
SIGNING OF LEGISLATION



BACKGROUND

In November of 2021, The Association of Prosecuting Attorneys, in partnership with Yale Law School's Justice Collaboratory and LaGratta Consulting selected the Columbus City Attorney's Office as a pilot site for their Elevating Trust and Legitimacy for Prosecutors Project. The goal of the Elevating Trust initiative is to create a model for prosecutors' offices across the country that builds on the premise that these offices belong to the community, rather than to any elected official or government employee.

Through the 24-month Elevating Trust project period, the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys team assessed how Columbus City Prosecutors interacted with the surrounding community then worked hand in hand with the Prosecution Unit to develop and implement evidence-based practices for increasing public safety and trust. Based on the lessons learned through assessment period and the public safety strategies identified, the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys is awarding the City Attorney's Prosecution Unit a small private grant to support activities identified under unit's Elevating Trust- Gun Safety strategy (\$5,500).

Association of Prosecuting Attorneys funds will support 1) food costs for two community impact panel discussions on gun safety, and 2) fees associated with sending twenty-four Columbus residents through certified firearm safety courses. The panel discussions will include representatives from Columbus Division of Police, Columbus Public Health's Care Coalition, The Ohio State University Star Program, community corrections, the faith community and local neighborhood associations to discuss gun violence, accidental gun deaths and the traumatic impacts that these types of incidents have on individuals and neighborhoods. Panelists will also discuss best-practices for safe gun handling and storage. These community conversations in tandem with firearm safety trainings will cultivate a deeper understanding of the impact of gun violence on communities (and families) and promote responsible gun ownership. These activities will also foster public trust and increase safety.

The Association of Prosecuting Attorneys is a national 501(c)(3) established in 2009. It is a professional association of elected and appointed prosecutors who are dedicated to leading nationwide training and technical assistance initiatives. The association also serves as a national clearinghouse for innovative and effective prosecutorial practices. This award and national recognition are true testaments to our City's commitment to engaging community in public safety solutions.

The City Attorney's Office requests authorization to set up an Elevating Trust Private Grant Fund; to accept the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys \$5,500 cash award; to appropriate \$5,500 within the Private Grant Fund; and to appropriate future awards/donations to the Private Grant Fund in support of Elevating Trust activities.

Emergency action is requested in order to immediately provide the funds necessary to cover costs associated with hosting the June Elevating Trust gun safety panel discussion.

Background: In April of 2021, the Columbus Recreation and Parks Commission voted in support of and Columbus City Council passed a resolution to support the Columbus Urban Forestry Master Plan (UFMP) and its immediate implementation. By authorizing the implementation of the Urban Forestry Master Plan, the Forestry Section of the Recreation and Parks Department can implement key recommendations through hiring staff, purchasing equipment, procuring tree service contracts, inventorying the City's street trees, designing a new facility for Forestry's North Zone, and engaging urban forestry consultants.

This ordinance is requesting the authorization of \$1,500,000.00 in voted bond funds and the authorization for the Director of Recreation and Parks to enter into various contracts relating to the Urban Forestry Master Plan. This ordinance will establish auditor's certificates and authorize expenditures in conjunction with the management of the UFMP. Contracts will be entered in compliance with the relevant provisions of Columbus City Code Chapter 329, however this legislation will set up all of the funding required to enter into contracts with vendors on an as-needed basis. All purchases will be through competitive bidding, through any current universal term contract, or through any current State of Ohio purchasing contract pre-approved by the City of Columbus Purchasing Office, per Ordinance No. 0582-87.

The staffing, supplies, services, and equipment needs that will be paid for as part of this funding request may include, but are not limited to, tree installation, hazardous tree removal, stump grinding, tree site preparation, urban forestry professional services, cellular service, office supplies, forestry supplies, uniforms, and safety equipment. All supply, service, and equipment needs related to the UFMP have been established as one overall capital improvement project. Each purchase order will be written separately based on all City of Columbus Codes that apply.

The Columbus Urban Forestry Master Plan is the first citywide strategic plan to invest long-term in Columbus' trees. Over the next decades, the UFMP will guide the entire Columbus Community to prioritize, preserve, and grow our tree canopy. Tree canopy refers to the part of a city that is shaded by trees. Canopy cover is the percentage of the city that is covered by trees when viewed from above, as opposed to other land cover like water, open green space, hard surfaces and bare soil. In Columbus, approximately 22% of the city is currently covered by trees.

Columbus faces many challenges today, and over the coming decades. Trees are part of the solution. Trees help reduce urban stressors by cleaning our air, providing shade, intercepting stormwater, and more. The benefits that urban trees provide is valued up to five times what it costs to maintain them. In Columbus, our trees provide approximately 38 million dollars in benefits each year. However, our tree canopy is vulnerable to threats from disease, pests, the changing climate, and increased development. Also, the City is expecting to grow by 1 million residents in the coming decades. To improve and sustain our residents' quality of life, we needed a strategic plan to invest in our trees.

We engaged residents across Columbus through five avenues, including an online survey, an open house, small-group presentations, interviews, and multiple meetings of two stakeholder groups. These two stakeholder groups were comprised of over 100 community leaders and City of Columbus Staff. The themes that emerged were used to develop the vision, goals, and actions of the Urban Forestry Master Plan. The vision of the Urban Forestry Master Plan is to prioritize, preserve, and grow the tree canopy in Columbus, equitably across neighborhoods, to improve the health and quality of life for all residents.

The Urban Forestry Master Plan has three goals. One is a long-term goal and the other two are short-term

goals. All are critical to achieving our vision for Columbus' urban forest. These goals are as follows:

Goal 1: Reach Citywide Tree Canopy Cover of 40% by 2050.

Goal 2: Stop the Net Tree Canopy Losses by 2030.

Goal 3: Invest in Equitable Tree Canopy Across All Neighborhoods by 2030.

To reach our goals, we will follow four strategies, including community coordination and collaboration; best practices, dedication of resources, and stronger policies.

Benefits to the Public: Trees provide tangible benefits to Columbus residents. As the 15th largest city in the nation, Columbus is home to over 900,000 people. Columbus had the 8th most intense urban heat island effect of major US cities, impacting health, energy use, and water quality. The recently published Columbus Climate Action Plan recommends planting trees as a solution. Street trees are the workhorses as they clean our air, reduce heat, and absorb stormwater. In an Ohio summer, trees provide the shade that makes walking outside bearable. Trees should be equitably distributed across the City so all residents benefit.

Community Input/Issues: Hundreds of stakeholders helped create the Urban Forestry Master Plan. Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to enter into contract with Kimley-Horn and Associates to provide architectural and engineering services for the Gender Road Park and McCoy Park Improvements Project. The contract amount is \$345,235.28, with a contingency of \$68,167.54, for a total of \$413,402.82 being authorized by this ordinance.

Gender Road Park and McCoy Park are two different park parcels owned by the Recreation and Parks Department that are currently undeveloped. Gender Road Park is a 32 acre undeveloped parkland in the City's South East Community. McCoy Park, along Harmon Avenue, is an underutilized greenspace of nearly 20 acres in the City's Southwest Community. This project will provide professional services to develop improvements for Gender Road Park and McCoy Park. The project will involve master planning, conceptual design, park programming, and public engagement.

