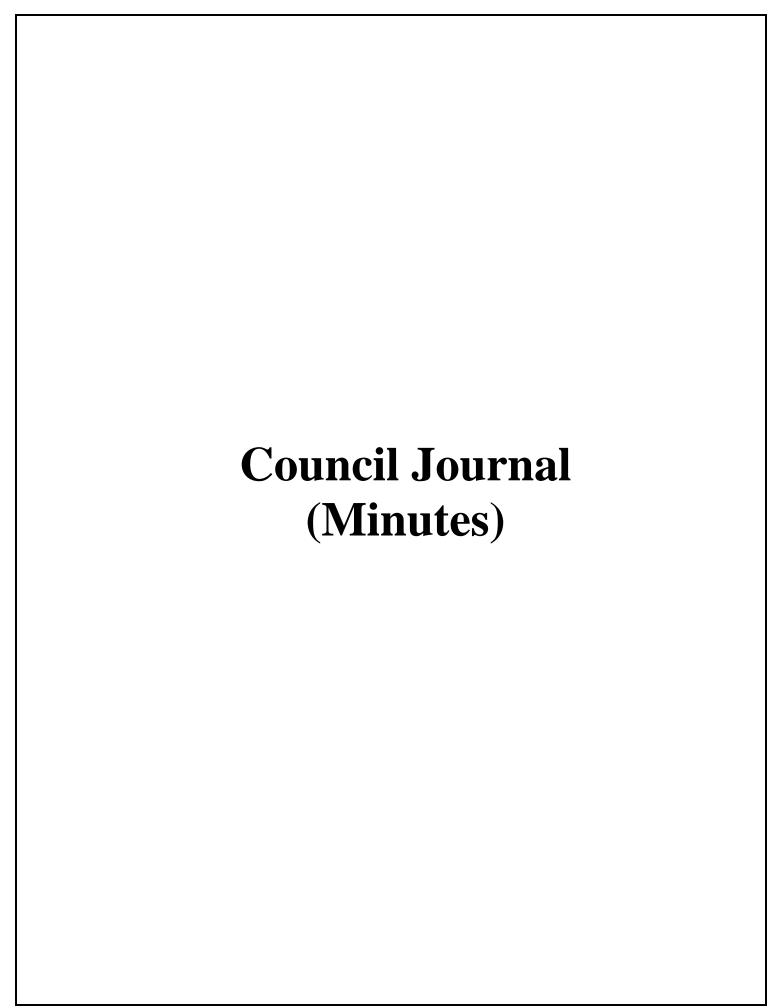


SIGNING OF LEGISLATION

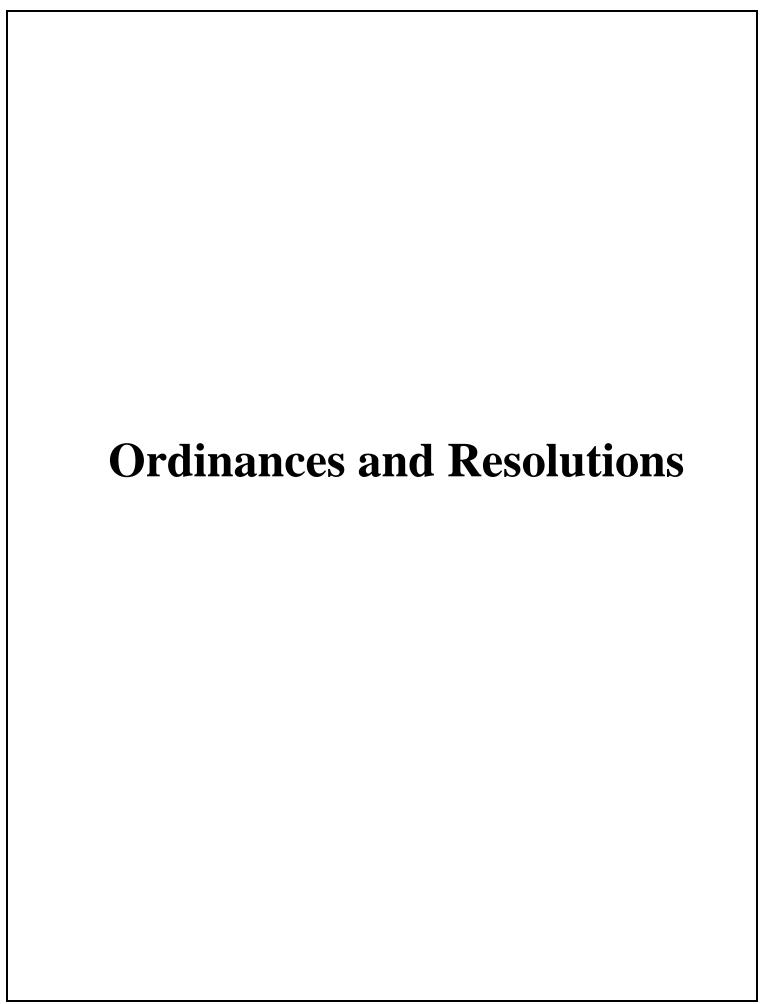

Background: Pursuant to the *Big Darby Accord Watershed Master Plan* and Resolution 0216X-2008 adopted by City Council on April 20, 2009, three revenue generation sources were identified: tax increment financing (TIF), new community authority (NCA) development charges, and per unit developer contributions for Big Darby Accord public improvements and other regionally beneficial public improvements within the Big Darby Accord area (the "Big Darby Revenue Program"). Redwood Galloway Alton Darby Creek Road OH P1 LLC (the "Owner") owns ±42.22 acres of property along the east side of Alton Darby Creek Road north of West Broad Street located at approximately 400 Alton Darby Creek Road and identified as tax parcel ID 470-318353 (the "Developer Property,"). Ordinance 2636-2022 passed by Council on October 10, 2022 rezoned the Developer Property to allow the Owner to cause a private investment of approximately \$28.25 million to construct 217 multi-family single-story apartment homes.

Pursuant to Ordinance 1501-2023 passed by City Council on June 12, 2023, the City and the Owner entered into the Big Darby - Redwood Farms Development Agreement dated July 28, 2023 to outline the plans and respective commitments for the fulfillment of Big Darby Revenue Program. This includes adding the Developer Property to the "Big Darby West Broad Street NCA" established in accordance with the petition submitted by Crown Pointe LLC, and assigned to Metro Development, LLC, pursuant to Resolution 0060X-2021, Resolution 0242X-2021, and Ordinance 1291-2022. On October 2, 2023, an application for the Written Consent to Add Property to the Big Darby West Broad Street NCA (the "Consent") was filed by the Owner with the Clerk of City Council. By this resolution, City Council, as the organizational board of commissions described and required by Chapter 349 of the Ohio Revised Code, will determine the sufficiency of the Consent, authorize a public notice, and set a public hearing date for the Consent.

