


SIGNING OF LEGISLATION

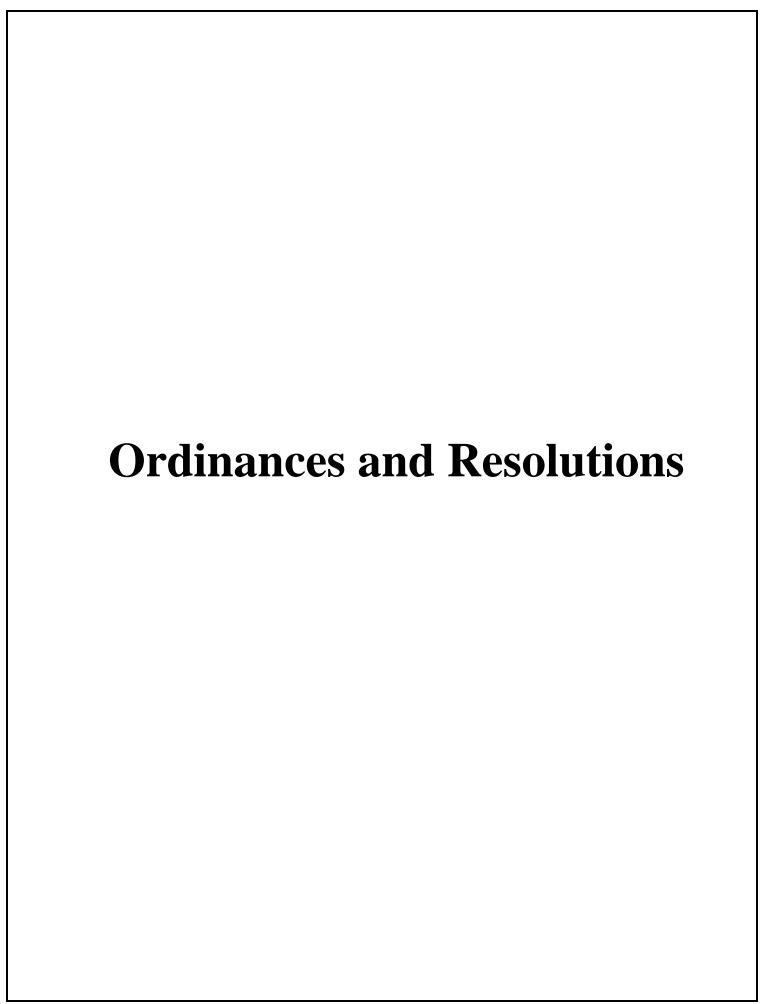

In 2019, the city executed a formal bid for industrial hygiene and occupational safety and health professional services. The RFP was published on December 11, 2019 and bids were opened on January 9, 2020. information was available on the city's vendor services website. Safex Inc. was the only vendor to submit a bid. The Department of Human Resources Occupational Safety and Health Program Manager worked with Safex, Inc. to develop a favorable agreement. The result was a three year contract, beginning March 1, 2020, and lasting for three years. Following the third year and assuming sufficient appropriation, two additional one-year contract extensions are permissible.

The Bureau of Workers Compensation (BWC) encourages employers to enhance occupational safety health programs and initiatives. This legislation enables the city to do so and exhibits an ongoing effort to promote workplace safety and efficient claims management. This contract allows the city to provide industrial hygiene and occupational safety services, as required by state and federal law. Since 2004, Safex Inc. has done an outstanding job of responding to the needs of city departments. Continuing the existing contractual relationship with Safex Inc. enables the administration to achieve its objective of improving the level of workplace safety and decreasing the risk of exposure to injury. This female owned business has helped the city in all aspects of industrial hygiene and occupational safety tasks in an efficient and cost effective manner.

The contract term is for three years, with the option to renew for two additional one-year periods, subject to sufficient appropriation.

This contract shall run from March 1, 2024 to February 28, 2025. This is the second of the two permissible one-year contract extensions.

Safex Inc.'s contract compliance number is 311365251.

Emergency action is requested in order that industrial hygiene services and safety program assistance may continue without disruption.

Fiscal Impact:

Funding for this contract totals \$100,000.00 and is specifically budgeted in the 2024 employee benefit fund budget and is contingent on passage of Ordinance 3012-2023, the 2024 other funds appropriation legislation.

BACKGROUND: In 1984, the City responded to concerns raised by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regarding potential exposures to employees at the City's trash burning power plant. The City began testing employees at the Columbus Department of Health. In particular, the Occupational Safety and Health Clinic provided medical surveillance examinations, pre-placement examinations, immunizations, health and fitness assessments,

clearance for respirator wear, assessment of workers' fitness for duty, consultation, hearing conservation training, and audiometric testing.

In 2006, Columbus Public Health restructured its focus from internal safety assessments to monitoring community health status, public health threats, and preventing/controlling disease. The City then shifted the operations of employee occupational safety and health medical services from Columbus Public Health to the Department of Human Resources. This was done in an effort to provide focused and coordinated occupational safety and health medical services in accordance with the Public Employment Risk Reduction Program (PERRP), OSHA, and the State Bureau of Workers Compensation (BWC).

