeframe and deadlines of the grant as the grant was awarded in the updated Contract Year (KY) 2023 Planned Allocation Summary issued by the ADAMH Board of Franklin County on April 18, 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Alcohol Use Disorder (AUD) Treatment grant is fully funded by the ADAMH Board of Franklin County and does not require a City match.

To authorize the Board of Health to accept a grant from the ADAMH Board of Franklin County in the amount of \$55,992.54; to authorize the appropriation of \$55,992.54 to the Health Department in the Health Department Grants Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$55,992.54)

1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a contract with Arcadis U.S., Inc. for professional services and construction services for the SWWTP VFD & Harmonic Filter Upgrades project, CIP #650346-100002, in an amount up to \$443,624.94.

The Department of Public Utilities' (DPU) Division of Sewerage & Drainage (DOSD) has identified numerous Variable Frequency Drives (VFDs) and Harmonic Filters at several Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant (SWWTP) processes that are nearing the end of their useful service life and are becoming increasingly difficult to repair and maintain. These processes include the fine screens, the Return Activated Sludge (RAS) pumps, the thickening centrifuges, and the skimmings' concentrators. This project will provide specialized professional engineering services to evaluate, replace, configure, and program the VFDs and harmonic filters, provide new controls that may be necessary to integrate the new equipment into the existing systems, and provide any other ancillary work to provide a fully functioning system. This work will also include recommendations for the standardization of equipment that can be used in the DOSD Guide Specifications and programming of Programmable Logic Controllers (PLCs). The equipment specified will vary based on site conditions, building use, building permit requirements, and ease of maintenance issues. Consideration shall be given to increasing ease of maintenance, development of standardized operating systems, and specifying control systems access software. This work is part of the City's continuing effort to upgrade its treatment facilities, provide efficient, reliable, cost-effective operations, and enhance personnel safety.

This agreement will provide engineering services necessary for the preliminary design, detailed design, services for construction procurement, and engineering services during construction. The original agreement will be for preliminary design only. Future modifications of this contract are planned to provide funding for the remaining services. This project may be funded via the WPCLF program.

The Community Planning Area is "99 - Citywide".

TIMELINE: Arcadis will begin work after the Notice to Proceed (NTP) is given upon execution of their Professional Engineering Services Agreement which is anticipated to be during the summer of 2023. The engineering agreement will provide Step 1, Preliminary Design Services. The completion of Preliminary Design and approval of the PDR is currently scheduled for the fourth quarter of 2023. A modification request for Detailed Design is currently scheduled for late 2023 so that the modification can be finalized and Detailed Design can begin upon completion of Preliminary Design in the first quarter of 2024. Detailed Design will continue until advertisement for bids, then bidding services will commence. It is anticipated that plans and

specs will be finalized and ready for advertisement during the second quarter of 2024, bids will be received in the third quarter of 2024, and Notice to Proceed of the construction contract will be in the fall of 2024. The anticipated end of the construction contract is early 2026. The Professional Engineering Services contract will continue beyond completion of construction to provide record drawings of the constructed facilities and to provide assistance during the warranty period. The engineering agreement is anticipated to be closed in 2027.

The total term of the engineering agreement is estimated to be 3.5 years. The estimated ending month and year of the agreement is January, 2027.

ESTIMATED COST OF PROJECT: The original engineering agreement amount is \$443,624.94. Two additional contract renewals are anticipated at this time.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Safety, on behalf of the Division of Support Services, to enter into a contract with Motorola Solutions Inc. for the ongoing maintenance and support of the City of Columbus 800MHz Radio System that serves nearly all city departments including Public Safety, Public Utilities, Public Service, Development, and Recreation and Parks. The radio system is used as a primary source of communications from the Department of Public Safety's dispatch center to public safety units in the field, for internal communications of public safety units, and for interoperability communications between federal, state, and other local public safety agencies. Other Departments use the radio system for similar communications with their employees in the field. The system aids the dispatchers by transmitting critical information by voice signal. The City first installed the 800 MHz Radio System in April 1992 and upgraded the infrastructure with Federal Grant Funds in 2006. The 2015 upgrade brought the radio system up to the most current industry standard of public safety radio systems and allowed the City of Columbus to retain the level of interoperability communications with its partners who have upgraded to the P-25 Digital System.

Ordinance 1405-2015 authorized the second phase of the City's 800 MHz radio system upgrade to the P-25 digital system. It incorporated the installation of all new infrastructure at the City of Columbus' 800MHz tower sites, connectivity of the tower sites to the State of Ohio's system, and included testing and migration of all agencies to the new infrastructure. Motorola installed all of the new infrastructure at the communications sites and connectivity from the tower sites, and tested and migrated all of the agencies to the new infrastructure.

<u>Bid Information</u>: This purchase is being executed in accordance with the sole source provisions of Chapter 329 of the Columbus City Codes. The ongoing maintenance and support of the existing system requires proprietary software and infrastructure owned by Motorola Solutions Inc. Two hundred and two (202) vendors were solicited (RFQ10714), and four (4) proposals were received and opened on November 7, 2018. The evaluation and final ranking was based upon the criteria in the Request for Proposal and Roberts Service Group, Inc. was determined to be the most qualified responder to provide the necessary electric power system maintenance services.

The original contract, PO153604, was established for a period of one (1) year with three (3) additional one (1) year renewal options contingent upon mutual agreement, availability of funding, and approval by Columbus City Council. This ordinance authorizes the appropriation of \$282,222.70 in the Information Services Operating Fund, Columbus City Schools (CCS) Telephone Services subfund. This subfund houses moneys that CCS has provided to the City of Columbus, Department of Technology (DoT) to pay for supplies, services and capital equipment associated with the Voice-over-Internet-Protocol (VOIP) telephone project.

Per ordinance 2557-2017 (and all exhibits) passed by City Council on October 30, 2017, this on-going project is a collaborative partnership between the city and the schools. As the city expands its VOIP solution, services and equipment are made available to the schools and the schools are, in turn, reimbursing the city for incurred costs. These costs include maintenance and license renewals, phone and data charges, staff augmentation, etc. The funds are deposited into a special subfund, created expressly to account for the project's revenues and expenditures. Periodic appropriations from the unappropriated balance of this subfund are sought as needed and as funds are received by the city.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is currently an unencumbered cash balance of \$282,222.70 in the Information Services Operating Fund, Columbus City Schools Telephone Services subfund. This amount is solely the cash carryover into 2023 (resulting from prior-year encumbrances cancellations and lapsed appropriations).