Emergency Justification: Emergency action is requested and necessary in order to provide immediate authorization to notice in a newspaper for three weeks prior to a public hearing and set the public hearing date within 30-45 days of the date after the Consent was filed in accordance with Ohio Revise Code Chapter 349.

Fiscal Impact: No funding is required for this legislation.

To determine that the application for the Written Consent to Add Property to the Big Darby West Broad Street NCA filed with the City Clerk by Redwood Galloway Alton Darby Creek Road OH P1 LLC is sufficient and complies with the requirements of Chapter 349 of the Ohio Revised Code; to set the time and place for a public hearing on the consent; to authorize the notice of such public hearing by publication in a newspaper; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, Redwood Galloway Alton Darby Creek Road OH P1 LLC (the "Owner") plans to cause the development of 217 multi-family single-story apartment homes on its ± 42.22 -acre site located along the east side

of Alton Darby Creek Road north of West Broad Street and identified as tax parcel ID 470-318353 (the "Developer Property") within the municipal corporate boundaries of the City of Columbus, Ohio (a municipal corporation, hereafter, the "City") pursuant to Ordinance 2636-2022 rezoning the Developer Property; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 1501-2023 authorized the City and the Owner to enter into the Big Darby - Redwood Development Agreement dated July 28, 2023 (the "Big Darby Agreement") to outline the plans and respective commitments of the Developer Property to fulfill the "Big Darby Revenue Program" requirements required by Resolution 0216X-2008; and

WHEREAS, the Big Darby Revenue Program and the Big Darby Agreement require including the Developer Property in a new community district of a new community authority pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") Chapter 349; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2021, Crown Pointe LLC (since assigned and assumed by Metro Development, LLC pursuant to Ordinance 1291-2022, the "Developer") submitted to the Clerk of the Council of the City ("Council"), pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03, a Petition for Establishment of the Big Darby West Broad Street New Community Authority under R.C. Chapter 349 (the "Petition"); and

WHEREAS, the "Big Darby West Broad Street New Community District," as described in the Petition, is located entirely within the municipal corporate boundaries of the City and this Council, as the legislative authority of the City, is therefore the organizational board of commissioners for purposes of the Petition in accordance with R.C. Chapter 349; and

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2021, pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03, Council adopted Resolution 0060X-2021, which determined that the Petition is sufficient and complies with the requirements of R.C. Section 349.03 in form and substance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 0242X-2021 adopted by Council on December 13, 2021, a new community authority with the corporate name designated in the Petition (such name being, the "Big Darby West Broad Street New Community Authority") was organized as a body politic and corporate, and the boundaries of the Big Darby West Broad Street New Community District were made consistent with the boundaries described in the Petition encompassing the property owned by Crown Pointe LLC; and

WHEREAS, on September 9, 2022, applications for the Written Consent to Add Property to the Big Darby West Broad Street NCA (the "Applications") were filed by GMT Property Holdings LLC, Rock Capital Holdings LLC, and Darby Crossing Apartments LP with the Clerk of Council; and

WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution 0182X-2022 and Resolution 0226X-2022 to approve the sufficiency of the Applications, notice the public and hold a hearing on the Applications, and to add the property thereunder to the Big Darby West Broad Street New Community District; and

WHEREAS, on October 2, 2023, another application for the Written Consent to Add Property to the Big Darby West Broad Street NCA (the "Consent") was filed by the Owner with the Clerk of Council; and

WHEREAS, this Council has reviewed the Consent, and by this resolution desires to legislatively determine, pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03, that the Consent complies with the requirements of that section as to form and substance; pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03, to set the time and place of a hearing on the Consent; and further

pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03, authorize the notice by publication of the hearing on the Consent; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Development in that it is immediately necessary to make the legislative determinations described herein regarding the sufficiency of the Consent in order to provide notice in a newspaper for three weeks prior to a public hearing and set the public hearing date within 30-45 days of the date after the Consent was filed in accordance with R.C. Chapter 349 all for the preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety, and welfare; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Columbus that:

SECTION 1. Organizational Board of Commissioners. This Council hereby acknowledges and determines that, pursuant to R.C. Section 349.01(F)(3), it is the "organizational board of commissioners" of the Big Darby West Broad Street New Community Authority for all purposes of R.C. Chapter 349.

SECTION 2. Petition's Sufficiency and Compliance with R.C. Section 349.03. This Council has examined the Consent and finds and determines that the Consent is sufficient and complies with the requirements of R.C. Section 349.03 in form and substance.

SECTION 3. Time and Place of Hearing. Pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03, this Council hereby determines to hold a hearing about the Consent on November 8, 2023 at 1:30 p.m. in the offices of the City Department of Development, 111 N. Front Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215, and this Council hereby authorizes each of the City Attorney, the Clerk of Council, and the City Director of the Department of Development, or any of them individually, to cause notice of the hearing to be published once a week for three consecutive weeks, or as provided in R.C. Section 7.16, in a newspaper of general circulation within Franklin County, Ohio, pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03(A).

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or ten days after the passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

BACKGROUND:

It is necessary under the amendments to the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 ("PURPA"), made in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 ("IIJA"), for the City of Columbus Department of Public Utilities ("CDPU") Division of Power ("DOP") to consider adopting two federal standards related to demand response and demand flexibility and electric vehicle charging programs and provide a written determination of its decision after a public hearing process.

To recommend that the Department of Public Utilities adopt two new Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act standards pursuant to the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021.