Currently, the Occupational Safety and Health Clinic provides surveillance exams and appropriate follow up to at risk City employees, identifies occupational related disease or disability, assists in rehabilitation activities, determines fitness and suitability for assigned work, and promotes and maintains PERRP/OSHA compliance. The Clinic also promotes employee health, wellness, and quality of life by preventing and controlling disease/injury, providing assistance in injury care activities and rehabilitation activities, and providing educational and training programs promoting employee wellness and safe work practices.

This contract was re-bid in September, 2016; Mt. Carmel Health Providers was declared the successful bidder. This ordinance represents the third of three one-year contract extensions approved in the original five year contract. Every year the contract renewal is subject to approval by both parties as well as sufficient appropriation and funding.

This ordinance authorizes and directs the Director of the Department of Human Resources to enter into contract with Mount Carmel Health Providers for occupational safety and health medical services for the City of Columbus. In addition, this ordinance authorizes the expenditure and establishes a maximum obligation liability of \$360,000.00 to be paid from the employee benefits fund. The contract dates are from March 1, 2024 to February 28, 2025.

Contract compliance number is 31-1382442.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding for this contract totals \$360,000.00 and is budgeted in the 2024 employee benefits fund budget. This ordinance is contingent on the passage of the 2024 Other Funds operating budget, Ordinance 3012-2023.

BACKGROUND: The Department of Human Resources, Risk Management Office, requires services to verify the accuracy of the Bureau of Workers' Compensation payroll and claims data for the City of Columbus; to provide occupational injury management data, general workers' compensation consulting services; to calculate the allocation of workers' compensation claims experience by department, division, and fund; to conduct claims management on a per request basis; and to attend Industrial Commission hearings on a per request basis.

The Department of Human Resources executed a Request for Proposal (RFP) in late 2019, for workers' compensation cost containment services. In accordance with relevant sections of the Columbus City Codes, Chapter 329, CCI Investments, LLC dba CareWorks Comp, now called Sedgwick Claims Management Services, Inc., was the recommended service company based on the ability to assist the city with cost saving strategies in its workers' compensation program.

The term of the contract was three years, with the option to extend, upon mutual agreement and with sufficient appropriation, for two additional one-year contracts. This represents the second of the two additional one-year contracts and the cost is \$55,000.00.

Sedgwick Claims Management Services, Inc. (formerly CareWorks Comp) has been the city's third-party administrator for the workers' compensation cost containment program since March, 2009. The term of the current contract is from March 1, 2024 to February 28, 2025.

Contract Compliance: The Federal Tax Identification number for Sedgwick Claims Management Services, Inc. consultants is 36-2685608.

Emergency Action: Emergency action is requested to allow for the continuation of actuarial services with regards to workers' compensation cost containment programs.

Fiscal Impact: Funds totaling \$55,000.00 are specifically budgeted for this contract in the Department of Human Resources 2024 employee benefits fund budget; the availability of funds is contingent on the passage of Ord. 3012-2023, the 2024 Other Funds Appropriations ordinance.

To authorize the Director of the Human Resources Department to contract with Sedgwick Claims Management Services, Inc., to provide workers' compensation cost containment services from March 1, 2024 to February 28, 2025; to authorize the expenditure of \$55,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay the cost of said contract; and to declare an emergency. BACKGROUND: Columbus City Council ("COUNCIL"), by Ordinance No. 2504-2019, passed October 14, 2019, authorized the City of Columbus ("CITY") to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement (the "AGREEMENT") with RM Biltrite LLC and Watkins Road LLC (collectively, and hereinafter referred to as the "ENTERPRISE") for a tax abatement of seventy-five percent (75%) for a period of ten (10) consecutive years in consideration of the company's total proposed investment of approximately \$11,470,500.00, which \$4,705,500.00 in acquisition cost,\$1,650,000.00 in approximately real property improvements, \$5,000,000.00 in machinery and equipment, \$100,000.00 in furniture and fixtures, \$15,000.00 in stand-alone computers to acquire, renovate, and redevelop a vacant industrial warehouse distribution facility consisting of approximately 177,566 square feet at 1635 Watkins Road, Columbus, Ohio 43207, parcel number: 010-001860 (the "PROJECT SITE"). The ENTERPRISE committed to create forty (40) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1,677,740.00 and retain one (1) full-time employee with an annual payroll of approximately \$85,000.00 to preserve or create employment opportunities within the Columbus Enterprise Zone, (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT"). The AGREEMENT was made and entered into effective January 30, 2020 (Agreement No. 023-20-02).

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to execute a Lender Participation Agreement with numerous, individual lenders who wish to partner with the Department of Development for the American Dream Downpayment Initiative (ADDI) program.

The Department of Development's ADDI program provides down payment assistance using federal HOME funds or non-federal funds to first time homebuyers whose household income is at or below 80% or 120% AMI, respectively, for the purchase of a home in the City of Columbus. The amount of assistance provided is the lesser of 6% of the purchase price or \$7,500.00 and is provided as a forgivable loan. The household must remain in the home for a period of five years for the loan to be forgiven.