For Gender Road Park, the consultant team will provide a report detailing the existing public recreational facilities in the surrounding three square mile area, conduct public engagement with the surrounding community, and conduct internal program discussions with staff to develop a high quality programming plan for the Recreation and Parks Department to utilize over the next decade of development as the design for this park is put together. The intent of this project for McCoy Park will be to develop a new master plan for the site, followed by a detailed design development plan that can begin implementation in 2024. The Columbus Recreation and Parks Department intends to develop a diverse and inclusive park layout that includes therapeutic recreation space capable of accommodating multiple outdoor sports opportunities, athletic fields, pickleball courts, a splash pad; family park amenities, parking improvements, and access improvements. This contract will be modified at a later date in 2023 to prepare detailed construction documents for construction anticipated to start in mid 2024.

Lineworkers construct and maintain electric poles, transformers, and lines. The Division of Power (DOP) has an active journeyman lineworker training program with another vendor, who, until AMP's program, was the sole company offering this training locally. AMP's program is offered in partnership with the Northwest Lineman College, which provides the books and curriculum. Of the two programs to offer the training locally, AMP's

program cost per attendee is the lowest cost option. Thus, it is in the best interest of the City to waive the provisions of competitive bidding and modify the Master Services Agreement with AMP to include journeyman lineworker safety and training.

The Division desires to have 18 employees enroll in the training. BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a not-for-profit service contract with Rev1 Ventures for the purpose of partnering in the Diversity Equity & Inclusion Grant Fund Program.

Rev1 Ventures, formerly known as TechColumbus, is a seed stage venture development organization that combines investment capital and strategic services to help entrepreneurs build products that people want and companies that succeed. Rev1 Ventures led a successful regional proposal to the State of Ohio to secure \$18.7 million for the Entrepreneurial Signature Program (ESP) which accelerates the creation and growth of new technology companies in Central Ohio. The City of Columbus has been a partner in support of the Rev1 Venture's Entrepreneurial Support Program since 2007 by providing annual financial support. Rev1 Ventures has also been a partner with the City of Columbus by providing grant and loans through the COVID Small Business Response and Recovery Program.

The mission of the Rev1 Diversity Equity and Inclusion Grant Fund Program is to continue to provide support to the business community by leveling the playing field for underserved entrepreneurs and innovators.

The grant fund will provide services which will include the following: (1) salary and benefits for underserved entrepreneurs/innovators for up to 1 year; (2) support for recruiting diverse CEO and key leaders; (3) support for early product development; and (4) subsidized salary for hiring diverse interns and fellows through Rev1 Venture's Innovative Internship Program.

Rev1 Ventures has announced its expansion of support for women and persons of color who are seeking to commercialize technologies and launch new scalable businesses in the Columbus Region. The funding totals nearly \$3MM in new programs, including a \$1.4MM grant from the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) "Build to Scale" program, which aims to accelerate technology entrepreneurship by increasing inclusive access to business support and startup capital.

The services included in this contract cannot be provided by existing city employees because these services are beyond the City's current expertise and capacity to provide.

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to modify and increase the professional services agreement with Hatch Associates Consultants, Inc. for the Southwesterly Composting Facility Odor Control Improvements project, CIP 650375-100002, in a dollar amount up to \$1,115,400.00.

The Department of Public Utilities, Division of Sewerage and Drainage (DOSD) operates and manages two large municipal wastewater treatment plants (WWTPs). The Compost Facility processes biosolids from both WWTPs by composting under negative aeration and biofiltration. There have been 3 phases of this Contract. The original Contract performed preliminary engineering and equipment upgrades at the Compost Facility. The next phase completed the detailed design providing facility upgrades and expansion. The project was placed on hold at 95% design due to budgetary concerns, and then there was an unplanned modification for redesign, reducing the Construction scope. The redesign is complete, and the designer created the bid package.

This planned modification is for engineering services during construction. Construction, Construction Management Services and commissioning of the improvements will be performed by others.

1. BACKGROUND

This Ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to modify and increase the professional engineering services contract with MS Consultants, Inc., for the Southerly Stormwater and Floodplain Improvements project, CIP 650377-100000, in an amount up to \$4,000,000.00 to pay for the first phase of detailed design services.

The City's wastewater treatment plants require continual development and upgrades in order to keep processes and equipment up-to-date, in compliance, and running well. All site re-development requires compliance with the City of Columbus Stormwater and Drainage Manual as well as the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) Stormwater general permit and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements. This project will develop and implement the stormwater and floodplain masterplan for the Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant to achieve and maintain compliance. The Department of Public Utilities (DPU) is planning large scale developments at the facility which will require expansion of the current footprint into the floodplain. This will require significant permitting and environmental mitigation and involves the design and permitting of a

levee.

The first phase of this contract performed preliminary engineering and analyzed several alternatives for meeting these regulations while accounting for any unmitigated historical impacts as well as future development. Findings of the initial phase are that a levee is required to accommodate future expansion necessary for an expected increase in flows from new development in the area.

Due to the size and complexity of the project the detailed design will be split into two phases, which are being called Step 2a and Step 2b. Step 2a is the upcoming phase of work and will perform field investigations and develop technical memoranda (TM) required to fully define the environmental permitting, develop proposed environmental mitigation plans, and progress the design through 30% of the design package. Step 2a is expected to cost approximately \$8,000,000.00 and is anticipated to be funded with two contract modifications of \$4,000,000.00 each.

1.3 Reason other procurement processes are not used: The current consultant has intricate knowledge about the facility and has performed a significant amount of hydraulic modeling and preliminary design. Continuing the design with the current consultant will be more economical and efficient than a rebid of the project. A new consultant would need to perform significant duplication of efforts in order to become familiar with the work. Modification of the existing contract will also require less time to begin detailed design and permitting of the eventual facility expansion. This permitting work needs to be completed prior to the 4th train construction to allow development in the floodplain. This project is complex and time critical, so it is in the City's best interest to maintain services with the current design professional to complete the design.

Background: This legislation authorizes the Finance and Management Director, on behalf of the Division of Fleet Management, to fund the yearly services with Assetworks LLC, to continue fleet management software, hardware and related services. The Division of Fleet Management is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of city owned vehicles and this software provides a management system to bill, manage, monitor and analyze all maintenance related data. Competitive best value proposals from qualified companies were solicited to provide all aspects of fleet management software services including, but not limited to, GPS monitoring, vendor hosting, and integration with related fuel and fluid monitoring systems. Ordinance 1649-2022 set the initial terms of this contract for the period July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2025. Funding for this term will be approved on an annual basis. After this initial period, this contract allows seven (7) annual renewal options, which may be exercised at the discretion of the City. The renewals are on a year to year basis and are subject to funds availability and approval of Columbus City Council.

Bid Information: RFQ018817 was advertised and seven (7) Best Value Procurement proposals were

received on June 29, 2021.

An evaluation committee consisted of representatives from the Department of Finance and Management and the Department of Technology. Of the seven (7) vendors that submitted proposals, two (2) were selected for presentations. After presentation from the two vendors the committee presented its rankings to the Finance and Management Director. Assetworks LLC scored the highest in five of six categories. The Finance and Management Director instructed the committee to proceed with negotiations with Assetworks LLC. The results of the negotiation were successful.

It is therefore recommended that a contract be awarded to Assetworks LLC CC#460521049, Expiration 12/9/2022.

The City of Columbus, Department of Public Service is engaged in the Miscellaneous Economic Development - Confluence Village Public Infrastructure project. The contract work was for the preparation of detailed design plans for public infrastructure which included new pavement, curb, sidewalks, storm sewer, sanitary sewer, water main, street lighting, bridge lighting, street trees, signals, underground electric distribution, underground duct system for private utilities within the Confluence Village site, and design of improvements to the existing railroad.