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Finance and Management Director to enter into a non-profit service contract with Impact Community Action to implement the Empowered! program and support energy efficient, sustainable neighborhoods in line with the City's Columbus Climate Action Plan. Empowered! is a clean-energy jobs program geared toward Columbus residents ages 18-24. The program will provide training and on-the-job experience for careers in the clean-energy sector and focus on recruiting participants from communities of color and women in Opportunity Neighborhoods. These services cannot be provided by current city employees.

Funding will support three cohorts of program participants over the next year, providing training to establish the skills and knowledge needed to be a competitive candidate for full-time employment within the clean-energy sector. Training will also highlight career exploration; digital literacy; diversity, equity and inclusion; and wraparound services.

Additionally, Empowered! participants will receive on-the-job experience as Energy Advocates, helping residents navigate and better understand energy efficiency and the range of energy programs available to them. They will also perform low-level energy audits and simple energy upgrades such as LED-bulb replacement. Participants will be paid \$17 per hour as Energy Advocates and receive compensation for their training.

Upon completion of the program, Empowered! graduates will be placed in pre-apprenticeships or apprenticeships, or directly employed in fields such as weatherization, construction, utilities, solar installation and manufacturing. The Empowered! Program will advance both the Columbus Climate Action Plan and environmental justice by supporting those communities most impacted by climate change.

Additionally, this funding will also support the expansion of IMPACT's Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP), which will provide home energy conservation assistance including housing unit inspections; attic, wall and basement insulation; and access to energy-efficient applications to help lower home energy costs and reduce environmental pollutants for customers who are between 200-300% FPL. Areas for improvement were initially considered through recommendations from internal staff and public involvement. All requests were assessed through a Pavement Condition Rating (PCR) form and were given a rating from 0, meaning the worst condition, to 100, meaning the best condition. All requests were prioritized for action based on their respective PCR scores. From there, staff confirmed which projects to move forward with.

This project provides improvements at locations throughout the City of Columbus, including Greene Countrie Park, Stoneridge Park, Joan Park, Cremeans Park, Karns Park, Parkridge Park, Amvet Village Park, Holton Park, Three Creeks Park, Big Walnut Park, Wolfe Park, Carriage Place Park, Franklin Park and Krumm Park.

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to enter into a

grant agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) for the Franklinton Loop - Souder Avenue Trail Connector Project. This ordinance will also authorize the appropriation of grant and matching funds. The grant amount is \$4,294,938.00 and the local match amount is \$3,470,053.85. This ordinance also authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to enter into contract with Complete General Construction for the Franklinton Loop - Souder Avenue Trail Connector Project. The contract amount is \$6,578,969.16, with a contingency of \$658,000.00, for a total of \$7,236,696.16. Emergency Justification: Emergency action is requested in order to meet the required ODOT Federal grant funding fiscal deadline in June of 2023, securing the grant dollars available for the project.

Benefits to the Public: The Franklinton Community is one of the city's most disadvantaged areas for safe accessibility to parks and trails. The existing Souder Avenue roadway bridge is a heavily used bike and pedestrian route, with regional trails connecting to it on both banks of the Scioto River. This two lane bridge is recognized widely as one of the city's most unsafe and narrow crossings. Manual trail counts were conducted and found that the average daily use of the Souder Avenue Bridge by pedestrians and cyclists was approximately 250 uses per day. This equates to roughly 90,000 uses annually. These numbers place the Souder Avenue Bridge connection near the top five busiest counted sections in the Columbus trail system. The Broad Street and Souder Avenue corridor is also experiencing major redevelopment. FISCAL IMPACT: Funds exist within the Public Safety Department's Safety Voted Bond Fund for this purchase. Cash is available upon transfer from various projects within the Safety Voted Bond Fund for this purchase.

The scope of work includes the replacement of the boiler in the mechanical room at the Reeb Avenue Center. The contractor will also provide all testing and training for maintenance personnel.

- **3. MINORITY CONTRACT PARTICIPATION:** Of the 436 vendors solicited, 159 were Minority-owned, 2 Veteran-owned, 270 Small Business-owned, and 100 Women-owned. C.D. Whitfield Company did not propose any minority designated subcontractors. A goal was not assigned by the Office of Diversity and Inclusion due to the low estimated amount of the project.

- **4. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION:** Construction needs to be finished by December 31, 2023 in order to meet the requirements of the CDBG grant. Emergency designation will eliminate 6 weeks of downtime. Materials should be ordered as soon as possible due to current supply-chain issues. Having the necessary materials on order will enable the contractor to mobilize and finish construction by the December 31, 2023 deadline.
- **5. FISCAL IMPACT:** Funding for this project will come from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement Program provides annual grants on a formula basis to cities and counties to develop viable urban communities. An appropriation of funds will be needed to align this Ordinance with the Draft FY 2023 Annual Action Plan as approved by City Council through the adoption of Ordinance No. 3353-2022.

The appropriation and expenditure of \$127,646.00 will be needed within the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Fund.

To authorize the Director of Finance and Management, on behalf of the Office of Construction Management, to enter into a construction contract with C.D. An evaluation committee consisted of five (5) representatives from the Finance and Management Department. Each member of the committee scored and ranked the proposals. All offers and cost proposals were evaluated in compliance with Columbus City Code 329, the committee submitted final rankings.

Workspace Ohio LLC, dba Dupler Office received the highest score, 94.2 out of 100 points. The selected Offeror provides interior space design services and furniture procurement services.

The request for purchase of Commercial Interior Space Design Services and Furniture Procurement Services UTC used the best value competitive sealed proposal process to award the supplier that provided the relevant criteria specifically listed in the BVP and the lowest cost.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Mifflin Township was filed on behalf of QSI Properties LLC on December 28, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the petition was considered and approved by the Franklin County Board of Commissioners at a hearing on February 28, 2023; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2023, the City Clerk received from Franklin County a certified copy of the resolution addressing the petition; and

WHEREAS, sixty days have now elapsed since receipt of the resolution in accordance with the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code; and

BACKGROUND:

This ordinance approves the acceptance of certain territory (AN22-022) by the city of Columbus and authorizes its transfer from Blendon Township to Montgomery Township per an annexation agreement between the City and the Township. The Ohio Revised Code stipulates that to be effective, City acceptance must take place a minimum of 60 days from the receipt by the City Clerk of the approval notice from the county. If City Council does not accept the ordinance within 120 days of its first consideration, the annexation will be considered rejected. This petition was filed with Franklin County on February 21, 2023.

Franklin County approved the annexation on March 7, 2023 and the City Clerk received notice on March 28, 2023. No service ordinance was required because this annexation was filed as a Type 1 application as defined by the ORC. Although not required, a service statement reflecting the City's ability to provide services for this site upon annexation is attached.