The department partners with multiple lenders to provide information about the ADDI program to the lenders' eligible clients, as defined by program guidelines. Only lenders who have executed a Lender Participation Agreement and whose staff have completed city-created training can recommend clients for the ADDI program. The City does not make payment to the Lender for their participation in this program, nor is the lender a subrecipient as defined in 2 CFR 200. A lender's participation in this program allows the lender to recommend a potential resource of additional funds to eligible clients who may not be able to purchase a new home without additional financial assistance.

The department evaluates its programs and agreement templates on a regular basis. This review may necessitate program or agreement template changes based upon new federal regulations or process improvements because of a change in best practices or lessons learned. As such, changes to the Lender Participation Agreement may need to be made to reflect these changes. In order to prevent a disruption in the program if a change must occur expeditiously - for which a disruption may result in a first time homebuyer not being able to purchase a home - the Director of Development is seeking authority to modify these agreements as needed without seeking further City Council approval. Modifications would reflect changes required by federal regulations or changes to the department's program, which is described in the agreement. Since the lender is not being compensated, no funding will be added to these agreements through a modification.

The Agreement was made and entered into effective August 12, 2021 (Agreement No. 023-21-19) with the Project expected to begin in the fall of 2020, with all real property improvements expected to be completed by December 2021, and with the abatement to commence no later than 2022 nor extend beyond 2031.

Paragraph fourteen within Section 6 (Program Compliance) of the Agreement states that the "Agreement is not transferable or assignable without the express, written, approval of the City" and paragraph fifteen of that same section states that "any requested amendment…to any of the terms of the Agreement…shall require the payment to the City by the Enterprise of an Amendment Fee in the amount of five-hundred dollars (\$500.00)."

In a letter received by the City on behalf of the Enterprise dated January 6, 2022 and through ensuing correspondence, it was confirmed that the office building transitioned into an office condominium, with each of the three floors owned by the tenants. As a result of this transition, The Quarry Trails Office Condominium ("Quarry Trails") was created on December 10, 2021. The three floors were conveyed to WAG ROCK, LLC ("WAG"), EPF 5, LLC ("EPF 5"), and Panacea Property Ventures, LLC ("Panacea"), and each entity has acquired ownership of the **Project Site** from Quarry Trails, with the transfer having been recorded at the County Recorder's Office on June 24, 2022 for WAG, on April 3, 2023 for EPF 5, and on August 18, 2022 for Panacea. BACKGROUND

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a contract with The Waterworks, LLC, in an amount up to \$300,000.00 to provide residential emergency heating, plumbing, and water and sewer services as part of the Division of Housing's Emergency Repair Program using Housing Preservation Bond funds. The department advertised RFQ026104 on Vendor Services seeking contractors to provide emergency mechanical repairs on October 10, 2023 with bids being due on November 3, 2023. The Emergency Repair Program is a home repair program operated by the Housing Division.

Emergency action is requested to continue performing needed repairs for residents as quickly as possible.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding is available within the Development Taxable Bond Fund. An amendment to the 2023 Capital Improvements Budget and a transfer of cash and appropriation are required to establish sufficient budget authority, cash, and appropriation within the proper project.

1. BACKGROUND

This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Utilities to enter into a contract with Resource International, Inc. for professional engineering services for the Chesapeake Avenue Area Water Line Improvements project, CIP #690236-100154, in an amount up to \$336,594.25.

The purpose of this project is to construct necessary improvements to the water distribution system in the Chesapeake Avenue Area. The improvements identified in the scope of work will replace or rehabilitate water lines that have high break histories and require frequent maintenance. This project includes replacing or rehabilitating approximately 10,150 linear feet of 2-inch, 6-inch, 8-inch water lines and transferring existing services from a 4-inch to a 16-inch water line. The streets include Chesapeake Avenue, Virginia Avenue, West 8th Avenue, Concord Avenue, Sells Avenue, Western Avenue, Hess Street, West 6th Avenue, Delashmut Avenue, Broadview Avenue, Stella Court, and West 5th Avenue.

This project is located within the Olentangy West (38) and Fifth by Northwest (42) Community Planning Areas.

TIMELINE & FUTURE RENEWAL(S): The duration of the design phase for this project is expected to be 12 months. It is estimated the end of this contract will occur in 2025.

ESTIMATED COST OF PROJECT: The contract amount is to be \$336,594.25 including a 15% contingency that will be utilized to fund needed and approved changes in the work. No contract modifications are anticipated at this time; however, design exigency might later compel modification of this contract if unforeseen difficulties are encountered.

5. MINORITY AND WOMAN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE & SMALL LOCAL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

This contract was bid with an anticipated City of Columbus MBE/WBE Program goal of 10%. After review of the Utilization Plan and other related information the contractor submitted with their bid response, an MBE/WBE Program goal of 10% is established for this contract. Failure by the contractor to meet this goal subjects the contractor to the Penalties for Non-Compliance as described in the terms and conditions of the bid documents.