The Confluence Village Public Infrastructure is a project with Confluence Community Authority (CCA). The realignment required an additional R/W dedication from Confluence Development LLC (0.168 acres) to the City of Columbus (shown in green on the exhibit). BACKGROUND: This ordinance amends the current authorized strength, as set forth in ordinance 0692-2023.

Oregon, 97224, for the Street

The strength levels for most general fund agencies are set to be equal to the 2023 budget as amended by City Council (including the Departments of Health and Recreation and Parks). Authorized strength levels of smaller non-general fund agencies are set to be equal to the adopted 2023 budget as amended, while the strength levels of certain larger non-general fund agencies may have their strength set slightly higher to allow for flexibility in hiring.

Within the City Auditor's Office a reduction of four full-time positions in the Division of Income Tax will allow for an increase of three full-time positions and two part-time positions in the City Auditor Division. One position is requested for the Municipal Court Judges in response to the newly enacted state record sealing law. The Municipal Court Clerk requests to move eight full-time positions from the computer fund to the general fund and change one part-time position to full time, resulting in no overall change in Authorized Strength. The Department of Civil Service requests an increase of two part-time positions to assist in hiring for the Division of Police. Within the Department of Public Safety, the Division of Police requests two additional full-time civilian positions for the DNA Grant and the Division of Fire requests an increase of one civilian part-time position. Two full-time positions are requested in the Office of CelebrateOne. The Office of Violence Prevention request four positions for various operational needs. One additional full-time position is requested in the Department of the Inspector General to address increasing workload. The Department of Building and Zoning Services requests an increase of one part-time Office Assistant in Code Enforcement. In the Department of Development five full-time positions in Administration and one full-time positions in the Division of Housing are requested to account for increased workload. Within the Department of Finance and Management, the Division of Financial Management will add two part-time positions. The Department of Recreation and Parks requests to move strength by increasing by one full-time position and decreasing by two part-time positions. The Department of Public Service requests to increase by three part-time positions in the Division of Infrastructure and two part-time positions in the Division of Traffic. Within the Department of Public Utilities, Administrative Division 12 additional full-time positions are requested for various programs. The Division of Water will increase by 11 full-time positions in order to address the Smart Meter and lead and copper certification programs.

Fiscal Impact: Funds for these strength levels are budgeted and/or the positions will not be filled until revenues have been clearly identified and appropriated. In all cases, the ability to hire will be monitored by the Division of Finance and Management. As such, there is no fiscal impact associated with passage of this ordinance.

Emergency Justification: Emergency action is requested to allow for the filling of budgeted vacant positions in certain departments in order to assure the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare.

To establish a new authorized strength ordinance for various divisions in the City of Columbus; to repeal ordinance 0692-2023; and to declare an emergency.

The Division of Power (DOP) uses a system called Responder to track and manage power outages, etc. This system uses a tool list called ArcFM that integrates with ESRI's GIS to trace outages on the DOP GIS data layers. Columbus Public Health has been awarded grant funding from the Ohio Department of Health originating from the Centers for Disease Control for the Get Vaccinated Ohio (GVO) Program. This ordinance is needed to accept the funding of \$384,508.00 in grant monies for the Get Vaccinated Ohio (GVO) grant program for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. This ordinance also authorizes a subrecipient agreement with Franklin County Public Health for \$88,989.63, for the provision of immunization services to clients required to meet the deliverables of the grant for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

The GVO program will enable Columbus Public Health to ensure that critical elements of vaccine provided and the vaccine delivery system are adequate; to establish and maintain a high level of awareness and demand for immunizations by parents, particularly racial/ethnic minority parents and other under-served population groups; and to accurately measure the ability of local vaccine providers to raise immunizations levels in children under

the age of two toward the goal of 90% coverage.

The purpose of the subrecipient agreement is to partner with Franklin County Public Health to carry out the deliverables detailed in the Get Vaccinated Ohio (GVO) Program from the Ohio Department of Health. This agreement with Franklin County Public Health is for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. The subrecipient will assist CPH in fulfilling the deliverables of the grant to achieve and maintain 90% vaccination coverage levels for universally recommended childhood vaccines. Contracting with FCPH allows CPH the ability to carry out immunizations service delivery throughout Franklin County in areas other than the City of Columbus jurisdiction. Services to be provided include targeted immunization services to address immunization coverage disparities; conduct immunization provider education and assessments for practices throughout Franklin County in order to promote immunization best practices; conduct School Immunization Assurance; recruit, enroll, and educate providers on the State Immunization Registry (ImpactSIIS); and carry out Perinatal Hepatitis B Case Identification and Follow-up. Franklin County Public Health is public health district organized pursuant to ORC Section 3709. This organization will service the populations that are outside of the City's jurisdiction to carry out the deliverables for the entirety of Franklin County.

This ordinance is submitted as an emergency to not delay vaccination services to clients and families, and to meet grant deliverables required by the grantor.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Get Vaccinated Ohio (GVO) grant program is entirely funded by the Ohio Department of Health and does not generate revenue or require a City match.

Pursuant to the EDA, the parties contemplated that within the Site there would be an approximately +/- 6.1 acre public parkland consisting of what is now Franklin County Tax Parcel ID's 010-299006 and 010-299081 (the "Public Parkland").

To facilitate the acquisition and development of the Public Parkland, City Council adopted Resolution No. 0153X-2018 on May 21, 2018 and Resolution No. 0325X-2018 on November 5, 2018 to establish the Harrison Market Community Authority (the "Authority") and its new community district over the Site. Ordinance No. 3140-2018 passed by City Council on November 18, 2018 authorized the assignment of the EDA from Perry Street, LLC to WTD Development, LLC (the "Developer") and authorized the City, the Authority, and the Developer to enter into the Tax Increment Financing and Cooperative Agreement dated December 1, 2018 (the "Agreement"). In accordance with the EDA and the Agreement, the City originally committed to providing up to \$2.2 million of funds from the Harrison West Redevelopment Incentive District (the "AC Humko II TIF") that had been established by City Council pursuant to Ordinance No. 0670-2004 passed on April 26, 2004.

Due to inflation and supply chain issues caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and its aftermath, this legislation is necessary to authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into the First Amendment to the Agreement (the "First Amendment") as additional funding is required to be appropriated and expended from monies generated by the AC Humko II TIF to immediately commence and complete the construction of the Public Parkland with the mutually agreed upon vendor selected through a competitive bidding process.

This Ordinance also authorizes the City's Recreation and Parks Department Director to enter into a Construction Agreement with the Developer for the construction of the improvements to the Public Parkland; to enter into a Right of Entry and Release of Liability Agreement with the Developer, to enter upon a ±1.8 acre parcel of land owned by the City and identified as Franklin County Auditor Parcel ID No. 010-299006-00, to construct improvements to the Public Parkland; and to enter into a Park Maintenance Agreement with the Authority.

Fiscal Impact: The City is appropriating and authorizing the expenditure of service payments in lieu of taxes and property tax rollback payments generated by the parcels in the AC Humko II TIF that are on deposit in Fund 7425 and Fund 7788 all in accordance with this First Amendment.

