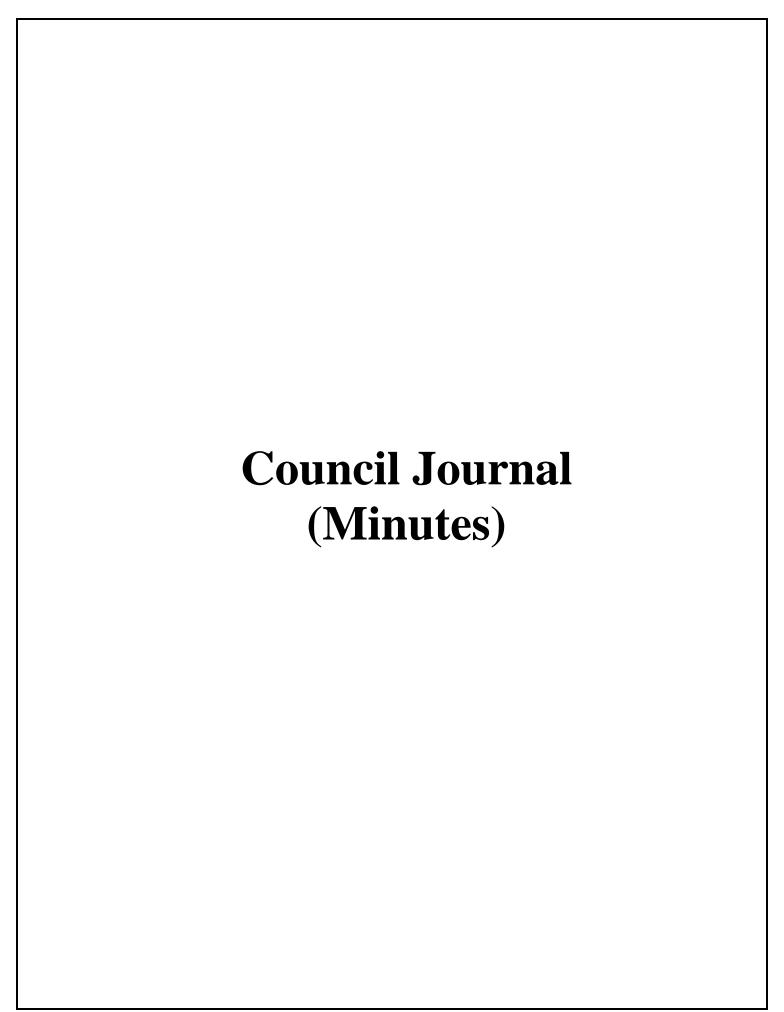


SIGNING OF LEGISLATION

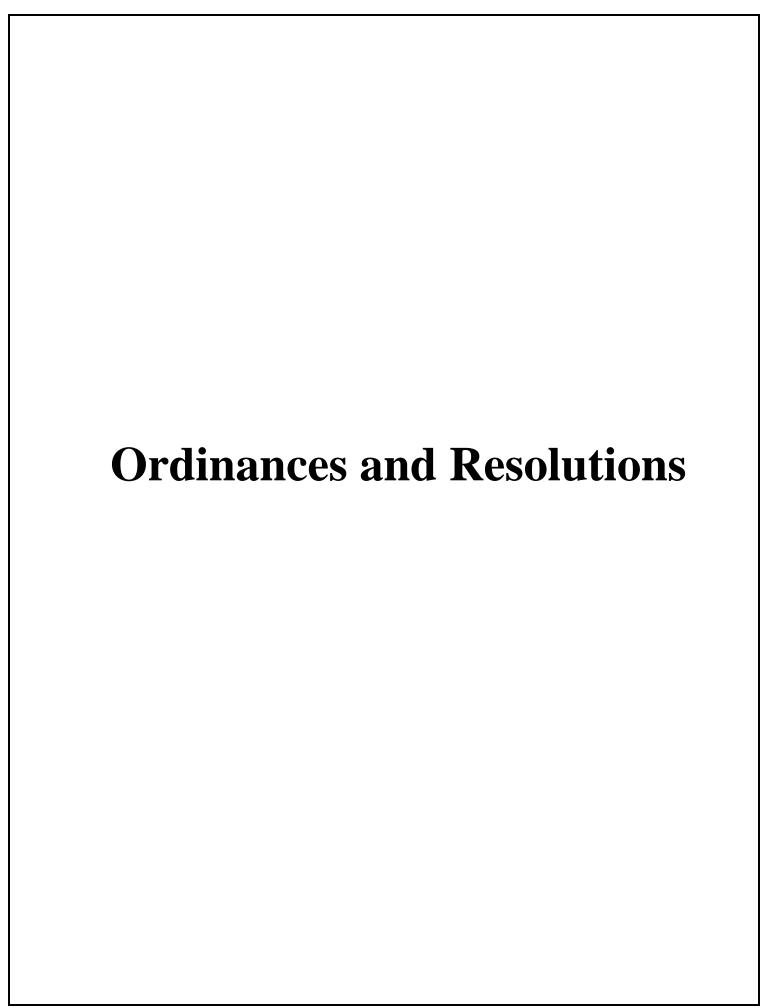

The City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities offers a Low Income Water and Sewer Discount Program to qualifying customers. A 20% discount is available on water and sewer consumption charges for qualifying low-income customers. In 2023, the department is also offering a one-time \$60 bill credit for approved customers. This credit was made possible due to the City's receipt of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, which were appropriated to the City's Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. The purpose of this legislation is to transfer funds totaling the amount of the bill credits issued to date from the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to the Water Operating Fund.