1. BACKGROUND

The United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) has issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO), with \$1 billion available through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program. The Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program makes federal funds available to states, U.S territories, federally recognized tribal governments, and local communities for hazard mitigation activities. It does so with a recognition of the growing hazards associated with climate change, and of the need for natural hazard risk mitigation activities that promote climate adaptation and resilience with respect to those hazards. These include both acute extreme weather events and chronic stressors which have been observed and are expected to increase in the future. The NOFO remains open through February 29, 2024.

The City meets the criteria to be eligible to submit an application as a subrecipient through the Ohio Emergency Management Agency (Ohio EMA), which is part of the Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS). City staff has spoken with Ohio EMA, and it is willing to submit an application requesting approximately \$600,000.00 to purchase friction sensors for city staff to use to monitor roadway and weather conditions during winter weather events. These sensors will allow city staff to respond to winter weather events as efficiently as possible.

This legislation will authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to formally apply for a BRIC program grant as a subrecipient to Ohio EMA. It also authorizes the execution of agreements with USDHS, ODPS, or others in connection with the application for the grant, the award of the grant, the expenditure of grant funds, and the return of unused grant funds if any should remain at the end of the grant.

Background: On November 5, 2018, City Council passed Ordinance 2978-2018, authorizing the Finance and Management Director to establish a Universal Term Contract (UTC) for the option to obtain Bill Presentment services with Level One LLC. The term authorized in the ordinance was for two (2) years from the contract

execution. The contract was able to be extended for up to four additional two (2) year periods, subject to mutual agreement by both parties. This would have allowed for a maximum of a ten (10) year contract. The actual signed contract PO149627, has a term of five (5) years, with the option to extend annually up to an additional five (5) years. Although both the ordinance and the contract allow for a maximum of a ten (10) year contract, the original signed term was not in accordance with the legislative authorization. This was done through human error.

Because this error has caused the original contract to lapse, an ordinance is necessary to re-establish the UTC by entering into a new contract with Level One LLC. A bid waiver is requested to re-establish this contract. Bid Information: The Purchasing Office advertised and solicited competitive bids in accordance with the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 relating to competitive bidding. RFQ006999 was advertised and Proposals were received on November 2, 2017. Seven (7) responses were received. Due to the expiration of the original contract, and the age of the original RFP, a bid waiver is requested.

Total estimated annual expenditures: the City has expended approximately \$926,000 per year during the contract.

Emergency action is requested so that the Public Utilities Department can continue Bill Presentment services with minimal interruption.

The CPH evaluation committee, utilizing established scoring criteria, unanimously recommended awarding the contract to Stephanie K Starks.

The contract compliance number for Stephanie K Starks is CC-042750.

Emergency action is requested in order to remain in alignment with the grant period and deliverables by not delaying the start of this contract. Any delay could result in the contract period surpassing the allowable grant period.

Information regarding municipal services that would be available, should the subject site be annexed, has been compiled and is reflected in this ordinance. Should the petition be approved by the County Commissioners, a second City ordinance accepting the annexation will be required to complete the process. The time frames specified in the ORC require that this legislation be filed as emergency.

FISCAL IMPACT: The statement of municipal services and zoning conditions for a proposed annexation area has no fiscal impact. While provision of the stated services does represent cost to the City, annexation of land also has the potential to create revenue to the city.

To set forth a statement of municipal services and zoning conditions to be provided to the area contained in a proposed annexation (AN23-023) of 9.45± Acres in Jackson Township to the city of Columbus as required by the Ohio Revised Code and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Jackson Township was duly filed on behalf of Jackie Lee & Louellen M. McNabb on December 27, 2023; and

WHEREAS, a hearing on said petition is tentatively scheduled before the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County on January 23, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code requires that before said hearing the Municipal Legislative Authority shall adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the municipal corporation will provide to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code requires that before said meeting the Municipal Legislative Authority adopt an ordinance stating zoning buffering conditions; and

WHEREAS, properties proposed for annexation are within the Westland Plan (1994); and

WHEREAS, upon annexation, properties will have uniform access to City services as they become available; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Development in that it is immediately necessary to present this ordinance to the Franklin County Board of Commissioners in accordance with the time limits provided by the Ohio Revised Code all for the preservation of the public peace, property, health safety and welfare; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. That the city of Columbus will provide the following municipal services for $9.45\pm$ acres in Jackson Township upon the annexation of said area to the city of Columbus:

Sanitation: Residential refuse collection services will be available upon annexation of the property.

Transportation: Maintenance will be available for any additional right-of-way that may be included in this annexation request. If this annexation contains existing signalized intersections, those intersections and signals are subject to Transportation Division Policy, which appeared in the December 6, 2003 Columbus City Bulletin, and any subsequent updates thereto.

Water: The site will be served by an existing 12" water main located in Demorest Road, the connection to which will be made the owner's expense.

Sewers: All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners and developers at their own cost and expense with no cost to the City.