The use of a Type 1 annexation application is stipulated in the annexation agreement between the City and Blendon Township. The annexation agreement also requires that territory annexed to the City of Columbus from Blendon Township be transferred to Montgomery Township. This ordinance authorizes the submission of a petition to the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, requesting that the boundary lines of Montgomery Township be changed to make them identical with the corporate limits of the City of Columbus for this annexation. The petition will be filed in accordance with Section 503.07 of the Ohio Revised Code.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Provision of municipal services does represent cost to the City; however, the annexation of land also has the potential to create revenue to the City.

To accept the application (AN22-022) of Jon-David Charlton and Jodi M. Charlton et.al. for the annexation of certain territory containing 32.99± acres in Blendon Township.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Blendon Township was filed on behalf of Jon-David Charlton and Jodi M. Charlton et.al. on February 21, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the petition was considered and approved by the Franklin County Board of Commissioners at a hearing on March 7, 2023; and

WHEREAS, on March 28, 2023, the City Clerk received from Franklin County a certified copy of the resolution addressing the petition; and

WHEREAS, sixty days have now elapsed since receipt of the resolution in accordance with the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the city of Columbus to accept the annexation of the territory addressed by the petition; and,

WHEREAS, the annexation agreement between Blendon Township and the City of Columbus requires the City to transfer territory annexed from Blendon Township to the city of Columbus and to conform the boundaries of Montgomery Township to make them identical with the corporate limits of the city; NOW, THEREFORE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the annexation proposed by Jon-David Charlton and Jodi M. Charlton et.al. in a petition filed with the Franklin County Board of Commissioners on February 21, 2023 and subsequently approved by the Board on March 7, 2023 is hereby accepted and said territory is hereby annexed to the city of Columbus. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 503.07 of the Ohio Revised Code the Director of the Department of Development be and is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the City of Columbus to present to the Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, a petition requesting such changes in and extensions of the boundary lines of Montgomery Township as may be necessary so that said township may include therein that portion of Blendon Township, which by the order of the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, on August 23, 2022 was approved for annexation to the city of Columbus, so as to make the boundaries of Montgomery Township co-extensive with the corporate limits of the said city of Columbus in accordance with the maps attached to said petition.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Service to enter into contract with Complete General Construction Company for the Intersection - Cleveland Avenue - 5th Avenue to Lehner Road project and to provide payment for construction, construction administration and inspection services.

This project consists of pedestrian improvements at seven intersections along Cleveland Avenue: Camden Avenue, E. 19th Avenue, Kenmore Road, Republic Avenue, Lakeview Avenue, Agler Road and Lehner Road. Improvements consist of the installation of enhanced crosswalk markings, the installation of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons or Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons at each intersection, and the replacement of non-ADA compliant curb ramps. Minimal pavement resurfacing is required where enhanced crosswalks are being installed, small amounts of additional traffic control is included, and other work as may be necessary to complete the contract in accordance with the plans and specifications set forth in the Bid Submittal Documents.

The estimated Notice to Proceed date is July 24, 2023. The project was let by the Office of Support Services through Vendor Services and Bid Express. Two bids were received on May 4, 2023, (both majority) and tabulated as follows:

4. FISCAL IMPACT

This ordinance is authorizing funding in the amount of \$25,000,000.00 for funding construction, utilities and related costs in addition to City Construction Inspection costs associated with the IR70 and IR71 corridor in Downtown Columbus project.

There are additional phases planned for this project which will need funding. Funding needs in excess of the amount encumbered with this ordinance for the current project phases and for future phases of the project will be submitted for Council consideration with future ordinances.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this project is available and appropriated in the Streets and Highways Bond Fund, Fund 7704, in an amount of up to \$25,000,000.00.

3. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION

Emergency action is requested to complete utility work and inspection prior to ODOT's required funding date and in order to adhere to ODOT's planned project schedule to promote highway safety.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to expend up to \$25,000,000.00 from the Streets and Highways Bond Fund for the Roadway Improvements - I-70/71 South and East Freeway project; and to declare an emergency. (\$25,000,000.00)

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Transportation proposes to construct various improvements to IR70/IR71 eastbound and westbound between 4th Street and Miller Avenue as part of Roadway Improvements - I-70/71 South and East Freeways project; and

Rezoning Amendment: Z08-040A

Ordinance #1714-2008, passed December 8, 2008 (Z08-040), rezoned 2.69± acres at 1041-1101 Bethel Road from CPD, Commercial Planned Development District to CPD, Commercial Planned Development District to permit 6,400 square feet of eating and drinking establishment space within the existing shopping center. This ordinance amends the permitted uses and CPD plan to permit a 1,540 square foot outdoor patio for accessory eating and drinking purposes. The remaining development standards from Ordinance #1714-2008 remain unchanged.

WHEREAS, Ordinance #1714-2008, passed December 8, 2008 (Z08-040), rezoned 2.69± acres at 1041-1101 BETHEL RD. (43220), from CPD, Commercial Planned Development District to the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District to permit eating and drinking establishment uses; and

WHEREAS, that rezoning established specific development standards addressing setbacks, traffic access, parking, landscaping, building design, and lighting commitments in the CPD text in accordance with a registered CPD plan; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant proposes to modify the CPD text and site plan to permit a 1,540 square foot outdoor patio for accessory eating and drinking purposes; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend Section 3 of Ordinance #1714-2008, passed December 8, 2008 (Z08-040) to revise the CPD text and site plan to permit a 1,540 square foot outdoor patio for accessory eating and drinking purposes; and

WHEREAS, all other aspects of Ordinance #1714-2008 are unaffected by this amendment and remain in effect, and are repeated below for clarity; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the Official Zoning Map of the City of Columbus, as adopted by Ordinance #0179 -03, passed February 24, 2003, and as subsequently amended, is hereby revised by changing the zoning of the property as follows:

1041-1101 BETHEL RD. (43220), being 2.69± acres located at the southwest corner of Bethel Road and Kenny Road, and being more particularly described as follows:

Situated in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin, and City of Columbus, being located within that 2.9011-acre tract as described in a deed to Bethel-Kenny Center, LLC, of record in Instrument No. 200402020022909, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northwesterly corner of said 2.9011-acre tract and in the southerly right-of-way line of Bethel Road, located South 89°58'38" West, a distance of 493.46 feet and South 00°09'00' East, a distance of 60.00 feet from the centerline intersection of Bethel Road with Kenny Road;

Thence North 89°58'38" East, along said southerly right-of-way line, a distance of 351.20 feet to an angle point;

South 45°01'22" East, a distance of 42.43 feet to a point in the westerly right-of-way line of Bethel Road;

I. Introduction:

The property owner requests an amendment to the existing CPD district to allow for the installation of a restaurant patio and two walk-in freezers.