There was a total of three (3) bids submitted. After the review of the bids, the lowest bidders (LESWEGO Corp and NAPA) provided bids for a machinery that was not a part of the bid specifications. Therefore, these bidders have been deemed non-responsive. The Fleet Division recommends the award be made to Planet Holdings as their initial bid came out to being the lowest and best bid response to bid specifications, length of warranty and available delivery date:

Fiscal Impact: A total of \$26,432.00 will be spent from the Fleet Management Capital Fund 5205. Amendments to the 2023 Capital Improvement Budget and transfers of cash within Fund 5205 will be necessary to align budget authority and cash with the proper projects.

Research shows that women who experience non-fatal strangulation with an intimate partner are seven times more likely to be killed by that partner. On April 4, 2023, Ohio adopted legislation making strangulation of an intimate partner or household member a felony crime (Ohio Senate Bill 288). Charging these high-risk cases as felonies allows the system to hold dangerous offenders accountable while also creating opportunities for victims to understand the seriousness of their situations and link with the resources needed to interrupt cycles of violence--violence interrupters that will save lives.

Type:

The City of Columbus received a United States Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), 2023 Improving Criminal Justice Response (ICJR) program grant. This ordinance accepts and appropriates \$800,000 in ICJR funds. This funding enhances and expands justice services and programs implemented through the City of Columbus and Franklin County Blueprint for Safety: Interagency Response to Domestic Violence initiative by creating a Domestic Violence Strangulation Task Force.

The Strangulation Task Force is a working committee of the Blueprint for Safety team and will focus on effective implementation of Ohio Senate Bill 288. Task force members include city and county prosecutors, detectives, patrol officers, judge(s), advocates and forensic nurses. The group will guide the development of response directives that promote flawless implementation of the law and rock-solid evidence collection, so cases can move forward with or without victim engagement. The group will also bring in experts to train justice processionals on the immediate and lasting impact of strangulation on the brain and body and how to use trauma informed techniques to help victims feel safe, trusted and able to share details of, often horrific, crimes in a supportive/non-triggering manner.

Through the three year award period, the group will produce and implement model response directives and training curriculum; present staffing solutions to accommodate increased caseloads for police detectives and prosecutors; and create consistent access to advocacy service for felony victims at municipal court arraignment. Funding will go to the Columbus City Attorney's Office and the Columbus Division of Police for staffing, training and equipment investments increasing their capacity for sustainable response.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes the acceptance and appropriation of \$800,000 in OVW 2023 Improving Criminal Justice Response funding from the United States Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women. This initiative does not generate any revenue nor require a City match.

This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department Public Service to close out the G591410 (Main Street at McNaughten Road 97197) grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) for the Intersection Improvements - Main Street at McNaughten Road PID 97197 project.

Ordinance 1393-2014 authorized the Director of the Department of Public Service to accept the Main Street at McNaughten Road grant and execute a grant agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation and to enter into contract with Korda/Nemeth Engineering, Inc. for the Intersection Improvements - Main Street at McNaughten Road project.

Ordinance 3009-2016 authorized the City Attorney's Office, Real Estate Division to hire professional services and to negotiate with property owners to acquire the various property rights necessary to complete the Intersection Improvements-Main Street at McNaughton Road project.

Ordinance 1950-2018 authorized the Director of the Department of Public Service to modify a professional services contract with Korda/Nemeth Engineering to add additional funds for design of the Intersection Improvements - Main Street at McNaughten Road project.

Ordinance 0923-2019 authorized the Director of the Department of Public Service to enter into contract with Shelly & Sands, Inc., for the Intersection Improvements - Main Street at McNaughten Road project and to provide payment for construction, construction administration and inspection services.

When completing the grant reconciliation for G591410 Main Street at McNaughten Road 97197, it was determined the grant was under charged for eligible expenses in both design and right of way costs. This ordinance allows the Director of the Department of Public Service to move expenses into grant number G591410 Main Street at McNaughten Road 97197 in order to complete final accounting and close the grant out. The total amount of grant funding from ODOT is \$1,932,982.14, of which \$111,213.64 needs to be appropriated.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

Funds in the amount of \$158,821.46 are available in Fund 7765, the Federal Transportation Grants Fund in G591410 (Main Street at McNaughten Road 97197) to expenditure correct to Fund 7704, the Streets and Highways Bond Fund, P530086-100029 (Intersection Improvements - Main Street at McNaughten Road). 1.2. Reason other procurement processes are not used:

The original professional services agreement was bid out and planned for a total of two contract modifications. The original agreement was executed in January 2022 to provide funds for approximately a one year period or until all funds are expended. This is the first modification to add funds.

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Service, or a designee, to expend up to \$100,000.00 to facilitate the mobilization and deployment of Rocky Fork Company for the provision of snow removal and de-icing services during episodes of heavy snowfall this winter.

The Department of Public Service administers a variety of municipal services within the City of Columbus necessary to public health and safety, including snow removal and de-icing during inclement weather. With more than 90,000 lane miles of roadways to service each winter, the Department of Public Service seeks the assistance of other jurisdictions and independent contractors to supplement City crews on local roadways. This year, the Department of Public Service posted two separate solicitations seeking local companies to assist in snow and ice removal operations on an on-call basis. Rocky Fork Company responded offering to support those operations by providing up to twenty four (24) trucks and staff capable of plowing or de-icing during heavy snowfall. This legislation seeks to authorize the execution of a service contract between the Department of Public Service and Rock Fork Company and the expenditure of up to \$100,000.00 to support the same.

2. CONTRACT COMPLIANCE

Rocky Fork Company will be required to become contract compliant prior to execution of the proposed service contract.