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 ("IIJA"), which amended the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 ("PURPA"), requires non-regulated electric utilities that have annual retail electric sales greater than 500 million kilowatt-hours to consider adoption of two new PURPA standards relating to: (20) demand response and demand flexibility and (21) electric vehicle charging programs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus' Department of Public Utilities ("CDPU") Division of Power ("Columbus Power") is a non-regulated electric utility with annual retail electric sales greater than 500 million kilowatt-hours and has generally followed the IIJA's procedures for considering the two new PURPA standards, including providing the public with an opportunity to be heard and undertaking a public hearing process; and

WHEREAS, the Columbus City Council initiated the process to consider the two standards in response to a request from CDPU; and

WHEREAS, as part of its consideration, Columbus City Council was required to convene a public hearing and issue a final determination, in writing, based upon evidence presented in the hearing process and upon findings specifically included in its written determination, and thereafter, make that determination available to the public; and

WHEREAS, Columbus City Council issued a notice of public hearing on November 12, 2022 and again on January 7 and 14, 2023, inviting all interested residents to provide public testimony by submitting written comments on the CDPU's potential adoption of the two PURPA standards by the hearing date of January 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Columbus City Council received no comments on its consideration of the adoption of the aforementioned PURPA standards from any member of the public; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2023, Columbus City Council held the public hearing and heard testimony from two representatives of CPDU: Kristian Fenner, Assistant Administrator of the Division of Power ("Columbus Power"), and Alana Shockey, the Deputy Director of Sustainability and Regulatory Compliance; and

WHEREAS, based on that testimony, Columbus City Council finds that:

- Columbus Power is a full-service, publicly owned electrical utility that provides
 power to more than 17,000 industry, business, and residential customers through its own
 distribution system. It has retail electric sales greater than 900 million kilowatt-hours a year.
 As a nonprofit municipal utility, any proceeds from providing service to Columbus Power
 customers fund city streetlights. Columbus Power is committed to provide reliable and low-cost
 energy services to its electricity customers.
- 2. Columbus Power and CDPU recommended that CDPU adopt the PURPA

standard regarding demand response to continue to promote the use of demand response.

- 3. Columbus Power has an existing demand response program. The City originally enacted legislation in 2009 to aggregate demand response of retail customers. Since 2011, Columbus Power has contracted with a curtailment service providers. The current contract is with NRG through May 31, 2023.
- 4. In adoption of the PURPA demand response standard, Columbus Power plans to promote the existing opportunities to its customers to encourage additional participation in the demand response program established with NRG.
- 5. CDPU houses Columbus Power and the City's sustainability program, Sustainable Columbus. The City is committed to a 45% reduction in emissions by 2030 to meet its goal of carbon neutrality by 2050, as pledged in the Columbus Climate Action Plan. Columbus Power is a full participant in the Plan and is charged with evaluating and implementing projects in the plan.
- Columbus Power and CDPU recommends that CDPU adopt the PURPA standard regarding electronic vehicle charging rates to further consider measures to promote greater electrification of the transportation sector.
- 7. Columbus Power has already considered the efficacy of an electric vehicle charging rate for its customers. In 2017, Columbus Power hired a contractor to analyze setting an electric vehicle charging rate as part of cost of service analysis. At that time, the consultant recommended against adopting the rate to allow further development of data related to energy usage and demands specific to electric vehicle charging sources. To date, Columbus Power has not implemented a specific electric vehicle charging rate.
- 8. In adoption of the PURPA electric vehicle charging rate standard, Columbus Power plans to re-evaluate the efficacy of an electric vehicle charging rate through its current cost of service evaluation.
- 9. The cost of service evaluation is a study that will determine the cost to provide power to each segment of Columbus Power's customers, including electric vehicle charging stations. The main considerations for electric vehicle charging station rate design are: (1) providing a rate that is structured such that the station is economical for electric vehicle owners to use; and, (2) the rate should adequately recover the costs incurred by the system to provide electric service at the station. Typically, a cost of service study takes a year to complete. Therefore, we anticipate recommendations on electric vehicle charging rates to be complete in first quarter 2024.
- 10. Although the PURPA requirements only apply to nonregulated utilities, it is worth noting the strides that the City has made in promoting the greater electrification of the transportation sector through its sustainability work. The City recently adopted the EV Ready Parking Ordinance, which was passed after public notice, comment, and hearing. The implementation of the Ordinance will begin in 2024. Additionally, as part of its Columbus Climate Action Plan, the City is committed to having a zero emissions vehicle fleet by 2030. To support that goal, the City intends to develop an equitable electric vehicle charging plan by 2025; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the IIJA PURPA standards and these findings, Columbus City Council determines that CDPU should adopt the PURPA standards regarding (1) demand response and (2) electronic vehicle charging rates to further consider measures to promote greater electrification of the transportation sector; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the City of Columbus has complied with the requirements of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 with regard to the consideration of the PURPA standards.

SECTION 2. That the public interest is served by the City adopting the aforementioned PURPA standards.

SECTION 3. The City of Columbus shall cause this final determination to be made to the public by publication in the City Bulletin.

SECTION 4. That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

The City of Columbus is committed to improve safety one home at a time by offering gun buyback events, giving away free gun cable locks and lock boxes, and focusing this month on crime prevention; and

WHEREAS, Columbus, Ohio is committed and invested in crime prevention efforts. The City has passed local gun regulations, held rallies for common sense gun reform, and invested millions of dollars in prevention and intervention programs this year; now, therefore

BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes the Executive Director of the Mayor's Office of Education to modify a grant agreement authorized by ordinances 1390-2021 and 1180-2022, with the Workforce Development Board of Central Ohio (WDBCO), to extend the contract to December 31, 2025, and to allow them to use funds to outfit a mobile service unit for postsecondary and career outreach in the Columbus community.

For 33 years, I Know I Can (IKIC), a not-for-profit organization, has been the anchor organization for college access in Columbus, with recent expansion into additional Franklin County districts. IKIC achieves its mission, "to inspire, enable, and support Columbus students to pursue and complete a college education," by focusing service efforts around three critical junctures for students: early awareness of college and career opportunities, postsecondary access, as well as summer melt prevention and postsecondary persistence. WDBCO will contract with I Know I Can to administer this initiative.

Due to COVID-19, in the 2020-2021 school year, many Columbus City Schools (CCS) students had not acquired enough credits to graduate high school or matriculate to the next grade level. Ordinance 1390-2021

provided crucial funding for Summer JAM: a collaborative initiative to assist students with acquiring high school credits and provided them summer employment and other programming.

Of the \$5,855,232.80 encumbered by ordinance 1390-2021, WDBCO invoiced the City for, and received \$3,000,000.00. Of this, only \$1,348,791.00 was spent. WDBCO retained a balance of \$1,651,209.00, \$500,000.00 was re-appropriated by the City and \$2,355,232.00 remains encumbered at the City.

Because of this, Ordinance 1180-2022 authorized the Executive Director of the Mayor's Office of Education to modify the original agreement, to increase the depth and breadth of the college and career readiness services provided to CCS classes of 2022, 2023, and 2024 as well as provide college retention support to graduates who, with ongoing pandemic concerns, are at risk for stopping out due to financial constraints, increased anxiety, and decreased motivation.