The +/- 2.69 acre site is developed with a 30,485 sq. ft. shopping center and is zoned CPD. The site was originally zoned CPD in 1992 (Z92-040) to allow development of the property with a shopping center and

rezoned CPD in 2008 (Z08-040) to remove the restaurant prohibition and allow up to 6,400 square feet of restaurant use. This 2008 rezoning also updated provisions of the underlying CPD for use restrictions, landscaping, screening, lighting, and graphics control.

The site is located within the planning area of The Northwest Plan (2016). The Plan recommends Mixed Use 2 uses for this site. This is a commercial classification with residential uses supported. Development may include a mix of uses on one site (for example, residential units located either above and/or next to the commercial uses), or it may include only one use per site. The designation does not require a mix of uses, but instead promotes mixed use development where it is a viable development scenario.

To the north is a swim club in the R-1, Residential District and a restaurant in the C-4 Commercial District. To the east across Kenny Road is a mix of industrial and residential uses in the M-1, Manufacturing District. To the south are single-family dwellings in the SR, Suburban Residential District and a two-family dwelling in the R2F, residential District. To the west is a medical office in the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District.

The Applicant proposes installation of a 1,540 square foot restaurant patio on the east side of the building. The patio may be converted from covered to uncovered. The Applicant also proposes the installation of an 8'X12' walk-in freezer for retail use on the west side of the building and a 10'X10' walk-in freezer for restaurant use on the east side of the building. The walk-in freezer for restaurant use is included within the maximum allowed 6,400 square foot of restaurant use.

II. Permitted Uses:

A. Those uses permitted within Section 3356.03, C-4, Permitted Uses, of the Columbus City Code shall be permitted. Except, the following uses are prohibited:

Billboards and off premise signage

Motorcycle, boat and other motor vehicle sales, leasing and rental or service/repair uses

Community food pantry

Hotel or motel

Missions/Temporary Shelters/halfway house

Check cashing and loans

Outdoor power equipment stores

Pawn broker

Truck, utility trailer and RV sales, rental and leasing

Funeral parlor

Garden, landscaping and nursery centers and sales

Limousine and taxi service

Movie theaters

Animal shelter

Bowling alley

Farm equipment and supply stores

Cabaret, dance hall

Nightclub or discotheque

Poolroom or arcade, amusement arcade

Laboratory

Blood and organ banks

Tire repair or sales shop

Carpet and upholstery cleaning services Vending machine operators

III. Development Standards: Unless otherwise indicated in this Text or on the submitted development plan ("CPD Site Plan"), the applicable development standards are contained in Chapter 3356, C-4 Commercial District of the Columbus City Code shall apply.

A. Density, Height, Lot and/or Setback Commitments:

- 1. Building and parking setbacks shall be as depicted on the CPD Plan.
- 2. There shall be a maximum of 6,400 square feet of restaurant use and 1,540 square feet of restaurant patio use.
- B. Access, Loading, Parking, and/or other Traffic Related Commitments:
- 1. All circulation, curb cuts, and access points shall be as depicted on the CPD Plan.
- 2. The minimum number of required parking spaces for the entire site shall be 126.
- 3. The speed humps installed along the service drive along the west and south property lines shall be maintained.
- C. Buffering, Landscaping, Open Space and/or Screening Commitments:

The developer shall maintain the existing landscaping and fencing as shown on the CPD Plan.

- D. Building, Design, and/or Interior-Exterior Treatment Commitments:
- 1. All sides of the building shall be finished with brick.
- 2. The building roof shall have a pitch.
- E. <u>Dumpsters</u>, Lighting, Outdoor Areas, and/or other Environmental Commitments:
- 1. The trash dumpster located at the northwest corner of the site as shown on the site plan shall continue to be screened from the north and west by a brick or masonry wall of not less than seven (7) feet in height measured from the grade of the dumpster.
- 2. All light poles and standards shall be in dark brown, bronze or black.
- 3. All external outdoor lighting fixtures to be used shall be from the same or similar manufacturer's type to insure compatibility.
- 4. Outdoor displays in front of a store shall be limited in area so that there is at least a five foot wide sidewalk adjacent to the outdoor displays. No outdoor display or sales area shall be permitted in the parking lot.
- 5. Lighting for patio shall be shielded.

F. Graphic and Signage Commitments:

All graphics shall conform to Article 15 of the Columbus Graphics Code, as it applies to the C-4, Commercial District. Any variance to applicable sign standards shall be submitted to the Columbus Graphics Commission.

G. CPD Criteria:

- 1. Natural Environment. The Site is developed with a 30,485 square foot shopping center and surface parking lot. There are no natural features.
- 2. Existing Land Use. The property is zoned CPD and used for retail and restaurant uses.
- 3. Transportation and Circulation. All circulation, curb cuts, and access points are existing, as depicted on the CPD Plan.
- 4. Visual Form of the Environment. The visual form of the Site has been established with the construction of the shopping center.
- 5. View and Visibility. The Site is visible from Bethel Road and Kenny Road.
- 6. Proposed Development. The Applicant proposes installation of a 1,540 square foot restaurant patio on the east side of the building. The patio may be converted from covered to uncovered.
- 7. Behavior Patterns. The site is along the Bethel Road commercial corridor.
- 8. Emission. No adverse effect from emissions shall result from the proposed development.

H. Modification of Code Standards:

- 1. Section 3356.11. Building setback line. This section shall be modified to reduce the minimum building setback line from Kenny Road from 30 feet to 12 feet.
- 2. Section 3312.27 Parking setback line. This section shall be modified to reduce the minimum parking setback from Kenny Road from 10 feet to 1 foot. This is an existing parking setback reduction (Z08-040).
- 3. Section 3312.09 Drive aisle. This section shall be modified to reduce the drive aisle on the west side of the building from 20 feet to 17 feet. This modification is requested to legitimize an existing condition.
- 4. Section 3312.21 Parking lot interior landscaping. This section shall be modified to waive the interior parking lot tree landscaping requirement. This modification is requested to legitimize an existing condition.
- 5. Section 3312.49, Minimum number of required parking spaces. This section shall be modified to reduce the minimum number of required parking spaces for the entire site from 185 to 126. This calculation is based on the most intense possible uses of 24,085 square feet of retail use (1:275), 6,400 square feet of restaurant without pickup use (1:75), and 1,540 square feet of restaurant patio use (1:150). The proposed restaurant patio and walk-in freezer adds 4 parking spaces to the existing parking demand. This modification is in general conformance with the existing parking reduction from 182 to 128 (Z08-040).
- 6. 3312.51.2 Loading space. The section shall be modified to allow a loading space within a drive aisle. This

modification is requested to legitimize an existing condition.