3. FISCAL IMPACT

This Ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department Public Utilities to modify and increase the professional services agreement with EMA, Inc. for the Advanced Metering System (AMS) Study and Implementation Project, CIP #690358-100000, in an amount up to \$1,200,000.00

In 2015 the Department of Public Utilities awarded a contract to EMA, Inc. through the City's Request for Proposal process to develop and recommend a strategy, roadmap, and plan for implementation of an Advanced Metering System (AMS) for water and electrical meters. The contract was for the entire process anticipated to last several years and to consist of the following phases:

Phase 1: Develop an AMS System Roadmap (current)

Phase 2: Prepare an AMS system RFP

Phase 3: Coordinate an AMS System Vendor Selection Process

Phase 4: Provide program management assistance during the implementation.

Under Original Contract No. EL017444 authorized by Ordinance 1597-2015, the Department of Public Utilities contracted with EMA, Inc. to assist in Phase 1 of the contract which was to develop and recommend a strategy, roadmap, and implementation plan of an Advanced Metering System (AMS) for water and electric meters. Under this phase, EMA, Inc. evaluated state-of-the-art AMS technologies; evaluated and compared cost impacts; developed a detailed implementation schedule; and assisted the City in budgetary planning efforts.

Modification No. 1 occurred in May 2017 to procure Phase 2 Services, which included preparation of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for an AMS system that clearly defined the City's objectives and requirements.

Modification No. 2 occurred in June 2019 to provide Phase 3 and Phase 4 Services, which included coordination of the AMS System vendor selection process, assisting the City in negotiating the technical requirements of the project so a final scope and cost could be determined for the project solution, and program management assistance.

Modification No. 3 occurred in October 2021 to provide continued Phase 3 and Phase 4 Services. This included coordination of AMS business process development, program management assistance during the implementation of the project, and coordinating the system installation, system interface development and testing plans.

Modification No. 4 occurred in November 2022 to provide continued Phase 4 Services. These services included continued program management assistance during implementation from Proof of Concept through mass meter installations, introduction to the customer portal, vendor management, area management, continued public outreach communications, installations inspections, and reporting.

Modification No 5 (current) is a planned modification to continue providing Phase 4 Services. This includes continued program management assistance during implementation from Proof of Concept through mass meter installations, introduction to the customer portal, vendor management, area management, continued public

outreach communications, installations inspections, and reporting. Due to the volume of meter installations this phase is projected to last the remainder of the project and will need annual funding through the project completion.

The planning area is "99 - Citywide" as this project serves multiple planning areas.

1.2. Reasons additional goods/services could not be foreseen:

This is a planned modification as indicated in the original authorizing legislation, Ordinance No. 1597-2015, as well as the modifications under Ordinance No's 0797-2017, 1847-2019, 2572-2021, and 2746-2022.

1.3. Reason other procurement processes are not used:

Modifications to the agreement were planned as part of the original Request for Proposals RFP. Additionally, the current consultant is familiar with the project and has completed all the work to-date. Bidding the work to another consultant will further delay the project and will result in higher costs due to bringing the new consultant up to speed on the project.

1.4. How cost of modification was determined:

An AMS program is favorable to DPU's operations and customer service functions, as replacing older water and electrical meters will improve service, decrease burden on maintenance operations, reduce water loss, and improve revenue. Moving from quarterly to monthly billing will have a positive impact on customers as the bills will be more manageable in both cost and time.

4. CONTRACT COMPLIANCE INFORMATION

EMA, Inc.'s contract compliance number is CC007843 and expired 10/7/23. Contract compliance will need to be renewed before the contract modification can be executed.

Background: The Director of the Department of Human Resources seeks the authority to utilize the subscription services of Salary.com LLC to provide a market data tool for the City's Compensation Office. The

survey tool is called Comp Analyst and will be able to aggregate several thousand salary surveys across all industries in both the public and private sector. The data will augment surveys conducted internally by the Compensation Management team with like jurisdictions ranging from local to national geographies.

To acquire a subscription service for a salary survey tool in the most timely manner, it was critical for the City and the Compensation Management team to perform due diligence. The internal team identified several potential providers known to the compensation professional community. Market data industry leaders were contacted to gain knowledge of their products and pricing options. Presentations were given and each bidder followed up with question-and-answer meetings and any additional requested information.

Four reputable market data providers that were considered were Economic Research Institute (ERI); Mercer; Payscale, Inc.; and Salary.com LLC. The following table details the offers and terms from each provider:

After thorough analysis of the services provided, cost, quality of product, and performance in other venues, the salary survey tool offered by Salary.com was determined to be the best for the City. The rationale is as follows:

- · Robust, aggregated survey data with 4,300 benchmark jobs and more than 15,000 unique jobs in its database
- · More than 25,000 organizations contribute to the continuously updated data
- · Professional Human Resources-reported compensation data, not employee-reported data, which can be filtered by geography, industry segments, organization size, and other scopes of study
- · Other contract amounts were offered for varying time periods, but the platform is trustworthy and well-respected, so the five-year time period is both appropriate and fiscally responsible
- · Upon contract approval, Salary.com LLC will provide access codes for immediate web-based access to the platform

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Human Resources to enter into a five year subscription contract with Salary.com LLC consisting of one initial year and four one-year renewals and will further authorize the expenditure of \$16,000.00 for the initial year one, to commence shortly after the passage of this ordinance.

The competitive bid process would not be conducive to acquiring a subscription service for a market data survey tool. Therefore, competitive bidding requirements are being waived.

This ordinance authorizes modifying and increasing two contracts with Vertiv Corporation. First, the ordinance authorizes modifying and increasing a contract with Vertiv Corporation, for annual maintenance and related

services associated with the Department of Technology's uninterrupted power supply (UPS). Ordinance 0580-2023, which passed on March 13, 2023, authorized, via bid waiver, entering into contract with Vertiv Corporation for the above-noted maintenance services. The term of the contract authorized by Ordinance 0580-2023 was for one year, beginning on April 19, 2023 and ending on April 18, 2024, at a total cost of \$89,243.02. It has been determined that additional funds will be needed to undertake UPS maintenance for the balance of the above-noted term. Thus, this ordinance authorizes modifying the UPS contract authorized by Ordinance 0580-2023 by adding \$33,093.06 to the original amount. This modification will be co-termed with the contract expiring in April 2024.