Sanitary: No objection. All parcels will need to be combined and/or a sanitary sewer extension may be required. A sanitary sewer capacity study may be required during site compliance activities. All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners/developers at their own expense with no cost to the city.

Storm: All storm sewers necessary for development/redevelopment of the area shall be designed in accordance with design policy and zoning codes in effect at the time of development.

All sanitary and storm sewers required shall be constructed privately by the owners/developers at their own expense with no cost to the city.

Section 2. If this 9.45± acre site is annexed and if the City of Columbus permits uses in the annexed territory that the City of Columbus determines are clearly incompatible with the uses permitted under current county or township zoning regulations in the adjacent land remaining within Jackson Township, the Columbus City Council will require, in the zoning ordinance permitting the incompatible uses, the owner of the annexed territory to provide a buffer separating the use of the annexed territory and the adjacent land remaining within Jackson Township. For the purpose of this section, "buffer" includes open space, landscaping, fences, walls, and other structured elements: streets and street right-of-way; and bicycle and pedestrian paths and sidewalks.

Section 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT:</u> The Ben Franklin Tuberculosis grant program is entirely funded by the grant from the Franklin County Board of Commissioners and does not generate revenue or require a City Match.

Community Improvement Grants are available on a competitive basis from Keep America Beautiful (KAB), and the Foodservice Packaging Institute Foam Recycling Coalition (FPIFRC).

The Keep America Beautiful comprehensive grant application is designed to support the KAB Affiliate network, other nonprofit organizations, and community groups to implement programs or projects designed to build clean, green, and beautiful places for all to thrive and enjoy. The comprehensive grant application allows the applicant to receive eligibility for any Keep America Beautiful grant programs. The City of Columbus, Department of Public Service, Division of Refuse Collection, and Keep Columbus Beautiful (KCB) will apply for multiple grants from Keep America Beautiful listed below, as well as any future grants eligible for consideration under this comprehensive grant application, and one from the Foodservice Packaging Institute Foam Recycling Coalition.

Upon execution of the grant agreements with Keep America Beautiful, and the Food Service Packaging Institute Foam Recycling Coalition, the awarded grant funds will be used by the Division of Refuse Collection and Keep Columbus Beautiful, a City of Columbus community improvement program and national affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, for the programs, supplies, and equipment listed below in the grant program descriptions:

The America Recycles Day event co-sponsored by Anheuser Busch, will clean-up designated areas in the City of Columbus. Keep Columbus Beautiful will oversee the clean-up, organize the volunteer efforts, and provide the tools and protection equipment necessary for the event. The Division of Refuse Collection and KCB will also provide waste removal, media accommodations, and reporting for the event. A total of \$16,000.00 will be awarded.

The Cigarette Litter Prevention Program (CLPP) will fund the purchase of KAB approved disposal receptacles, which will be installed throughout the community at homes, business locations, and local parks. The cigarette butt receptacles will be collected and recycled by the TerraCycle organization. A total of \$20,000.00 will be awarded.

The Martin Luther King, Jr. Recycled Materials Art Competition creates an opportunity for Columbus children to learn more about recycling, the responsible use of resources, and sustainable living through creative exploration. A \$500.00 classroom mini-grant will be awarded to the teacher of each winning student group. A total of \$20,000.00 in funding will be awarded.

The Foam Recycling Coalition will provide funding for the purchase and installation of a high-capacity densifier unit at the Alum Creek Transfer station, to better manage foam recycling collection. The densifier

will accept foam materials, such as food service packaging, post-consumer foam packaging and padding, and production scrap from local businesses and residents. A total of \$50,000.00 in funding will be awarded.

PROPOSED USE: 186-unit apartment complex.

GREATER SOUTH EAST AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The applicant has received a recommendation of approval from Staff and the Development Commission for a concurrent rezoning (Ordinance #0059-2024; Z23-056) to the ARLD, Apartment Residential District for a multi-unit residential development. The proposed development is an apartment complex comprised of 186 units. BACKGROUND

This Ordinance is to authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a grant agreement in an amount up to \$555,000.00 with Healthy Rental Homes VIII LLC. This ordinance also authorizes the appropriation and expenditure of up to \$560,000.00 of HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) entitlement grants (\$513,352.90 from the 2022 grant and \$46,647.10 from the 2023 grant) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to execute a commitment letter and loan agreement and authorizes the city to act as a lender and have a promissory note, mortgage, and restrictive convent executed for this project with Healthy Rental Homes

VIII LLC. This legislation also seeks to authorize eligible costs, including soft costs, which may have been incurred prior to the establishment of the project's purchase order, making those pre-award costs eligible for reimbursement if needed.

Healthy Homes is an affordable housing developer that is wholly owned by Community Development for All People, a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) which is eligible for CHDO HOME set aside funds. Healthy Homes is focused on increasing the stock of high-quality housing options available to families earning no more than 80% of Area Median Income (AMI) on Columbus' South Side. Healthy Rental Homes VIII LLC seeks to further address the housing affordability issues that Columbus faces by developing 11 units of new construction rental housing in zip codes 43206 and 43207. These properties will consist of infill development, designed to replace structures that have been demolished. Additionally, the parcels that have been identified for redevelopment are being acquired exclusively from the City of Columbus and Franklin County Land Banks.