Emergency Justification: Emergency legislation is requested to make funds available to the Harrison Market Community Authority so that it may enter into a contract for construction of the public parkland improvements with the selected contractor prior to the expiration of the bid validity period.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a First Amendment to the Tax Increment Financing and Cooperative Agreement with the Harrison Market Community Authority and WTD Development, LLC; to appropriate and authorize the expenditure of service payments in lieu of taxes and property tax rollback payments generated by parcels in the Harrison West Redevelopment Incentive District (AC Humko II TIF) pursuant to the First Amendment to the Tax Increment Financing and Cooperative Agreement to provide additional financing for the development of public parkland improvements; to authorize the City's Recreation and Parks Department Director to enter into a Right of Entry and Release of Liability

Agreement and a Construction Agreement with WTD Development, LLC; to authorize the City's Recreation and Parks Department Director to enter into a Park Maintenance Agreement with the Harrison Market Community Authority; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 5709.40, 5709.42 and 5709.43 of the Ohio Revised Code, City Council, after giving proper notice to the Columbus City School District, by its Ordinance No. 0670-2004 passed on April 26, 2004 as amended by Ordinance No. 3139-2018 passed on November 19, 2018, created the Harrison West Redevelopment Incentive District (the "AC Humko II TIF") over certain properties within the Harrison West neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, within the AC Humko II TIF prior to Ordinance No. 3139-2018 was property formally owned by the Battelle Memorial Institute and generally bounded by W. Fifth Avenue, Perry Street, W. Third Avenue, and the Olentangy River (the "Site"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 0443-2018 passed on February 26, 2018 by City Council, the City entered into an Economic Development Agreement dated August 27, 2018 (the "EDA") with Perry Street, LLC concerning redevelopment of the Site; and

WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution No. 0153X-2018 on May 21, 2018 and Resolution No. 0325X-2018 on November 5, 2018 to establish the Harrison Market Community Authority (the "Authority") and its new community district over the Site; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the EDA, the parties identified within the Site a ±1.8 parcel along W. Third Avenue currently identified as being Franklin County Tax Parcel ID 010-299006, and a ±4.2 acre parcel along the Olentangy River currently identified as Franklin County Tax Parcel ID 010-299081, to be public parkland (together, the parcels comprise the "Public Parkland"); and

WHEREAS, in order to finance the redevelopment of the Site and the Public Parkland, City Council passed Ordinance No. 3140-2018 on November 18, 2018 that authorized the assignment of the EDA from Perry Street, LLC to the WTD Development, LLC (the "Developer") and authorized the City, the Authority, and the Developer to enter into a Tax Increment Financing and Cooperative Agreement dated December 1, 2018 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the EDA and the Agreement, the City determined to originally use up to \$2.2 million of the service payments in lieu of taxes generated from the AC Humko II TIF to finance the costs to acquire, design, and construct, and install trail improvements, street trees, and park trees on the Public Parkland (collectively, the "Park Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, due to inflation and supply chain issues caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and its aftermath, the bid to construct the Park Improvements has increased above the originally agreed upon budget in the EDA, and the City has determined that it is in its best interest to appropriate and authorize the expenditure of additional funds generated from the AC Humko II TIF to fund the Park Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City's Department of Development desires to enter into a First Amendment to the Agreement (the "First Amendment") with the Developer and the Authority to provide for the additional funding; and

WHEREAS, the City's Recreation and Parks Department desires to enter into a Right of Entry and Release of Liability Agreement and a Construction Agreement with the Developer, and to enter into a Park Maintenance Agreement with the Authority (collectively, the "Park Agreements") permitting access to the City-owned Franklin County Tax Parcel ID 010-299006, for construction of the Park Improvements on the Public Parkland; and to authorize and require maintenance of the Park Improvements and the Public Parkland by the Authority; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the Department of Development and the Recreation and Parks Department in that it is immediately necessary to enter into the First Amendment and the Park Agreements to expedite the availability and remittance of AC Humko II TIF funds to enable the selected vendor to begin constructing the Park Improvements prior to the end of the vendor's open bid period, thereby saving additional funding by not rebidding, all for the preservation of the public health, peace, safety and welfare without delay; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

- Section 1. That in consideration of the above, the Director of the Department of Development, or his or her authorized designee, (the "Development Director"), on behalf of the City, is authorized to enter into the First Amendment presently on file with the Department of Development, along with any changes or amendments thereto not inconsistent with this Ordinance and not substantially adverse to the City and which shall be approved by the Development Director and the City Attorney, provided that the approval of such changes and amendments thereto, and the character of those changes and amendments not being substantially adverse to the City, shall be evidenced conclusively by the execution and delivery thereof, that such changes are not inconsistent or adverse to the City.
- Section 2. That in consideration of the above, the Recreation and Park Department Director, or his or her authorized designee, (the "Parks Director"), on behalf of the City, is authorized to enter into the Park Agreements, as those agreements are presently on file with the Recreation and Parks Department, along with any changes or amendments thereto not inconsistent with this Ordinance and not substantially adverse to the City and which shall be approved by the Parks Director and the City Attorney, provided that the approval of such changes and amendments thereto, and the character of those changes and amendments not being substantially adverse to the City, shall be evidenced conclusively by their execution and delivery thereof, that such changes are not inconsistent or adverse to the City.
- Section 3. That the Development Director, Parks Director, and/or other appropriate officers of the City, are authorized to execute subsequent amendments to the First Amendment to add additional work or allow City approved change orders related to the Park Improvements, consistent with the City-approved plans and specifications of the Public Parkland, and/or to increase the maximum obligation provided thereunder (provided such increase does not exceed the amount of service payments in lieu of taxes and property tax rollback payments derived from the AC Humko II TIF) and to execute such other agreements, modifications, and instruments, subject to approval by the City Attorney's Office, and to take all actions as may be necessary to implement this Ordinance and the transactions contemplated by the First Amendment and Park Agreements authorized in Section 1 and Section 2 of this Ordinance.

- Section 4. That the service payments in lieu of taxes and property tax rollback payments deposited into Fund 7425 and Fund 7788 shall be deemed appropriated for the purposes set forth in the First Amendment and authorized to be expended therefrom in accordance with the First Amendment; provided, the Development Director is authorized to amend the authorized maximum obligation provided thereunder if it is determined by the Development Director, upon consultation with the Parks Director, that additional financing is required for the Park Improvements so long as such increased amount does not exceed the funds generated from the AC Humko II TIF; and the City Auditor is authorized to make payment(s) to the Authority or its designee from Fund 7425 and Fund 7788, as applicable, in accordance with the First Amendment upon order of the Development Director and that no order shall be drawn or money paid except by voucher, the form of which shall be approved by the City Auditor.
- **Section 5.** That the City Auditor is authorized to establish such accounting codes as necessary, to make any accounting changes to revise the funding source for all agreements, contracts, amendments, or modifications associated with this Ordinance and the transactions contemplated by the First Amendment.
- **Section 6.** That the City Auditor is authorized to transfer the unencumbered balance in a project account or subfund to the unallocated balance account within the same fund upon receipt of certification by the Director of the Department administering said project that the project has been completed and the monies are no longer required for said project.
- **Section 7.** That for reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

This modification provides funding for Preliminary Design Services (Phase 2), which will further advance the study/preliminary design services provided under Phase 1 of this project to enable the development of a Preliminary Design Report that will serve as a basis for the subsequent detailed design phase.

It is the City's intent to execute future contract modifications for Detailed Design Services (Phase 3),

Engineering Services during Construction (Phase 4) and Engineering Services during Operation (Phase 5).

5. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION

Emergency action is requested to complete the project in a timely manner to meet future anticipated water demands to prevent a water shortage and to avoid public health and welfare issues.