Although maintenance services for the UPS systems are available from other suppliers, Vertiv Corporation is the only factory-authorized service provider for the UPS equipment used at the City's data centers. Where alternate providers of UPS services are required to utilize Liebert technicians, Vertiv Corporation's policy is to bill the end user directly and not the third-party service provider; nor does Vertiv Corporation support third-party organizations with technical back-up or guaranteed parts availability. Given the critical need for reliable UPS systems at the city's data centers, it is in the city's best interests to contract directly with Vertiv Corporation. As such, this modification is being submitted with a request to waive relevant portions of Columbus City Codes relating to competitive bidding.

Second, this ordinance also authorizes modifying and increasing a contract with Vertiv Corporation for HVAC maintenance and repairs. These services were also most recently authorized by Ordinance 0580-2023. The term of this contract, authorized by Ordinance 0580-2023, was for one year, beginning on April 19, 2023 and ending on April 18, 2024, at a total cost of \$74,798.59. This ordinance authorizes adding \$35,000 to the existing HVAC maintenance and repair contract. This modification will also be co-termed with the contract expiring in April 2024.

The need for these additional goods and services would not have been foreseen when the original contract was awarded as the amount of and need for repair and maintenance services varies from year-to-year. It would not be feasible to bid this out at this time as the current vendor is familiar with DoT's UPS and HVAC systems and will bill DoT directly, thus not requiring a third-party provider. The named vendor provided DoT with a quote for the above-described services.

Finally, this ordinance also authorizes the total expenditure of \$68,093.06 for the above-noted services.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funds for this ordinance are budgeted and available in the Department of Technology's Information Services Operating Fund.

Background: The Department of Development seeks to enter into multiple contracts in an amount totaling up to \$925,000.00 for the implementation of the third year of the Accelerate Columbus program targeting small businesses.

In 2019, the City of Columbus launched Accelerate Columbus Small Business as part of a branded set of small business training, technical assistance, mentoring, and advisement programs targeting aspiring entrepreneurs and existing small business owners. Initially offered as a pilot program, the goal of the program was to provide structured as well as on-demand training, one-on-one advisement, and technical assistance to both aspiring and existing entrepreneurs and small businesses.

During the pilot year, the City selected and contracted with two organizations to administer the program on behalf of the City. The consultants administered the program in both classroom and small group settings over two tracts targeting businesses at particular stages of the business lifecycle. Accelerate Columbus: Start-Up and Launch targeted individuals in the exploration, ideation, and pre-revenue business lifecycle stages and Accelerate Columbus: Scale Up and Grow targeted those businesses in a revenue-generating posture and who were uniquely positioned for growth.

In 2022, the City selected and contracted with seven organizations to administer the Accelerate Columbus: Scale Up and Grow program on behalf of the City. These Entrepreneur Support Organizations provided services aimed at increasing the quality of local small business in individual and small group settings. By way of this ordinance, the director seeks to encumber the planned funds from the 2023 operating budget for multiple contracts to administer the third year of the Accelerate Columbus program with to-be-determined firms. The department is currently engaged in the Request for Proposal process per Columbus City Code Chapter 329, but the process will not be completed before City Council's last meeting in 2023. It is estimated that the contracts with the selected vendors will be legislated and executed in January 2024.

This ordinance is submitted as an emergency to ensure continuity of the Accelerate Columbus Program and to utilize the 2023 General Funds in which this program was budgeted.

Fiscal Impact: \$875,000.00 is planned and available within the Economic Development Division's General Fund budget and \$50,000.00 is planned and available within the Office of Diversity and Inclusion's General Fund budget.

To authorize the Director of Development to encumber funds for multiple contracts totaling an amount up to \$925,000.00 with to-be-determined firms for the implementation of the Accelerate Columbus program targeting small businesses; and to authorize the expenditure of up to \$925,000.00 from the General Fund; and to declare

an emergency. (\$925,000.00)

WHEREAS, the Director of Development seeks to enter into multiple contracts for the implementation of the third year of the Accelerate Columbus program targeting small businesses; and

The dollar amount of purchases that may need to be made against individual universal term contracts is unknown at this time as it depends upon breakage, equipment failures, and other factors. It is anticipated the Department of Public Service will need to expend more than \$100,000.00 in a fiscal year to purchase from some universal term contracts established for traffic management and control for the Department of Public Service. 1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Service to modify an existing service contract with Data Ticket, Inc. (Data Ticket) to facilitate the continued operation and maintenance of certain systems currently utilized to support parking enforcement efforts by the Department of Public Service, Division of Mobility & Parking Services.

Pursuant to Ordinance 3148-2022, the Department of Public Service, acting through its Director, executed a professional services contract with Data Ticket to oversee the implementation and operation of citation processing and permit management systems intended to streamline and improve on-street parking enforcement. The initial cost to implement and operate those systems for the first year was estimated to be \$1,200,000.00. However, due to unexpected cost overruns related to the acquisition and installation of license plate recognition

equipment, it is now necessary to encumber additional funding to support the provision of services through the initial contract term.

Amount of additional funds to be expended:

\$750,000.00

Original contract amount: \$1,200,000.00

Reason additional goods/services could not be foreseen:

Due to issues impacting the functionality and usability of the license plate recognition equipment initially installed in parking enforcement vehicles, it ultimately was necessary to remove those devices and source different units from an alternate supplier. The final cost to procure and install the new license plate recognition equipment was nearly double the original cost estimate.