I. Miscellaneous Commitments:

- 1. The site shall be developed in accordance with the submitted site plan titled "CPD Plan," excluding floor plans. The Site Plan may be slightly adjusted to reflect engineering, topographical or other site data developed at the time that development and engineering plans are completed. Any slight adjustment to the Site Plan shall be reviewed and may be approved by the Director of the Department of Building and Zoning Services, or a designee, upon submission of the appropriate data regarding the proposed adjustment.
- 2. The applicant shall dedicate right-of-way along the southeast corner of the property in order to provide a right-of-way equal to 30 feet from the centerline of Kenny Road.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BACKGROUND

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to modify loan documents for Harry L. Macklin, Jr. (dba Accurate Auto Center) that were used for the purpose of purchasing the real property located at 1710, 1714, 1726, and 1728 East Main Street, Columbus, Ohio 43205 which is located in the Main Street Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization corridor.

The owner, Harry L. Macklin, is in the process of selling the aforementioned properties on Main Street. The City's Business Development Loan, in the amount of \$100,000 was awarded in 1998 to Accurate Auto Center. The current principal balance and interest is a total of \$199,492.75 as of April 24, 2023. A modification is requested to forgive the interest totaling \$105,881.91 as of April 24, 2023. The current principal balance of \$93,610.84 will be paid by Accurate Auto Center upon the sale of the stated properties.

Accurate Auto Center was also awarded a Working Capital Loan used to meet short term payroll needs in the amount of \$30,000.00 in April, 1999. The current principal and interest is \$27,062.71 as of April 24, 2023. A modification is requested to forgive the interest amount of \$14,183.26 as of April 24, 2023. The current principal balance of \$12,879.45 will be paid upon sale of the stated property.

The Business Development Loan and Working Capital Loan were secured by mortgages recorded as Instrument Numbers 199804030079885 and 199804030079887, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio.

Due to ongoing losses, Accurate Auto Center filed a chapter 7 bankruptcy on July 30, 2012 and the bankruptcy was terminated on August 15, 2013. The chapter 7 bankruptcy, however, did not include the above referenced properties on Main Street.

The above referenced properties were used as security for the Business Development Loan and Working Capital Loan.

Emergency action is requested to allow Harry Macklin to proceed with the real estate closing of the stated

properties, which is planned for May or June of 2023, and to allow reimbursement of the principal of the Business Development Loan and Working Capital Loan as well as forgive the interest on the Business Development Loan and the Working Capital Loan.

WHEREAS, the current principal balance is \$12,879.45 and the interest is \$14,183.26 as of April 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, a modification is requested to forgive the interest of \$14,183.26 as of April 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the current principal balance of the Business Development Loan of \$93,610.84, and the current principal balance of the Working Capital Loan, of \$12, 879.45, will be paid upon the sale of the above referenced properties; and

The principal amounts of those loans will be paid and satisfied upon the sale of the properties located at 1710, 1714, 1726, and 1728 East Main Street.

SECTION 2: For the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

PROPOSED USE: Outdoor automobile storage.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The 227.54± acre site consists of a single parcel which has been historically operated as a sand and gravel quarry in the EQ, Excavation and Quarrying District. The mining, excavating, and quarrying operations include ancillary manufacturing uses, including but not limited to outdoor storage and office and warehouse structures. The site was part of the 1956 annexation of Merion Village into the City of Columbus, and as a result of the annexation, the EQ District was also established in 1956. Ordinance #1037-2008 (CV08-013), passed July 23, 2008 permitted the establishment of the City of Columbus' Impound Lot at this location. The requested Council variance will legitimize the automobile storage use for a nearby automotive auction and other businesses in addition to the excavation and impound lot uses.

Portable trailer/buildings are already in use on site, permitted via Special Permit #BZA21-024. Variances to driveway width, dumpster area, lighting, landscaping and screening, maintenance, maneuvering, parking

setback line, parking space, striping and marking, access and circulation, required surface for parking, wheel stop device, minimum parking spaces, loading space dumpster area, and required conditions are included in this request. The site is within the boundaries of the *Scioto Southland Plan* (2007), which recommends "Park" land uses at this location once the quarrying operations become obsolete and "Light Manufacturing" uses. Additionally, the Plan includes adoption of the *Columbus Citywide Planning Policies* (C2P2) Design Guidelines (2018). Staff notes that the proposed use is an expansion of a similar existing use, and the Plan notes that the "Park" recommendation should only be applicable once quarry-related activity has ended on the site. Additionally, the reduced development standards reflect existing conditions of the site, and are therefore supportable by Staff. This ordinance is conditioned on the outdoor storage use occurring within the "inner-side" of Impound Lot Road (south and west of the existing private street).

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3369.02, Permitted uses; 3312.13, Driveway; 3312.15, Dumpster area; 3312.19, Lighting; 3312.21, Landscaping and screening; 3312.23, Maintenance; 3312.25, Maneuvering; 3312.27, Parking setback line; 3312.29, Parking space; 3312.39, Striping and marking; 3312.41, Access and circulation; 3312.43, Required surface for parking; 3312.45, Wheel stop device; 3312.49, Minimum numbers of parking spaces required; 3312.51, Loading space; 3321.01, Dumpster area; and 3369.04, Required conditions, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **399 HAUL RD. (43207)**, to permit outdoor automobile storage with reduced development standards in the EQ, Excavation and Quarrying District (Council Variance #CV21-027).

WHEREAS, by application #CV21-027, the owner of property at **399 HAUL RD. (43207)**, requests a Council variance to permit outdoor automobile storage with reduced development standards in the EQ, Excavation and Quarrying District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3369.02, Permitted uses, permits only those uses associated with farming, excavation, quarrying, and solar energy collections, while the applicant proposes outdoor automobile storage and miscellaneous non-objectionable manufacturing uses as listed in Section 3363.08; and

WHEREAS, Section 3369.02, Permitted uses, prohibits impound lots, outside storage, offices and warehouses, while the applicant proposes to allow a miscellaneous non-objectionable use, Section 3363.08, and outdoor storage; and (see above)