WDBCO was provided a deadline of August 31, 2023 to spend down the \$1,651,209.00 in funds already provided to them, and a deadline of August 31, 2024 to allocate the \$2,355,232.00 unspent, but encumbered by the City. For various reasons, WDBCO will neither be able to spend that funds that they possess by August 31, 2023 nor the funds still encumbered by the City by August 31, 2024.

WDBCO also requests that IKIC be allowed to use funding to outfit a mobile service unit for postsecondary and career outreach in the Columbus community

Therefore the Office of Education requests the authority to extend the deadlines in the existing contract to provide WDBCO additional time to do their work.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no new funding associated with this ordinance. The original funding was provided to the City of Columbus from the American Rescue Plan Act passed by Congress and signed into law March 11, 2021.

WHEREAS; For various reasons, WDBCO will be unable to meet the funding deadlines established by the existing agreement; and

WHEREAS; A mobile unit will assist IKIC in meeting students where they are; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the Director of Education is hereby authorized to modify a grant agreement with the Workforce Development Board of Central Ohio to extend the deadlines in the existing contract to provide WDBCO additional time to do their work in support of career and college readiness programs for current, past, and future Columbus City Schools Seniors.

SECTION 2. That the City Auditor is authorized to make any accounting changes to revise the funding source for all contracts or contract modifications associated with this ordinance.

SECTION 3. That the funds necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance are hereby deemed appropriated, and the City Auditor shall establish such accounting codes as necessary.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Cityworks AMS will be a department wide Asset Management solution and will replace Oracle WAM. The software contract is an annual Enterprise licensing agreement that includes cloud-hosting services.

Due to a Request for Proposal (RFQ018791) that was published for the Department of Public Utilities (DPU) to obtain an Asset Management System, Woolpert, Inc. was the awarded firm and the software solution they chose in the proposal was Cityworks. It has been determined that establishing one contract for services with Woolpert, Inc. and one contract for software directly with Azteca Systems, LLC (Cityworks) is the best path forward, and it is in the best interest of the City to waive the provisions of competitive bidding and enter into a contract with Azteca Systems, LLC.

The original contract (PO356535) was established in accordance with the pertinent provisions to waive for competitive bidding of Chapter 329 of the Columbus City Code and authorized with Ord. 2517-2022. Services

under the original contract covers for one (1) year period from date of execution with the option to renew annually for an additional five (5) years on a year-to-year basis, or a portion thereof, based on mutual agreement of the parties, availability of budgeted funds and approval of Columbus City Council. This renewal No. 1 is to provide the necessary funding for the continuation of the Cityworks Asset Management System. This proposed renewal No. 1 is for year two (2) of the contract and to extend the contract through 11/13/2024 and ADD \$421,000.00. Total amount including this renewal is \$802,000.00. This contract shall not automatically renew. All other terms and conditions of the original agreement remain in full force and effect. If unforeseen issues or difficulties are encountered that would require additional funding, a modification would be requested.

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Utilities wishes to renew and increase PO356535 with Azteca Systems LLC for the Cityworks Asset Management System (AMS) software that will become a department wide Asset Management solution and will replace Oracle WAM; and

WHEREAS, due to a Request for Proposals RFQ018791 that was published for DPU (RFQ018791) to obtain an Asset Management System, Woolpert was the awarded firm and the software solution they chose in the proposal was Cityworks. It has been determined that establishing one contract for services with Woolpert and one contract for software directly with Azteca Systems, LLC (Cityworks) is the best path forward, and it is in the best interest of the City to waive the provisions of competitive bidding (City Code, Chapter 329) and enter

into a contract with Azteca Systems, LLC.; and

WHEREAS, the contract amount will be utilized to provide software under this contract related to the Cityworks Asset Management System for use throughout the Department of Public Utilities; and

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to enter into contract with The Righter Co., Inc. for the Raymond and Wilson Bridge Improvements 2023 Project. This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Service to modify a professional services contract with Gannett Fleming Engineers & Architects to add additional funds for the design of the Roadway - Westbourne Avenue Extension project. This modification is to design Blossom Field Boulevard from Broad Street to Westbourne Avenue.

Ordinance No. 1934-2020 authorized the Director of Public Service to enter into a \$500,000.00 professional services contract with Gannett Fleming Engineers & Architects for the Roadway - Westbourne Avenue Extension project. This is a planned modification that is necessary to cover Phase 2 of the design now known as the Roadway - Blossom Field Boulevard - Broad Street to Westbourne Avenue project. This project creates a new public street where a private street (Blossom Field Boulevard) exists from E. Broad Street to approximately 1,800 feet north of E. Broad Street. This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a construction contract with Kenmore Construction Co., Inc. for the JPWWTP Disinfection Piping Replacement project, CIP #650260-102017, in an amount up to \$1,128,278.40, and to encumber funds with the Department of Public Service for prevailing wage services in an amount up to \$2,000.00, for a total expenditure of \$1,130,278.40.

This project will demolish the existing PVC sodium hypochlorite and sodium bisulfite lines. The old chlorine gas lines that feed the induction units will also be removed. The PVC pipe will be replaced with HDPE piping that

will run from the sodium hypochlorite and sodium bisulfite feed pumps to the respective induction units. The project will also replace flowmeters, pressure transmitters, pressure gauges, and heat tracing along the new pipe.

The Community Planning Area is 99 - Citywide, since the Jackson Pike Waste Water Treatment Plant serves several Columbus Communities.

TIMELINE: Contract work is required to be completed in a manner acceptable to the City within 620 days from the date that a Notice to Proceed (NTP) is given by the City.

ESTIMATED COST OF PROJECT: The bid amount and proposed award amount is \$1,128,278.40, including a 20% construction contingency amount that will be utilized to fund needed and approved changes in the work. The Bowen Engineering bid was deemed non-responsive due to not meeting the City MBE/WBE goal requirements. The Kenmore Construction Co., Inc.'s bid was then evaluated and deemed the lowest, best, most responsive bid. Kenmore Construction Co., Inc.'s certification was in good standing at the time of the contract award.

5. MINORITY AND WOMAN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE & SMALL LOCAL BUSINESS

ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

This contract was bid with an anticipated City of Columbus MBE/WBE Program goal of 8% as assigned by the City's Office of Diversity and Inclusion (ODI). After ODI's review of the Utilization Plan and Good Faith Effort submitted by Bowen Engineering, ODI deemed their bid non-responsive for not meeting the goal and for an insufficient Good Faith Effort.