Reason other procurement processes are not used:

It ultimately would have been more cost prohibitive and untimely to initiate a separate competitive procurement process to source the necessary license plate recognition equipment directly from a qualified manufacturer or retailer and to have that vendor make any modifications to those devices that might have been needed to render them compatible with the citation processing and permit management systems developed and operated by Data Ticket.

How cost of modification was determined:

The funding needed to support the proposed contract modification reflects the estimated cost to sustain the continuation of monthly services through at least March 2024 based on the average cost of services in the past 60 days.

2. CONTRACT COMPLIANCE

The contract compliance number for Data Ticket, Inc. is CC-042414, which expires July 12, 2024.

3. FISCAL IMPACT

Funding in the amount of \$750,000.00 is available within the Mobility Enterprise Operating Fund for this expenditure; however, the necessary funds must be appropriated because this is an unplanned expense.

4. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION

Emergency action is requested to facilitate the execution of the requisite contract modification as soon as reasonably practicable so as to prevent an interruption in services.

To authorize the City Auditor to appropriate funds within the Mobility Enterprise Fund; to authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to modify an existing service contract with Data Ticket, Inc. for the provision of off-street parking management services; to authorize the expenditure of up to \$750,000.00 from the Mobility Enterprise Operating Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$750,000.00)

WHEREAS, Ordinance 3148-2022 authorized the execution of a service contract between the Department of Public Service and Data Ticket, Inc. (Data Ticket), to facilitate the implementation and operation of citation processing and permit management systems intended to streamline and improve on-street parking enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the operational funding previously appropriated pursuant to Ordinance 3148-2022 will be exhausted prior to the conclusion of the initial contract term due to unexpected cost overruns related to the acquisition and installation of license plate recognition equipment; and

WHEREAS, this legislation seeks to authorize the Director of Public Service, or a designee, to execute a contract modification with Data Ticket for the purposes of amending the initial contract term and authorizing the encumbrance and expenditure of additional funding to support the provision of services through that time; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Director to modify an existing contract as soon as reasonably practicable so as to prevent an interruption in services, thereby preserving the public health, peace, property, safety and welfare; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That from the unappropriated monies and from all monies estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources and unappropriated for any other purpose during the fiscal year ending December 31, 2023, the sum of \$602,000.00 is appropriated in Fund 6500 (Mobility Enterprise Operating Fund), Dept-Div 59-06 (Division of Mobility & Parking Services), Object Class 3 (Services) per the account codes in the attachment to this ordinance.

SECTION 2. That the Director of Public Service be and is hereby authorized to execute a contract modification with Data Ticket, Inc., to facilitate the continued operation and maintenance of the Citation Processing Management System and the Permit Management System utilized to support parking enforcement efforts by the Department of Public Service, Division of Mobility & Parking Services.

SECTION 3. That the expenditure of \$750,000.00, or so much thereof as may be needed, is authorized in Fund 6500 (Mobility Enterprise Operating Fund), Subfund 650001 (Mobility Enterprise), Dept-Div 59-06 (Division of Mobility & Parking Services), in Object Class 03 (Services) per the accounting codes in the attachment to this ordinance.

SECTION 4. That the City Auditor is authorized to make any accounting changes to revise the funding source for all contracts or contract modifications associated with this ordinance.

SECTION 5. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approvals by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

BACKGROUND: Canine "Maverick," a Bomb Squad dog, was acquired by the Division of Fire in 2016; "Maverick" will be retiring from active service effective October 2023 and will continue living with his handler,

Type:

Firefighter Richard Harding.

It is recommended that "Maverick" be sold to Firefighter Harding, who will continue to provide a good home to this canine that has served the citizens of Columbus for several years. Firefighter Harding will sign a general release document that relinquishes the City of Columbus from any liability as it relates to the post-retirement care and control of canine "Maverick," and assigns that liability to Firefighter Harding.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact upon the Fire Division due to this ordinance.

To authorize and direct the Director of the Department of Finance and Management to sell to Firefighter Richard Harding, for the sum of \$1.00, a Bomb Squad canine with the registered name "Maverick", which has no further value to the Division of Fire; and to waive the provisions of the Columbus City Codes, Sale of City-Owned Personal Property. (\$1.00)

WHEREAS, it is recommended that canine "Maverick," a retired Bomb Squad dog with the Division of Fire since 2016, be authorized to be sold to handler Firefighter Richard Harding; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to waive the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of the Columbus City Codes relating to the Sale of City-Owned Personal Property to permit the aforementioned sale; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to allow this canine to be purchased by Firefighter Richard Harding for the sum of \$1.00; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary in the usual daily operation of the Department of Finance and Management to authorize the Director to sell this canine upon his retirement; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the Finance and Management Director be and is hereby authorized and directed to sell a Bomb Squad canine with the registered name of "Maverick" to Firefighter Richard Harding.

SECTION 2. That the Council finds that the Bomb Squad canine with the registered name of "Maverick" is no longer needed by the City for public use.

SECTION 3. That this Council finds it is in the best interest of the City to waive the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of the Columbus City Codes relating to the Sale of City-Owned Personal Property to permit the sale of this specific Bomb Squad canine "Maverick" to Firefighter Richard Harding for the sum of \$1.00.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes the amendment of Ordinance No. 2635-2023, passed by Columbus City Council on September 18, 2023, to authorize the modification of the vehicle model, and to declare an emergency.

Ordinance No. 2635-2023, passed by Columbus City Council on September 18, 2023, authorized the Fleet Management Division on behalf of the Administrating and Presiding Judge of the Franklin County Municipal Court to establish a purchase order for one vehicle from Ricart Properties Inc. The ordinance states in Section 2 that the vehicle purchased for the Municipal Court's Specialized Enforcement and Response Team (SERT) will be a 2022 Ford.

Due to the supply available, the vehicle year needs to be changed from 2022 to 2021.