6. FISCAL IMPACT

This design modification is expected to be financed with a loan from the Water Supply Revolving Loan Account (WSRLA) through the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and administered by the Ohio Water Development Authority. Non-construction loans do not have a nomination deadline for pre-approval for this source of funding and are nominated as the need for financing arises.

BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health (CPH) is hosting three farmers' markets in 2023. The markets in 2023 will be held on July 20th, July 27th and August 10th. This ordinance establishes an imprest petty cash operating fund in the amount of \$5,000.00 for the three markets for the reimbursement to farmers who accept the Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) services for market customers using Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Produce Perks Farmers Market Nutrition Incentive program tokens as payment during the markets.

At each market, the CPH Farmers Market Staff will swipe customer Ohio Directions EBT cards and provide one token for each \$1.00 in SNAP benefits they redeem plus a matching Produce Perks token for each \$1.00 in SNAP benefits redeemed up to a maximum of \$25.00 per EBT transaction. Customers will shop at the markets, using the tokens provided. At the end of each market, the CPH Farmers Market Staff will reimburse the farmers \$1.00 for each SNAP token received and \$1.00 for each Produce Perks token they have accepted as payment during the market. To facilitate this, a cash box will be required at each of the three farmers markets. After the market, reimbursement will be submitted immediately. Columbus Public Health will be reimbursed the next day for the SNAP benefits redeemed and will be reimbursed 2-4 weeks after each market for the Produce Perks.

Emergency action is requested in order to have the cash available to reimburse farmers after the first market held on July 20th, 2023.

Fiscal Impact: To provide the sum of \$5,000.00 to create an imprest petty cash fund for the three farmers'

markets. At the conclusion of the markets, remaining cash is deposited back into the City fund and all disbursed cash is reimbursed and deposited. There is zero net cost to the City to provide the petty cash fund.

To authorize the establishment of an imprest petty cash operating fund for the Columbus Public Health farmers' markets to be held this summer; to authorize a transfer within the operating fund; and to authorize the expenditure of \$5,000.00; and to declare an emergency. (\$5,000.00)

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) began accepting applications for its Municipal Bridge Program on January 1, 2023, and applications were due February 28, 2023. The Municipal Bridge Program provides federal funds to municipal corporations, metroparks and Regional Transit Authorities for bridge replacement or bridge rehabilitation projects. ODOT will cover up to 95% of eligible costs for construction. Total awards are capped at \$2 million. In order to receive funding, a bridge must either be on ODOT's Target Bridge List or be eligible due to inspection results received after the list was generated.

The City meets the criteria to be eligible to submit an application to replace the Kimberly Parkway Bridge over Mason Run. The Department of Public Service has had to limit loads on this bridge to 65% of the legal truck load. The Department estimates the total project cost will be approximately \$1,563,413.00. ODOT recently announced its intention to award funding to the City of this project.

This legislation will authorize the Director of Public Service to execute agreements with ODOT in connection with the award of the grant, expend awarded grant funds, and return unused grant funds if any should remain at the end of the grant.

1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a contract modification for professional engineering services with AECOM Technical Services, Inc. for the Inflow Redirection - Markison, C.I.P. #650790-122181 and Hydraulic Modification to CSO Regulator - Markison, C.I.P. #650790-122182, in an amount up to \$47,118.32. The modification work will be performed for the Wilson Avenue Area Water Line Improvements, C.I.P. #690236-100176.

This is an unplanned modification. The purpose of this modification is to construct necessary improvements to the water distribution system in the Wilson Avenue Area. The improvements identified in the scope of work will replace or rehabilitate water lines that have high break histories and require frequent maintenance. This project includes replacing or rehabilitating approximately 3,500 linear feet of 8-inch water lines. The streets include Oakwood Avenue and Linwood Avenue.

The original contract provided design services for the inflow redirection and hydraulic modification to the combined sewer overflow regulator on Markison Avenue. The water line work included in this modification was not part of the original scope. It was not until very late in design that it was realized it would be very beneficial to include water line replacement with the proposed sewer work. The final configuration of the utilities would make for a very difficult water line replacement in the future, and it made more sense to include the work now and with the sewer project.

This November, residents will head to the polls and vote for the districts for the first time. It is imperative that residents be educated on how to use this new system and how it will affect them and their families.

Triumph Communications will develop a community-wide education and marketing campaign on the importance of understanding how districts will impact residents and their neighbors. Triumph will develop a wider message platform and resources to reach inclusive demographics within Columbus. The education campaign will be comprised of television, digital, social and radio.

While an informal bidding process was utilized, a bid waiver to enter into contract with Triumph Communications is requested in order to create a media campaign in support of the transition to Columbus districts. Triumph Communications has prior and thorough familiarity with the City of Columbus district transition and is best positioned to immediately initiate services prior to the general election in November.

Fiscal impact: Funding is available within the Neighborhood Initiatives subfund.

Emergency action is requested in order to avoid any delay in ensuring that residents are properly informed regarding the new districts.

To authorize the City Clerk to enter into a contract with Triumph Communications for an educational campaign for the general public on the Columbus districts; to authorize an appropriation and an expenditure within the Neighborhood Initiatives subfund; to waive the competitive bidding requirements of the Columbus City Codes; and to declare an emergency. BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to accept and execute a private grant from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation in an amount up to \$2,000,000.00 under their "Monuments Project" program for the City's Reimagining Columbus project and authorizes the appropriation of

up to \$2,000,000.00 for personnel costs and a professional services contract upon the receipt of the grant funds.

Launched in 2020, the Monuments Project is a five-year, \$250 million commitment by the Mellon Foundation to transform the nation's commemorative landscape by supporting public projects that more completely and accurately represent the multiplicity and complexity of American stories. The Monuments Project builds on the Mellon Foundation's efforts to express, elevate, and preserve the stories of those who have often been denied historical recognition and explores a more complete telling of who we are as a nation.

Through the Department of Development, the City applied for a grant to engage the community and generate discussion about the city's namesake, Christopher Columbus, and to assess the future disposition of the Christopher Columbus statue that was created by Edoardo Alfieri and gifted to the City of Columbus by its Sister City of Genoa, Italy in 1955. Funding through the Monuments Project would enable the City of Columbus to 1) methodically and inclusively host conversations to understand what Columbus residents value most, and how the city's future symbology and public art landscape can communicate shared values and aspirations, 2) provide the public with opportunities to collaboratively ideate on the future disposition of the Christopher Columbus statue, and with requisite community buy-in, design a new space that allows the public to understand and physically interact with difficult history, and 3) create a replicable model for dealing with difficult topics within the community and pilot new community engagement methodologies, including restorative practices.

The proposed initiative will collect feedback from community conversations, research into colonial and contemporary history, and best practices in placemaking to cast a vision for how a new statue site should look and feel, how visitors could interact with it, and how the site can support the sharing of personal histories and lived experiences. The City of Columbus does not intend for the statue to return to the City Hall campus; rather, as a grant deliverable, the City will develop a plan to create new public art for the campus, to be funded by future capital funds.

Through this work, the City sees an opportunity to create a preeminent gathering place for confronting the legacy of Christopher Columbus; a place where we address hard truths about the man and the inordinately sanguine ways we as a society have told his-our-stories.

Public engagement is key to this project; the process will be designed to support open and inclusive dialogue, healing and truth-telling. The engagement process will be led by a diverse team of experts in public engagement, cultural competency, public art, placemaking, and design and augmented with the perspectives of Advisory Committees composed of local residents and community leaders. The project will use conventional and restorative practices to glean insight and support the sharing of different perspectives and lived experiences.