The next low bidder, Kenmore Construction Company, submitted a Utilization Plan meeting the 8% goal. After review of their Utilization Plan and other related information the contractor submitted with their bid response, ODI has approved an MBE/WBE Program goal of 8% for this contract. Failure by the contractor to meet this goal subjects the contractor to the Penalties for Non-Compliance as described in the bid documents for this contract.

The strength levels for most general fund agencies are set to be equal to the 2023 budget as amended by City Council (including the Departments of Health and Recreation and Parks). Authorized strength levels of smaller non-general fund agencies are set to be equal to the adopted 2023 budget as amended, while the strength levels of certain larger non-general fund agencies may have their strength set slightly higher to allow for flexibility in hiring.

Within City Council an increase of nine full-time positions are requested to account for two additional Council members and associated staff. Two positions are requested for the City Attorney's Office to assist with the Zone initiative. The Municipal Court Clerk requests to change one part-time position to full time, resulting in no overall change in authorized strength. The Civil Services Commission requests to increase by one full-time position. Within the Department of Safety, the Administrative Division requests one additional full-time position in the Human Resources section. The Department of Public Service requests to increase by three full-time positions in the Administrative Division for various initiatives.

Fiscal Impact: Funds for these strength levels are budgeted and/or the positions will not be filled until revenues have been clearly identified and appropriated. In all cases, the ability to hire will be monitored by the Division of Finance and Management. As such, there is no fiscal impact associated with passage of this ordinance.

Emergency Justification: Emergency action is requested to allow for the filling of budgeted vacant positions in certain departments in order to provide for the efficient operation of the city that will assure the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare.

To establish a new authorized strength ordinance for various divisions in the City of Columbus; to repeal ordinance 1619-2023; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Executive 2023 budget was submitted to City Council on November 10, 2022 for consideration; and

The foregoing positions authorized include all positions within each department, division, board, office or commission, whether appointed or elected except the members of any board or commission authorized by charter or ordinance. No Appointing Authority shall appoint full-time or part-time personnel in excess of the maximum permitted by this ordinance unless authorized by ordinance of City Council.

SECTION 2. Such of the positions within the Division of Fire as the Director of Public Safety and Fire Chief shall designate, shall be within the uniformed ranks and all other positions therein shall be deemed civilian positions, provided there shall not be in excess of five (5) Fire Assistant Chiefs and there shall not be in excess of four (4) Fire Deputy Chiefs; as a normal complement, in excess of thirty-six (36) Fire Battalion Chiefs nor as a temporary complement, in excess of thirty-seven (37) Fire Battalion Chiefs at any one time; sixty-three (63) Fire Captains nor as a temporary complement, in excess of sixty-four (64) Fire Captains at any one time; one (1) Fire Chief; and two-hundred nine (209) Fire Lieutenants. The complements of fire captains and fire lieutenants are intended to be temporary, subject to review and change at any time.

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a Capital Contribution Agreements with Columbus Downtown Development Corporation (CDDC) in an amount up to \$550,000.00 for the property renovation portion of the Downtown Ground Floor Growth Initiative.

The Downtown Ground Floor Growth Initiative (Program) (formally called the Downtown Commercial Marketplace Program) is a small business program that seeks to achieve multiple goals through one comprehensive program. The Program includes:

- · Providing downtown storefront space for small, local businesses who are oriented towards walk in customers (such as retail or restaurant businesses).
- · Providing a master lease holder to: 1) sublease to small, local businesses in a way that promotes their growth and gives them a safe place to land, and 2) rent vacant properties downtown and guarantee stability for the property owners of those spaces.
- · Providing technical assistance to the Program participants so that the businesses renting the downtown storefronts can grow and succeed.
- Provide funds for the renovation of properties rented as part of the Program.

This Program is designed to decrease vacancy downtown; promote small, local businesses; and promote the amenities of downtown as a neighborhood for Columbus residents living and working inside and outside of downtown.

Capital funds in an amount up to \$1,000,000.00, approved within the 2023 Capital Improvement Budget, will be used to renovate spaces selected for the Ground Floor Growth Initiative. This Ordinance represents \$500,000.00 of the full commitment. Property owners and program participants will contribute to the planning of and investment in the selected spaces. The City will partner with CDDC to implement part of this Program and this legislation is one of multiple pieces of legislation being put forth for this Program. The City is also partnering with Columbus Compact Corporation (Ordinance 2044-2023) to identify up to 10 small businesses to participate in the Program and to provide technical assistance to the participants.

Using bond funds, CDDC will work with the City and Columbus Compact Corporation to identify vacant, ground floor, downtown space that, with assistance from the City and other stakeholders including the property owner

and the program participants, can be transformed into a space for selected program participants. Once a business and space are approved for the Program, CDDC shall submit to the department a cost estimate for the renovation (design and construction costs). Once a project is approved by the City, funds will be advanced to CDDC to manage the renovation. With this ordinance, up to \$500,000.00 of the \$1,000,000.00 commitment is available for renovations costs. The additional \$500,000.00 will be legislated at a later date. CDDC will be advanced \$50,000.00 for administration services. Project funds will be advanced on a project by project basis, but the administration funds will be advanced in full. To further assist local business, CDDC shall publicly procure design and construction services for this Program and shall pay prevailing wage, as applicable under Ohio law.

Fiscal Impact: Funding in the amount of \$500,000.00 is available in the 2023 Capital Improvement Budget. An amendment to the 2023 Capital Budget is required to establish sufficient budget authority for the project. Funding in the amount of \$50,000.00 is available in the General Fund Job Growth subfund.

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Safety, on behalf of the Division of Fire, to enter into a contract with and issue a purchase order to ESO Solutions, Inc. for software integration and licensing. The contract is necessary to provide Fire Incident Reporting via ESO's cloud-based software for the period covering December 1, 2023 through November 30, 2024. This contract will provide incident reporting coverage until the current Request For Proposal (RFP) process is completed which solicits a replacement system. A waiver of the competitive bidding provisions of the Columbus City Code, Chapter 329 is necessary for this purchase to accommodate the RFP process.

This software platform provides for the Fire Division's incident reporting needs, with each of the approximately 170,000 calls for service taken per year requiring an incident report. These reports are maintained as a records database, and must be retained as permanent records. These incident reports are sent to the US Fire Administration and the Ohio Fire Marshal as mandated by Federal and State requirements. In addition to these incident reports, this software platform manages all inspections conducted by the Columbus Fire Prevention Bureau, which total approximately 35,000 occupancies annually; accompanying the inspections are the issuance of fire permits, which generates \$1.5M of revenue for the City annually.