Emergency action is requested to prevent the loss of the held vehicle and allow the SERT Unit to fulfill its primary mandate to oversee individuals considered to be at the highest risk for domestic violence and violent offenses, increasing safety in the community.

FISCAL IMPACT: No additional funding is necessary.

To amend Ordinance No. 2635-2023, passed by Columbus City Council on September 18, 2023, to authorize the modification of the vehicle year listed in Section 2, and to declare an emergency. (\$0.00)

WHEREAS, the Fleet Management Division on behalf of the Administrating and Presiding Judge of the Franklin County Municipal Court to establish a purchase order for one vehicle from Ricart Properties Inc for a 2022 Ford.; and

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Technology (DoT) to enter into a two-year contract with OARnet/OSU, a non-profit organization, for VMWare software licensing, maintenance, and support services. The original agreement (EL011737) was authorized by ordinance 1716-2010, passed December 13, 2010. The agreement was most recently renewed by authority of ordinance 0887-2023, passed by Columbus City Council on April 26, 2023. The total cost associated with this ordinance is \$916,566.52 for the coverage term period from April 2, 2024 to April 1, 2026.

Through the State of Ohio Virtualization Program, OARnet offers significant discounts on VMWare that are not available in the market place. As such, it is in the city's best interests to procure VMWare through OARnet, rather than another procurement process. The pricing offered to the city reflects the agreed upon public sector discounts available to all participants in the State of Ohio Virtualization Program.

Server virtualization is the conversion of one physical server into multiple individual and isolated virtual storage spaces. This industry standard was adopted by the DoT in 2009 to reduce the costs of Data Center operations. This also reduces power consumption, cooling requirements, and provides further capabilities for recovery and availability of information systems. VMWare software is the core component that is needed in order to operate virtual servers that run critical applications for the enterprise such as Accela, CUBS, and 311.

This ordinance also authorizes the appropriation of \$1,170,328.00 to the Department of Technology, Information Services Division, from the unappropriated cash balance of the Information Services Operating fund, pursuant to the projections outlined in DoT's 3rd quarter 2023 review submission.

Additionally, this ordinance authorizes various transfers in the Information Services Division's operating fund. As part of the 2023 third quarter financial review, the Department of Technology and the Department of Finance and Management identified surpluses and deficits in various object classes within the technology services fund. In order to properly align appropriations with projected expenditures and allow divisions to operate without interruption through the end of 2023, it is necessary to transfer \$3,210,538.00 among divisions

and object classes within the Information Services operating fund.

Finally, this ordinance authorizes the expenditure of \$916,566.52 for the above-mentioned purpose.

NOT-FOR-PROFIT CONTRACT INFORMATION

This agreement is being awarded under City Code section 329.30, which prescribes the method for contracting with not-for-profit organizations. DoT and OARnet negotiated the cost for provision of the above-described services, the costs for which are outlined in the attachment to this ordinance. The services being authorized herein include VMWare software licensing, maintenance, and support.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funds for the above-described services are budgeted and available within the Department of Technology, Information Services Division, Information Services Operating Fund.

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Director of the

Department of Technology enter into contract with OARnet/OSU for VMWare software licensing, maintenance, and support, pursuant to Columbus City Codes sections relating to not-for-profit service contracts,

PROPOSED USE: Non-accessory parking garage.

NORTH LINDEN AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The site consists of two undeveloped parcels in the R-3, Residential District, located along a public alley west of 2877 Cleveland Avenue. The requested Council variance will allow a non-accessory parking garage with the capacity to securely park four transport vans utilized by a local non-profit organization. Variances to prohibited parking, lot width, lot area, and fronting are included in the request. The site is within the planning boundaries of the *North Linden Neighborhood Plan Amendment* (2014), which recommends "Low-Medium Density Residential Uses" at this location. While the proposed use is inconsistent with Plan's land use recommendation, the garage will be used for the sole purpose of parking. The site fronts on a public alley where parking and vehicular access is the predominant use.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3332.035, R-3 residential district; 3312.35(B), Prohibited parking; 3332.05, Area district lot width requirements; 3332.13, R-3 area district requirements; and 3332.19, Fronting, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **2877 CLEVELAND AVE.** (43224), to allow a non-accessory parking garage with reduced development standards in the R-3, Residential District (Council Variance #CV23-038).

WHEREAS, by application #CV23-038, the owner of property at **2877 CLEVELAND AVE. (43224)**, is requesting a Council Variance to allow a non-accessory parking garage with reduced development standards in the R-3, Residential District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.035, R-3 residential district, lists single-unit dwellings as the only allowed residential use, while the applicant proposes a garage that will provide secure parking for transport vans utilized by a local non-profit organization; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.35, Prohibited parking, prohibits commercial vehicles from being stored on residentially-zoned lots, while the applicant proposes a non-accessory parking garage on the subject site for four transport vans utilized by a local non-profit organization; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.05(A)(4), Area district lot width requirements, requires a minimum lot width of 50 feet in the R-3, Residential District, while the applicant proposes to maintain a reduced lot width of 47± feet; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.13, R-3 area district requirements, requires that a single-unit dwelling or other principal building shall be situated on a lot of not less than 5,000 square feet in area, while the applicant proposes a reduced lot area of 4,700± square feet; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.19, Fronting on a public street, requires a building to have frontage on a public street, while the applicant proposes no frontage on a public street which is an existing condition of this lot; and

WHEREAS, the North Linden Area Commission recommends approval; and

WHEREAS, City Departments recommend approval of the requested Council variance because the proposed garage will be specifically used by a local non-profit organization for securely parking transport vehicles, and is located along a public alley were the predominate use is parking and vehicular access; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance requires separate submission for all applicable permits and a Certificate of Occupancy for the proposed use; and