WHEREAS, Section 3312.13, Driveway, requires that a commercial driveway be at least twenty feet wide, while the applicant proposes to allow for driveway widths less than twenty feet; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.15, Dumpster area, requires that dumpsters shall comply with the provisions of general site development standards chapter, while the applicant proposes to eliminate these requirements as the dumpster will be moved regularly due to capacity and seasonality of the business; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.19, Lighting, requires that lighting shall comply with the provisions of the general site development standards chapter, while the applicant proposes to eliminate these requirements as the lighting will be moved regularly due to capacity and seasonality of the business; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.21, Landscaping and screening, requires landscaping to be provided both inside and on the perimeter of a parking lot, while the applicant proposes to maintain no interior or perimeter landscaping or screening; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.23, Maintenance, requires that the owner or operator of property used for parking, circulation and loading shall maintain such area in good condition so that it is safe, clean, dust-free, and free of

any hazard, nuisance or other unsafe condition; striping for parking spaces shall be maintained in good condition, while the applicant proposes to waive these requirements, and;

WHEREAS, 3312.25, Maneuvering, requires that every parking and loading space shall have sufficient access and maneuvering area, while the applicant proposes to eliminate designated drive aisles, and;

WHEREAS, Section 3312.27, Parking setback line, requires a minimum 25 foot parking setback line from a street right-of-way, while the applicant proposes to maintain a 0 foot parking setback line from the east and north sides and within the "inner-side" of Impound Lot Road; and

WHEREAS, 3312.29, Parking Space, requires that a parking space shall be a rectangular area of not less than nine feet by 18 feet, while the applicant proposes to eliminate these requirements, and;

WHEREAS, Section 3312.39, Striping and marking, requires parking spaces to be striped, while the applicant proposes to maintain no striping or marking; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.41, Access and circulation, requires pedestrian sidewalks or striped crosswalks to be provided from buildings to public sidewalk systems, while the applicant proposes to maintain a gravel parking area with no pedestrian sidewalks or striped crosswalks; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.43, Required surface for parking, requires the surface of any parking area to be improved with Portland cement, asphaltic concrete, or other approved hard surface, while the applicant proposes a gravel parking area with no hard surface; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.45, Wheel stop device, requires parking spaces to have wheel stop devices, while the applicant proposes to maintain no devices within the existing parking lot; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.49, Minimum numbers of parking spaces required, requires 1 parking space per 450 square feet of general office space and bicycle parking, while the applicant proposes to provide 0 parking spaces for the trailer and to eliminate the bicycle parking requirements; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.51, Loading space, requires loading spaces to have a minimum clearance height of not less than 15 feet and shall have minimum dimensions of not less than 12 feet in width and 50 feet in length, exclusive of any driveway, aisle, or other circulation area, while the applicant proposes to eliminate dimensions and set locations for loading spaces; and

WHEREAS, Section 3321.01, Dumpster area, requires that a dumpster shall be in a designated area that does not interfere with any aisle, driveway, parking space, loading space or other circulation area and be screened from view on all sides, while the applicant proposes to eliminate these requirements as the dumpster will be moved regularly due to capacity and seasonality of the business; and

WHEREAS, Section 3369.04, Required conditions, requires that development plans shall be submitted to and approved by the Development Commission for planned industrial (or other) uses and their necessary municipal and utility services, while the applicant proposes to waive this requirement as the areas of use change due to capacity and seasonality of the business; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments recommend approval because the requested variances are compatible with the existing uses on site and reflect existing conditions; and

COLUMBUS SOUTH SIDE AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The site consists of one parcel developed with an automotive repair shop in the C-4, Commercial District, and is subject to the Parsons Avenue Urban Commercial Overlay (UCO). The requested Council variance will permit two 8 feet by 20 feet shipping containers to be used for accessory storage. A Council variance is required because storage is not a permitted use in the C-4 district. A variance to reduce the parking setback is also included with this request. The site is within the boundaries of the *Near Southside Plan* (2011), which recommends "Mixed-Use (Neighborhood)" land uses at this location, and includes the early adoption of the *Columbus Citywide Planning Policies* (C2P2) Design Guidelines (2018). While the Plan does not address shipping containers as a storage use, Staff are supportive as the proposal will provide accessory storage that is located behind the existing commercial structure, away from the primary frontage along Parsons Avenue, and does not represent the introduction of an incompatible use.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3356.03, C-4 permitted uses; and 3372.604, Setback requirements, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **1048 PARSONS AVE. (43206)**, to permit accessory storage with a reduced parking setback in the C-4, Commercial District (Council Variance #CV23-002).

WHEREAS, by application #CV23-003, the owner of property at **1048 PARSONS AVE. (43206)**, is requesting a Council variance to permit accessory storage with a reduced parking setback in the C-4, Commercial District; and

Columbus Public Health has been awarded a grant from the Ohio Department of Health. This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate a total of \$25,000.00 in grant money to fund the Enhanced Gonococcal Isolate Surveillance Project (eGISP) Grant Program, from the period of May 15, 2023 through June 30 2023. Through increased laboratory and surveillance capacity, participation in the eGISP program will permit Columbus Public Health (CPH) to increase our detection of antibiotic-resistant N.gonorrhoeae in our community. This program is part of the federal government's "National Strategy for Combating

Antibiotic-Resistant Bacteria". Examination of samples from gonorrhea-infected clients seeking screening for sexually transmitted diseases in the CPH Sexual Health and Wellness Center will be sent to the CDC for antibiotic susceptibility testing. Results are combined with other geographical sites across the US to create profile and measures to combat antibiotic resistant gonorrhea. The results are also shared with surveillance and clinical experts at CPH, to make local decisions regarding patient treatment.

Emergency action is required to ensure the continued operation of the eGISP grant program and to allow CPH to additional analysis of eGISP variables, this analysis is a requirement from grantor.

FISCAL IMPACT: The eGISP Grant Program is entirely funded by the Ohio Department of Health.

To authorize and direct the Board of Health to accept a grant from the Ohio Department of Health to fund the Enhanced Gonococcal Isolate Surveillance Project (eGISP) grant program; to authorize the appropriation of \$25,000.00 from the unappropriated balance of the Health Department grant fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$25,000.00)

WHEREAS, \$25,000.00 in grant funds have been made available through the Ohio Department of Health for the eGISP Grant Program, for the period of May 15, 2023 through June 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to accept and appropriate these funds from the Ohio Department of Health for the support of the eGISP Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, it necessary to allow the City Auditor to transfer appropriations between object classes for the eGISP grant programs needed upon the request by the Columbus Public Health Department; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is submitted as an emergency so as to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the city's accounting system as soon as possible; and to allow program to meet deliverables required from grantor. Up to date financial posting promotes accurate accounting and financial management; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Health Department in that it is immediately necessary to accept these grant funds from the Ohio Department and to appropriate these fund to the Health Department to ensure the immediate delivery of essential eGisp services, all for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, poverty, safety, and welfare; NOW, THEREFORE,

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary to issue a note in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, in the amount of \$382,000.00 to provide for the payment of a portion of the costs of the street lighting project described below; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the Department of Public Utilities in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the issuance of a note in order to fund the resident portion of the street lighting project described below, which will allow the Department of Public Utilities to enter into contract(s) for and begin such improvements at the earliest possible time during the summer season, for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health or safety; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. It is hereby declared necessary to issue bonds of the City of Columbus, Ohio (the "City") in the principal sum of \$382,000 (the "Bonds") in anticipation of the levy and collection of special assessments for the purpose of providing funds to pay the costs of installing decorative street lighting utilizing light-emitting diode (LED) street lighting technology and underground wiring for the Freeway/Kingshill area, which includes the area bounded by Morse Road, Interstate 71, Karl Road, and Woodward Park/Woodward Nature Preserve, by installing poles, fixtures, power cable and conduit, constructing control facilities and doing such other things as may be necessary in the City.