Contract Compliance: ESO Solutions, Inc. (#36-4566209) - (Vendor #023932)

Emergency Designation: This legislation is to be declared an emergency measure to allow for the immediate purchase of these software services until the RFP process is complete.

Fiscal Impact: This ordinance authorizes the expenditure of \$110,508.75 from the General Fund for this expenditure. (43206)**, to permit habitable space above a detached garage with reduced development standards in the R-2F, Residential District (Council Variance #CV22-098).

WHEREAS, by application #CV22-098, the owner of the property at **703 S. 5TH ST. (43206)**, is requesting a Variance to permit habitable space above a detached garage with reduced development standards in the R-2F, Residential District; and

The system supports separate portals for tenants, property managers/landlords, agencies, and community. The system is ADA compliant and supports multi-language applications. This software moves applications quickly through the process of approval and meets eligibility requirements. The system provides consistency among agency partners and flexibility to fund applications efficiently.

The software has been in use since the city started distributing ERA funds, early in the COVID-19 pandemic. Up until now, HDS has had individual contracts with the city's non-profit partners and each organization paid for a portion of the software. That type of contract management has proved to be challenging and threatened to hold up use of the system by all if an organization did not make payment. Moving the contract to the city, with the city funding it, provides security and continues the efficiency and ease of use already established for the remainder of the program. Program/grant closeout will occur in FY 2023 and records need to be maintained for five years after grant closeout.

Sole Source Request: Under the authority of Columbus City Code Chapter 329.19(e), the Director of the Department of Development is requesting that this be considered a Sole Source Procurement because the software is only available from HDS and it would be prohibitive to do a competitive procurement effort to change software while nearing the end of the federal program. The current software houses all data and reporting needs for closing out the program and for record retention. Federal regulations (2 CFR 200.320(c)(2) authorizes a non-competitive procurement if the item is available only from a single source. See attached sole source document.

BACKGROUND: The Director of Human Resources seeks the authority to modify and increase the contract currently in effect with Safex, Inc. for occupational safety and health and industrial hygiene related activities. The City entered into the original contract effective March 1, 2020 (Ord. 0266-2020), and renewed the contract earlier this year (Ord. 0112-2023).

The Bureau of Workers Compensation (BWC) encourages employers to enhance occupational safety and health programs and initiatives. The initial legislation as well as this ordinance enables the city to do so and reflect the City's ongoing effort to promote workplace safety and efficient claims management. This contract allows the city to provide industrial hygiene and occupational safety services, as required by state and federal law. Continuing the existing contractual relationship with Safex Inc. enables the administration to achieve its objective of improving the level of workplace safety and decreasing the risk of exposure to injury. This female owned business has helped the city in all aspects of industrial hygiene and occupational safety tasks in an efficient and cost effective manner.

Costs initially legislated, per Ordinance 0112-2023, totaled \$100,000.00. This modification provides for an additional \$25,000.00 for expenses related specifically to hazardous waste training, quantitative exposure assessments, and evaluation of city buildings and work place settings for bio-hazard concerns. At the time the original contract was legislated, the Occupational Safety team had a full slate of projects to complete in 2023 and was unaware that hazardous waste mitigation and related projects would be needed in several City buildings in 2023. The cost of the projects being completed using these funds was determined based on the rate currently effective in the original contract.

This legislation serves to increase the maximum obligation liability by \$25,000.00, bringing the total contract obligation to \$125,000.00, and authorizes the expenditure of the additional \$25,000.00.

It would not be in the City's best interests to have additional contract requirements awarded through other procurement processes specified in chapter 329 of the Columbus City Code because Safex, Inc. won the industrial hygiene 2019 RFP and has contract with the City since 2004 on such matters, thus bringing a wealth of institutional knowledge and experience.

FISCAL IMPACT: Sufficient funds are available and budgeted in the Employee Benefits Fund for this purpose.

Emergency Action: Emergency action is being requested to allow Safex to begin assessment and training for hazardous waste mitigation in City buildings immediately.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Human Resources to modify and increase the existing contract with Safex, Inc., to provide industrial hygiene services and occupational safety program assistance; to authorize the expenditure of \$25,000.00 from the Employee Benefits Fund, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay the costs of said contract modification; and to declare an emergency. (\$25,000.00)

WHEREAS, Safex, Inc. was originally engaged to provide industrial hygiene services and occupational safety program assistance and related activities pursuant to Ordinance 0266-2020, adopted by City Council on February 10, 2020, for a contemplated three-year contract and two one-year options to renew; and

The contract language allows for two (2) one (1) year renewal options on a year to year basis upon mutual agreement, availability of funds, and approval by Columbus City Council. The Central Ohio Hospital Council a 501(c)(3) organization that facilitates collaboration between area hospitals and community stakeholders to improve the quality, value, equity, and accessibility of health care in the region. Its four members include Mount Carmel Health System, Nationwide Children's Hospital, The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center, and OhioHealth.

Columbus City Council has worked with the Central Ohio Hospital Council and its members to coordinate a large-scale debt forgiveness for Columbus residents who earn less than 400% of the federal poverty level. Under the hospitals' existing policies, those earning less than 200% of the federal poverty level already fall under charity care and do not hold medical debt from these hospitals. Debt forgiveness is targeted at those who received care from 2015 through 2020.

Central Ohio Hospital Council expects that 340,660 Columbus residents will receive debt forgiveness, with the average recipient receiving forgiveness in the amount of \$984. The total amount of debt forgiven across the four hospitals is expected to be \$335,213,212.00. In partnership with its members, the Central Ohio Hospital Council will work with a third party to validate patient data in order to mail notification letters of the debt forgiveness. Individuals will not need to take any further action.

This contract will support the validation of patients' income and address data and mailing costs of notification letters. The hospitals are supplying the staff and time to execute this data collection and notification process. Coordination of data collection and the notification process from the various participants cannot logistically be completed by existing city employees.

Fiscal Impact: Funding is available within the general fund.