The Reimagining Columbus project will document this process through video and photo documentation and white papers, and will host this content online so other communities can understand how this approach may help confront their own difficult histories. All content developed during this process will be shared with the Mellon Foundation and parties interested in replicating Columbus' successes.

Grant funding will be used hire a staff person to manage and facilitate the grant and project as well as contract with a consultant who will have the responsibility for project management, community engagement, landscape architecture and oversight of subconsultants. Separate legislation will be submitted to City Council as required by Columbus City Code. The term of the grant is from June 1, 2023, to May 31, 2025, with an approximate 3 month closeout period.

This legislation is submitted as an emergency in order to have the funds available to begin the hiring process and to execute the professional services contract as soon as possible to complete the work during the term of the grant.

FISCAL IMPACT: This legislation requests approval for the Auditor's Office to appropriate up to \$2,000,000.00 from the Private Grant Fund (Fund 2291), grant number to be determined, for this grant. Funding from this grant will be distributed to the City in two tranches: one half after execution of the grant agreement (summer 2023) and the remainder in the summer of 2024. Appropriations are to be made upon receipt of grant funds. Of the first tranche, \$250,000.00 shall be appropriated for personnel costs for the duration of the grant. The remaining amount, \$750,000.00, shall be used for a professional services contract. Tranche two, \$1,000,000.00, shall be used for a modification of the professional services contract. Additional legislation shall be submitted to authorize the execution and expenditure of funds for the modification.

BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to waive the competitive bidding requirements of Columbus City Code Chapter 329 and enter into a professional services contract with Designing Local Ltd., in an amount up to \$750,000.00, for the City's "Reimagining Columbus" project that is funded by The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation's "Monuments Project" program grant.

Designing Local Ltd shall serve as the City's lead consultant for the "Reimagining Columbus" project. Through the Department of Development, the City applied for a grant to engage the community and generate discussion about the city's namesake, Christopher Columbus, and to assess the future disposition of the Christopher Columbus statue that was created by Edoardo Alfieri and gifted to the City of Columbus by its Sister City of Genoa, Italy in 1955. The purpose of this project is to 1) methodically and inclusively host conversations to understand what Columbus residents value most, and how the city's future symbology and public art landscape can communicate shared values and aspirations, 2) provide the public with opportunities to collaboratively ideate on the future disposition of the Christopher Columbus statue, and with requisite community buy-in, design a new space that allows the public to understand and physically interact with difficult history, and 3) create a replicable model for dealing with difficult topics within the community and pilot new community engagement methodologies, including restorative practices.

The City proposed the Reimagining Columbus project to the Mellon Foundation and was awarded a \$2 million grant. As the lead consultant for project, Designing Local will be responsible for project management, community engagement, landscape architecture, and oversight of sub consultants. Sub Consultants will include experts in public engagement, cultural competency, public art, place making, and design and augmented with the perspectives of Advisory Committees composed of local residents and community leaders. The project will use conventional and restorative practices to glean insight and support the sharing of different perspectives and lived experiences.

Emergency action is requested in order to execute the professional services contract as soon as possible to complete the work during the term of the grant.

Waiver of Request for Proposal Requirements: A waiver of the competitive procurement requirements outlined in Columbus City Code Chapter 329 is being requested because Designing Local Ltd. previously was selected as the chosen consultant in response to RFQ021527. A contract was not awarded under RFQ021527 because program scope evolved in light of the private grant opportunity with the Monuments Project.

FISCAL IMPACT: The funding of \$750,000.00 for this contract is available in the Private Grant Fund (2291) Mellon Foundation-Monuments Project grant (grant number to be determined) and contingent upon Ordinance 1857-2023. Funding from the Mellon Foundation shall be disbursed to the City in two tranches: one half in summer of 2023 and one half in summer 2024. Upon receipt of the funds in 2024, legislation will be put forth to modify this contract to add the additional funds.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: The vendor's contract compliance 020995 is active and expires on 7/14/24.



Franklinton Area Commission Bylaws

As adopted June 13, 2023

These By-Laws / Rules of Procedure shall establish all proceedings under which the Franklinton Area Commission (herein referred to as "the Commission") shall execute those duties and functions set forth in and with authority granted in Chapters 3109 and 3111 of the Columbus City Code. These bylaws serve as an operating agreement and method of regulation for the members, officers and the management of the Commission including, but not limited to:

- Books and records of account
- Minutes of proceedings
- Requirements for notices of meetings
- Computation of time for notice, method of giving notice
- Quorum requirements
- Procedures for disqualification of area commissioners

These bylaws are consistent with Chapter 3109 of the Columbus City Code.

Article I: Boundaries

The Franklinton Area Boundaries are: Starting at the northwest corner where the alley west of Schultz Avenue would, if extended, intersect the Scioto River, then South along said alley, crossing West Broad Street to a point where, if extended, said alley would intersect I-70; then South along I-70 to Central Avenue, South on Central Avenue to Mound Street, East on Mound Street to Mt. Calvary; then South on Mt. Calvary to the midpoint on Renick and Mt. Calvary Streets; then following the boundary of the City of Columbus first West, then South to Greenlawn Avenue; then North on Harmon Avenue to West Mound Street; then East along I-70, to the East bank of the Scioto River; then North and West along the Scioto River to the place of the beginning.

Article II: Duties / Purpose

- A. Area commissions are established in the City of Columbus to afford additional voluntary citizen participation in decision-making in an advisory capacity and to facilitate communication, understanding and cooperation between neighborhood groups, city officials and developers.
- B. The Commission is an advisory body. No duty or function of the Commission shall invalidate any decision made by the Mayor's Administration or action of Columbus City Council.

Chairperson Initials

- C. The Commission shall identify and study the problems and requirements of the Commission area in order to:
 - a. Create plans and policies which will serve as guidelines for future development of the area
 - b. Bring the problems and needs of the area to the attention of appropriate government agencies or residents
 - c. Recommend solutions or legislation.
 - d. Aid and promote communications within the Commission area and between it and the rest of the city by means of:
 - i. Regular and special meetings of the Commission which are open to the public
 - ii. Public hearings on problems, issues, and proposals affecting the area
 - iii. Public forums and surveys to provide an opportunity for area residents, businesses, and organizations to state their problems and concerns
 - iv. Soliciting active cooperation of all segments of the area and city, including organizations, institutions, and government
 - v. Initiating proposals and supporting those introduced by individual citizens or area organizations, which will enhance the quality of life enjoyed by area residents and preserve the unique residential and commercial mix of the area
 - vi. Promoting and encouraging businesses whose functions, methods of operation, architectural appearance, and locations are consistent with the character and requirements of the area.
 - vii. Initiating, reviewing and recommending criteria and programs for the preservation, development, and enhancement of the Commission area, including, but not limited to, parks, recreational areas, sidewalks, streets and traffic, by means of:
 - 1. Reviewing the proposed capital improvements budget and proposing new items and changes relating to the area
 - 2. Making recommendations for restoration and preservation of the historical elements within the area
 - 3. Receiving and reviewing for recommendation, prior to adoption by governmental bodies, any new or revised comprehensive plan affecting the area.
 - e. Recommend priorities for and review government services and operation of the various government departments in the Commission area by means of:
 - i. Requesting and receiving from departments or agencies periodic reports concerning governmental services or practices in the area
 - ii. Meeting with administrative heads of any department or agency, or any of their subordinates, to obtain additional information deemed necessary for the Commission to fulfill its functions
 - iii. Requesting and receiving from departments or agencies, prior to implementation, full reports on any proposed changes in service or