WHEREAS, said variance will not adversely affect the surrounding property or surrounding neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, the granting of said variance will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent properties or unreasonably increase the congestion of public streets, or unreasonably diminish or impair established property values within the surrounding area, or otherwise impair the public health, safety, comfort, morals, or welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, the granting of said variance will alleviate the difficulties encountered by the owner of the property located at 2877 CLEVELAND AVE. (43224), in using said property as desired; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That a variance from the provisions of Sections 3332.035, R-3 residential district; 3312.35(B), Prohibited parking; 3332.05, Area district lot width requirements; 3332.13, R-3 area district requirements; and 3332.19, Fronting, of the Columbus City Codes, is hereby granted for the property located at **2877 CLEVELAND AVE. (43224)**, insofar as said sections prohibit a non-accessory parking garage in the R-3, Residential District; with a reduced lot width from 50 to 47 feet, reduced lot area from 5,000 to 4,700 square feet, and no fronting on a public street for the proposed garage, said property being more particularly described as follows:

2877 CLEVELAND AVE. (43224), being 0.11± acres located on the west side of a public alley 160± west of Cleveland Avenue, and 140± feet south of Weldon Avenue, and being more particularly described as follows:

Situated in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin and in the City of Columbus: Being 47 feet off the south side of Lots Numbers Thirty-nine (39) and Forty (40) of Crest Linden Addition, as the same are numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat thereof, of record in Plat Book 10, Page 66, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, being all of parcel numbers 010-073064 & 010-073065, also known as: Vacant land near Weldon Avenue, Columbus, OH 43224.

SECTION 2. That this ordinance is conditioned on and shall remain in effect only for so long as said property is used for a non-accessory parking garage, or those uses permitted in the R-3, Residential District.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is further conditioned on the Subject Site being developed in general conformance with a site plan titled, "SITE PLAN," dated August 24, 2023, and signed by Stephen Garland, the Applicant. The Plan may be slightly adjusted to reflect engineering, topographical, or other site data developed at the time of the development and when engineering and architectural drawings are completed. Any slight adjustments to the Plans shall be subject to review and approval by the Director of the Department of Building and Zoning Services, or a designee, upon submission of the appropriate data regarding the proposed adjustment.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is further conditioned upon the applicant obtaining all applicable permits and

a Certificate of Occupancy for the proposed use.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

The Columbus Fashion Council is a non-profit organization seeking to expand the fashion economy in Central Ohio through a combination of industry growth initiatives, community organizer support, funding access opportunities, and creative program development.

Columbus Fashion Council - Curvy Runway Show, which took place on September 29, 2023, featured three new plus-size designers in the city of Columbus. This was a part of Fashion Week Columbus (FWC).

FWC is a business platform and incubator for small businesses, and this was the first dedicated plus-sized show in the city of Columbus. The hope is to platform these designers and help them grow into businesses to storefronts in the city.

Fiscal Impact: Funding is available within the Neighborhood Initiatives subfund.

To authorize the City Clerk to enter into a grant agreement with CMH FASHION WEEK, INC dba the Columbus Fashion Council in support of their Curvy Runway Show; and to authorize an appropriation and expenditure within the Neighborhood Initiatives subfund. (\$10,000.00)

WHEREAS, The Columbus Fashion Council is a non-profit organization seeking to expand the fashion economy in central Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Columbus Fashion Council - Curvy Runway Show, which took place on September 29, 2023, featured three new plus-size designers in Columbus; and

WHEREAS, Fashion Week Columbus is a business platform and incubator for small businesses; NOW, THEREFORE,

BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health has been awarded grant funds from the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO). This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate \$70,000.00 in grant monies to fund the CDC's Building Up Infection Prevention & Control in Local Departments in Healthcare-Associated Infections and Antimicrobial Resistance (BUILD HAIAR) Grant Program for the period of October 17, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

Healthcare-Associated Infections (HAIs) are infections that patients acquire during the course of receiving healthcare services in hospitals, long-term care facilities, outpatient clinics, and other healthcare settings. HAIs pose a significant threat to patient safety and public health. These infections can cause prolonged hospital stays, increased morbidity and mortality rates, and sizeable financial burdens on healthcare systems. Despite substantial advancements in infection prevention and control practices, HAIs remain a persistent problem. The evolving nature of infectious agents, the emergence of antibiotic-resistant strains, and the complex dynamics within healthcare environments contribute to the ongoing transmission of HAIs. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Division of Healthcare Quality Promotion in partnership with NACCHO, will provide funding to strengthen local health department's capacity for healthcare-associated infections and antimicrobial resistance prevention and response.

Columbus Public Health will build upon its existing efforts to increase the capacity to improve healthcare infection prevention and response efforts, including COVID-19 and other HAIs, as well as those infections caused by antimicrobial resistant pathogens. This grant will provide training and certification for Long Term Care Infection Prevention for program staff with funding from CDC Grant# 6NU38OT000306-04-01, CFDA# 93.421.

This ordinance is submitted as an emergency to avoid forfeiture of the grant; to meet the deliverables of the grant; and to increase capacity to improve healthcare infection prevention and response efforts affecting public health and safety;

FISCAL IMPACT: The NACCHO Grant Program is entirely funded by the CDC Grant. This program does not generate any revenue or require a City match. (\$70,000.00)

The data migration from the legacy records management system (NetRMS) to the Motorola PremierOne Records system was authorized under ordinance 0343-2014 passed February 24, 2014 (EL015362), and awarded through solicitation SA005116, allowing for the data to be housed in one system.