Emergency Justification: It is essential to notify residents of a relieved liability as soon as possible in order to reduce confusion and provide increased financial stability. Therefore, this contract must be executed as quickly as possible.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Finance and Management to enter into a not-for-profit service contract with the Central Ohio Hospital Council; to authorize the transfer of \$500,000.00 within the General Fund; to authorize the expenditure of up to \$500,000.00 from the general Fund; and to declare an emergency. This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to forgive the principal and interest accrued at the property located at 398 S Grant Ave., Columbus, Ohio 43215 which was originally developed by National Church Residences as The Commons at Grant Limited Partnership and was the first property of significant size (100 units) to serve as permanent supportive housing in Ohio. A HOME loan was made on January 17, 2002 in the amount of \$1,500,000.00 from the City of Columbus for site acquisition and construction of the project which has been providing affordable housing for eligible residents since that time. The interest rate on the loan is 5.46% and the current balance of the loan exceeds \$4,374,025.00. The required federal compliance period for this loan is complete and the restrictive covenant can be released. The project has not had sufficient cash flow for most of its existence due to the population served and the cost of wrap around services. The completion of the 20 year HOME affordability period has passed and the property remains as a permanent supportive housing provider for those who were homeless or at risk of homelessness.

The City HOME loan matured on June 27, 2023 and because of limited rental income and higher operating costs that include extensive supportive services to assist the tenant population, the development is not able to repay the debt. The property owner has requested and the Development Department supports the request to forgive the loan.

Emergency action is requested so that The Commons at Grant Limited Partnership can remove the debt from its financial statements since the 20 year HOME affordability period is completed and the development is not able to repay the debt although the property remains as a permanent supportive housing provider for those who were homeless or at risk of homelessness.

FISCAL IMPACT: There will be a loss of about \$4,372,025.00 in fully reserved HOME receivables.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to forgive the principal and accrued interest for The Commons at Grant Limited Partnership on a HOME loan due to the City of Columbus totaling approximately \$4,375,025.00; and to declare an emergency. (\$4,375,025.00)

BACKGROUND:

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to forgive the principle and accrued interest for the property located at 3426 Corban Commons Dr., Columbus, Ohio 43219 that was originally developed by four mission driven non-profits Dayspring Christian Community Development Corporation, Columbus Housing Partnership dba Homeport, My Brother's Keeper (affiliated with Mt Hermon Missionary Baptist Church) and New Salem Real Estate Holdings (affiliated with New Salem Baptist Church) for low income elderly housing. A HOME loan was made on December 21, 1988 in the amount of \$720,000.00 from the City of Columbus for site acquisition and construction of the project which has been providing affordable housing for eligible residents since that time. The interest rate on the loan is 5.25% and the current balance of the loan exceeds \$1,500,000.00. The required federal compliance period for this loan is complete and the restrictive covenant can be released. The project has never operated at a profit. The completion of the 20 year HOME affordability period has passed and the owner would like to recapitalize using 4% LIHTC funding and have requested gap funding from the City and other sources to do so.

The property is being refinanced and re-syndicated to allow the property to remain affordable housing for decades to come. In order to recapitalize the property it must take on additional debt. The owners must show the additional debt and the existing city debt can be paid in full for the new debt to not be considered a grant. If it is considered a grant, the low income housing tax credit basis and the corresponding tax credit equity will be reduced causing a funding gap.

The debt forgiveness policy of the Development Department allows debt forgiveness in those instances in which the affordability period has been completed and debt forgiveness will facilitate recapitalization of the project with a new affordability period and monitoring by an outside agency - in this case, it will be monitored by OHFA for an additional 30 years.

Emergency action is requested so that Agler Elderly Housing Limited Partnership can remove the debt from its financial statements before the property is recapitalized.

FISCAL IMPACT: There will be a loss of about \$1,500,000.00 in fully reserved HOME receivables.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance is being submitted to set forth the municipal services and zoning conditions the city of Columbus will provide upon annexation of a territory located in Franklin Township. This ordinance is required by the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) as enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio. An annexation petition has been filed with Franklin County for this property. A service ordinance must be passed before the annexation meeting takes place before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County. Information regarding municipal services that would be available, should the subject site be annexed, has been compiled and is reflected in this ordinance. Should the petition be approved by the County Commissioners, a second City ordinance accepting the annexation will be required to complete the process. The time frames specified in the ORC require that this legislation be filed as emergency.

FISCAL IMPACT: The statement of municipal services and zoning conditions for a proposed annexation area has no fiscal impact. While provision of the stated services does represent cost to the City, annexation of land also has the potential to create revenue to the city.

To set forth a statement of municipal services and zoning conditions to be provided to the area contained in a proposed annexation (AN23-017) of 0.47± Acres in Franklin Township to the city of Columbus as required by the Ohio Revised Code and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Franklin Township was duly filed on behalf of Melissa & Adam Boals on October 4, 2023; and

WHEREAS, a hearing on said petition is tentatively scheduled before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County on October 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code requires that before said hearing the Municipal Legislative Authority shall adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the municipal corporation will provide to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation; and

Public Safety: After reviewing the proposed annexation, it is my opinion that the City of Columbus, Department of Public Safety is able to provide the appropriate level of safety related services to the proposed annexation area. While the petitioner for annexation may have proposed future development plans for the property in question, the Department of Public Safety requests that the City exercise its discretion in the coming development planning and review process to ensure any future development will be properly served by the

Department of Public Safety. Discussions between the City and the present property owner or any future developers regarding post annexation changes in zoning or other changes to the property should include the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Development to ensure any proposed development of the annexation property may be adequately accommodated. Specific details for safety services are dependent upon the parameters of future development that is ultimately approved by the City.

Sanitation: Residential refuse collection services will be available upon annexation of the property.

Transportation: Maintenance will be available for any additional right-of-way that may be included in this annexation request. If this annexation contains existing signalized intersections, those intersections and signals are subject to Transportation Division Policy, which appeared in the December 6, 2003 Columbus City Bulletin, and any subsequent updates thereto.

Water: This property does not have access to a public water main along the frontage of Ongaro Drive. The applicant would have to get a private easement from adjacent property that fronts Poplar Bend Drive to obtain access the 8" public water main, or have a water main extension, designed and constructed at their expense, from Wilson Road to this property (approximately 850 feet).

Sanitary: DOSD has no objection regarding this annexation. This parcel doesn't have direct access to a sanitary sewer but it is tributary to 36" RP7393. If this parcel needs to connect to a sanitary sewer then a sanitary sewer CC plan is required to extend sewer to the parcel, connection to which will be made at the owner's expense.

Sewers: All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners and developers at their own cost and expense with no cost to the City.

Storm: All storm sewers necessary for development/redevelopment of the area shall be designed in accordance with design policy and zoning codes in effect at the time of development.

All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners/developers at their own expense with no cost to the city.