The 11 rental units for which we are seeking funding will consist of 3 single family homes and 4 duplexes. All but two of these properties will be built by Unibilt Industries-a modular home builder located in Dayton, Ohio. The modular units will be delivered approximately 75% complete and set on full foundations. Healthy Homes has engaged a General Contractor who will complete all site preparations, construct the foundations and manage the balance of work post-delivery. Once delivered, the units will require mechanical connections for electric, plumbing, and HVAC. Porches will be constructed on site, and there will be some minor interior finishes to finalize. Lastly, the General Contractor will pour concrete parking pads and walk ways, and each site will be fully landscaped with sod and a shade tree. Upon completion, these projects will blend with the existing fabric of the community, and there will be no visible evidence to suggest that they are modular in nature. The two units that are not modular are traditional stick construction.

In addition to high-quality, affordable places to call home, the tenant families who will reside in these units will have access to a variety of supportive services and advocacy opportunities. Healthy Homes hired a full time Tenant Services Coordinator to serve as a link between residents and health/social service providers and Nationwide Children's Healthy Neighborhoods Healthy Families (HNHF) programming. The Tenant Services Coordinator will work to increase health knowledge and self-sufficiency of our tenant families through outreach, community education, and referrals to community resources, social supports, and advocacy. More specifically, tenants will have improved access to health, educational, workforce and life skills development opportunities. Financial literacy, parenting classed and mental health services will also be emphasized. Service engagement will not be a requirement for the families that Healthy Homes serves, but it will be available to all households as needed.

This legislation represents appropriation for a part of the HOME portion of the 2022 Action Plan per ordinance 2800-2021 and the 2023 Action Plan per ordinance 3353-2022.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: The vendor's contract compliance number is 047327 and expires on 11/16/25.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding is available in 2023 Capital Improvement in the amount of \$555,000.00. An amendment to the 2023 Capital Budget is required to establish sufficient budget authority for the project. This project is also utilizing funds within the 2022 HOME Investment Partnership Program Grant (G442102) in the amount of \$513,352.90 and 2023 HOME Investment Partnership Program Grant (G442202) funds in the amount of \$46,647.10. The commitment of funds through this legislation is conditioned on compliance with HUD's environmental review requirements. The funding from HOME Fund (2201) is only authorized if all

HOME review and comment requirements have been met prior to any commitment of funds, as approved by the Responsible Entity Agency Official. An Authorization to Utilize Grant Funds will be received by the City from HUD in advance of the execution of documents for this project.

To amend the 2023 Capital Improvement Budget; to authorize the City Auditor to transfer funds within the Development Taxable Bond Fund and within the Department of Development; to authorize the Director of the Department Development to enter into a grant agreement with Healthy Rental Homes VII LLC for an amount not to exceed \$555,000.00; to authorize an expenditure of \$555,000.00 from the Capital Budget, Development Taxable Bond fund 7739; to authorize the appropriation and expenditure of \$513,352.90 of the 2022 HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) entitlement grant (CHDO Set-a-Side) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and to authorize the appropriation and expenditure of \$46,647.10 of the 2023 HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) entitlement grant (CHDO Set-a-Side) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. (\$1,115,000.00)

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department Development seeks to enter into a grant agreement in an amount up to \$555,000.00 with Healthy Rental Homes VIII LLC; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department desires to support the Healthy Rental Homes VIII LLC, project with HOME funds, for a total contribution of \$560,000.00; and

WHEREAS, authorized costs, including soft costs, which may have been incurred prior to the establishment of the project's purchase order, will be eligible for reimbursement if needed; and

WHEREAS, Healthy Homes is focused on increasing the stock of high-quality housing options available to families earning no more than 80% of Area Median Income (AMI) on Columbus' South Side; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus is a participating jurisdiction of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus is the recipient of HOME Investment Partnerships funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS, the Columbus City Council has approved the 2022 and 2023 Action Plans, per Ordinance 2800-2021 and 3353-2022, respectively, as required by HUD; and

WHEREAS, Healthy Rental Homes VIII LLC seeks to further address the housing affordability issues that Columbus faces by developing 11 units of new construction rental housing in zip codes 43206 and 43207; and

WHEREAS, in the usual daily operation of the Department of Development it is necessary to authorize the Director to enter into a grant agreement with Healthy Rental Homes VIII LLC, to allow payment to the grantee for project costs incurred prior to the issuance of a purchase order, which advances the public purpose of providing affordable housing in a cost efficient manner; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the Director of the Department of Development be and is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement with Healthy Rental Homes VIII, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$555,000.00 to develop up to 11 new construction and 2 units of rehab construction rental housing units in zip code 43206.