Section 2. The Bonds shall be of the denomination of \$1,000 or any integral multiple thereof, shall be dated on or before the maturity date of the Note hereinafter provided for and issued in anticipation of the issuance of such Bonds, shall bear interest at a rate presently estimated to be six per centum (6.00%) per annum, payable semiannually or annually as determined at the time of issuance of the Bonds, until the principal sum is paid and shall mature in ten (10) annual installments after their issuance.

Section 3. It is necessary to issue and this Council hereby determines that a note (the "Note") in the principal amount of \$382,000 shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and collection of said special assessments and in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds for the purpose set forth above.

Section 4. After said improvements are completed and the costs thereof ascertained, Council shall by ordinance assess upon the benefited property, in the manner provided in the legislation referring to said improvements and heretofore adopted by this Council, the entire cost and expense thereof, except the portion to be paid by the City in accordance with the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code and Section 178 of the City Charter, and shall authorize the issuance of the Bonds under the provisions of Section 133.30 of the Ohio Revised Code and Section 189 of the City Charter.

All assessments collected for the improvements and the unexpended balances remaining in the special improvement fund after the cost and expense of the improvements have been paid, shall be applied to the payment of principal of and interest on the Note, and then to the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds.

Said tax shall be and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and shall be collected by the same officer, in the same manner, and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. Funds derived from said levies hereby required shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which, together with interest collected on the same shall be irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal and interest on the Note or the Bonds when and as the same fall due; provided, however, that in each year to the extent that funds from the collection of the special assessments referred to in Section 1 hereof or other sources are lawfully available for the payment of the Note and Bonds, and are appropriated for such purpose, the amount of such tax shall be reduced by the amount of such funds so available and appropriated.

Section 6. The Note shall be the full general obligation of the City and the full faith, credit and revenue of the City are hereby pledged for the prompt payment of the same. The par value to be received from the sale of the Bonds and any excess funds resulting from the issuance of the Note shall, to the extent necessary, be used only for the retirement of the Note at maturity, together with interest thereon, and is hereby pledged for such purpose.

Section 7. The Note shall be designated "City of Columbus, Ohio Freeway/Kingshill Street Lighting Assessment Note, 02-2023 (Federally Taxable)."

Section 8. The Note shall be issued only as one fully registered note, in the denomination of \$382,000; shall be numbered R-1; shall mature within one year of its date of issuance; and shall bear interest payable at maturity at such rate per annum, which rate shall not exceed six per centum (6.00%) per annum, as shall be determined by the City Auditor and certified to this Council as the fair market rate for such Notes. The Note shall be subject to redemption, at a redemption price equal to the par amount redeemed, at the option of the City at any time prior to maturity upon one day's prior written notice to the Note Registrar (as defined in Section 10 hereof).

Section 9. The Note shall set forth the purposes for which it is issued and

state that it is issued pursuant to this Ordinance; and shall be executed by the Mayor and the City Auditor of the City, in their official capacities, provided that either of those signatures may be a facsimile. The Note shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose or be entitled to any security or benefit under this Ordinance unless and until a certificate of authentication, as printed on the Note, is signed by the Note Registrar as authenticating agent. Authentication by the Note Registrar shall be conclusive evidence that the Note so authenticated has been duly issued and delivered under this Ordinance and is entitled to the security and benefit of this Ordinance.

The principal of and interest on the Note shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America without deduction for the services of the Note Registrar as paying agent. The principal of and interest on the Note shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of the Note at its maturity at the principal office of the Note Registrar.

Section 10. The City Auditor is hereby appointed to act as the authenticating agent, note registrar, transfer agent and paying agent (collectively, the "Note Registrar") for the Note. So long as the Note remains outstanding, the City will cause to be maintained and kept by the Note Registrar, at the principal office of the Note Registrar, all books and records necessary for the registration, exchange and transfer of the Note as provided in this Section (the "Note Register"). The person in whose name the Note shall be registered on the Note Register shall be regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes. Payment of or on account of the principal of and interest on the Note shall be made only to or upon the order of that person. Neither the City nor the Note Registrar shall be affected by any notice to the contrary, but the registration may be changed as herein provided. All payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon the Note, including the interest thereon, to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

The Note may be transferred only on the Note Register upon presentation and surrender thereof at the principal office of the Note Registrar, together with an assignment executed by the registered owner or by a person authorized by the owner to do so by a power of attorney in a form satisfactory to the Note Registrar. Upon that transfer, the Note Registrar shall complete, authenticate and deliver a new Note in the principal amount equal to the principal amount of the Note surrendered and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date.

The City and the Note Registrar shall not be required to transfer or exchange the Note for a period of fifteen (15) days next preceding the date of its maturity.

In all cases in which the Note is exchanged or transferred hereunder, the City shall cause to be executed and the Note Registrar shall authenticate and deliver a new Note in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance. The exchange or transfer shall be without charge to the owner; except that the City and Note Registrar may make a charge sufficient to reimburse them for any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer. The City or the Note Registrar may require that those charges, if any, be paid before either begins the procedure for the transfer of the Note. The Note issued upon any transfer or exchange shall be the valid obligation of the City, evidencing the same debt, and entitled to the same benefits under this Ordinance, as the Note surrendered upon that transfer.

Section 11. The Note shall be sold to the City's Treasury Investment Board (the "Original Purchaser") at a purchase price equal to 100% of the principal amount thereof plus interest accrued, if any, to the date of delivery of the Note to the Original Purchaser.

The proceeds from the sale of the Note, except accrued interest or costs of issuance, allocable to

the Note, shall be deposited in the City Treasury and applied to the payment of the costs of the project described in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Any accrued interest or premium received from such sale shall be deposited in the City Treasury and shall be credited to the proper Bond Retirement Fund to be applied to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Note in the manner provided by law. Said proceeds are hereby appropriated for such purposes.