- practice in the area, and recommending approval or disapproval of the proposed changes
- iv. Reviewing and evaluating pending legislation substantially affecting the area prior to its consideration by council
- v. Regularly receiving for review, comment and recommendation copies of applications and notices of all public hearings related to rezonings, special permits, variances, demolitions, and zoning appeals regarding property located wholly or partially within the area.
- f. Recommend persons from the Commission area for nomination to membership on city boards and commissions which make decisions or recommendations affecting the commission area.
- g. The Commission may meet with applicants for rezonings, special permits, demolition permits, or variances regarding property wholly or partly within the Commission area to discuss the proposal, its relationship to the area, and possible modifications. In order to assist decision-making without disrupting existing procedures, the Commission shall conduct such meetings and notify the appropriate body of its recommendations in a timely manner. Upon good cause shown, inability of the Commission to make a recommendation may be grounds for postponement of subsequent action by other bodies.
 - i. Suggestions and comments of the Commission shall be advisory only and failure of the applicant to comply therewith shall not in itself constitute grounds for denial of the application. Failure of the applicant to consult the Commission in a timely manner, however, may be grounds for postponement of further action by other bodies.
- h. The Commission shall not endorse any candidate for public office.

Article III: Membership and Terms

- A. The Commission shall consist of sixteen (16) seats. Seats will be filled by residents of the Franklinton area selected according to election procedures adopted by the Commission and/or individuals, appointed from agencies, businesses or organizations located in the Franklinton area. All members shall be appointed by the mayor with the concurrence of council.
- B. Except as noted elsewhere in these bylaws, members of the area commission shall serve without compensation for a term of three (3) years.
- C. Commission members are expected to participate with one or more committee meetings within their first year. By the beginning of their second year, it is the expectation that Commission members will join a committee and remain active in one or more committees until their term expires.
- D. No commissioner shall represent the Commission in its official actions before any other public body or official, except as specifically authorized by the Commission. This shall not be construed as a restriction upon the right of the individual area commissioners to represent their own view before public or private bodies, whether in agreement or disagreement with the official action of the Commission.

- E. Disqualification: Area commissioners shall maintain their residence, employment or business in the Commission area from which they were elected or appointed. Failure of an area commissioner to maintain his / her residence, employment or business in the area commission area shall be deemed a resignation and the Secretary shall notify the Department of Neighborhoods. An area commissioner's absence from three (3) regular meetings in any one (1) year shall be deemed a resignation from the area commission unless a written petition has been received by the Chairperson of the Commission. The petition from the area commissioner shall request that some or all of the absences be excused due to extenuating circumstances. If a petition is not received, it shall be deemed a resignation from the Commission and notice of such will be communicated to the Department of Neighborhoods. Failure to abide by federal, state, and local laws or these adopted bylaws may result in disqualification of an area commissioner. Disqualification of an area commissioner shall require a three quarter (3/4) majority vote of the area commission and the Secretary shall notify the Department of Neighborhoods.
- F. Resignation: Members of the Commission may resign in the following manners:
 - a. Written resignation submitted to the Executive Committee. Written resignations will be announced at the next regular meeting of the Commission.
 - b. Verbal resignation at a Commission meeting.
 - c. As noted above in article III section D, absence from three (3) regular meetings in any one (1) year shall be deemed a resignation. Resignations where a petition has not been received will be announced at the next regular meeting of the Commission.
 - d. The Chairperson shall notify the Department of Neighborhoods of any resignations immediately after the condition for resignation is fulfilled.
 - e. Resignations may not be retracted once submitted to the Department of Neighborhoods.
- G. Vacancies: The Executive Committee, following procedures created by the Election Committee, **may** nominate one (1) or more candidates to fill any vacancy caused by death, resignation or disqualification, or other means for the remainder of the unexpired term. The Commission **may** review all nominated candidates and vote to appoint one (1) candidate to fill the vacancy.
- H. All area commissioners must be appointed by the Mayor with the concurrence of Columbus City Council. Compliance with Columbus City Code 3109.08, 3109.10 and /or 3109.12 must be satisfied to officially participate as an area commissioner.

Article IV: Officers

- A. The officers of the Commission shall include: Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Zoning Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer. An individual may not be elected to serve in multiple officer positions.
- B. The officers of the Commission shall be elected by the membership of the Commission at the January meeting. Incoming officers shall begin duties on February 1.
- C. Commission officers shall serve without compensation for the term of one (1) year.

- D. The Chairperson may serve no more than six (6) consecutive years but may be reelected after a gap of at least three (3) consecutive years.
- E. An individual serving six (6) consecutive years as the Chairperson is not eligible to serve as any other officer of the commission for three (3) consecutive years after their term as Chairperson expires. This individual is eligible to continue to serve as an area commissioner.

F. Officer Duties:

- a. The Chairperson shall:
 - i. Be a resident of Franklinton.
 - ii. Preside at all meetings of the Commission.
 - iii. Serve as Ex-officio member of all committees.
 - iv. Prepare regular meeting agendas.
- b. The Vice-Chairperson shall:
 - i. Be a resident of Franklinton.
 - ii. Perform said duties of the Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson.
 - iii. Perform such duties of the Chairperson as the Chairperson may from time to time delegate.
- c. Zoning Chairperson
 - i. Receive applications for rezoning, zoning variances, and special permits for property located in the area.
 - ii. Receive and manage all demolition permits for property in the area.
 - iii. Comply with current City zoning notification requirements.
 - iv. Be chairperson of the Zoning Committee.
- d. The Secretary shall:
 - i. Call the roll at each meeting and maintains a permanent written record of it.
 - ii. Maintain a permanent written record of all action by the Commission and related committees.
 - iii. Maintain a permanent file of all correspondence of the Commission.
 - iv. Maintain a permanent written record of the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of Commission members.
- e. The Treasurer shall:
 - i. Have oversight of all Commission funds.
 - ii. Monitor the financial operations and financial condition of the Commission.
 - iii. Cause all financial records of the Commission to be maintained and reported to the Commission at each regular meeting, and to the City of Columbus as required.
 - iv. Be chairperson of the Finance Committee.
 - v. Be responsible for assuring that sound financial practices are maintained.

Article V: Meetings

A. All meetings of the Commission shall be open to the public at all times.

- B. In December annually, the Commission shall provide to the Department of Neighborhoods the schedule of regularly scheduled meetings for the upcoming year to be published in the Columbus City Bulletin.
- C. The Commission shall establish a method for communicating to the public the time and place of all regular and special meetings in addition to publication in the Columbus City Bulletin.
- D. All meetings other than the regularly scheduled monthly meetings or subcommittee meetings shall be published in the Columbus City Bulletin no less than seven (7) days prior to the date of the meeting. A meeting is defined as a gathering of a quorum. A quorum is a simple majority of current commissioners where commission business is conducted, transacted, deliberated, or discussed.
- E. Commission members must be in attendance at a meeting in order to be considered present or to vote at the meeting.
- F. The Commission members may not vote by secret ballot for commission appointments, officers, or for any other commission business.
- G. Meeting minutes shall be promptly prepared, filed, and maintained and shall be open to public inspection.
 - a. A copy of all meeting minutes shall be provided to the Department of Neighborhoods within thirty (30) days after approval by the area commission.