Section 2. If this $0.47\pm$ acre site is annexed and if the City of Columbus permits uses in the annexed territory that the City of Columbus determines are clearly incompatible with the uses permitted under current county or township zoning regulations in the adjacent land remaining within Franklin Township, the Columbus City Council will require, in the zoning ordinance permitting the incompatible uses, the owner of the annexed territory to provide a buffer separating the use of the annexed territory and the adjacent land remaining within Franklin Township. The Division of Housing's Homeowner Services Center has grant programs that assist individuals and families with remaining in their homes and live independently in a safe and sound environment. Programs include: Emergency Repair, Roof Replacement, and Critical Home Repair. These programs are currently bond funded or had been bond funded in the past but are now funded with Community Development Block Grant funds. Once a project at a home is approved, City staff engage a contractor to do the work, and then City staff inspect the work before deeming the project complete.

Division staff who inspect the projects are budgeted in the General Fund. They track their time inspecting bond eligible projects and each quarter, the department does an expenditure correction to move the inspection expense to bond funds. In years past, the expense was charged to a blanket Auditor's Certificate Purchase Order (ACPO). Beginning this year, the department desires to establish a dedicated Auditor's Certificate Direct Invoice (ACDI) for this expense. New ACDI's will be established in future years as needed.

Emergency action is requested in order to move expenses timely and maintain an accurate General Fund budget.

Fiscal Impact: \$50,000.00 is available in the 2023 Capital Improvement Budget, Development Taxable bond fund. An amendment to the 2023 Capital Budget is required to establish sufficient budget authority for the project.

As Columbus continues to grow, there are real concerns that housing affordability and supply issues will continue to worsen. This change allows for the program to be executed as was detailed in Ordinance No. 2499-2023, including the advance of all funds to the Tony R Wells Foundation.

Emergency action is requested in order to mitigate any negative impact on the planning processes of small business owner recipients. Due to the size of this grant program, applications are expected to come in quickly. The review committee will make all efforts to process and approve applications in an expedient manner in order to avoid any delay in notifying small business owners. Similarly, the Wells Foundation will quickly process applications to send grants to small business owners as quickly as possible. E-bikes are electric bicycles with a motor that gives riders a boost. E-bikes are a low-cost, energy efficient, climate-friendly form of transportation. E-bikes use rechargeable batteries and travel up to 28 mph. When you use an e-bike to get around, you can:

- Save thousands of dollars per year on fuel and maintenance by replacing daily car trips with e-bike rides
- · Bike greater distances and across harder terrain
- Set aside worries about arriving sweaty at your destination
- · Reduce your carbon footprint while running errands or commuting to work

In addition to creating low-cost, affordable transportation, e-bikes also provide climate-friendly transportation and will help Columbus reach its Climate Action Plan goals by reducing the carbon footprints in the Columbus community.

In July of this year, we launched the Resident E-bike Subsidy Program and provided vouchers for residents who were interested in purchasing an e-bike. Residents applied for the program and once selected to receive a voucher, were able to redeem the voucher at the point of sale and the bike shop would in turn receive that money. This program was wildly successful with over 1300 applicants within 24 hours and nearly 70% of the vouchers have been claimed and redeemed.

As a result of this success, this ordinance authorizes additional funding to support the cost of additional vouchers for the Resident E-bike Subsidy Program by entering into a grant agreement with Smart Columbus, LLC, a nonprofit entity, that will issue vouchers for resident purchases of e-bikes in accordance with the Program parameters.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to enter into a grant agreement with Smart Columbus, LLC in an amount up to \$250,000.00 for the Resident E-bike Subsidy program to continue the creation of multimodal transportation options for residents that reduce the carbon footprint in Columbus and

supports our goal of carbon neutrality by 2050; to authorize the appropriation and expenditure in the Neighborhood Initiatives Subfund; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, creating multimodal forms of transportation is paramount; and

WHEREAS, e-bikes serve as a low-cost, affordable form of transportation; and

WHEREAS, electric modes of transportation assist in lowering our carbon footprint; and

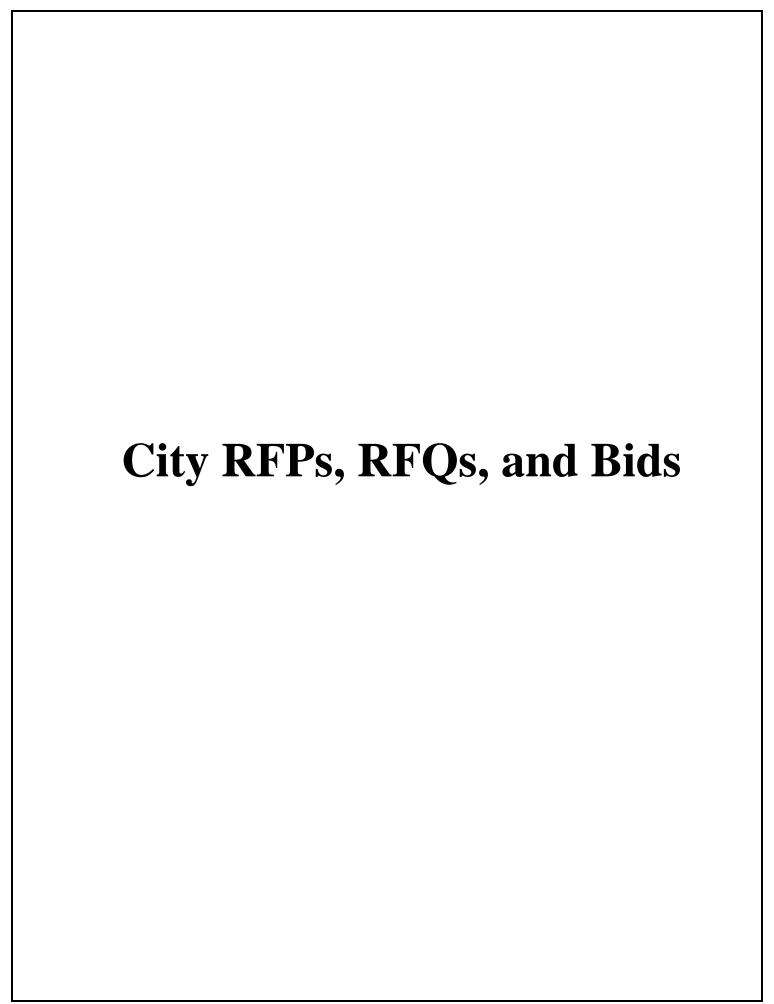