All moneys necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance are hereby deemed appropriated and authorized for expenditure by the City Auditor.

Section 12. The Mayor, City Auditor, the Director of Finance and Management, and Clerk of Council, or any of them individually, are hereby authorized and directed to take such action and to execute and deliver, on behalf of this Council, such additional instruments, agreements, certificates, and other documents as may be in their discretion necessary or appropriate in order to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. Such documents shall be in a form not substantially inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance, as the Mayor, City Auditor, the Director of Finance and Management, and Clerk of Council, or any of them individually, in their discretion shall deem necessary or appropriate.

Section 13. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 14. It is hereby found and determined that all acts, conditions and things necessary to be done precedent to and in the issuing of the Note in order to make the Note the legal, valid and binding obligation of the City have happened, been done and been performed in regular and due form as required by law; that the full faith, credit and revenue of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged for the prompt payment of the principal and interest thereof at maturity; and that no limitation of indebtedness or taxation, either statutory or constitutional, has been exceeded in issuing the Note.

Section 15. The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the County Auditors of Franklin, Fairfield, and Delaware Counties, Ohio.

Section 16. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, and in accordance with Sections 22 and 44-1(b) of the Charter of the City of Columbus, Ohio, this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten (10) days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

This \$90,000.00 total for TAPS will allow for funding ongoing expenses for the program to allow the Division of Police to continue offering these services.

FISCAL IMPACT: Total appropriation is \$90,000.00 and is available in the 2023 budget.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: Emergency action is requested in order to fund ongoing expenses to avoid any interruption in the summer program.

The purpose of this ordinance is to repeal Ordinance 1595-2023, ordaining Executive Order 2023-01 of the Mayor, which limited the hours of operations for mobile food vending during a period of enhanced safety operations in the Short North.

To repeal ordinance 1595-2023, pertaining to Executive Order 2023-01 of the Mayor prohibiting mobile food vending operations in the Short North after 11:59 pm on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday evenings; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, Chapter 573 of the Columbus City Codes, as recently amended by Ordinance No. 1730-2023, establishes regulations and licensing requirements for mobile food vending operations within the City; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 573 establishes and defines Congestions Zones as a geographic area that has a combination of public right of way parking limitations, meter restrictions, vehicular traffic patterns, pedestrian density, and mobility issues, such that unrestricted access for mobile food vending constitutes a threat to public health and safety and authorizes the Director of Public Safety to create, designate, alter, or eliminate Congestion Zones; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 573, areas in the Short North neighborhood, as defined by the Victorian Village Commission and the Italian Village Commission, have been designated as a Congestion Zone; and

WHEREAS, it had been observed that the presence of mobile food vending operations within the Short North had increased motor vehicle and pedestrian congestion and caused large gatherings of people, most especially in the hours after 11:59 pm on weekends, increasing the potential threat to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the Short North neighborhood experienced actual incidents of violence including a fatal shooting on May 14, 2023 and two separate shooting incidents eight days prior, resulting in 10 people wounded and 11 firearms recovered; and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 2023, the Mayor, through Executive Order 2023-01, ordered the limiting of the time, place, and location of mobile food vending operations; and

WHEREAS, Council ordained the provisions of said order on May 22, 2023; and

WHEREAS, in the ensuing three weekends, the City conducted enhanced safety operations in the Short North, including increasing law enforcement presence, limiting parking, relieving pedestrian congestion, and other actions to prevent violence in the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, these enhanced safety operations have resulted in a decrease in the threats to public health and safety such as to necessitate the immediate repeal of Ordinance 1595-2023; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Executive Order states that it shall remain in effect until superseded by subsequent ordinance of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, that for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, or safety, and for the reasons stated in the preamble hereof, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect upon signature by the Mayor; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That Council incorporates herein by reference the provisions of the recitals and finds the threats to public health and safety that resulted in passage of Ordinance 1595-2023 to have been mitigated by recent enhanced safety operations.

SECTION 2. That for the reasons provided in Section 1, Ordinance 1595-2023 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That it is the intention of the Council that this Ordinance supersede Executive Order 2023-01 as provided for in the Order.

SECTION 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

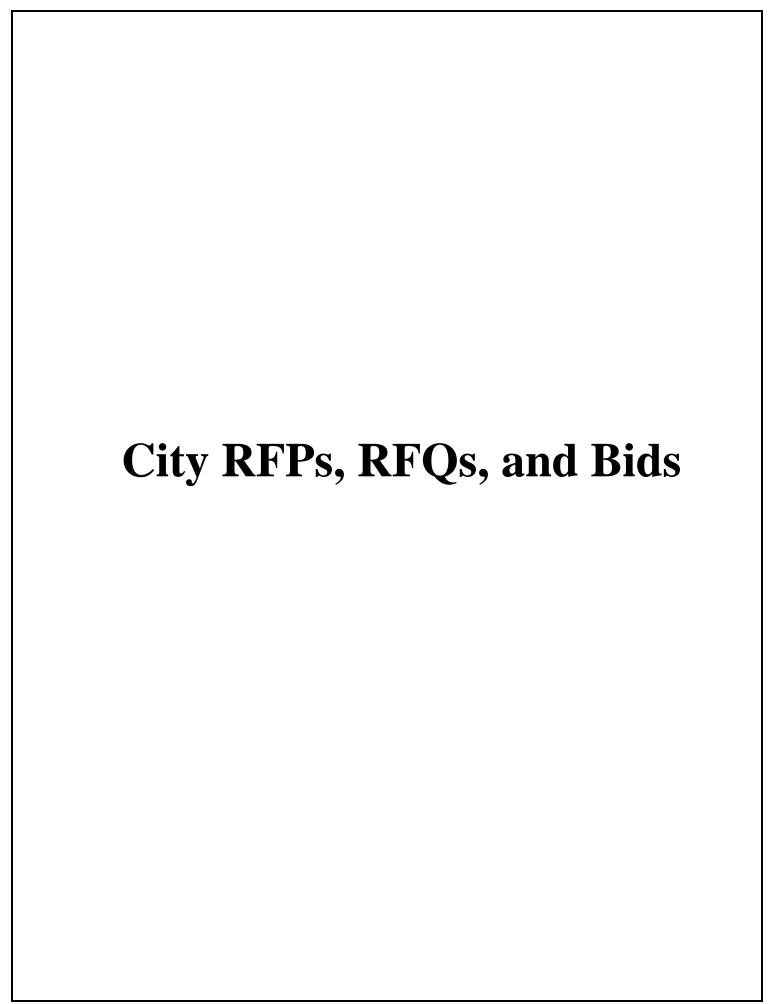