The PremierOne Records Computerized Crime Data Reporting System is a proprietary system from Motorola Solutions, Inc., the sole provider and copyright holder of the system. As such, the City must purchase annual support and maintenance from Motorola Solutions, Inc. For this reason, this ordinance is being submitted in accordance with the provisions of sole source procurement of the City of Columbus Code, Chapter 329.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Technology (DoT) to modify an existing contract with Brown Enterprises, LLC for upgraded Smartsheet Control Center subscriptions and licenses for various city departments. Smartsheet is used by several city agencies as it is (and can be) used to collaborate on project timelines, documents, calendars, assignments, and related tasks. Smartsheet's relatively simple user interface centers on "smartsheets," similar to other popular spreadsheets. Additionally, Smartsheet can import data from other applications, such as Microsoft Office or Google.

In July 2021, DoT received four (4) responses to RFQ019097. Brown Enterprises, LLC submitted the lowest responsive quote and was awarded the contract. The original contract, authorized by Ordinance 1926-2021 and passed on July 19, 2021, contained language allowing for up to three (3) renewals with mutual agreement by all interested parties. Ordinance 2142-2023 authorized the second of the three (3) allowable renewals for a

one-year term, beginning on September 1, 2023, and ending on August 31, 2024. Since this ordinance modifies the second renewal and will be co-termed with that contract, this modification will begin on the date of a confirmed purchase order by the City Auditor's Office and will end on August 31, 2024.

The need for these additional licenses was not known at the time the original contract was awarded. At that time, city departments were becoming familiar with the functionalities of the Smartsheet application and its usefulness in daily operations. After using it for two-plus years, it has been determined that additional functionality would greatly enhance departmental efficiencies. The total of the requested modification is \$53,947.22. DoT wishes to modify the current contract with Brown Enterprises rather than bid it out at this time. Doing so would be disruptive to operations, as Brown holds the current contract. The amount was determined via the submission of a quote from Brown.

Finally, this ordinance authorizes the expenditure of up to \$53,947.22 for the above-described purpose.

FISCAL IMPACT

In 2021, ordinance 1926-2021, which passed on July 19, 2021, authorized the original contract at a cost of \$71,140.00. To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to execute those documents necessary for the City to grant revocable encroachment easements to Joseph and Cindy Keaton for a cinder block retaining wall at 81 North Harris Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43204 (parcel 010-007965).

The Department of Public service is engaged in the Operation Safewalks - FRA-SRTS Grace St Sidewalks (3683-E) project. The purpose of the project is to add compliant sidewalks and improve existing curb ramps along Grace Street from Orel Avenue and to the alley west of Roys Avenue and from Hague Avenue to Eureka Avenue. A need for sidewalks along this corridor was identified in the School Travel Plan for Columbus City Schools report and in a safety study completed by the Division of Traffic Management in February 2020.

The City of Columbus, Department of Public Service, received a request that the City grant a Revocable Encroachment Easement to allow a portion of their cinder block retaining wall (0.0053 acres) to remain on City property within existing right-of-way. The existing cinder block retaining wall was identified to be encroaching into the right-of-way while reviewing the construction plans for the project. The cinder block retaining wall is not impacting any functionality of the right-of-way. Granting these encroachment easements is needed in order for ODOT and the City of Columbus to clear the right-of-way for this project. The following ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Service to execute documents necessary to grant these encroachment easements for the proposed building into the public rights-of-way.

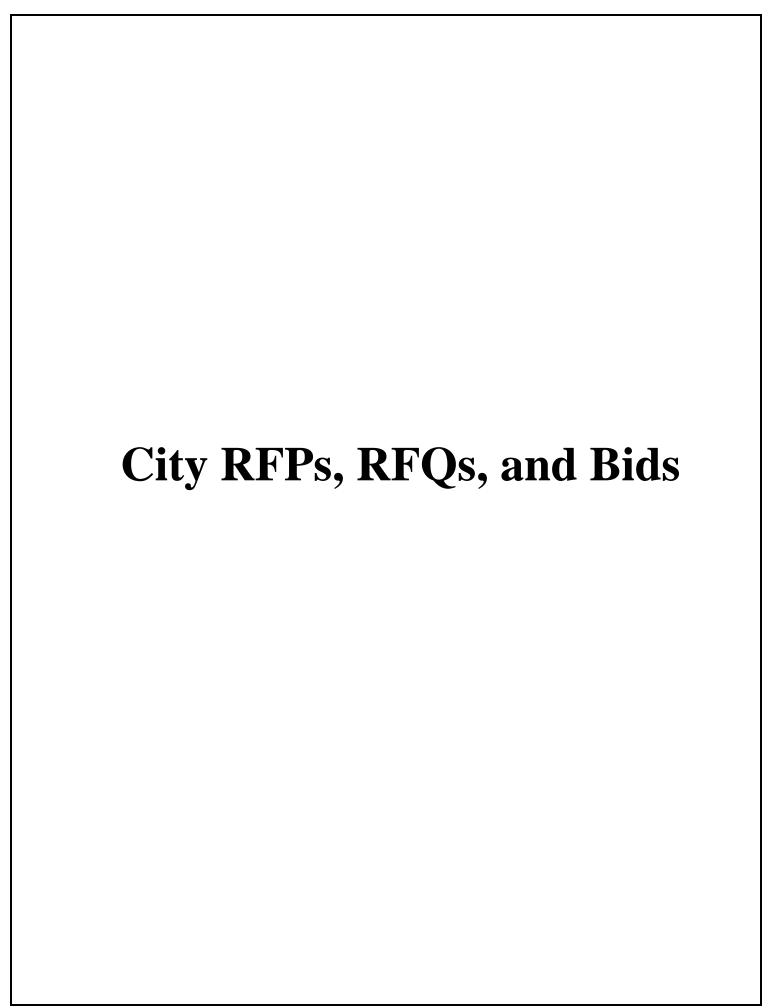

WHEREAS, the staff of Columbus Public Health recommend the following food service operation and retail food establishment license and facility layout & equipment specification review fees to recover current costs of the food protection program; and,