Article VI: Committees

- A. The functions carried out by any committee of the Commission may include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. Study the problems and needs of the Franklinton area, bring the problems and needs to the attention of proper government agencies or the citizens of the Franklinton area, and recommend solutions.
 - b. Determine the need for, and with agreement from the Commission, recommend to City Council or any other government body any needed legislation affecting the Franklinton area.
 - c. Provide a communication mechanism within the Franklinton Area Commission and thus to City Government through:
 - i. Holding regular and special meetings open to the public.
 - ii. Conducting public hearings on problems or issues confronting the Franklinton area.
 - iii. Sponsoring public forums on a periodic or as needed basis to provide an opportunity for Franklinton area residents to air problems or concerns.
 - d. Solicit input from all segments of the community including organizations, institutions, and government.
- B. The Chairperson of the Commission shall appoint committee members in February of each year.
- C. Committee members may be drawn from Commissioners, residents of Franklinton, or individuals from agencies, businesses or organizations located in the Franklinton area. All committee members have voting privileges within their committees. Committee members serve at the pleasure of the Chairperson.

- D. After appointment in February, the members of each committee shall elect a Committee Chairperson and Secretary from members of the Commission sitting on the respective committees.
- E. Present standing committees and their responsibilities are:
 - a. Executive Committee
 - i. Consist of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, Zoning Chairperson, Treasurer, and Chairpersons of any standing committee.
 - ii. Plan the direction and scope of the Commission
 - iii. Oversees the filling of vacant seats following Election Committee policies.

b. Planning Committee

- i. Review area plans and makes recommendations concerning them.
- ii. Address sanitation and traffic in the Franklinton area and make recommendations concerning related codes, as they pertain to area plans.
- iii. Examine historical significance of the area and make recommendations concerning the same.
- iv. In consultation with the City of Columbus, review flood control measures and other storm related problems, specifically including the adequacy of the West Columbus Flood Protection Plan, storm sewers, and sanitary sewers, and make recommendations concerning the same.

c. Housing Committee

- i. Foster relationships between public, private, and nonprofit sectors for the betterment of housing for all Franklinton residents.
- ii. Review housing and development projects.
- iii. Field housing concerns from Franklinton residents.
- iv. Leverage development to stabilize housing for all Franklinton residents.

d. Election Committee

- i. Oversee and ensure compliance with election and membership policies.
- ii. Annually review election and membership policies. Submit revisions, if any, to Commission for acceptance.
- iii. The decision of the Election Committee shall be final in deciding any election result that has been challenged. Challenges to the Election Committee decision may be referred to the City Attorney.

e. Zoning Committee

- i. Receive, review, and make recommendations concerning applications for rezoning, zoning variances, and special permits for property located in the area.
- ii. Receive and review all demolition permits for property in the area.
- iii. The zoning committee shall consider zoning cases that have been received by the Zoning Chair at least 14 calendar days prior to the Commission meeting. Cases received less than 14 days ahead will be heard at the next Commission meeting.

- iv. Commissioners shall be notified by the Zoning Chair of upcoming zoning cases no less than 12 days before the area commission meeting.
- Community Service Committee
 - i. Review social, recreation, safety, and health services in the area and make recommendations concerning them.
 - ii. Review employment and education opportunities for residents of the area and make recommendations concerning them.
 - iii. Review consumer-business relations in the area and make recommendations concerning the same.
- g. Finance Committee
 - i. The Treasurer of the Commission shall be the Chair of this Committee.
 - ii. The Committee shall be responsible for the planning, monitoring, and evaluation of the Commission funding and financial management.
 - iii. The Committee shall recommend an annual budget for approval by the Commission at the March meeting.
- h. Special committees
 - i. May be established for specific purposes by a majority vote at any
 - ii. Membership on special committees may be accorded to commission members and non-members.
 - iii. Special committees may be terminated by a majority vote at any meeting.
- F. All findings of the Commission's committees which result in proposed actions or resolutions shall be submitted at a regular or special meeting for Commission consideration.

Article VII: Elections

- A. The following rules shall apply to all election policies and procedures.
 - a. Election of resident Commissioners shall take place at a location determined by the Election Committee annually prior to September 30. Public elections may be conducted by secret ballot.
 - b. The Commission shall certify election results annually prior to September 30 at a regular full Commission meeting.
 - c. The commission shall appoint agency, business, or organization seats annually prior to September 30 at a regular Commission meeting.
 - d. All elected and appointed Commissioners shall complete the area commission appointment / code of conduct form and return the completed form to the Department of Neighborhoods. All forms shall be signed by the Commission Chairperson and submitted to the Department of Neighborhoods annually prior to September 30.
 - e. No election procedure shall be scheduled if the number of candidates is less than or equal to the number of elected commissioners with expiring terms.
 - f. No write-in candidates shall be allowed.

- g. No elector shall cast more than one (1) ballot in an election. Elections shall be determined by plurality of vote if three (3) or more candidates vie for a single position, otherwise a majority of votes cast shall elect.
- h. Commissioners shall begin their term on January 1. Commissioner appointments are subject to approval by the Mayor with the concurrence of Columbus City Council.
- i. Commissioner terms shall end on December 31 in the year that their term expires.
- j. Commissioners may not serve on more than one (1) area commission.
- k. Voters must be age 18 or over, a resident of Franklinton, and show proof of residency.

Article VIII: Training

- A. All Commission members are strongly encouraged to attend area commission training classes provided by the Department of Neighborhoods.
- B. Newly elected or appointed area commissioners are required to attend the new area commission training class provided by the Department of Neighborhoods within one (1) year of appointment or election.
- C. Newly elected Chairpersons, Vice Chairpersons and Zoning Chairpersons are required to have previously attended or to attend two zoning training classes provided by the Department of Neighborhoods and the Department of Building and Zoning Services within one (1) year of appointment or election.

Article IX: Public Records

- A. The Commission Secretary is responsible for maintaining all public records of the Commission.
- B. All public records shall be retained for the applicable period of time specified by the records retention schedule for the Department of Neighborhoods. Public records include, but are not limited to, official meeting minutes, agendas, election materials, zoning application packets, tape or video recordings of meetings and other correspondence.
- C. The Commission's records shall be organized and maintained in a manner that they can be made available for inspection or copying. Upon request, all public records shall be promptly prepared and made available for inspection to any person.

Article X: Code of Conduct

- **A.** Area commissioners shall conduct themselves in a professional and civil manner. Harassment, intimidation, or discrimination, as defined in Columbus City Code 2331, in any form will not be tolerated.
- **B.** Area commissioners shall treat other area commissioners, developers, and members of the public with respect and consideration regardless of the other's opinion, income, homeowner status, renter status, political affiliation, race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability, familial status or military status.
- C. Area commissioners, their family members, or business associates shall not benefit financially, or in any way as a result of their duties as an area commissioner or present the appearance of impropriety as a result of said duties. Area commissioners

- shall fully disclose to their area commission, at the earliest opportunity, information that may result in a perceived or actual conflict of interest. Area commissioners shall recuse themselves from all participation in any matters involving a conflict of interest on behalf of said commissioner.
- **D.** Failure of the Commission to abide by these adopted bylaws may result in the withholding of funding, the postponement of meetings and operations, or the exclusion of recommendations and actions to other bodies.

Article XI: Amendment of By-Laws

A. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Commission by two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the members, provided that the amendment was submitted in writing and read at the previous meeting of the area commission. The Secretary shall notify the Department of Neighborhoods of any approved amendment immediately after its adoption for filing with the Columbus City Clerk and publication in the Columbus City Bulletin. Amendments will take effect ten (10 days) after such publication per Columbus City Code 121.05.