SECTION 2. That the 2023 Capital Improvements Budget be amended as follows to establish sufficient authority for this project:

SECTION 6. That from the unappropriated monies and from all monies estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources and unappropriated for any other purpose during the fiscal year ended December 31, 2023, the sum of \$46,647.10 is appropriated in Fund 2201 (HOME), from Dept-Div 44-10 (Housing), G442202 (2023 HOME), object class 05 (Other Expenses) per the account codes in the attachment to this ordinance.

SECTION 7. That the expenditure of \$513,352.90 or so much thereof as may be needed, is hereby authorized in Fund 2201 (HOME), Dept-Div 4410 (Housing), G442102 (2022 HOME Grant), object class 05 (Other Expenses) per the account codes in the attachment to this ordinance.

SECTION 8. That the expenditure of \$46,647.10 or so much thereof as may be needed, is hereby authorized in Fund 2201 (HOME), Dept-Div 4410 (Housing), G442202 (2023 HOME Grant), object class 05 (Other Expenses) per the account codes in the attachment to this ordinance.

SECTION 9. That the commitment of funds through this legislation is conditioned on compliance with HUD's environmental review requirements. The funding from HOME Fund (2201) is only authorized if all HOME review and comment requirements have been met prior to any commitment of funds, as approved by the Responsible Entity Agency Official. An Authorization to Utilize Grant Funds will be received by the City from HUD in advance of the execution of documents for this project.

SECTION 10. That the Director of the Department Development is hereby authorized to execute a commitment letter and loan agreement and authorizes the city to act as a lender and have a promissory note, mortgage, and restrictive convent executed for this project with Healthy Rental Homes VIII LLC, utilizing HOME funds in an amount up to \$560,000.00 for developing 11 units of new construction rental housing in zip codes 43206 and 43207.

SECTION 11. That the funds necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance are hereby deemed appropriated, and the City Auditor shall establish such accounting codes as necessary.

SECTION 12. That the City Auditor is authorized to make any accounting changes to revise the funding source for all contracts or contract modifications associated with this ordinance.

SECTION 13. That, at the end of the grant period, any repayment of unencumbered balances required by the grantor is hereby authorized and any unused City match monies may be transferred back to the City fund from which they originated in accordance with all applicable grant agreements.

SECTION 14. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health has been awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services through the Ohio Department of Health. This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate \$89,000.00 in grant money to fund the Dental Sealant grant program, for the period January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024.

The primary purpose of the Dental Sealant Program is to prevent dental caries among school children through an evidence-based community approach. The program targets higher-risk schools in order to reach higher-risk children. In addition to currently served second and third grade students, the program will be expanded to include sixth and seventh grade students along with additional second and third grade students.

Emergency action is requested to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the City's accounting system as soon as possible in light of the January 1, 2024 start date and not delay all activities for the Dental Sealant program.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Dental Sealant program is entirely funded by the grant from Ohio Department of Health and does not generate revenue or require a City Match.

To authorize the Board of Health to accept a grant from the Ohio Department of Health in the amount of \$89,000.00 for the Dental Sealant program that prevents dental cavities among school children through an evidence-based community approach, to authorize the appropriation of \$89,000.00 from the unappropriated balance of the Health Department Grants Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$89,000.00)

WHEREAS, \$89,000.00 in grant funds have been made available through the Ohio Department of Health for the Dental Sealant grant program for the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to accept and appropriate these funds from the Ohio Department of Health for the continued support of the Dental Sealant grant program; and,

WHEREAS, this ordinance is submitted as an emergency so as to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the City's accounting system as soon as possible due to the January 1, 2024 start date. Up to date financial posting promotes accurate accounting and financial management; and,

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of Columbus Public Health in that it is immediately necessary to accept these grant funds from the Ohio Department Health and to appropriate these

funds to Columbus Public Health for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety and welfare, and to avoid delay in client services; **Now, therefore,**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the Board of Health is hereby authorized and directed to accept a grant award of \$89,000.00 from the Ohio Department of Health for the Dental Sealant grant program for the period January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024.

SECTION 2. That from the unappropriated monies in the Health Department's Grants Fund, Fund No. 2251, and from all monies estimated to come into said Fund from any and all sources during the grant period, the sum of \$89,000.00 and any eligible interest earned during the grant period is hereby appropriated to the Health Department, Division No. 5001, according to the attached accounting document.

SECTION 3. That the monies appropriated in the foregoing Section 2 shall be paid upon the order of the Health Commissioner and that no order shall be drawn or money paid except upon voucher, the form of which shall be approved by the City Auditor.

SECTION 4. At the end of the grant period, any repayment of unencumbered balances required by the grantor is hereby authorized and any unused City match monies may be transferred back to the City fund from which they originated in accordance with all applicable grant agreements.

SECTION 5. Funds necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance are hereby deemed appropriated, and the City Auditor shall establish such accounting codes as necessary.

SECTION 6. That for reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to enter into contract with Ironsite, Inc. DBA Facemyer Landscaping for the Olentangy Trail - Dodridge Street Connection Project. The contract amount is \$501,682.94, with a contingency of \$48,317.06, for a total of \$550,000.00. An additional \$2,000.00 is being authorized for interdepartmental inspections and fees for a total of \$552,000.00 being authorized by this ordinance.

This project will provide the community with a much needed connection to the Olentangy Trail at Dodridge Street in the northern section of the University District. The project will install sidewalks, a staircase, and bike ramps. There will also be improvements to the fix the hillside erosion that is impacting the trail in this area.

These improvements will increase public access to the Olentangy Trail near the Dodridge Street bridge which is currently limited between Tuttle Park and Clinton Como Park. Construction work will begin in the spring of 2024 and finish in the summer of 2025. There are anticipated minimal impacts to Olentangy Trail traffic and a detour route will be provided if any trail impacts arise.

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to apply for grant funding from the Ohio Department of Development, Office of Energy and Environment, Brightening Ohio Communities Fund Program. The Brightening Ohio Communities Fund Program is accepting applications for funding to implement cost-effective, energy efficiency lighting improvements. If awarded, the funding will be used to replace existing exterior park lighting with high-efficiency LED lighting.

The Ohio Department of Development is accepting grant applications for the Brightening Ohio Communities Fund Program. The grant is expected to be around \$400,000.00. The grant offers assistance to governmental agencies in to provide streetlight upgrades that will help local government agencies realize energy savings. Grant applications are due December 15, 2023. The notification of the grant acceptance will be awarded in the winter of 2023, and all project work must be completed by May 31, 2026.

The application requires an ASHRAE level II energy audit, which will be completed by Ameresco under an existing contract for grant application assistance. The energy audit will include the costs of replacement for exterior park lights and sports court lighting at Antrim Park. The estimate construction cost for the lighting replacement at Antrim Park is \$400,000.00, which will be a portion of the 2024 Lighting Improvements project intended to be completed in 2024.

BACKGROUND: Ordinance 1274-2023 authorized the Director of the Department of Development to transfer the Land Bank structure located at 536 Walnut St. (010-010628) to Columbus Landmarks Foundation. The City Land Bank program and Columbus Landmarks have partnered to stabilize the house and issue a joint Request for Proposals (RFP) to find a buyer who will renovate the structure in a historically appropriate manner. This Ordinance will repeal and replace 1274-2023, to change the buyer from Columbus Landmarks to Walnut Street Franklinton Partners, LLC, the winner of the RFP. The buyer will combine the structure with adjacent properties as a part of an adaptive reuse of three single-family homes for mixture of uses, including an art gallery, artist housing, and other commercial uses. transfer. A separate agreement between Columbus Landmarks and the buyer will place a historic easement on the site to ensure the structure is preserved in a historically appropriate manner.

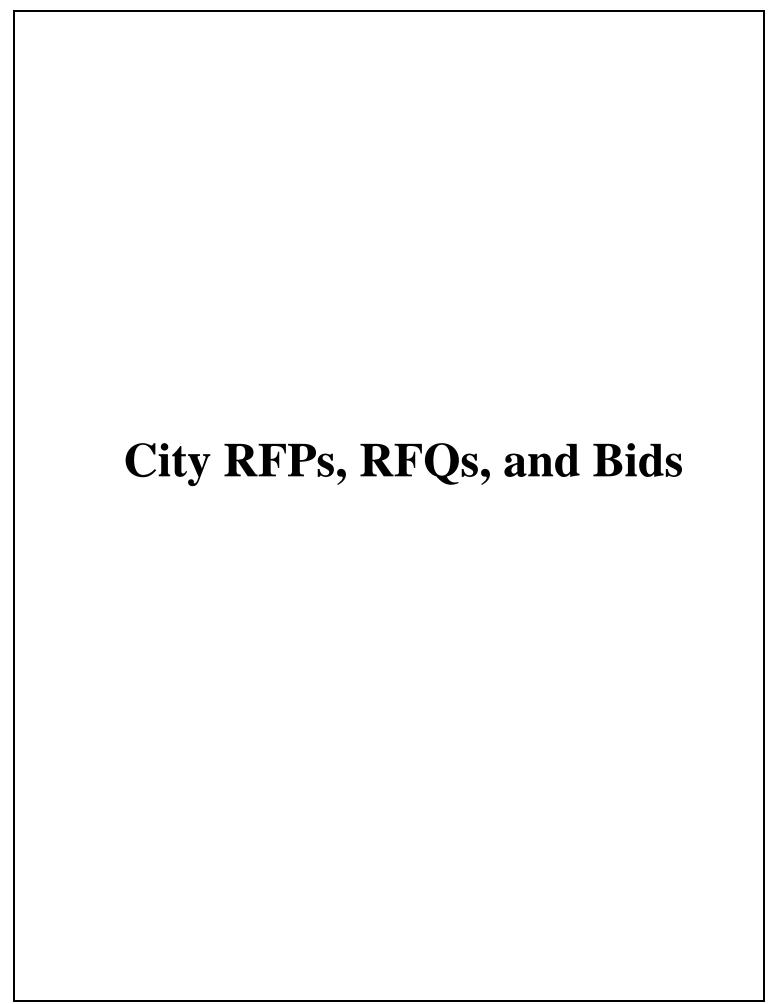
